SALUTE TO SERVICE

Salute to Service is one of the NFL's primary causes that acts to honor, empower, and connect our nation's service members, veterans, and their families. Each year, the Jets champion this cause by working closely with organizations that support the military, promoting special service members and their families, visiting military bases, and coordinating special events to recognize service branches and their members. This season, the Jets are highlighting Salute to Service through several activations, recognitions, and events during the team's Week Nine game versus the Los Angeles Chargers.

To honor salute to Service and all military members, The New York Jets will have different activations around the stadium. At the Tailgate Zone Presented by USVI, there will be a Coast Guard Swift Boat, MQ-1 Drone, US Army E-Sport Gaming Trailer, Interactive games, EOD (Bomb Disposal Units), Air Force interactive tractor trailers, New Jersey Dept. of Veterans Affairs Bus, and booths from West Point and all six branches. To Kick off the game, over 150 Veterans, Gold Star Family Members, Blue Star Family Members, Scholarship Recipients and ROTC Cadets will participate in the unfurling of the American Flag during the National Anthem and Presentation of Colors. West Point Officers will also surprise a local high school senior with his letter of acceptance to the West Point Class of 2028. Additionally, there will be various military presentations throughout the game.

Enlistment Ceremony: Before player introductions, an oath of enlistment ceremony will take place in the end zone for 100 future members of the armed forces. At the completion of the oath of enlistments, which will be administered by Lieutenant General Jody Daniels, Commanding General, U.S. Army Reserve Command, over 825 members of the armed forces would have taken their oath of enlistment at MetLife Stadium.

The Armed Forces ROTC Scholarships: During the game, Lieutenant General Jody Daniels, the first ever women Chief of Army Reserve and Commanding General, U.S. Army Reserve Command will surprise unsuspecting students with Army, Navy, and Air Force with ROTC college scholarships worth a combined over \$1,000,000.00.

SOLDIERS TO SIDELINES: The Jets will host service members, including active duty, retired and veterans from all military branches, for an in-person and virtual coaching certification seminar leading into the game. Attendees will participate in classroom and on field work in an effort to educate and empower them on how to become football coaches.

DARRELLE REVIS: During a special halftime ceremony, New York Jets Legend **Darrelle Revis** will receive his **Hall of Fame Ring of Excellence** presented to him by **Pro Football Hall of Fame President Jim Porter**. This past August, the **Hall of Fame** welcomed **Revis** into the **Pro Football Hall of Fame Class of 2023**.

There are three physical icons that represent an individual's enshrinement into the **Pro Football Hall of Fame**. Each **Hall of Famer** receives their Hall of Fame Gold Jacket on the eve of the enshrinement in Canton. The bronze bust is unveiled during the enshrinement ceremony held inside Pro Football Hall of Fame Field which is then placed permanently on display inside the Hall of Fame. The third symbol, the **Hall of Fame Ring of Excellence**, is presented to the Hall of Famer during a special presentation at his team's stadium.

A **four-time first-team All-Pro** from 2009-11 and 2014, cornerback **Darrelle Revis** entered the NFL as a first-round draft choice, by the Jets in the 2007 NFL Draft. During his 11-year career, **Revis** appeared in 145 regular season games with 142 starts for the Jets from 2007-2012, and 2015-16. **Revis** made an immediate impact on the Jets as he earned a spot on the **PFWA All-Rookie Team**. He finished his career with 496 tackles, 29 interceptions for 466 yards and three touchdowns, 139 passes defensed, four forced fumbles and 12 fumble recoveries earning him **seven Pro Bowl honors** from 2008-2011 and 2013-15. He was also named to the **NFL's All-Decade Team of the 2010s**. A **two-time Curtis Martin Team MVP**, **Revis** finished the 2009 season with 31 passes defensed, the **most in the NFL since 2000**. In 2022, **Revis** was inducted into the **Jets Ring of Honor**.



HEADLINES

CONSECUTIVE SCORES: Over the Jets three-game winning streak, running back **Breece Hall** has scored a touchdown in each game. The second-year running back is now **tied for the fifth-longest active streak in the NFL** of games with a touchdown.

Additionally, **Hall** has averaged a **League-high 5.7 yards** per carry this season, while owning **two of the three longest rushes in the League this year.**

PASSING DEFENSE: The Jets defense has **not allowed a 300-yard passer in 25 straight games (2021)**, the **second-longest streak** in the NFL (New Orleans - 29 games).

During the Week Eight victory at NYG (10/29), the Jets defense held the Giants to **-9 net passing yards, tied for the fewest allowed in the NFL since 2000.**

Additionally, the Jets have recorded a **42.2% pressure rate** on quarterbacks this season, the **second-best in the NFL.**

Additionally, opposing quarterbacks have recorded a 78.1 passer rating when facing the Jets, the **fourth-lowest allowed in the League this season.**

TOP FIVE: Linebacker and team captain **CJ Mosley** has recorded five passes defended this season, a **top five** total among linebackers in the NFL and the **seventh time in his career he's recorded at least five for the season.** Among those in the top five, his **seven seasons are the best.** This marks the **first time in Mosley's career he has had five in the first seven games since his rookie season (2014).**

In addition to his drops into coverage, **Mosley** has produced pressure at a **top 10** rate among linebackers this season. His seven QB pressures on 24 pass rush snaps (29.2% pressure rate) is the **10th best among all linebackers** with at least 20 pass rush snaps.

Additionally, **Mosley** has recorded 71 tackles this season, **tied for the fifth-most in the NFL** among linebackers through seven games.

It marked **one of 11** games this season that a player has produced **2.0+ sacks and four+ QB hits**, and the only one where the opposing quarterback dropped back 25 times or less.

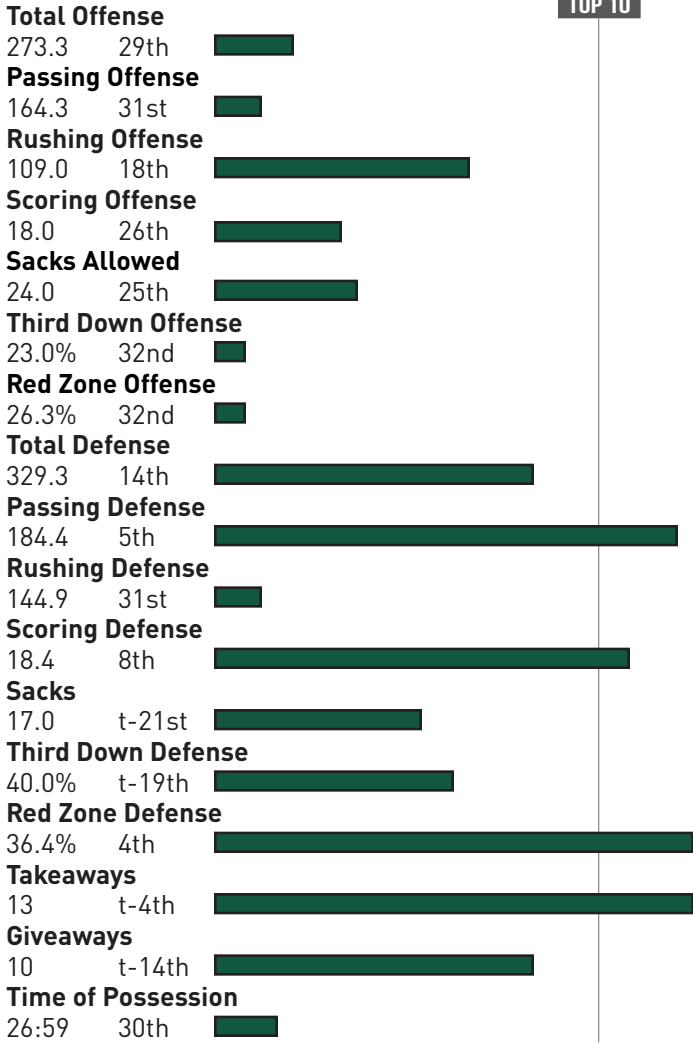

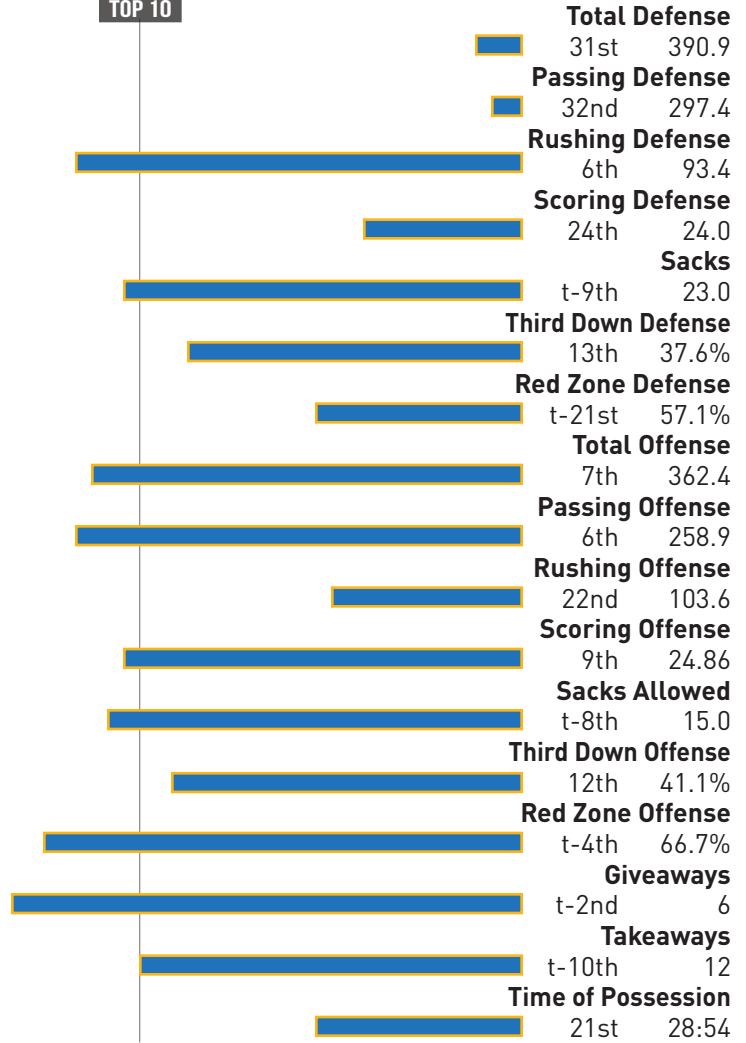

BY THE NUMBERS

-9

During the Week Eight victory at NYG (10/29), the Jets held the Giants to -9 net passing yards, tied for the fewest allowed since 2000.

1

Linebacker **QUINCY WILLIAMS** is the only player in the NFL this season to record at least 70 tackles, eight tackles for loss and 2.0 sacks.

2ND

Since entering the League (2022), All-Pro cornerback **SAUCE GARDNER** is second in the NFL in passes defended (23).

3

During the Week Eight win at NYG (10/29), punter **THOMAS MORSTEAD** downed three punts within the five-yard line, tied for the most by any punter since 2000. Additionally, he is the only Jets punter to do so in franchise history.

3

Undrafted free agent and rookie wide receiver **XAVIER GIPSON** became only the third player in NFL history to return a punt for a touchdown in overtime, after doing so during the team's Week One victory vs. BUF (9/11).

3

With his three interceptions Week One vs. BUF (9/11), safety **JORDAN WHITEHEAD** became the first player in the NFL to record at least three interceptions in a game since 2018.

3

Through seven games this season, linebacker **BRYCE HUFF** has recorded a team-high 31 pressures, tied for the sixth-most in the NFL. Additionally, **HUFF'S** 3.5 sacks on the year are tied for the second-most on the team.

4TH

This season, the Jets rank fourth in the NFL in red zone efficiency, allowing touchdowns on only 36.4% of opponent red zone drives.

6

After converting on a fake punt during Week Two at DAL (9/17), the Jets have now converted on six straight fake punts since 2014, the second-most consecutive conversions by a team over that span.

7

Since becoming head coach (2021), **ROBERT SALEH** has won seven games in which his team has trailed 10+ points, tied for the most in the League over that span.

12

Linebacker **JERMAINE JOHNSON** became just the 12th player in the NFL since 2016 to record at least three pressures and three passes defended in a game after doing so Week Six vs. PHI (10/15).

13

The Jets have registered 13 takeaways this season, tied for the sixth-most in the NFL.

20+

Quarterback **ZACH WILSON** now has four 20+ yard completions in the last :30 seconds of the game since entering the League (2021), tied with Tom Brady for the most by any quarterback in that span.

27

First-Team All-Pro and Pro Bowl defensive lineman **QUINNEN WILLIAMS** has 27 quarterback pressures this season, tied for the fifth-most when rushing as an interior lineman.

39

Since entering the League in 2014, team captain and linebacker **CJ MOSLEY** has recorded 39 games with 10+ tackles, tied for the third-most in the NFL during that span.

70%

Through his first 24 career games, quarterback **ZACH WILSON** only threw for a 70%+ completion rate once. **WILSON** has done so in back-to-back weeks this season (Weeks Four & Five).

72

After recording a 72-yard touchdown run Week Five at DEN (10/8), running back **BREECE HALL** now owns two of the three longest runs in the NFL this season. Additionally, **HALL'S** 5.7 yards per carry lead the NFL this season.

Among kickers with at least 15 attempts this season, kicker **GREG ZUERLEIN** has recorded the fifth-best field goal percentage (94.1%).

100

Second-year wide receiver **GARRETT WILSON** recorded his 100th career reception during Week Four vs. KC (10/1). Having done so in only 21 games, **WILSON** is the fastest player in franchise history to reach 100 receptions.

300

The Jets defense has an active streak of 25 straight games without a 300-yard passer, the second-longest in the NFL (New Orleans - 29 games).

ROBERT WOOD JOHNSON

CHAIRMAN



ROBERT WOOD JOHNSON, a member of the founding family of Johnson & Johnson, has built upon his family's proud legacy of achievement as a successful businessman, compassionate philanthropist, civic leader, and diplomat.

Upon purchasing the team in 2000, Johnson established his commitment to a culture of success built on three key elements: passionate players, supportive fans, and a new stadium. Under his leadership, the Jets entered their new home field, MetLife Stadium, an award-winning venue that has been ranked as the #1 highest grossing venue in the world and recognized by Billboard as stadium of the decade. He also moved the Jets into the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center, a world-class 224,000 square-foot complex that united the entire organization, and provided the perfect facility for everyone—players, coaches, and staff—to continually improve and excel.

In 2017, Johnson was appointed the U.S. Ambassador to the United Kingdom. As ambassador, he strengthened the 'Special Relationship' between the US and the UK, by promoting security and economic prosperity over a range of issues from trade to cyber security policies. While in London, the Ambassador resided in the historic Winfield House, receiving world leaders including Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II and on multiple occasions, President Donald Trump. Ambassador Johnson led the relocation of over 1,000 employees from the Embassy's historic location at Grosvenor Square to a new state of the art headquarters at Nine Elms. When the pandemic struck London, he then directed those employees in the remote, effective, and efficient operation of the Embassy to continue to serve and promote the United States' interests in the United Kingdom. Throughout his tenure at the Embassy, Ambassador Johnson engaged with government leaders and the British people, traveling extensively throughout the United Kingdom and Northern Ireland to hear local concerns and emphasize the 'Special Relationship.'

Beyond the field, Ambassador Johnson's philosophy of a successful team celebrates the crucial role of fans, as well as the significant role the team plays in the community. In this spirit, the team, through the New York Jets Foundation, positively influences the lives of young people in the area by expanding youth football, preventing bullying, and promoting social justice, particularly in disadvantaged communities. Among the Foundation's programs is the launch of the first

Girls High School Flag Football League in New Jersey and first NFL Girls Flag Football League in the United Kingdom.

In 2022, the Jets announced a \$1 million donation to help aid the people of Ukraine, with the money distributed among various organizations, each receiving \$100,000, over the course of a year. For Johnson, the events in Ukraine are personal; his wife, Suzanne, grew up in a Ukrainian neighborhood in New York. Her mother, Marie, was born to Ukrainian immigrant parents while Suzanne's father, Stefan Ircha, was originally from Ternopil, a town outside of Kyiv, and immigrated to the United States after WWII. The Johnson family traveled to Poland last summer to meet with Ukrainian refugees and understand firsthand how the unprovoked invasion has impacted their lives.

Chief among Ambassador Johnson's healthcare initiatives is the support for lupus research. In 1999, he founded the Alliance for Lupus Research (now the Lupus Research Alliance). This was the first organization devoted exclusively to finding new methods to prevent, treat, and ultimately cure lupus. Thanks to his leadership, the organization has dedicated more than \$245 million for research grants and achieved the major milestone of funding research which set the stage for the recent FDA approval of three new treatments for this autoimmune disease.

Over many years, Ambassador Johnson has been active in philanthropy and civic affairs, including past roles as an Honorary Trustee of the Wildlife Conservation Society and a past board member of the National September 11 Memorial & Museum at the World Trade Center and the Peregrine Fund. The Ambassador also served as a Trustee and a Trustee Emeritus of the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, the nation's largest philanthropic organization devoted exclusively to promoting health and healthcare for Americans.

Currently, the Ambassador is an active member of the NFL's Finance Committee, Investment Committee, and Stadium Committee.

CHRISTOPHER W. JOHNSON

VICE CHAIRMAN



CHRISTOPHER WOLD JOHNSON, has overseen pivotal changes within the organization and has been a key part of the New York Jets leadership since 2000.

In his time as Chairman and CEO (2017-2021), Johnson implemented the promotion of team President Hymie Elhai, and hired General Manager Joe Douglas and Head Coach Robert Saleh. In these three, Johnson is confident that he found collaborative leaders who will unify the Jets in their shared goal of building a sustained, winning franchise.

Johnson has developed a strong bond with the players. At a particularly critical time of racial strife, Johnson addressed the team and discussed how they all—Johnson, coaches, executives, and players—could use their powerful platform to influence positive change. He proudly stood with the players and worked with them on initiatives promoting more inclusive social justice. These efforts continue today.

Johnson currently serves as an active member of the NFL's Media Owned and Operated committee.

Johnson is active in various educational endeavors and local philanthropy, supporting a range of initiatives, including charter school construction, youth sports and the encouragement of public discourse and exchange of ideas through debating societies.

HYMIE ELHAI

PRESIDENT



HYMIE ELHAI begins his fifth season as the president of the New York Jets after his appointment in 2019. Now in his 24th year with the team, Elhai's impact is felt throughout the organization.

Under Elhai, who has garnered League and industry respect by his peers during his tenure, the Jets have solidified their business staff's senior leadership, as he oversees all team business operations. Elhai's leadership has helped the Jets reach unprecedented growth through all aspects of the business, including sponsorship, sales and content, leading to several organizational accolades and industry recognition, including a 2023 NJBIZ Best Places to Work honor.

Elhai has remained committed to redefining the culture of the organization through his steady hand of leadership, strategic planning and various organizational initiatives, including the formation of the Social Justice, Diversity, and Inclusion Team (SJDIT) and the expansion of the Jets Women's Organization (JWO).

Playing a key role in the hiring of the football leadership, Elhai worked with Vice Chairman Christopher W. Johnson to hire General Manager Joe Douglas in 2019, and with both Johnson and Douglas to hire Head Coach Robert Saleh in 2021.

Entrusted by Chairman Woody Johnson, the collaboration among Elhai, Douglas and Saleh, forms the foundation that has moved the Jets toward their goal of being a sustained, winning, and innovative franchise on and off the field. Throughout his time as president, Elhai has worked closely with the football staff, providing counsel and support for various organizational-encompassing objectives.

Elhai previously served as the club's senior vice president, business affairs and general counsel, where he was responsible for all legal aspects of the team, including sponsorship, licensing, event, digital media, production and broadcasting agreements, and all employment related matters. Additionally, Elhai helped football administration on all planning initiatives.

A Sports Business Journal Forty Under 40 honoree, Elhai received the Distinguished Alumni Award from Rutgers School of Law at their Alumni Recognition Gala in October 2021. He currently serves as a member of the NFL's CBA player benefits plan committee.

Elhai is a graduate of Rutgers Law School and The Johns Hopkins University.

JOE DOUGLAS

JOE DOUGLAS begins his fifth season as general manager of the New York Jets after being named to the position in June of 2019. Now in his 24th season in the National Football League, Douglas, a three-time Super Bowl winning executive, has put his stamp on the organization.

“You better know what you’re looking for and know what you’re looking at.”

That was advice Douglas recalled from his mentor, former Ravens General Manager Ozzie Newsome, and he has stayed true to his core principle that successful teams are built by people with the right level of commitment, character, and competence, as Douglas looks to develop and sustain to what he characterizes as, “the best culture in sports.”

Since taking the position, Douglas has shown that the search for players never stops. He has added starters and contributors in the NFL Draft and undrafted free agency, signed key free agents, both from the onset and throughout the year, and made steadying in-season moves via waiver claims and trades. Since his appointment, over 97% of the roster was acquired or extended by him, with over 83% coming in the last two years.

For Douglas, roster construction isn’t a quick fix. “Ultimately, I think when you look at successful organizations, no matter what the sport, you don’t see a lot of teams that build long-term success by buying their way out of it,” he said in 2020. “You see the teams, the organizations that have long-term success, they draft well, and they develop their players.”

Not long after his hiring, Douglas began implementing a variety of programs and initiatives throughout the organization all with the intent of having the “best culture in sports” at One Jets Drive. Nearly four years later, Douglas and his staff have seen that plan come to fruition. After the success on defense last season, ranking fourth overall in the NFL, and the early contributions of several young offensive players, the culture that Douglas and Saleh have built has become an attractive destination for

players around the League, including four-time NFL MVP, Super Bowl XLV MVP, and 10X Pro Bowler Aaron Rodgers. Since his hire, Douglas has improved the team’s financial flexibility and added a number of draft assets, both by trading players with expiring contracts and draft-day deals. Through those deals, most notably the acquisition of two first-round picks and a third-round pick for safety Jamal Adams, as well as a second-round pick, fourth-round pick, and sixth-round pick for quarterback Sam Darnold, the Jets have picked in the first two rounds of the 2021, 2022, and 2023 drafts nine times, including six first-round selections.

Entering any draft, the mission for Douglas is always the same – add difference makers that fit within the culture and scheme. Over his four drafts as the general manager (2020-23), he has done just that, using top 45 picks on both sides of the ball, selecting edge Will McDonald IV (No. 15, 2023), center Joe Tippmann (No. 43, 2023), cornerback Sauce Gardner (No. 4, 2022), wide receiver Garrett Wilson (No. 10, 2022), edge Jermaine Johnson (No. 26, 2022), running back Breece Hall (No. 36, 2022), quarterback Zach Wilson (No. 2, 2021), Alijah Vera-Tucker (No. 14, 2021), and tackle Mekhi Becton (No. 11, 2020), while showing mobility in each draft to target key players via moving up, first with Alijah Vera-Tucker and again in 2022 with Jermaine Johnson and Breece Hall.

Douglas has added starters and depth throughout the draft, highlighted by the selection of the NFL’s 2022 Defensive and Offensive Rookies of the Year in first-team All-Pro cornerback Sauce Gardner and wide receiver Garrett Wilson. With both Gardner and Wilson’s recognitions, the Jets became just the third team in NFL history to win both awards in the same season. Additionally, Douglas saw 2022 second-round rookie running back Breece Hall become the team’s leading rusher last year after averaging 5.8 yards a carry while establishing himself as a playmaker within the League.

Despite the added wrinkle that his first draft as general manager (2020) was also the NFL's first ever virtual draft because of the COVID-19 global pandemic, he showed no signs of being a rookie, despite drafting from his home, the first-time G.M. turned eight draft picks and Leonard Williams' expiring contract into 13 players, while also adding key undrafted free agents.

As with the draft picks, matching character and talent has shown to be key when Douglas has used free agency to add to the roster. Over the last two offseasons (2022-23), the Jets added multiple veterans with Super Bowl experience as wide receiver Mecole Hardman Jr., cornerback D.J. Reed, defensive lineman Solomon Thomas, Pro Bowl guard Laken Tomlinson, tight end C.J. Uzomah, and safety Jordan Whitehead have all played in one of the last four Super Bowls.

Prior to the start of training camp (2023), Douglas further exemplified his commitment to players who fit his vision by extending All-Pro and Pro Bowl defensive lineman Quinnen Williams to a four-year contract extension.

Since becoming General Manager in 2019, Douglas has overseen a roster that fielded four players who earned First Team All-Pro recognition, an Offensive and Defensive Rookie of the Year, and seven Pro Bowlers.

Whether through free agency, the draft, or League trades, Douglas has remained committed to exploring every avenue for ways to improve the roster. At his end of year press conference, Douglas shared, "As it pertains to upgrading the roster, we're going to look at every avenue, every position, every different way we can to upgrade the team." Douglas and his staff did just that this offseason, trading for Rodgers.

Among the priorities for Douglas has been transforming both the lines – offensive and defensive – into deep and talented units. Offensively, in addition to adding first and second round picks through the draft – Becton, Vera-Tucker, and Tippmann – has signed free agents, including Pro Bowlers Duane Brown and Tomlinson and veterans Connor McGovern and Wes Schweitzer. On the defensive side, draft picks Johnson and McDonald, along with free agent signings Carl Lawson, Quinton Jefferson, Thomas, Al Woods, have teamed with All-Pro Quinnen Williams to form a strength upfront on the Jets defense.

Throughout his time in the League, Douglas has put in the work and paid his dues, working as both a pro and college scout in Baltimore, Chicago, and Philadelphia, and helping shape three different Super Bowl winning rosters. Before joining the Jets, he spent the previous three seasons as the vice president of player personnel with the Eagles. In Philadelphia, he was a key component in acquiring many of the players that helped win Super Bowl LII, including the game's MVP, quarterback Nick Foles.

Using every avenue to help improve the team, Douglas was part of a front office that acquired the players who scored all but two of the team's postseason touchdowns, including four of the five scores in the Super Bowl. A trio of 2017 unrestricted free agent signings - LeGarrette Blount, Foles and Alshon Jeffery – as well as a pair of street free agents – Patrick Robinson and Torrey Smith – all contributed scores on the team's title run. The Eagles' leading receiver in the Super Bowl, running back Corey Clement, was signed as an undrafted free agent, while the team's leading rusher in the game, running back Jay Ajayi, joined the club as a midseason-trade acquisition.

Prior to joining the Eagles, Douglas spent a season as the director of college scouting for Chicago (2015).

Entering the NFL as a player personnel assistant (2000) the year Baltimore won Super Bowl XXXV, Douglas ascended within the Ravens organization, holding various posts in the club's scouting department, serving as a national scout (2012-15), Southeast area scout (2009-11), East Coast area scout (2008) and Northeast area scout (2003-07), helping add a number of prominent players via the draft, including the Super Bowl XLVII MVP, Flacco, as well as a number of Pro Bowl players – Ben Grubbs, C.J. Mosley, Justin Tucker and Marshal Yanda.

An All-Atlantic 10 selection, Douglas started 45-consecutive games at tackle for the University of Richmond. Following his collegiate playing career, he transitioned into a volunteer assistant coach role with the Spiders in 1999.

As an offensive and defensive lineman at Mechanicsville (VA) HS, formerly Lee-Davis, Douglas was recognized as a two-time all-state honoree.

He and his wife, Shannon, have two daughters, Addison and Leighton, and a son, Thomas.

ROBERT SALEH (*pronounced: SAH-luh*) was named the head coach of the New York Jets on January 19, 2021. With Saleh and General Manager Joe Douglas, Chairman Robert Wood Johnson envisioned a synergy to help bring the franchise to their ultimate goal.

"I think you have a synergy of people," Johnson said during the 2022 offseason. "Those two people particularly are on absolutely the same page. That's a positive. Joe knows exactly what Robert needs at every position and they have a long list and criteria that they're looking at."

"He is a collaborative leader," Vice Chairman Christopher W. Johnson said in a statement after Saleh's hiring. "I know he will develop the players on our roster, hold them accountable, and put them in a position to succeed. Most importantly, I believe they will connect with him."

Connecting with players has been a constant under Saleh. "They need a personal investment made into them so they can develop into being great football players," he said after being hired. "They want to be rewarded for what they've gone through, and so players should expect that from their coaches, and from the organization. It is an absolute joy to see them hit the pinnacle of their career, where they get rewarded for it. To give that and understand that part is just being human to me."

"All Gas, No Brake," for Saleh, it is a mindset that goes beyond the team's practice and preparation to everything they do, on and off the field. More than just the players and coaches, it is about the entire organization stepping on the gas and getting better each and every day.

This past season (2022), Saleh oversaw a team that increased their total by three wins, the sixth largest in the league. Despite using three different starting quarterbacks, they improved in nearly every offensive category. After finishing last in the League in total defense in 2021, Saleh led a defensive unit that finished fourth overall in the NFL. His defenses have now ranked in the top five in three of the last four seasons, including becoming one of just five since 2000 to finish in the top five, a season after ranking 32nd.

While the team found success as a whole this past season, Saleh also helped his players reach multiple individual accolades, including four Pro Bowl selections, two First-Team All-Pro honors, one Second-Team All-Pro honor and both Offensive and Defensive Rookie of the Year selections in wide receiver Garrett Wilson and cornerback Sauce Gardner - becoming one of only three teams in NFL history to do so.

Since becoming head coach, Saleh's group has seen a League-high 9,808 snaps by rookies, including 117 starts, the third-most in the NFL over that span. In his first season with the Jets (2021), Saleh coached the League's youngest roster with an opening day age of 25.13. They became only the second team since the merger led by rookies in passing yards, rushing yards and receiving yards that season and while the results weren't always there, the scars and the experience gained through them were.

"These are all scars that they are getting," Saleh said during his first season. "They're learning. You have to learn not to lose first. Then, once you learn how not to lose, you figure out how to win. Then, once you learn how to win, you have to learn how to close games."

"That's a hard thing for a coaching staff to do with so many young players, I think we all realize that," Douglas said after the 2021

season. “No one dipped their toe in the water, they cannonballed in, they attacked it, the entire staff developed these young players and the whole plan for that is to benefit the future. So, now we have a group of young players that have played a lot of snaps, a lot of quality NFL snaps. When they’re called on to help us again, they’re going to be ready. What Coach and his staff did, I can’t say enough positive things about that.”

As the season progressed, the young roster did just that. Seven of the final eight games were within a score in the fourth quarter, compared to four of the first nine games. Playing those close games against six teams that finished with winning records, including three playoff teams, the team also improved their numbers on defense in points per game, yards per play, pass yards per attempt and yards per rush over the final seven weeks. On offense, they averaged 5.19 yards per carry over the final eight weeks, the second best in the League.

Before joining the Jets, Saleh spent four seasons as the defensive coordinator with San Francisco. Since 2017, his group ranked third in the League in passing yards allowed (211.4), holding opposing quarterbacks to the eighth lowest completion percentage (62.9%), while producing Pro Bowl players at linebacker (Fred Warner), cornerback (Richard Sherman), and defensive line (Nick Bosa & DeForest Buckner) - Bosa was also selected as the 2019 Defensive Player of the Year by the Associated Press.

The last two seasons under Saleh, the 49ers defense led the League in passing defense (188.6), ranking in the top 10 in passer rating allowed (85.8), completion percentage allowed (62.4%), tackles for loss (154) and defensive touchdowns (six), while also helping San Francisco advance to Super Bowl LIV.

In his final season with the 49ers (2020), Saleh’s unit still finished fifth in the League in total defense and fourth in passing defense, despite an injury-plagued season, getting career years from cornerback Jason Verrett, who started 13 games after playing in just six total the previous four seasons and defensive lineman Kerry Hyder, who started 14 games after logging more than 450 snaps in a season just once in his five previous years in the League. Hyder finished the season as one of just 11 defensive linemen with at least 8.0 sacks, 15 quarterback hits and 40 total tackles.

A key part of the team’s Super Bowl LIV run (2019), Saleh’s defense finished second in total defense, first in passing defense and third in third-down defense, while producing 48 sacks (tied for the fifth most in the League), and 28 takeaways (the sixth most). The San Francisco defensive line saw four players – Arik Armstead (10.0), Bosa (9.0), Buckner (7.5), and Dee Ford (6.5) – all produce at least 6.5 sacks, the only team in the NFL to have four-or-more players with 6.5-or-more sacks that season. In the postseason, the defense allowed just over 300 yards per game, holding opponents to just 31.4% on third down and producing seven total takeaways, including two interceptions of League MVP Patrick Mahomes in the Super Bowl, the only game Mahomes had more than one interception that season.

In Saleh’s second season with the 49ers (2018), the defense was one of six to allow fewer net yards per game, rushing yards per game and passing yards per game than they did the previous season. In 2017, his first as a coordinator, San Francisco allowed .62 yards fewer per play, the third best improvement in the League. Over the final eight weeks, they ranked second

in the League in rushing yards allowed and fourth in yards per carry.

Coaching linebackers for three seasons in Jacksonville, Saleh oversaw a linebacker group that included Paul Posluszny and Telvin Smith as the pair each finished in the top five in the League in total tackles between 2015-16 (according to Radar360). The team’s linebackers were also a key part of a Jaguars defense that ranked fifth in passing defense and sixth in opponent rushing average in 2016, and fifth in rushing average allowed in 2015.

Prior to his time in Jacksonville, Saleh spent three seasons in Seattle as a defensive quality control coach, responsible for assisting the defensive staff with day-to-day duties with a focus on the linebackers, while learning an important lesson from Head Coach Pete Carroll:

“The biggest influence I took from Coach Carroll is from a philosophy standpoint,” Saleh said in 2017. “Understanding who you are as a person. Understanding what’s important to you as a person. And, how to apply it to the message that you’re trying to deliver. Understanding that everybody has a style and that every style is the right style provided you apply it in the right way. So, just from a philosophy standpoint, speaking to people, handling people is where I have my greatest growth from Coach Carroll.”

In those three seasons, he helped develop linebackers Bobby Wagner (2012 second-round pick) and K.J. Wright (2011 fourth-round pick) as the two became future Pro Bowl selections. A part of the Seahawks Super Bowl XLVIII winning staff, another of the team’s linebackers, seventh-round pick Malcolm Smith, earned MVP honors after Smith registered nine tackles, a fumble recovery and a 69-yard interception returned for a touchdown.

Saleh began his NFL coaching career in Houston as a coaching intern (2005), becoming a defensive assistant (2006-08) and ultimately the linebackers coach (2009-10). Linebackers DeMeco Ryans (2006) and Brain Cushing (2009) each earned Associated Press Defensive Rookie of the Year honors while Saleh was there and were both selected to the Pro Bowl in 2009. That season, the tandem finished in the top 10 in the League in total tackles (according to Radar360).

Before his start as an NFL coach, Saleh spent four seasons coaching college football at Georgia (2005), Central Michigan (2004), beginning his coaching career at Michigan State (2002) as an offensive assistant/tight ends coach before becoming a defensive assistant/defensive line the following season.

A native of Dearborn, MI, Saleh attended Northern Michigan University where he started for four years at tight end. He earned his finance degree, beginning a career as a credit analyst before getting into coaching.

Saleh and his wife, Sanaa, have seven children, sons, Adam, Zane, Michael, Sam, and Jacob, and daughters, Mila and Ella. Born to Lebanese parents, Sam and Fatin, he is considered one of three Arab-American head coaches in NFL history and believed to be the first Muslim-American head coach.



BRANT BOYER returns for his eighth season as the special teams coordinator of the New York Jets after initially joining the team in 2016. Under three different head coaches in his time with the Jets, Boyer has transformed the special teams unit into one of the best in the League.

Roster change has been a constant for Boyer, but despite the changes, his group has posted top 10 rankings in total touchdowns (seven – scoring via punt return, kickoff return and via fumble recovery), blocked punts (six), kickoff return average (23.1), punt return average (8.91), and opponent kickoff return average (21.3) since being named special teams coordinator in 2016.

This past season (2022), Boyer’s unit finished top five in the NFL in punt return average (11.43) for the second consecutive year. Additionally, the Jets were the only team in the NFL that year to record three blocked kicks and a successful onside kick, one of 17 teams in the League with a recovery since 2000. While the unit found success as a whole, Boyer also helped his players reach individual milestones throughout the year.

After recording a single-season best 14 special teams tackles, team captain Justin Hardee was selected to his first Pro Bowl, becoming just the sixth Jets special teamer to be selected to the Pro Bowl since 1970 and the only core special teamer. Of the six, three have come during Boyer’s tenure with all three being their first career selection. Additionally, Boyer has also helped two players earn First-Team All-Pro recognition in both returners Andre Roberts (2018) and Braxton Berrios (2021).

Under Boyer’s lead, kicker Greg Zuerlein recorded three of the four longest field goals in franchise history and became one of four Jets to convert multiple field goals of 55+ yards as a Jet. Zuerlein also became one of just five kickers in the NFL to convert a 60+ yard field goal.

NATHANIEL HACKETT enters his first year with the New York Jets, after being named offensive coordinator on January 26, 2023.

Hackett brings 15 years of NFL coaching experience to the team, most recently serving as the Head Coach of the Denver Broncos (2022). Prior to his stint as head coach, Hackett spent eight of the last 10 years as an offensive coordinator, most recently for the Green Bay Packers (2019-21), after leading the Jacksonville Jaguars (2016-18) and Buffalo Bills (2013-14) offenses.

He had the opportunity because of his life’s work as an offensive coordinator and all the different things that he’s done in this League and how much respect he’s garnered throughout the League, and all his different spots, all the people, all the players he’s developed and the people that he’s worked with.

JEFF ULBRICH returns for his third season as the defensive coordinator after joining the New York Jets as part of Robert Saleh's first staff in 2021. Ulbrich, a 10-year NFL veteran linebacker, begins his 14th season as a coach, 11th at the NFL level.

This past season (2022), Ulbrich led a defensive unit that finished fourth overall in the NFL in total defense, allowing 311.1 yards per game, a significant improvement from their 32nd rank and 397.6 average in 2021. Since 2000, the Jets are one of just five teams to finish in the top five in total defense a season after ranking last in the League.

Ulbrich's defense allowed an average of just 18.6 points per game in 2022, the fourth best in the NFL and became the only team in the League to not allow a 300-yard passer. Additionally, the unit only allowed six players to hit 100 rushing or receiving yards in a game, tied for the best in the NFL. Ulbrich saw his team finish top five in the NFL in almost all defensive categories this past season.

Much of the unit's 2022 success was attributed to individual bests that were accomplished throughout the year. Ulbrich saw three key defensive players selected to the Pro Bowl, two first-team and second-team All-Pro selections, a second-team All-Pro honor and a Defensive Rookie of the Year.

Defensive lineman and 2022 Curtis Martin Team MVP Quinnen Williams recorded a career year, registering a single-season best 12.0 sacks, tied for the seventh most in a season by a Jet in franchise history. Rookie cornerback Sauce Gardner finished first in the NFL in passes defended (20) and became the only rookie in the League to produce at least one pass defended in each of his first seven games. Veteran linebacker and team captain C.J. Mosley became one of only four players in the NFL last season to record 12 games with nine+ tackles, while his 158 tackles on the year marked his sixth season registering at least 100+ tackles, one of only five active players to do so.

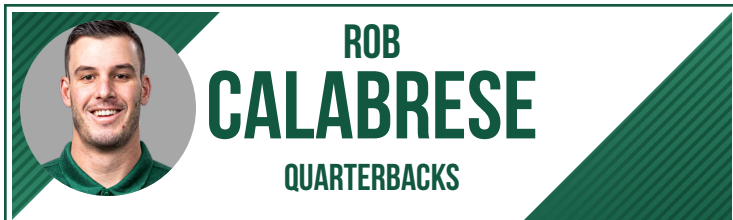

ROB CALABRESE returns for his third season as the quarterbacks coach, after initially joining the New York Jets as part of Robert Saleh's first staff in 2021. For Calabrese, he continues his work with the Jets quarterbacks after two seasons in Denver.

Under Calabrese's lead this past season (2022), the Jets saw three different quarterbacks record at least two games of 300+ passing yards, becoming the only team in the NFL to do so. Quarterback Mike White became just the fifth player in NFL history to record 350+ passing yards in at least two of their first five career starts, after doing so at Minnesota (12/04/22) and vs. Cincinnati (10/31/21). Additionally, Calabrese helped quarterback Joe Flacco become the first player with two passing touchdowns in the final 2:00 of a fourth quarter during the team's victory at Cleveland (09/18/22), while second-year quarterback Zach Wilson finished the season top 10 in the NFL in a variety of fourth quarter statistics.

TODD DOWNING begins his first season with the Jets as passing game coordinator, bringing 24 years of coaching experience to the team. Downing recently served as offensive coordinator for the Titans (2021-22), after initially joining the club as a tight ends coach (2019).

TAYLOR EMBREE returns for his third season as the running back coach, after initially joining the New York Jets as part of Robert Saleh's first staff in 2021. For Embree, this is his seventh NFL season and third as a position coach.

In his second season with the Jets (2022), Embree oversaw a group that saw five different backs record at least 25 carries, all recording at least one explosive play. Despite suffering a season-ending injury during Week Seven, rookie Breece Hall led the group in rushing yards (463) and yards per rush (5.8). Additionally, Hall became one of just two rookies in the NFL to record at least 275 rushing yards and 213 receiving yards in their first five games since 1970. Although only appearing in six games this season, Hall was the only player to record at least 100 receiving yards and 95 rushing yards in a game, after doing so at Miami (10/09/22). He became one of just five players in the last decade to do so.
