# LOS ANGELES CHARGERS vs. CHICAGO BEARS

#### **BEAT BEARS IN PRIMETIME**

The Los Angeles Chargers defeated the Chicago Bears on Sunday Night Football, 30-13. WR Keenan Allen, S Derwin James Jr., and DL Sebastian Joseph-Day were the game captains for the Chargers. The Bolts won the toss and deferred to the second half.

On offense, the Bolts converted seven-of-13 attempts on third down and did not allow a sack in the passing game. QB Justin Herbert completed 31 passes on 40 attempts (77.5 pct.) for 298 yards and three touchdowns with zero interceptions (122.7 rating). It was the fourth-best completion percentage in a Sunday night game in NFL history among players with 40 attempts and zero interceptions. He completed passes to eight different receivers.

RB Austin Ekeler totaled 123 yards from scrimmage (94 receiving, 29 rushing) and caught the 30th touchdown of his career. Herbert's second passing score went to WR Simi Fehoko, who registered his first career touchdown catch on the play, while his third was to **TE Donald Parham Jr.**, who set a career high with his fourth of the season. In the first quarter, Herbert completed all 11 passes for 120 yards and two touchdowns with zero interceptions (151.7 rating), the most completions in a single first quarter with zero incompletions by any Chargers QB in at least the last 30 years.

Defensively, Los Angeles picked off two passes and forced three turnovers on downs, holding Chicago to one fourth-down conversions on four attempts. LB Eric Kendricks led the defense with 10 tackles (nine solo), while OLB Joey Bosa recorded his fourth sack of the season. S Derwin James Jr., and DB Ja'Sir Taylor recorded the interceptions, with Taylor's being the first of his career. The unit broke up seven passes, including a pair from **CB Asante Samuel Jr.** 

**K Cameron Dicker** made all three field goals and all three PATs on the night, setting a single-game career high with 12 points scored.

# THE YOUNGES

RB Austin Ekeler led the team with 94 receiving yards and a touchdown on seven catches (13.4 avg.). He reached 30 career receiving touchdowns on his 39-yard catch-and-run in the first quarter. At 28 years, 265 days old on Sunday, Ekeler became the youngest running back to reach 30 touchdown catches.

He also is now the only running back in the Super Bowl era (since 1966) to have 30 receiving scores with the same team and is just one of seven players in NFL history to have 30 touchdowns rushing and 30 touchdown catches in a career.

# HERBERT EFFICIENT ON SUNDAY NIGHTS

QB Justin Herbert completed his first 15 passes of the game, finishing with 298 yards and three touchdowns with zero interceptions on 31-of-40 passing (77.5 pct.) to register a 122.7 passer rating. Herbert's completion percentage was the fourthhighest in a Sunday night contest in NFL history among players with at least 40 passing attempts and zero interceptions.
