## FIRST AND 10

• The Chicago Bears hit the road this week when they travel to Los Angeles for a prime time meeting against the Chargers on Oct. 29. Kickoff inside SoFi Stadium is scheduled for 7:20 p.m. CT.

• The Bears and Chargers will meet for 14th all-time meeting in a series that dates back to the 1970 NFL season. The Bears hold a slight edge in the series at 7-6.

• Chicago has the upper hand as of late, winning two of the last three meetings. Chicago also has wins in three of the past four road contests dating back to 1993. Los Angeles holds the overall record when playing on the West Coast with a 3-4 mark.

• The two teams last met in Week 8 of the 2019 regular season, an eventual 17-16 win for the Chargers at Soldier Field. The last meeting on the West Coast came in 2015 when the Bears earned a 22-19 Week 9 victory at Qualcomm Stadium in San Diego.

• Sunday's contest will mark the fourth October meeting between the two clubs while Chicago has a 1-2 record in the previous three matchups. All three of the previous October meetings vs. Los Angeles have taken place in Chicago.

• During his time as an assistant coach, Bears head coach Matt Eberflus faced Los Angeles four times, holding an 0-4 record in those games after going 0-1 as a line-backers coach with the Cleveland Browns (2009-10), 0-2 in the same role with the Dallas Cowboys (2011-17) and 0-1 as a defensive coordinator with the Indianapolis Colts (2018-21).

• Sunday's contest will mark the fourth of four AFC West matchups on the season. The Bears previously faced Kansas City in Week 3, Denver in Week 4 and Las Vegas in Week 7. The Bears last faced the AFC West in 2019, going 1-3 with a win at Denver.

• Chicago's 2023 opening day lineup against Green Bay on Sept. 10, featured 10 starters not on the '22 roster (3 offense; 7 defense). Overall, Chicago enters the 2023 NFL season with 11 players on the active roster from When Poles was hired as the club's GM.

• The 2023 season features new faces on both the offensive and defensive side of the ball, acquiring talent through the draft, trades and free agency. Notable additions on the defensive side include LBs Tremaine Edmunds and T.J. Edwards along with DEs DeMarcus Walker and Yannick Ngakoue. Offensively, the Bears added pass-catchers in wide receiver DJ Moore and tight end Robert Tonyan along with offensive line additions in Nate Davis and first-round draft pick, Darnell Wright.

• The Bears hit the road next week when they travel to New Orleans for a meeting against the Saints on Nov. 5. Kickoff inside the Caesars Superdome is scheduled for Noon. CT.

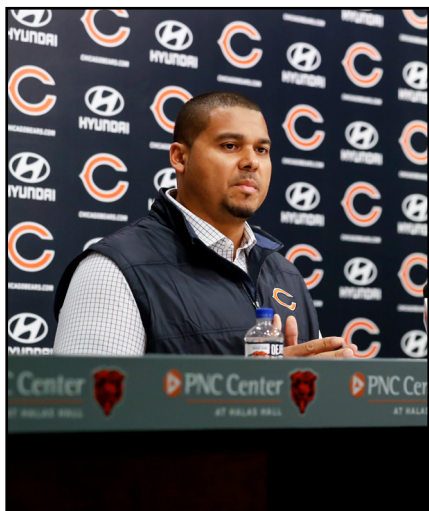

- The Bears are underway in year two of the Matt Eberflus and general manager **RYAN POLES'** era.
- Despite finishing the 2022 season with a 3-14 record, the Bears saw several bright spots throughout the roster which continue to serve as building blocks in all three phases of offense, defense and special teams.
- Collectively, the 2022 Bears finished the season with one of the youngest on-field rosters in the NFL, leading the league with first-year snaps at 6,721, almost 1,000 snaps more than second-place Seattle's 5,898.
- Defensively in 2022, the Bears finished the season ranking among the best in the league in several categories: completions (323, 6th), receiving touchdowns allowed (22, T-11th) and interception return yards (201, 9th), to name a few.
- Offensively, under new offensive coordinator **LUKE GETSY** in 2022, the Bears led all teams in rushing with 3,014 rushing yards on the year. They set a franchise record in doing so, passing the club's previous mark set in 1984 (2,974 rushing yards). The last time the Bears led the NFL in rushing yards was the 1986 season when they totaled 2,700 yards on the season.
- Looking to the special teams unit, the club finished the 2022 season under first-year special teams coordinator **RICHARD HIGHTOWER** and saw Cairo Santos open the season with 14 consecutive makes and finished the year connecting on 21-of-23 attempts (91.3%).

**Bears GM Ryan Poles**

- Chicago finished the 2022 season with several new faces on the roster following three trades made by Bears general manager Ryan Poles, beginning on Oct. 26, in addition to several free agent signings and waiver claims throughout the season.
- The first trade sent veteran defensive end Robert Quinn to the Philadelphia Eagles on Oct. 26, in exchange for a 2023 fourth-round pick.
- Poles later dealt Bears former 2018 first-round pick (No. 8 overall), linebacker Roquan Smith, to the Baltimore Ravens in exchange for a 2023 second-round pick, a 2023 fifth-round pick and veteran linebacker A.J. Klein.
- His final trade came on Nov. 1, acquiring former Pittsburgh wide receiver Chase Claypool in exchange for a 2023 second-round draft pick.
- Poles' trades at the time marked the third, fourth and fifth trades he'd made since he was named General Manager on Jan. 25, 2022. He also dealt LB Khalil Mack to the Los Angeles Chargers for a 2022 second-round pick and acquired wide receiver N'Keal Harry by sending a 2024 seventh-round pick to New England.
- With the Bears acquiring a second-round pick for Roquan Smith, a fourth-round pick from the Eagles in exchange for defensive end Robert Quinn and later trading a second-round pick for Chase Claypool, they held seven picks entering the 2023 draft.
- Holding the No. 1 pick entering the 2023 Draft, Poles struck a deal with the Carolina Panthers on March 15,

which brought in wide receiver **DJ MOORE** in addition to the 2023 No. 9 overall selection, the 2023 61st overall pick, a 2024 first-round selection and a 2025 second-round selection.

- The roster additions continued in free agency. On March 15-16, the Bears acquired several new faces: LBs **TREMAINE EDMUNDS** and **T.J. EDWARDS**, DE **DEMARCUS WALKER**, OL **NATE DAVIS**, RBs **TRAVIS HOMER** and **D'ONTA FOREMAN**, TE **ROBERT TONYAN** and DL **ANDREW BILLINGS**.
- Poles' most recent splash in free agency came late in the offseason, signing both DE **YANNICK NGAKOUE** and TE **MARCEDES LEWIS** to deals within a 24-hour period on August 4.
- Looking to 2023, the Bears roster is comprised of new, young talent as the team has transformed from one of the oldest rosters in the NFL at the end of the 2021 season, to one of the youngest teams in the NFL. The Bears led all teams in terms of total snaps from first-year players in 2022 (6,721).
- Chicago's 2023 opening day lineup featured 10 starters not on the '22 roster (3 offense; 7 defense).
- Chicago opened the 2023 NFL season with 11 players that were on the active roster before Poles was hired as the club's GM.
- In Chicago's Week 1 matchup versus San Francisco in 2022, Eberflus and the Bears played 11 rookies. It was the most rookie debuts by any NFL roster in Week 1 (2022) and the most by a Bears team dating back to Week 1 of the 1988 season when they played 11 rookies on Sept. 4, vs. Miami.

- Chicago's starting lineup in Week 1 versus San Francisco featured eight new starters (offense: 3, defense: 5). Three of the eight starters were rookie draft picks and five were signed in free agency.
- Dating back to the start of the 1991 NFL season, Bears offensive lineman **BRAXTON JONES** became just the sixth offensive lineman drafted in the fifth round or later to start a game at left tackle for an NFL team in Week 1 of his rookie season. He joined Russell Freeman (DEN, 1992), Everett Lindsay (MIN, 1993), Shar Pourdaneh (WAS, 1996), Mike Harris (SD, 2012) and Desmond Harrison (CLE, 2018) among the list.

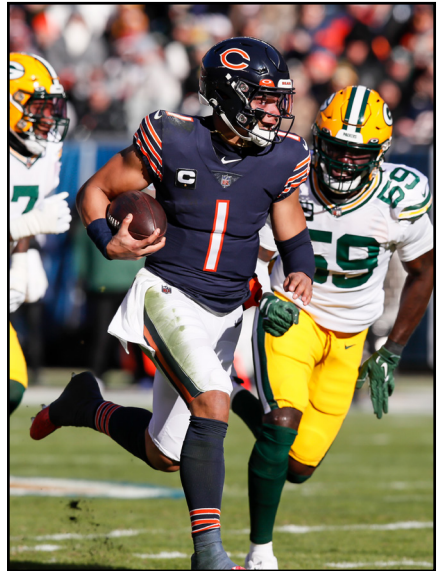
### QB Justin Fields

- Quarterback **JUSTIN FIELDS** has appeared in six games on the season, completing 100-of-162 passes for 1,201 yards with 11 touchdowns and a passer rating of 91.6.
- Prior to being sidelined due to injury, Fields finished Week 6 as one of the NFL's top deep ball threats while also possessing the ability to make plays with his legs.
- In terms of 20+ yard touchdown passes in Weeks 1-6, Fields ranked second among all NFL passers with six, trailing only Detroit's Jared Goff.
- Fields' 21 passes of 20+ yards in Weeks 1-6 ranked tied for sixth among all passers and fourth among NFC quarterbacks.
- Fields led the league in Weeks 1-6 in passing touchdowns with 21+ air yards (5) while holding the fifth-best passer rating on all attempts of 21+ air yards (130.1).
- Through the first six weeks of the season, Fields ranked second among all NFL passers in TD% (6.8), tied for fifth in passing touchdowns (11) and ranked third in rushing yards (237).
- In his most recent game against Minnesota, before exiting the game due to injury, he reached 1,800 rushing yards for his career in the third quarter. Fields' 1,380 rushing yards since the start of the 2022 season is the top mark among all quarterbacks.
- Fields strung together back-to-back games with passer ratings above 125.0 in Weeks 4-5. In Week 5 he logged a 125.3 passer rating against the Washington Commanders after posting a career-high rating of 132.7 in Week 4 against the Denver Broncos.

- Against Washington, Fields completed 15-of-29 passes for 282 yards with four touchdowns and no interceptions (125.3 rating). He became the second Bears quarterback to pass for 4+ touchdowns in consecutive games (Jay Cutler, Weeks 16-17 in 2009).
- Fields' first quarter passing totals (145 yards) topped his career high in first quarter passing, upping the previous mark of 93 yards vs. Detroit in Week 4 of the 2021 season.
- He completed three first-half touchdown passes for the second-straight week, becoming the first Bears quarterback in franchise history to do so. Josh Allen and Jared Goff are the only other NFL quarterbacks to pass for three first half touchdowns in 2023.
- Fields surpassed 5,000 career passing yards midway through the first quarter at Washington. In doing so, he joined Atlanta's Michael Vick, Baltimore's Lamar Jackson and Philadelphia's Jalen Hurts to become just the fourth quarterback since the 1970 NFL merger to pass for 5,000 yards and rush for 1,500 in their first 30 NFL starts.
- Fields' 11 touchdown passes in Weeks 1-6 were tied for the second-highest total among all NFC quarterbacks along with Detroit's Jared Goff while trailing Minnesota's Kirk Cousins (14).
- Dating back to the start of the 1970 NFL season, from Weeks 1-5, Fields' 95.4 passer rating was the seventh-highest total by a Bears quarterback, his 11 touchdown passes ranked second overall (J. Cutler - 12, 2014), his 7.2 TD% ranked second overall (J. McMahon - 8.1, 1985) and his 191 rushing yards ranked fifth.
- In his Week 4 outing against the Denver Broncos, Fields completed 28-of-35 passes for 335 yards and four touchdowns while finishing the game with a 132.7 passer rating.
- Fields finished the game with (then) career-high numbers in completions (28), completion % (80.0, T-1st), passing yards (335), passing touchdowns (4) and overall passer rating (132.7).
- Fields completed 16-of-17 passes for 231 yards and three touchdowns in the first half alone against Denver. It was the fifth passing performance by a Bears quarterback of 230+ yards in the first half since the start of the 2000 season.
- Per @ESPNStatsInfo, since 2000, Fields' 16 consecutive completions to start the game were the most consecutive completions by any Bears quarterback.
- Fields' 158.3 first-half passer rating was the highest total through the first half of his career. It was the fourth perfect passer rating by a Bears quarterback in a first half since the start of the 2000 season.
- Fields' 16-of-17 completions in the first half were good for a 94.1 completion percentage. Dating back to the start of the 1970 AFL-NFL merger, it was the highest first-half completion percentage by a Bears quarterback and the T-12th highest among all NFL passers.

- Fields eclipsed 40 total touchdowns and 30 passing touchdowns for his career with three in the first half against Denver (two touchdown passes to tight end Cole Kmet and one to wide receiver DJ Moore).
- Prior to an early exit in Week 6, Fields had at least one passing touchdown in all five of Chicago's contests in 2023 and had thrown a TD pass in eight consecutive games dating back to Week 15 of the 2022 season.
- Against the Chiefs in Week 3, Fields reached 400 career completions in the fourth quarter. He became the fifth Bears quarterback to reach 400 career completions in his first 30 games.
- Against Tampa Bay in Week 2, Fields finished the afternoon completing 16-of-29 passes for 211 yards and a touchdown while finding the endzone on a one-yard rush. It capped off Chicago's opening drive going six plays and 75-yards. The score marked Fields' 11th career rush TD after finding the endzone eight times in 2022 and twice as a rookie in 2021.
- Against Green Bay in Week 1, Fields picked up where he left off in 2022, leading all Bears rushers with 59 yards on the afternoon. With the performance, he surpassed former Bears QB Jim Harbaugh (1,609) for second on the Bears All-Time QB Rushing List. Fields (1,754) now only sits behind Bobby Douglass (2,470). Fields also completed 10 passes in the first half for 96 yards, the sixth-highest first-half passing total in his career.
- Fields connected with wide receiver Darnell Mooney for a 20-yard touchdown pass to cap off a six-play, 65-yard drive with 1:05 left in the third quarter against Green Bay. It marked Fields' 26th career touchdown pass along with Mooney's 11th career receiving touchdown.
- In 2022, Fields became the third quarterback in NFL history to rush for 1,000+ yards in a single season. With 95 yards rushing against the Philadelphia Eagles on Dec. 18, Fields joined Baltimore's Lamar Jackson and 4x Pro Bowl QB Michael Vick among the club of passers to rush for 1,000+ yards in a season. Jackson did so twice in his career with 1,206 yards in 2019 and 1,005 in 2020. Vick accomplished the feat in 2006 with 1,039 yards. Fields finished the 2022 season with 1,143 yards.
- In the first half against Philadelphia in Week 15 last season, Fields rushed for 81 yards, helping him surpass a Bears single-season rushing record by a quarterback, passing Bobby Douglass' 1972 season with 968 yards rushing. Fields finished the game with 95 yards rushing and an even 1,000 yards on the season.
- The 95-yard rushing performance marked Fields' fifth consecutive game with 70+ rushing yards, which was the longest streak by any QB since at least 1950, per NFL Research.

- Fields finished 14-of-21 passing with 152 yards and two touchdowns. He finished with a passer rating of 119.5, the (then) second-highest passer rating he'd recorded in a single game in his career.
- Against Detroit in Week 17, Fields finished the first quarter alone with 105 rushing yards. It was the most rushing yards by any Bears player since the start of the 1991 season. The only other Bears player to rush for 100+ yards in the first quarter of a game since 1991 was Matt Forte, doing so on Oct. 10, 2010, at Carolina (101 yards). Fields also joined Philadelphia's Jalen Hurts as the only other quarterback in the NFL to rush for 100+ in a single quarter since 1991. Hurts rushed for 103 yards earlier this season against Green Bay.
- The 100-yard outing marked the fourth such performance of Fields' career. He became one of four quarterbacks since the start of the 1970 season to log 4+ 100-yard rushing performances, joining Lamar Jackson (12), Michael Vick (10) and Russell Wilson (4).
- Per ESPN Stats & Info: Fields had more 60-yard rushes in 2022 (3) than every other QB has combined in the last 5 seasons.
- Per @EliasSports, Fields' 105 rushing yards were the most by any QB in a quarter in the last 45 seasons.
- Fields, who was sidelined against the Jets in Week 12, rushed for a combined 156 yards in his previous two outings against the Falcons and Packers. Including Week 15 vs. Philadelphia, Fields extended a streak of rushing for 60+ yards to eight games. Fields had rushed for 60+ yards in nine of his past 13 outings.

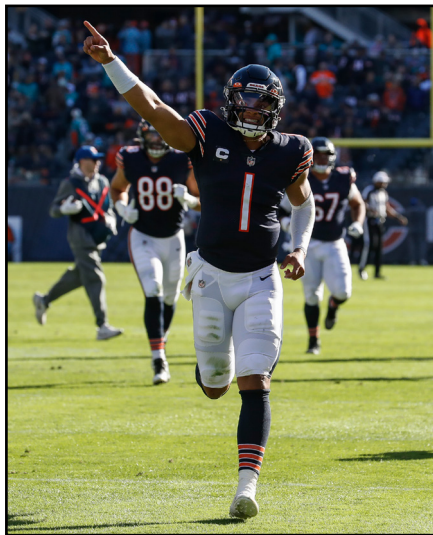
- Against the Packers in Week 13, Fields logged a 55-yard rushing touchdown. It was his third rushing touchdown of 50+ yards on the season. Fields became the first quarterback in NFL history to log three such touchdowns in a career.
- Fields also completed a 56-yard pass to wideout Equanimeous St. Brown against Green Bay. With the completion and the rush above 50+ yards, Fields became the fourth player in NFL history to record both a 50-yard passing touchdown and 50-yard rushing touchdown in the same game, joining Ace Parker, Cam Newton, and Lamar Jackson.
- Against Atlanta in Week 11, Fields totaled 238 yards (153 passing, 85 rushing) and two touchdowns (one passing, one rushing).
- Extending his stretch of consecutive games with both passing and rushing touchdowns vs. Atlanta, Fields is just the second player in the Super Bowl Era to record at least one touchdown pass and one rushing touchdown in five consecutive games (Weeks 7-11), joining Arizona's Kyler Murray (5 games, 2020).
- Fields became the third quarterback to record a rushing touchdown in five consecutive games in the Super Bowl era, joining Kyler Murray (2020) and Cam Newton (2021).
- Fields, who had 178 rushing yards in Week 9 and 147 rushing yards in Week 10, became the third quarterback in the Super Bowl era with at least 75 rushing yards in three consecutive games in a single season, joining Buffalo's Josh Allen (2018) and Baltimore's Lamar Jackson (2019).

- Fields ended the 2022 regular-season with 27 career starts in two seasons. He had 4,112 passing yards with 24 touchdowns through the air in addition to 1,563 yards and 10 touchdowns rushing.
- Fields' 1,800 career rushing yards are the second-most all-time by a Bears quarterback. He trails Bobby Douglass' 2,470 yards from 1969-75.
- Despite missing Weeks 12 and 18 last season, Fields still owned a league-leading 1,143 rushing yards on the season among quarterbacks. His 1,143 yards were a Bears franchise record, and finished just 63 yards shy of Lamar Jackson's single-season NFL rushing record.

- Fields' 7.14 average ranked fifth overall by any player in the National Football League (min. 75 rushes) since 1970. Mike Vick owns the single-season record with an 8.45 avg. (1,039 yds. on 123 rushes).
- On third downs alone in 2022, Fields continually presented troubles for opposing defenses. His league-best 519 rushing yards were the most on record by any offensive player in a single season and his 34 first down rushes lead all ball-carriers when moving the chains.

- Fields' 1,143 yards on the season made him the 10th Ohio State Buckeye to rush for 1,000+ yards in the history of the National Football League, joining: Eddie George (7x), Robert Smith (4x), Ezekiel Elliott (4x), John Brockington (3x), Beanie Wells (1x), Carlos Hyde (1x), Jim Otis (1x), Pete Johnson (1x) and Raymont Harris (1x).
- With eight rushing touchdowns on the season, Fields finished two shy of becoming the eighth Buckeye in NFL history to finish a single season with double-digit rushing touchdowns. He would have joined: Pete Johnson (4x), Ezekiel Elliott (4x), Eddie George (2x), Ron Springs (1x), Tim Spencer (1x), Raymont Spencer (1x) and Beanie Wells (1x).
- Among all Buckeye offensive players in a single season, Fields' 7.14 rush avg. was the highest ever since the start of the 1920 season.

- Fields rushed for 640 yards in Weeks 6-11, which is the most by any quarterback in a six-game span and the most by a quarterback during the Super Bowl era.
- Prior to Week 11, Fields had back-to-back outings against Miami in Week 9 (178 yards) and Detroit in Week 10 (147 yards) where he rushed for 140+ yards in back-to-back weeks.
- Against Miami in Week 9, Fields completed 17-of-28 passes for 123 yards and three touchdowns, while also rushing 15 times for 178 yards and a touchdown. He finished with a passer rating of 106.7, which was the third-highest performance of his career. It also marked his second straight game with a passer rating above 100.
- With the two-week stretch, Fields became the first quarterback in Bears franchise history to post back-to-back games with 100+ rushing yards. He's the first Bears player to rush for 100+ yards in consecutive games since Jordan Howard did so on Dec. 24, 2016, and Jan. 1, 2017.
- Weeks 9 and 10 yielded a combined 325 rushing yards, which is the most total rushing yards in a two-game span by a quarterback in NFL history, surpassing Lamar Jackson's 268 combined yards which he recorded Oct. 13, 2019 through Oct. 20, 2019.

- In week 10 vs. Detroit, Fields scored two rushing touchdowns on the afternoon, his first from one yard out and his second on a 67-yard rush. His 67-yarder broke the franchise record for the longest rush ever by a Bears quarterback and the longest touchdown run by a Bears quarterback that he set just one week prior, when he rushed for a 61-yard touchdown against the Dolphins.
- Per STATS Research, Fields became the first quarterback in NFL history with a 60+ yard rushing touchdown in consecutive games. He was also just the seventh offensive player to do so since 1994, the last player being Saquon Barkley on Dec. 22, 2019 and Dec. 29, 2019.
- Fields also had a pair of passing touchdowns vs. Detroit. With the 67-yard touchdown run and 50-yard touchdown pass, he became the fourth player in league annals to record a 50-yard touchdown pass and 50-yard rushing touchdown in the same game, joining Baltimore's Lamar Jackson (2022), Carolina's Cam Newton (2012) and Brooklyn Dodgers Pro Football Hall of Famer Ace Parker (1938).
- Against Miami in Week 9, Fields' rushing performance broke Michael Vick's previous single-game record of 173 rushing yards. Fields' 178-yard rushing performance now stands as the highest rushing total by any NFL quarterback in a regular-season game in the NFL since at least 1940. He also surpassed former Bears quarterback Bobby Douglass' 127-yard rushing performance on Dec. 17, 1972 to become the Bears' single-game franchise record-holder.

- Fields beat everyone to the endzone on the opening drive of the second half against Miami with a 61-yard scramble, the third Bears touchdown of the afternoon. That rushing touchdown was both the (then) longest rush ever by a Bears quarterback (Vince Evans, 58-yard rush in 1980) and the longest touchdown run by a Bears quarterback (Bobby Douglass, 57-yard TD run in 1972) dating back to the start of the 1960 season.
- Fields added three passing touchdowns against the Dolphins, becoming the first player since at least 1950 to record 150+ rushing yards and 3+ passing touchdowns in a single game.
- Fields joined Buffalo's Josh Allen, Cincinnati's Joe Burrow and Baltimore's Lamar Jackson as the only players last season to record at least three touchdown passes and a rushing touchdown in the same game.
- Per NFL Research, Fields and former Bears running back Walter Payton are the only two players with 150+ rushing yards and 2+ pass touchdowns in a single game. Payton accomplished these marks on Sept. 18, 1983, vs. the New Orleans Saints, rushing for 161 yards on 28 carries (5.8 avg.) while passing for two touchdowns.
- Fields finished the day with eight runs of 10+ yards in the Week 9 matchup vs. the Dolphins. It stands as the most runs of 10+ yards by an offensive player in a single game last season. It matched Tennessee running back Derrick Henry's performance with eight carries of 10+ yards vs. the Colts on Nov. 29, 2020 and it was the most since former Miami running back Jay Ajayi had nine such carries against the Buffalo Bills on Oct. 23, 2016.
- Fields completed 11-of-15 pass attempts in the first half vs. Miami, which is tied for the most completions he's had in a first half in his career. It was also the fourth time in Fields' career he's had 10+ completions going into the half.
- Fields has 11 career rushing touchdowns and had eight on the season in 2022. His eight rushing touchdowns last season are tied for the second-most all-time by a Bears quarterback in a single season and the most since Vince Evans had 11 rushing touchdowns in 1950.

- Bears quarterback **TYSON BAGENT** became the first undrafted rookie since at least 1960 to start a game at quarterback for the Bears. He led Chicago to a 30-12 victory over the Las Vegas Raiders on Oct. 22, at Soldier Field.
- Bagent finished the game completing 21-of-29 passes for 162 yards with a touchdown and a 97.2 passer rating. He became the sixth-youngest Bears quarterback to win his first start (23 years, 14 days).
- The last undrafted quarterback (non-rookie) to start a game for the Bears was Chase Daniel in 2019 (10/6/19 in London).
- Bagent connected with running back D’Onta Foreman for his first career touchdown pass on a five-yard reception to finish off a 15-play, 88-yard drive with 4:09 left in the third quarter.
- Dating back to the start of the 1970 NFL season, Bagent’s 97.2 passer rating was the eighth-best total by a Bears quarterback in their starting debut. Bagent represented the Bears’ 45th starting quarterback since the start of the 1970 NFL season.

- Bagent’s debut numbers also included a 72.4 completion percentage. Among all Bears passers in their starting debuts, Bagent’s 72.4 completion percentage was the third-highest completion percentage, trailing only Steve Fuller’s 77.8 percentage in 1984 and Peter Tom Willis’ 73.1 percentage in 1992.

- In total, Bagent is one of three NFL quarterbacks to both graduate from a Division II college and start an NFL game in the last 20 years. Bagent joins Jon Kitna (Central Washington) and Todd Bouman (St. Cloud State).
- Jon Kitna’s last NFL start came in Week 16 of the 2010 season, an eventual 27-26 loss at Arizona. He was the last quarterback from a Division II school to start an NFL game.
- Bagent made his NFL debut in Week 6 against the Vikings, coming in for an injured Justin Fields. He finished the game completing 10-of-14 passes for 83 yards with a pair of runs, one of which resulted in a one-yard touchdown run.

## OFFENSIVE NOTES | TYSON BAGENT

**QB Tyson Bagent**

- A graduate of Division II Shepherd University, Bagent became the first quarterback from a Division II school to start and win an NFL game since 2010, the last being Jon Kitna in Week 15 vs. the Washington Redskins.
- One year prior to Bagent's first NFL start vs. Las Vegas, he was preparing for a Week 9 matchup between Shepherd University (8-0) and West Chester University (4-4), an eventual 47-14 win for Bagent and the Shepherd University Rams.
- During his senior season in 2022, Bagent appeared and started in all 15 games, earning first team All-PSAC East honors.
- He was named the 2022 PSAC East Offensive Player of the Year after completing 400-of-572 passes for 4,580 yards with 41 touchdowns.
- During that 2022 season, Bagent ranked second nationally in points responsible for (276), passing yards (4,580), passing touchdowns (41), and completion percentage (69.9), while also finishing third in completions per game (26.67) and sixth in total offense (310.1)
- Bagent finished his collegiate career as the all-time leader for all NCAA divisions in career touchdown passes with 159.
- Was named a 2022 First Team D2CCA All-Region selection and the D2CCA Super Region One Offensive Player of the Year.
- Was named a First Team AFCA Division II Coaches' All-American choice.
- In February of 2023, Bagent was the first ever participant in the Reese's Senior Bowl from Shepherd University. He completed 17-of-22 passes for 138 yards for a 77.2 completion percentage, the highest percentage among all participating quarterbacks.
- Bagent was a 2018 graduate of Martinsburg High School where he played football for coach Dave Walker. During his time there, he led the Bulldogs to a pair of state championships and passed for 7,800 yards and 112 touchdowns.
- At the start of the 2023 NFL season, Bagent was the lone Division II quarterback on any NFL roster. In total, there were 11 defensive backs in the NFL coming from Division II schools, seven defensive linemen, six wide receivers, five linebackers and five running backs to round out the highest position group totals.

**OFFENSIVE NOTES | RUSHING**

- In addition to Fields' and Bagent's individual performances, Chicago's offense has also found success in the ground game, rushing for 160+ yards in four consecutive weeks. The Bears posted a 171-yard outing in Week 4 vs. Denver, a season-high 178-yard outing at Washington in Week 5, a 162-yard showing against Minnesota in Week 6 and most recently had a 173-yard day against the Raiders in Week 7.
- Chicago's 989 rushing yards on the season rank fourth among all NFL teams and second in the NFC, trailing only Philadelphia's 999 yards.
- Chicago's 684 rushing yards in Weeks 4-7 are the highest total in the NFL.
- Collectively among all NFL teams, the Bears rank third in big plays rushing (10+ yards) with 31, third in first downs rushing (57), fifth in rushing average (4.75) and sixth in yards per game (141.3).
- Overall, the club's 989 rushing yards in weeks 1-7 are the second-highest total by a Bears offense since the start of the 2000 season, trailing only the franchise's record-setting 2022 season with 1,267 rushing yards through the first seven weeks.
- The Bears' 173-yard rushing performance against Las Vegas marked the club's 11th outing with 170+ team rushing yards since the start of the 2022 NFL season, the most among all NFL teams.
- The club's 31 "big plays rushing" (10+ yards) are the second-highest total by a Bears offense in Weeks 1-7 since the start of the 2000 season, trailing only the 2022 (36) season.
- Chicago's 4.75 average in Weeks 1-7 is the third-highest total by a Bears offense since 2000, trailing only the 2022 (5.24) and 2011 Bears (4.78).

- Most recently against Las Vegas, the Bears used the ground game to convert for a first down on 13 occasions, tied for the second-highest single-game total for first downs rushing by a Bears offense in Weeks 1-7 since the start of the 2000 season, trailing only a 2014 matchup vs. Green Bay in which the club reached 16 first downs on the ground.
- On third downs this season, the Bears are averaging 5.69 yards per attempt, the fourth-highest club total among all NFL teams and the second-highest among NFC teams (ARI, 5.83).



**RB D'Onta Foreman**

- Looking back on the 2022 season, the Bears are coming off of a historic, record-setting year.
- The 2022 Bears rushed for at least 225 yards in five consecutive games in Weeks 6-10. The Bears became the first team in NFL History to rush for 225+ in five consecutive games.
- Chicago rushed for 200+ yards in 7-of-17 games throughout the 2022 season. They owned five of the top 15 single-game rushing totals by all NFL teams last season. They've also accounted for six of the top 18 NFL single-game rushing performances throughout the 2022 season.
- In Week 10 vs. Detroit, the Bears accounted for 258 rushing yards against the Lions. It was their second-highest rushing total on the season, trailing only a 281-yard performance against the Texans in Week 3.
- In Week 9 against Miami, the club put up 252 rushing yards with a touchdown. The 252 yards came on 40 rushing attempts for 6.3 avg.
- Against Dallas in Week 8, the Bears finished the game with 240 rushing yards as a team, which was the third straight game they'd rushed for 230+ yards and the fourth time they'd rushed for 200+ last season.
- Chicago's 3,014 rushing yards led the NFL in 2022. The last time the Bears led the league in rushing was the 1986 season when they rushed for 2,700 yards.
- The 1984 Bears previously held the all-time franchise record for most rushing yards in a single season with 2,974 yards. The 2022 Bears surpassed that mark in Week 18 with 118 rushing yards vs. the Minnesota Vikings.

- Chicago's 3,014 rushing yards in 2022 were the highest rushing total since the record-setting 1984 season. Among all NFL teams since the start of the 2000 season, the Bears' 3,014 rushing yards in 2022 rank third overall, trailing Baltimore's 3,296 rushing yards in 2019 and 3,071 yards in 2020.
- The Bears rushing attack put together a league-best 5.40 yards per carry average on the 2022 season with 3,014 yards on 558 attempts. The 5.40 average is the seventh-highest average by any NFL team since the start of the 2000 NFL season.

- Chicago's 148 first downs rushing in 2022 were the most first downs rushing in a single season by a Chicago offense since the start of 1990 NFL season.
- The Bears finished fifth among all NFL teams last season with 148 first downs rushing, trailing: Baltimore (167), Philadelphia (161), Atlanta (152) and the New York Giants (150).

- Entering Week 13, Chicago's 121 first downs rushing were the most-ever among all teams in Weeks 1-12 dating back to the start of the 1994 season when the league started tracking first downs rushing, edging the 2021 Philadelphia Eagles' 119 first downs rushing in Weeks 1-12.

- The Bears 177.3 rushing yards per game led all NFL teams in 2022. It is the third-highest Bears average through a single season since 1970. The last time Chicago rushed for a higher yards per game average was in 1977 when the club averaged 200.8 yards per game.

- The Bears had 81 carries of 10+ yards in 2022. It finished as the second-most in the NFL, trailing only Baltimore's 88. The 2022 season marked the first time since at least 1994 that the Bears have surpassed 60 big run plays of 10+ yards in a single season.

- Chicago's 81 rushing plays of 10+ yards in 2022 were the most single-season carries of 10+ by any Bears offense since the start of the 1994 season. The 2011 and 2013 Bears are tied for second with 58 apiece.

- With a season-best 281 rushing yards in Week 3 vs. Houston, the Bears finished with the fifth-highest single-game rushing total since the start of the 1970 season. It's the most yards they've rushed for in a game since Sept. 30, 1984 vs. Dallas, when they recorded 283 yards on the ground. They also averaged 7.0 yards per carry over the course of the game, which was the 10th time in team history with over 7.0 yards per carry since 1950. The last time they met or exceeded this average was also against the Texans, on Dec. 13, 2020 (7.4 avg.).

- Individually, the Bears were led by RB **KHALIL HERBERT** prior to his IR designation. Herbert's 2022 season was highlighted by 643 yards on the ground through the first 10 weeks of the 2022 season before being placed on IR.

- Through 35 career games, Herbert's 5.07 rushing average is the highest among all Bears running backs dating back to the start of the 1970 season. He has 1,436 yards on 285 carries.

- Herbert has 272 yards on 51 carries (5.33 avg.) in five games. Entering Week 6, Herbert had the eighth-highest rushing average among all NFL running backs and the fourth-highest among NFC ball-carriers.

- Herbert had his second-straight rushing performance of 75+ yards against the Commanders in Week 5 before exiting the game in the third quarter due to injury (10 attempts, 76 yards).

**OFFENSIVE NOTES | RUSHING**

- Against the Broncos in Week 4, Herbert totaled 103 yards on 18 carries (5.7 avg.). It was his third career outing surpassing the century mark and his first of the 2023 season.
- Herbert's Week 4 performance was the club's sixth individual 100-yard rushing performance under Matt Eberflus.
- Herbert's season totals in 2022 ranked 10th among all NFL running backs and were fifth among NFC ball-carriers entering Week 11 when he was placed on IR. It was the highest total by a Bears running back through Week 10 since Jordan Howard rushed for 716 yards in 2017.
- In Week 3 against the Texans, Herbert rushed for 157 yards on 20 carries (7.9 avg.). Herbert's performance stands as the fifth-highest rushing yardage total in a single game by a Bears player going back to the 1990 NFL season and was the highest single-game rushing total since Matt Forte rushed for 205 yards against the Carolina Panthers in 2011.
- Herbert had a 64-yard carry with 4:01 to go in the second quarter vs. Washington. It was the longest rush of his career and the longest rushing attempt by a Bears player since David Montgomery broke free for an 80-yard touchdown vs. Houston on Dec. 13, 2020.
- Herbert found the end zone twice against Houston on Sept. 25, scoring from 11 yards out and one yard out. Herbert owns five career rushing touchdowns. His outing vs. the Texans marked his first-career game with 2+ rushing touchdowns and he's the first running back to log 2+ touchdowns in a single game since David Montgomery did so on Jan. 2, 2022, vs. the New York Giants.
- Herbert found the endzone in one of the Bears' three touchdowns against the 49ers in Week 1, scoring from three yards out in the fourth quarter with 7:21 to go in the game. Herbert's first touchdown of the 2022 season extended a 19-10 lead.
- Herbert compiled a 5.95 yards per carry average in Weeks 1-10. The 5.95 avg. ranked second among all NFL running backs (min. 80 attempts).



**RB Khalil Herbert**

- Herbert had a 52-yard carry with 11:15 to go in the third quarter vs. Houston. Prior to his 64-yard run vs. Washington, it was the longest rush of his career and the longest run by a Bears running back since David Montgomery broke free for 57 yards at Green Bay on Nov. 29, 2020.
- With Herbert's 64 and 52-yard carries in 2022, the third-year back was one of 10 players in the NFL to have multiple carries of 50+ yards. Herbert joined Tennessee's Derrick Henry (56, 50) Detroit's D'Andre Swift (50, 50), New Orleans' Taysom Hill (60T, 57), Seattle's Kenneth Walker III (74T, 69T), Dallas' Tony Pollard (57T, 54T), Minnesota's Dalvin Cook (81T, 53T), Detroit's Jamaal Williams (58, 51T), Los Angeles Chargers' Austin Ekeler (72T, 71) and teammate Justin Fields (67T, 61T, 55T) as the only 10 ball-carriers to have multiple games with carries of 50+ yards.
- The Bears were the only team in the NFL with two players that have multiple rushes of 50+ yards.
- Herbert finished the 2022 regular season with 731 rushing yards on 129 attempts (5.67 avg.). His 5.67 average ranks fifth all-time in a single season among Bears running backs.
- In addition to the Bears ranking second in the NFL in rushing plays of 10+ yards with 81 carries of 10+, they also ranked tied for second in rushing plays of 20+ yards, totaling 20 on the year. Cleveland (21) and Buffalo (20) join the Bears atop the leaderboard. Chicago averages 39.8 yards per carry when a run exceeds 20 yards. The 39.8 average is the second-highest average among all teams with 10+ carries of 20+ yards (DET, 39.9).

**OFFENSIVE NOTES | RUSHING & RECEIVING**



**RB D'Onta Foreman**

- Adding to the rushing attack this season is the emergence of running back **D'ONTA FOREMAN**, who is recently coming off of a three-touchdown performance vs. Las Vegas.
- Foreman finished the game with 16 carries for 89 yards and a pair of touchdowns on the ground with one through the air. He set season-highs in carries (16), rushing yards (89) and offensive touchdowns (3). This marked his third career multi-touchdown game and tied his career high for total touchdowns in a single game (3 at Atlanta on Oct. 30, 2022).
- Foreman eclipsed 2,000 career rushing yards in the second quarter vs. Las Vegas. In 46 career games, Foreman has 2,071 yards on 479 attempts (4.3 avg) with 12 touchdowns.
- Foreman's first game of the season in a starting role came against Minnesota in Week 6, logging 65 yards on 15 attempts (4.3 avg).
- Foreman spent the 2022 season with the Carolina Panthers in addition to time with the Tennessee Titans (2020-21) and Houston Texans (2017-18).
- Foreman produced a career-year in 2022, setting new career-highs in practically every rushing category. Foreman finished the season with 914 rushing yards on 203 carries (4.5 ypc) and five touchdowns on the ground.
- Foreman eclipsed the century mark in rushing five times last season. His five 100-yard rushing games in Weeks 7-18 in 2022 was tied for the second most in the NFL, trailing Derrick Henry's seven. Foreman's five 100-yard rushing games ranks fourth in Carolina's franchise history for a single season.

- Foreman became the first NFL player to rush for 100+ yards in a game twice against the same opponent (Atlanta Falcons, Week 8 & 10) in a span of 12 days or less (regular season) since Buffalo's Cookie Gilchrist did so twice in seven days against the Jets in December of 1963.
- Looking to the passing game, Chicago has leaned on the addition of **DJ MOORE** early in 2023. Moore's 636 receiving yards rank fifth among all pass-catchers this season and his five touchdowns rank tied for fourth in the NFL and second in the NFC.
- Moore is one of nine wideouts this season to log three or more 100-yard games. Only five-pass-catchers in the NFL have more than three: Detroit's Amon-Ra St. Brown (4), Los Angeles Rams' Puka Nacua (4), Miami's Tyreek Hill (4), Buffalo's Stefon Diggs (5) and Philadelphia's A.J. Brown (5).
- Moore had his best game of the season against Washington in Week 5, logging 230 receiving yards on eight receptions (28.8 avg.) with three touchdowns.
- In that Week 5 performance, Moore set career-highs in yards (230), touchdowns (3) and receptions of 25+ (4).
- Dating back to the 1960 NFL season, Moore became one of three Bears to ever record 200+ yards in a single game, joining Alshon Jeffery, who logged 249 yards at Minnesota (12/1/13), Jeffery again with 218 yards against New Orleans (10/6/13) and Johnny Morris, who tallied 201 yards at Dallas (11/18/62).
- Moore is one of 18 active players in the NFL to log a 200+ yard single-game receiving performance, and is one of three to do so in 2023, joining Miami's Tyreek Hill (215 at LAC) and Los Angeles Chargers' Keenan Allen (215 at MIN).
- Moore's 230-yard outing is the highest single-game receiving performance of the 2023 season and the highest single-game receiving total since Cincinnati's Ja'Marr Chase totaled 266 yards on 11 receptions against the Kansas City Chiefs in Week 17 of the 2021 season.
- Against Tampa Bay in Week 2, Fields connected with Moore early in the first quarter on 31 and 33-yard pass completions. It was the 29th game in Moore's career logging a 30+ yard reception. The 33-yard completion also marked Fields' longest completion of the season. Moore finished the first quarter with two catches for 64 yards, tied for the third highest first-quarter total in his career, trailing only a 76-yard opening quarter on Sept. 23, 2021, at Houston and a 66-yard first quarter on Nov. 22, 2020. Moore was the leading receiver for the Bears on the day, logging six receptions for 104 yards as this was his 16th career game finishing over the 100-yard mark in receptions.

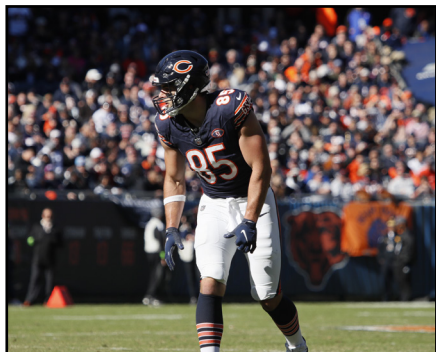
- In Week 4 against Denver, Moore had a (then) season-high 131 receiving yards on eight receptions (16.4 avg.) with a touchdown. The 131-yard outing was his fourth time ever topping 130 yards and his first since a 152-yard performance at Atlanta in 2022.
- Moore signed with the Bears in the 2023 offseason after spending the first five years of his career in Carolina (2018-22).
- While in Carolina, Moore hauled in 364 receptions, good for fifth all-time by a Panther.
- His 21 receiving TDs ranked tied for fifth all-time by a Carolina pass-catcher, becoming the 4th Panther to eclipse 5,000 career receiving yards.
- Moore is just one of three players in the NFL (Travis Kelce-KC, Davante Adams-GB/LV) to record at least 115 targets, 60 receptions and 850 receiving yards in each of the last four seasons.
- Since Week 1 of the 2019 season, Moore has totaled 5,049 receiving yards, eighth most in the NFL over that span.
- In addition to Moore, tight end **COLE KMET** has played a key role in the passing game this season, accounting for 240 receiving yards on 25 catches (9.6 avg.) with a trio of touchdowns. Kmet's 240 receiving yards is the second-highest total among Bears pass-catchers.
- Among all NFL tight ends in 2023, Kmet ranks 12th in receiving yards (240), tied-10th in receptions (25) tied-first in touchdowns (3) and tied-ninth in moving the chains for a first down (14).
- Dating back to the start of the 2000 season, from Weeks 1-6 by a Bears tight end, Kmet ranked: fifth in receptions (25), seventh in receiving yards (240), sixth in avg. (9.6), seventh in first downs (14) and tied-third in touchdowns (3).
- Against the Commanders, Kmet logged five receptions for 42 yards and a touchdown – his second-straight game finding the endzone.



**TE Cole Kmet**

- Against the Broncos in Week 4, Kmet put together a six-catch, 85 yard performance with two touchdowns. It was the third multi-touchdown performance of his career and his first on the season. The 85 receiving yards sat just two shy of matching a career high set in Week 9 of the 2021 season at Pittsburgh (87 yards). The Week 4 outing against Denver was his second career time topping 80+ yards in a single game.
- Against the Chiefs in Week 3, Kmet eclipsed 1,500 scrimmage and receiving yards for his career. He finished the game with two catches for 22 yards. He became just the sixth Bears tight end to reach 1,500 receiving yards since the NFL-AFL merger in 1970.
- Last season, Kmet continued to build on a 2021 campaign where he finished second on the team in both receptions (60) and receiving yards (612). Kmet surpassed 500 receiving yards at Seattle in Week 16 in 2021 with four catches for 49 yards. Trey Burton was Chicago's most recent tight end to surpass the 500-yard mark by a tight end, doing so in 2018 with 569 receiving yards on 54 receptions (10.5 avg.).
- Kmet led all Bears with 544 yards on 50 receptions (10.9 avg.) with seven touchdowns in 2022.
- In Week 10 vs. Detroit last season, Fields and Kmet connected for a pair of third-quarter touchdowns. The duo found each other for a six-yard completion with 7:36 on the clock and once more from 50-yards out with 2:53 remaining in the third quarter to extend the Chicago lead to 23-10.
- For Kmet, his second touchdown reception of the game also marked his fifth in his previous three games as well as his second game with multiple touchdown receptions last season. The last Bears tight end to log touchdowns in three consecutive games was Trey Burton in 2018, scoring in Weeks 4-7 (Week 5 was a Bye Week).
- Kmet finished the 2022 regular season tied for the third-most touchdowns in the NFL by a tight end (7).

- Kmet is one of seven tight ends in Bears history to have logged 5+ touchdowns in the first 10 weeks of the season. He joined Mike Ditka (three times), Greg Olsen (2009, 6), Martellus Bennett (2014, 5), Trey Burton (2018, 5), Jimmy Graham (2020, 5) and Emery Moorehead (1982, 5).
- He found the endzone for the second straight week against Miami in Week 9. On the opening play of the second quarter, Kmet scored on an 18-yard pass. It was Kmet's fourth career touchdown and his second on the season. The last time a Bears player caught TD passes in consecutive games was Jimmy Graham in Weeks 12 and 13 of the 2021 season.
- Kmet and Fields connected again for a score vs. Miami, this time on a four-yard touchdown pass with 11:42 left in the fourth quarter to cap off a 10-play, 65-yard drive. This was the first time in his career with multiple touchdowns in a single game, and he's the first Bears player with multiple receiving touchdowns in a single game since tight end Jimmy Graham on Dec. 27, 2020 at Jacksonville. Kmet finished the day with five receptions for 41 yards in addition to the pair of touchdowns.
- Kmet logged a career-high 87 yards on six receptions (14.5 avg.) in Week 9 at Pittsburgh in 2021. His second-highest receiving yardage performance of the season came Week 15 vs. Minnesota when he posted a team-high 71 receiving yards.
- Kmet's 60 receptions in 2021 tie former Bears TE Greg Olsen for fourth-most all-time in Bears single-season history for receptions amongst tight ends.

**WR Darnell Mooney**

- Last season in 2022, the Bears relied on several new faces on the 2022 roster throughout the season. With wide receiver **DARNELL MOONEY** on injured reserve after Week 12, opportunities for a larger role have opened for former Packers wide-out **EQUANIMEOUS ST. BROWN** and rookie wide receiver **VELUS JONES JR.**
- Mooney, who served as one of Fields' top targets last season, had one of his biggest games this season against Minnesota in Week 6, logging 48 yards on two catches. One of his two receptions was for a gain of 39 yards, his longest on the season and the seventh-longest of his career.
- Prior to his injury in 2022, Mooney had continually helped the Bears offense stretch the field. In five straight weeks from 4-8, Mooney hauled in a reception of 20+ yards. Entering Week 12 at the Jets, Mooney logged catches of 20+ in six of his last nine games.

- Mooney's five straight games with a reception of 20+ yards was his first five-game stretch in doing so.
- Mooney caught his first touchdown on the season in Week 9 vs. Miami, hauling in a 16-yard reception from Fields at the 2:00 mark in the first half.
- Following a five-catch, 70-yard performance at Dallas in Week 8, Mooney surpassed the 2,000-yard receiving milestone. He became the seventh wideout drafted by the Bears to eclipse the 2,000-yard mark since 2000.

- Mooney helped open the Bears passing game with 94 receiving yards on four receptions in Chicago's Week 4 meeting with the New York Giants. It was Mooney's highest single-game outing in 2022 and the highest single-game outing by a Bears pass-catcher last season.
- Mooney led the team with 81 catches for 1,055 yards and four touchdowns in 2021, in addition to one rushing score. Those reception and yardage numbers were good for seventh and ninth-best in the NFL, respectively. Mooney has totaled 142 receptions for 1,560 yards and eight touchdowns heading into his third season. His 142 receptions are the most by any Bears player in their first two seasons in the NFL, breaking Tarik Cohen's old record of 124 catches from 2017-18.
- Mooney posted back-to-back 100-yard games in Weeks 12-13 last season with 10 catches for 244 yards and a score while finishing the season with four 100-yard games. His Week 12-13 totals were the second-most receiving yards in the NFL over that two-week stretch. Minnesota's Justin Jefferson was first with 252 yards.

- In Week 12 in 2021, Mooney caught a 52-yard pass from Andy Dalton late in the 2nd quarter (5:21) at the Lions, marking five straight games with a reception of 20+ yards. That streak ended in Week 13 vs. the Cardinals. Mooney finished the season with at least one 20+ yard reception in 9-of-17 games.
- Mooney recorded his first career rushing touchdown in Week 9 at Pittsburgh in 2021 on a 15-yard run with 14:17 to go in the fourth quarter. He also recorded the sixth receiving touchdown of his career, hauling in a 16-yard pass from Justin Fields to put the Bears ahead 27-26 with 1:46 left in the fourth quarter.
- Mooney became Chicago's fifth different wideout since 1960 to score a rushing touchdown. It was the 11th rushing touchdown scored in franchise history by a wide receiver, joining Dennis Gentry (5), Johnny Morris (3), Dennis McKinnon (1) and Michael Thompson (1).
- Dating back to 1970, Mooney became Chicago's second wide receiver to log a rushing touchdown and a receiving touchdown in the same regular-season game, joining Michael Timpson's Nov. 26, 1995 performance vs. the New York Giants in a 27-24 victory.
- Adding to the passing game in 2022 via free agency acquisition is wide receiver **EQUANIMEOUS ST. BROWN**. St. Brown started 16 games last season and logged receptions of 18+ yards in seven of those contests.

**TE Robert Tonyan**

- St. Brown ended the 2022 season with 323 yards receiving, a 15.4 yards per catch average and 14 receptions to move the chains for a first down.
- St. Brown had his biggest game in a Bears uniform vs. Green Bay in Week 14, logging 85 yards on three catches (28.3 avg.) with a season-high 56-yard completion.
- St. Brown logged a 19-yard reception in the Bears Week 7 win over New England in part of his four-catch, 48-yard performance against the Patriots. In doing so, St. Brown surpassed the 700-yard mark in his career (then: 701 yards, 47 catches, 14.9 avg.).
- St. Brown recorded a 41-yard rush midway through the first quarter (10:01) against Houston on Sept. 25. It was the longest rush of his career and the second-longest offensive play of his career, trailing a 54-yard reception on Oct. 7, 2018, when he was a member of the Green Bay Packers.
- With the 41-yard rush against the Texans and a 30-yard reception vs. Green Bay in Week 2, Equanimeous joined his brother, Amon-Ra St. Brown (WR, Detroit Lions), as the only two players to have a rush of 30+ yards and a reception of 30+ yards this season.
- St. Brown finished the Week 3 game vs. Houston with 63 total yards from scrimmage. It was the third-most combined yards he's logged in a game in his career.
- As a rookie wide receiver, **VELUS JONES JR.** had one of the biggest games of his career in Week 16 vs. Buffalo last season, hauling in two receptions for a combined 52 yards. He moved the chains on one of the receptions, which went for a season-long 44 yards. It was his first reception above 25 yards on the season.
- Additional newcomers to the offensive side of the ball include TE **ROBERT TONYAN**, OL **NATE DAVIS** and TE **MARCEDES LEWIS**.
- Tonyan comes to Chicago after spending the 2018-22 seasons in Green Bay. He has appeared in all six games this season, making two start with 39 yards on five catches.
- While in Green Bay, Tonyan tied the single-season franchise record (Paul Coffman, 1984) for the

- most TD receptions by a tight end with 11 in 2020, which was also tied with Chiefs TE Travis Kelce for the league lead among TEs.
- Tonyan became the first Green Bay TE to lead the NFL in TD receptions since Bubba Franks in 2002 (tied for No. 1 with seven).
- Tonyan posted career highs for receptions (52) and receiving yards (586) in 2020, joining Coffman (54-814-11 in 1983) as the only TEs in team history to register 45-plus catches, 500-plus receiving yards and nine-plus receiving TDs in a season.
- Tonyan registered a TD catch in five straight games in 2020 (Weeks 11-15), the longest streak by a TE in franchise history.
- Tonyan originally entered the NFL as an undrafted free agent out of Indiana State with the Detroit Lions in 2017. While at Indiana State, Tonyan played WR for his final three seasons, finishing as the school's leader in career TD receptions (20), single-season TD receptions (10, 2016) and most consecutive games with a reception (21, 2015-16).
- A teammate of Tonyan's in Green Bay, Marcedes Lewis is the second tight end to join the Bears' pass-catchers. Lewis is one of only three tight ends in NFL history (Tony Gonzalez, Jason Witten) to start 200-plus regular-season games (221) and post 400-plus receptions (432).
- Lewis has appeared in all four games for the Bears this season, making one start and logging one reception for eight yards.
- In total, Lewis enters his NFL record 18th season in the league, passing Tony Gonzalez and Jason Witten (17 apiece) for the most in NFL history among tight ends.
- Lewis has played in 257 career regular-season games, No. 3 among tight ends in league history.
- He had appeared in 15-plus regular-season games in 14 of his 17 seasons in the league and is one of only three TEs in NFL history to do so in 14-plus seasons (Gonzalez, Witten).

## DEFENSIVE NOTES

**LB Tremaine Edmunds**

- The Bears are coming off two of their best defensive performances on the season after limiting Minnesota to 220 total net yards in Week 6 (46 rush, 174 pass) and Las Vegas to 235 in Week 7 (39 rush, 196 pass).
- The club's 227.5 yards per game allowed on defense in Weeks 6-7 leads all NFL teams, while their 288.5 yards per game allowed in Weeks 4-7 rank sixth in the NFL.
- The Bears are limiting opponents to an 18.2 conversion rate on 3rd downs over the past two weeks, the best rate in the NFL.
- The Bears have not allowed a rushing touchdown since Week 3 of the season (at KC). They join the Atlanta Falcons as the only other team in the NFL to not allow a rushing touchdown in Weeks 4-7.
- Chicago's 52.8 rushing yards allowed in Weeks 4-7 are a league best, while their 82.3 yards per game on the season rank fifth overall.
- The Bears are coming off of their second-straight outing when it comes to limiting opponents to less than 250+ total net yards. In Week 7 vs. Las Vegas, they held the Raiders to 235 total net yards while adding a trio of turnovers.
- Chicago's defense limited Minnesota to 3-of-13 3rd down conversions on Sunday, a season-best for the Bears and the 11th-best conversion rate by a club's defense in a single game this season.
- The Bears defense held Minnesota's offense to season-lows in total net yards (220), net passing yards (130), first downs (12) and first downs passing (8).
- In Week 5 against the Commanders, the club put together a five-sack, two-turnover showing on Thursday Night Football. The Bears limited the Commanders' offense to 20 points in doing so.
- Chicago's 5.0 sacks against the Commanders were the most since logging 6.0 against the Baltimore Ravens on Nov. 21, 2021 at Soldier Field.

**LB T.J. Edwards**

- In addition to the sack totals, the Bears' defense recorded two takeaways on the night at Washington. The first being an interception by defensive back **GREG STROMAN JR.** in the second quarter, and the second on a forced fumble and recovery by rookie defensive back **TERRELL SMITH** in the third quarter. This was Stroman's third career interception and was Smith's first career forced fumble and fumble recovery.
- Looking at the 2023 Bears defense, individually, new faces have brought experience to the club's linebacker and pass-rush groups.
- **LB TREMAINE EDMUNDS** enters year six in the NFL following a five-year stay in Buffalo, where he logged 100+ tackles in every season with the club.
- Through seven games with the Bears in 2023, Edmunds has logged 62 total tackles (35 solo) with three tackles for loss, a fumble recovery and an interception. With an interception against the Raiders in Week 7 (sixth career INT) and a fumble recovery vs. Minnesota in Week 6 (first of his career), Edmunds has been involved in a takeaway in consecutive games for the first time in his career.
- Edmunds was the first player in NFL history with two 100+ tackle seasons before the age of 21.
- Edmunds was named to the AFC Pro Bowl roster in two of the past three seasons, earning the honor following both the 2020 and 2021 seasons.
- Edmunds finished his rookie season in 2018 as the only NFL player with 120+ tackles, 12+ passes defended, 2+ sacks, 2+ INTs and 2+ forced fumbles.
- Adding depth on the inside is **LB T.J. EDWARDS**, who comes to Chicago following a four-year stay with the Philadelphia Eagles.
- Through seven weeks, Edwards leads all Bears defenders with 70 total tackles (37 solo). It ranks fourth among all defensive players in the league and leads the NFC.
- Edwards, a Lake Villa (Ill.) native, ranked seventh in the NFL in tackles in the NFL with 159 total tackles in 2022.
- Dating back to the start of the 2021 season, Edwards ranks sixth in the NFL in total tackles with 354.

**DE Demarcus Walker**

- Most recently in 2022, Edwards led the NFC Champion Eagles' defense with 159 total tackles while adding 10 TFLs, 7 PDs, 5 QB hits, 2.0 sacks and 1 FR.
- Edwards, who went undrafted out of Wisconsin, started 52 games for the Badgers, the 2nd-most in school history and the 5th most by a Big Ten player.
- Adding pressure to the defensive front is DE **YANNICK NGAKOUE**, who joins the Bears from Indianapolis, where he spent the 2022 season.
- Now in his eighth NFL season, Ngakoue has appeared in 117 games (109 starts), registering 217 tackles (173 solo), 67.0 sacks for 416 yards, two interceptions, 13 passes defended, 138 QBH, 69 tackles-for-loss, 21 forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries.
- Since entering the NFL in 2016, Ngakoue ranks fifth in the league in forced fumbles (21).
- A 2016 third-round draft pick out of the University of Maryland, Ngakoue was drafted No. 69 overall by the Jaguars and spent time with the Ravens, Vikings, Colts and Raiders before joining the Bears
- Ngakoue finished his career in Jacksonville ranking second all-time in franchise history in sacks (37.5).
- Adding to the pass-rush is defensive end **DEMARCUS WALKER**, who enters his seventh year in the NFL after being selected in the second round (51st overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft by the Denver Broncos. He spent the first four years of his career in Denver before joining the Houston Texans (2021) and Tennessee Titans (2022) for one season apiece.
- Walker has started all seven games for the Bears in 2023, logging seven tackles, 1.5 sacks and five quarterback hurries with five tackles-for-loss.
- Last season with the Titans, Walker experienced a breakout year, recording several career highs with 32 tackles, 16 quarterback hits, 10 tackles for loss and 7.0 sacks. He also had back-to-back seasons with 30-plus quarterback pressures, racking up 32 in Tennessee.



**CB Jaylon Johnson**

- Walker has appeared in 73 games over his seven-year career with 20 starts, compiling 126 tackles, 44 quarterback hits, 29 tackles-for-loss, 21.0 sacks and two forced fumbles.
- With the Texans in 2021, Walker notched 30 quarterback pressures for the first time in his career while adding 31 tackles, four tackles-for-loss, 16 quarterback hits and two sacks.
- Under new defensive leadership last season, the Bears finished the 2022 season ranking among the best in the league in several categories: completions allowed (323, 6th), receiving touchdowns (22, T-11th) and interception return yards (201, 9th), to name a few.
- In the secondary, veteran corner **JAYLON JOHNSON** is coming off the best game of his career with a two-interception performance vs. Las Vegas in Week 7. It was Johnson's first multi-interception performance and the first by a Bears defender since Roquan Smith had two interceptions vs. Jacksonville in Week 16 of the 2020 season.
- Both of Johnson's interceptions came in the fourth quarter against Las Vegas. The last Bears defender to log 2+ interceptions in the fourth quarter of a game was Kyle Fuller in Week 2 of the 2014 NFL season, picking off Colin Kaepernick twice in a 28-20 Bears victory.
- According to Pro Football Focus, Johnson has limited opposing passers to a 22.2 passer rating when targeting Johnson, the lowest figure among all defensive backs in 2023.
- Last season, Johnson moved to IR in Week 15, young talent was called to step up in his place. Johnson had led the group in his third season in the NFL. The Utah product ranked first in passes defended (7) and had one of his best games in a Bears uniform in Week 15 with three passes defended before being placed on IR. It matched the second-highest pass defense total by all defensive players in Week 15 and only trailed his career-best of four PDs vs. Cincinnati last season.

## DEFENSIVE NOTES

**S Jaquan Brisker**

- Individually last season, Chicago's defense was highlighted by rookies **JAQUAN BRISKER** (S, Penn State) and **KYLER GORDON** (CB, Washington) following a string of injuries to the Bears veteran standouts.
- Gordon forced his third takeaway on the season against Buffalo in Week 16, picking off Josh Allen with 13:10 remaining in the second quarter. It was Gordon's second straight game with a pick, and his third on the season. That tied him for third-most takeaways among all rookies. In addition to the interception, Gordon had five solo tackles and one pass defended.
- Gordon became the fourth Bears rookie defensive back since the start of the 2000 season to log interceptions in consecutive games. He joined Charles Tillman (2003), Nathan Vasher (2004) and Kyle Fuller (2014).
- Against Philadelphia in Week 15, Gordon intercepted Jalen Hurts with 7:26 remaining in the first quarter. It was the second interception of his rookie season following a Week 7 takeaway on New England's Bailey Zappe.
- In Chicago's Week 7 contest at New England, Gordon got his first career interception. It was the Bears third interception on the night and the fourth takeaway overall in the game when Gordon snagged the Zappe pass with 2:52 left in the fourth quarter. Gordon and teammate Jaquan Brisker became the first pair of Bears rookies to record an interception in the same game since David Bass and Jon Bostic did so on Nov. 17, 2013 vs. Baltimore.
- The Gordon interception marked the Bears defense's seventh second-half takeaway on the season while previously having one per week in Weeks 1-5, 0 against Washington in Week 6 and ultimately a pair vs. New England in Week 7.
- In that Week 7 contest at New England, the Bears earned a 33-14 victory. In doing so, they picked up their first win over the Patriots since Dec. 10, 2000, and their first win on the road against New England in franchise history.
- The Bears tallied four total turnovers vs. New England, including three interceptions that were returned for a combined total of 52 yards. The last time the Bears had four takeaways in a single game was Sept. 19, 2021 against the Bengals. They ended Week 7 with eight interceptions as a team, which is tied with the Steelers, Jets and Ravens for third-most in the NFL.
- With the win, the Bears snapped a 16-0 record held by Patriots coach Bill Belichick in which New England was perfect at home when facing a club in Week 7 or later who held a record with two or fewer wins.
- Adding to the turnovers column, rookie defensive back Jaquan Brisker picked off Patriots quarterback Mac Jones on a 2nd and 10 with 13:08 remaining in the second quarter to give the Bears their first takeaway of the evening. Brisker became the first Bears defensive back since Eddie Jackson (two, 2017) to record a pick during their rookie campaign. Brisker ended the night with seven combined tackles (five solo) and one pass defended in addition to the pick.
- Brisker was also valuable in adding pressure to opposing quarterbacks. Brisker finished with a team-leading 4.0 sacks on the season. He became the seventh Bears safety to record 3+ sacks in a single season since sacks became an official stat in 1982.
- Brisker's 4.0 sacks on the season were the most ever by a Bears' rookie.
- Brisker's 4.0 sacks were tied for the fourth-most by any rookie last season: Aidan Hutchinson, DET - 9.5, James Houston, DET - 8.0, and Kansas City's George Karlaftis, - 6.0, lead all rookie sack leaders.
- Brisker finished the season tied with New York Giants' Kayvon Thibodeaux's 4.0 sacks. Brisker tied Los Angeles Chargers' safety Derwin James (4.0) and trailed Cowboys' safety Donovan Wilson (5.0) to lead all defensive backs in sack totals. It's also the third time in Bears franchise history that a defensive back has logged four or more sacks in a season, joining Dave Duerson (7.0 sacks, 1986) and Todd Bell (4.5 sacks, 1984).

**DEFENSIVE NOTES**

- Brisker was one of four defensive backs in the NFL to have at least 4.0 sacks and an INT to his name. He joined Dallas' Donovan Wilson (5.0 SKs, 1 INT), Los Angeles Chargers' safety Derwin James Jr. (4.0 SKs, 2 INT) and Tampa Bay's Antoine Winfield Jr. (4.0 SKs, 1 INT).
- Brisker was one of six rookies in the NFL to have 4.0+ sacks to his name. After being selected in the second round of the 2022 NFL Draft (48th overall), Brisker joins Detroit first-round pick Aidan Hutchinson (9.5 sacks), Detroit sixth-round pick James Houston (8.0), Kansas City first-round selection George Karlaftis (6.0 sacks), Giants' first-round pick Kayvon Thibodeaux (4.0) and Dallas' Sam Williams (4.0).
- New and upcoming talent like Gordon and Brisker had to step up in place of veteran safety **EDDIE JACKSON**, who was placed on injured reserve in Week 14 last season.
- Jackson, who had four interceptions through the first 12 weeks of the 2022 season, ranked tied for third among all defenders and trailed only Philadelphia's C.J. Gardner-Johnson's six interceptions and Seattle's Tariq Woolen's five.
- Jackson's most recent interception came at Dallas in Week 8, picking off quarterback Dak Prescott with 40 seconds remaining in the second quarter, his fourth interception of the season and the 14th of his career.
- Jackson was one of three Bears to have 4+ INTs through the first eight weeks of the season dating back to the start of the 2000 season, matching Ricky Manning Jr.'s four in 2006 and trailing only Tim Jennings' six interceptions in 2012.
- Jackson's interceptions last season came in Week 1 vs. San Francisco (4th, 9:52), Week 3 vs. Houston (1st, 0:51) Week 4 at the New York Giants (4th, 13:44) and Week 8 at Dallas (2nd, 0:40). The Bears are 12-2 in games where Jackson picks off the opposing quarterback.
- Jackson also owned a pair of forced fumbles this season; 1 vs. HOU (9/25) and 1 vs. WAS (10/13). Jackson had 10 forced fumbles since he entered the NFL in 2017, which ranked tied for fifth among NFL safeties during that span.
- Jackson has scored six defensive touchdowns since he entered the league in 2017 as a fourth-round draft pick (112th overall). His six touchdowns lead the entire NFL. In total, only 19 defensive players in the NFL have scored 3+ touchdowns since Jackson entered the league in 2017.

- Prior to going on IR last season, newcomer to the sacks column was rookie **JACK SANBORN**. Undrafted out of Wisconsin, Sanborn had 2.0 sacks on the 2022 season -- both came against Detroit in Week 10. Sanborn was the first undrafted free agent to log 2.0+ sacks in a single NFL game since former Houston linebacker Nate Hall (Northwestern University) did so on Nov. 26, 2020, against the Lions.
- Against the Chiefs in Week 3 this season, with 3:27 left in the third quarter, Sanborn logged his first career interception and returned it for 42 yards.
- Against the Jets in Week 12 last season, Sanborn logged a season-high 14 tackles. It was the most ever by a Bears rookie in a single game.
- Sanborn finished with a team-high 10 combined tackles vs. Green Bay. It was Sanborn's third time in five games with double-digit tackles since taking over at starting linebacker. He is now tied for the second-most such games by a rookie in Bears franchise history, trailing only Roquan Smith's six games with 10+ tackles during the 2018 season.

## SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

**K Cairo Santos**

- The 2023 Bears special teams unit is led by **RICHARD HIGHTOWER**, who completed his first year as special teams coordinator with the Bears in 2022. He returned to Chicago after previously serving as assistant special teams coach for the Bears in 2016.
- Hightower arrived with 15 years of NFL coaching experience, including the last five as special teams coordinator with the San Francisco 49ers.
- In addition to Hightower and assistant special teams coach Carlos Polk, the Bears return game was highlighted in Week 1 against Green Bay with a pair of new returners. Newly acquired veteran wide receiver/punt returner **TRENT TAYLOR** logged two punt returns for 16 yards (8.0 avg.), good for 2-9th among all returners and fifth among all NFC returners. Rookie wideout **TYLER SCOTT** also added a new face on special teams returning kicks against the Packers. Scott logged four returns for 84 yards (21.0 avg.), good for 8th among all NFL kick returners and third among NFC returners.
- Taylor has served as the club's 2023 punt returner all season. Taylor was acquired via waivers on Aug. 31 from Cincinnati. He has six returns on the season for 53 yards (8.8 avg.).
- **K CAIRO SANTOS** is 11-for-11 on field goal attempts this season and 15-of-16 on extra points.
- The Bears special teams unit has been successful on 14 consecutive field goal attempts dating back to a blocked kick vs. Green Bay in Week 16 of the 2022 season.
- Dating back to the start of the 2020 season, Santos has connected on 88-of-96 field goal attempts. His 91.7 field goal percentage across that span is tied for the second-best mark in the NFL (Min. 40 FGM).
- Santos opened the season going 2-for-2 against the Packers (47, 29) and added a 52-yard attempt in Tampa Bay in Week 2. It was his 15th career field goal of 50+. In Week 3 at Kansas City, he connected on a 21-yarder. His best game of the season came in Week 5, connecting on 4-of-4 kicks at Washington. He was 2-for-2 against Minnesota in Week 6 and 1-for-1 against Las Vegas in Week 7.
- Connecting on 4-of-4 at Washington marked the 10th game of Santos' career making 4+ kicks, the first time doing so since a Week 7 performance at New England in 2022.
- Santos finished the 2022 regular season as the most accurate kicker in Bears history (*min. 80 attempts*), connecting on 78-of-87 attempts in a Bears uniform (89.7%).
- Santos finalized the 2022 season having made 21-of-23 (91.3%) field goal attempts on the season.
- Prior to coming up short on a 56-yard field goal against Atlanta in Week 11, Santos had connected on 21 consecutive field goals dating back to Week 15 of the 2021 season. His 21 consecutive makes are the second-longest streak he'd compiled in his career, trailing a streak of 40 makes during the 2020-21 seasons.
- Santos made four of five kicks from 50+ yards last season. It's the first time he's made four or more from 50+ since going 4-for-8 in 2015 when he was with the Kansas City Chiefs.
- Santos finished the 2020 season connecting on 30-of-32 field goals (93.8), completing the most accurate single-season performance by a Bears kicker.
- Santos went 3-for-3 in field goal attempts against Houston in Week 3, including knocking home a game-winning field goal from 30 yards out to secure the 23-20 victory for the Bears.
- Santos has made 185-of-219 (84.5%) career field goals throughout the course of his career, including 14 from 50+ yards or more.

**SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES**



**Special Teams Coordinator Richard Hightower**

- Dating back to Week 1 of the 2020 season, Santos has made 51 consecutive field goals inside of 40 yards. It is the second-longest active streak in the NFL.
- Santos' game-winning field goal against Houston in Week 3 was the first time the Bears had kicked a field goal to score go-ahead points in the final two minutes of regulation since the Bears' Thanksgiving victory at Detroit in Week 12 of the 2021 season. The last time the Bears won in regulation by scoring go-ahead points was during the Bears' Christmas Day victory over the Seahawks in Week 16 of the 2021 season.
- Santos had a streak of 40 consecutive FGs snapped in Week 9 at Pittsburgh last season on a 65-yard attempt as time expired. The streak was a Bears record, the longest active streak in the NFL at the time and tied for the third longest all-time in NFL history.

- Punter **TRENTON GILL** recorded his 25th punt to land inside the 20-yard line in his career on his first punt of the game at Washington. Last season, he had 20 punts land inside the 20-yard line, which ranked 5th among rookie punters.
- Gill finished the 2022 regular season having played in all 17 games in his rookie campaign. He logged 66 punts and compiled a 46.0 average (40.3 Net).
- Gill's 40.3 net average on punts last season sat 0.4 yards shy of matching former Bears punter Pat O'Donnell's 2019 franchise record-setting season where he finished with a single-season net average of 40.7 yards per punt.

- In Week 8 at Dallas, Gill booted four kicks for 203 yards, including a 62-yarder. The 62-yarder was a season-best for the seventh-round draft pick.
- Gill, in 66 attempts last season, downed 20 punts inside opponent's 20-yard line with just three touchbacks.
- Long snapper **PATRICK SCALES** played in his 112th career game against Las Vegas. He is one of two current Bears players to play 100+ games with the Bears (Cody Whitehair- 113).
- In the kick return game, Chicago has seen growth out of draft pick **VELUS JONES JR.**, who owns a 27.6 average on 27 career returns. He finished the 2022 regular season with the 12th-highest single-season kick return average in Bears history (min. 15 attempts).
- Jones recently logged a career-high 110 scrimmage yards in Week 6 vs. Minnesota, passing his previous career mark of 70 scrimmage yards, which came at home vs. Minnesota in Week 18 of the 2022 season. Jones returned the opening kickoff 37 yards. This marked his longest kick return on the season and fifth-longest of his career. His 90 kick return yards on the day were the third-most in his career (114 vs. Green Bay (12/04/2022), 113 vs. Buffalo (12/24/2022)
- As a club in 2022, the Bears special teams game was highlighted by their 26.2 kickoff return average on the season, which led all NFC teams and ranked second overall in the NFL to Indianapolis' 27.8 average.
- The 26.2 kickoff return average on the season was the third-highest return average since the start of the 2000 season, trailing the 2015 Bears special teams unit which averaged 27.0 yards per return and the 2019 Bears' 26.6 average. Deonte Thompson (29.2) and Marc Mariani (26.1) were Chicago's primary returners during the 2015 season and Cordarrelle Patterson (29.5) led the group in 2019.

**UPCOMING MILESTONES**



**Justin Fields | Quarterback**

Fields needs 100 rushing yards to reach 1,900 in his career. He currently ranks second all-time in rush yards among Bears quarterbacks behind only Bobby Douglass (2,470).

Additionally, Fields needs five passing touchdowns to reach 40 in his career and four total touchdowns to reach 50.

This season, Fields ranks T-6th in passing touchdowns (11) and 3rd in rushing yards among quarterbacks (237). He is one of four quarterbacks to rush for at least 230 yards this season (Lamar Jackson-363; Jalen Hurts-275; Josh Dobbs- 232).



**Marcedes Lewis | Tight End**

Lewis needs one touchdown to reach 40 in his career.

By playing in his 18th season, Lewis broke the record for most seasons played by a tight end.

He is one of only three tight ends in NFL history (Tony Gonzalez, Jason Witten) to start 200-plus regular-season games (222) and post 400-plus receptions (433). Among active players, Lewis currently ranks first in games played (258) and second in games started (222).



**T.J. Edwards | Linebacker**

Edwards is 10 tackles away from reaching 450 in his career. He also needs three tackles-for-loss to reach 25 in his career and nine solo tackles to reach 250.

This season, Edwards ranks 4th in the NFL in total tackles (70) and T-10th in solo tackles (37). He leads the Bears in total tackles and is just one of four players in the NFL to have at least 70 tackles this season.

Edwards has lead the Bears in tackles in five of seven games played and has recorded at least seven tackles in six games this season.



**DeMarcus Walker | DL**

Walker needs one tackles-for-loss to reach 30 for his career. He is also one quarterback hit away from reaching 45. Additionally, Walker needs 24 tackles to pass 150 in his career.



**Eddie Jackson | S**

Jackson needs one interception to reach 15 in his career. Among all Bears safeties (since 1940), Jackson ranks T-5th in interceptions, T-2nd in interceptions returned for touchdowns, and 3rd in total interception return yards.



**Jaquan Brisker | DB**

Brisker is one tackles away from reaching 150 in his career. Since the start of last season, Brisker ranks T-6th in the league in total tackles among defensive backs. He is also 0.5 sacks away from reaching 5.0 in his career. Last season, he led the Bears with 4.0 sacks.



**Jaylon Johnson | DB**

Johnson needs 10 tackles to reach 150 for his career. He also needs one tackle-for-loss to reach five in his career and one pass defended to reach 35. Since joining the Bears in 2020, Johnson has recorded 140 tackles (111 solo), 34 PDs, four TFLs, three FFs, three interceptions and one defensive touchdown

## NEW FACES IN 2023 • KEY DEFENSIVE ADDITIONS

### Tremaine Edmunds | LB



Edmunds, 25, spent his first five NFL seasons with the Bills after being selected by Buffalo with the 18th pick in the first round of the 2018 draft out of Virginia Tech.

The 6-5, 250-pounder joined the Bears in March having started all 74 games he's played, registering 565 tackles, 32 tackles-for-loss, 6.5 sacks, five interceptions and two forced fumbles. He has recorded at least 100 tackles in each of his five NFL seasons.

Edmunds was selected to the Pro Bowl in 2019 and 2020, was named a Bills captain in 2019 and has also started eight career playoff games. Last year he opened all 13 games he played, compiling 102 tackles, six tackles-for-loss, one sack and one interception.

### Yannick Ngakoue | DE



Ngakoue, a 6-2, 246 pounder comes to Chicago with six years of experience and previous stops in Indianapolis (2022), Las Vegas (2021), Minnesota (2020), Baltimore (2020) and Jacksonville (2016-19).

Ngakoue joined the Bears in August, having played in 110 games (102 starts), totaling 65.0 sacks, 202 tackles (163 solo), 134 QBH, 65 tackles-for-loss, 21 forced fumbles, 13 passes defended three fumble recoveries, two interceptions and one touchdown.

Most recently in 2022, Ngakoue started in 15 contests for Indianapolis, where he logged 29 tackles (18 solo), 9.5 sacks for minus-62.5 yards, eight tackles for loss and one forced fumble.

He is currently one of just two players to register at least 8.0 sacks in each of the last six seasons.

### DeMarcus Walker | DE



Walker, 28, has six years of NFL experience, most recently playing for the Titans in 2022. The Florida State product was drafted by the Broncos in the second round of the 2017 draft and spent his first four NFL seasons in Denver. In April 2021, he signed with the Texans as a free agent before joining Tennessee in May 2022.

Last season with the Titans, Walker experienced a breakout year, recording several career highs with 32 tackles, 16 quarterback hits, 10 tackles for loss and 7.0 sacks. He also had back-to-back seasons with 30-plus quarterback pressures, racking up 32 in Tennessee.

Prior to his arrival in March, Walker had appeared in 66 games over his six-year career with 13 starts, compiling 114 tackles, 39 quarterback hits, 24 tackles-for-loss, 19.5 sacks and two forced fumbles.

### Andrew Billings | DL



Billings, 28, enters his sixth year in the NFL after originally being selected in the fourth round (122nd overall) of the 2016 NFL Draft. He spent three years in Cincinnati (2017-19) before joining the Cleveland Browns (2021) and Las Vegas Raiders (2022).

A 6-1, 311-pounder, Billings joined the Bears in March having appeared in 67 NFL games (51 starts) while logging 120 tackles (67 solo), 4.5 sacks, 17 tackles for loss and 15 quarterback hurries.

Most recently in 2022, Billings started in all 14 appearances with the Raiders, tallying 39 tackles (18 solo), 1.0 sack, three tackles for loss

### T.J. Edwards | LB



Edwards, 27, spent his first four NFL seasons with the Eagles after originally signing with Philadelphia in 2019 as an undrafted free agent out of Wisconsin.

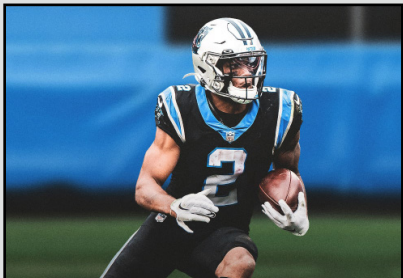
In his four years with Philadelphia, Edwards appeared in 61 regular season games with 47 starts, accruing 370 tackles – 206 solo – 20 tackles-for-loss, 17 quarterback pressures, nine quarterback hits, five sacks, two interceptions, two forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries.

The 6-1, 242-pound linebacker registered a team-high 159 tackles through 17 starts in 2022 which ranked seventh in the league.

Edwards assumed the green dot responsibilities for one of the league's top defenses. Last season while also started in all three playoff games and totaled 13 tackles, including six in the Super Bowl.

**NEW FACES IN 2023 • KEY OFFENSIVE ADDITIONS**

**DJ Moore | WR**



Moore arrives in Chicago after spending his first five NFL seasons with the Carolina Panthers. Selected by Carolina with the 24th pick in the first round of the 2018 draft out of Maryland, he had appeared in 80 games with 73 starts and caught 364 passes for 5,201 yards and 21 touchdowns before joining the Bears in March.

Moore topped 1,100 yards in three straight seasons— with 1,175 in 2019, 1,193 in 2020 and 1,157 in 2021. Last year he had 63 receptions for 888 yards and seven TDs for a Panthers offense that had three quarterbacks all start at least five games: Baker Mayfield, Sam Darnold and P.J. Walker.

**Robert Tonyan | TE**



Tonyan, 29, spent his first five NFL seasons with the Packers, accumulating 1,437 receiving yards on 137 receptions with 17 touchdowns. The tight end appeared in 68 games with 18 starts between 2018 and 2022.

After signing with the Lions as an undrafted free agent out of Indiana State in 2017, Tonyan was released by Detroit after training camp and later picked up by the Packers on Dec. 5.

Tonyan totaled 177 receiving yards on 14 receptions in his first two seasons then broke out in 2020 when he caught 52 passes for a career-high 586 yards and 11 touchdowns, tying the single-season franchise record for the most TD receptions by a tight end. His 11 TDs were tied with Chiefs tight end Travis Kelce for the most in the league in 2020.

**Nate Davis | OL**



Davis, 26, was selected by the Titans in the third round of the 2019 draft out of Charlotte. The 6-3, 316-pounder started 54 of 55 games he played with Tennessee over the past four seasons. He also started five playoff games.

With the Titans, Davis helped opened holes for star running back Derrick Henry. During their four seasons as teammates, Henry was selected to three Pro Bowls, named first-team All-Pro in 2020 and second-team All-Pro in 2019, and led the NFL in both rushing yards and rushing touchdowns in 2019 and 2020.

Davis was born in Maine and grew up in Virginia. He was a four-year letterwinner at Stone Bridge High School in Loudoun County, Va., and a four-year starter at Charlotte.

**D’onta Foreman | RB**



Prior to his arrival in Chicago, Foreman, 27, had appeared in 43 NFL games with 13 starts over five seasons with the Texans (2017-18), Titans (2020-21) and Panthers (2022). The 6-1, 236-pounder has rushed for 1,901 yards and 10 touchdowns on 443 carries and caught 23 passes for 265 yards and two TDs.

Foreman was selected by the Texans in the third round of the 2017 draft out of Texas.

Foreman missed most of the 2018 season while recovering from an achilles injury, playing in just one game Dec. 23.

After sitting out the 2019 season, he was signed to the Titans practice squad Sept. 29, 2020, and ultimately appeared in six games, rushing for 95 yards and three TDs on 22 carries.

**Marcedes Lewis | TE**



Before joining the Bears, Lewis had played 17 NFL seasons with the Jaguars (2006-17) and Packers (2018-22), appearing in 251 games with 221 starts and catching 432 passes for 5,084 yards and 39 touchdowns. The 6-6, 267-pounder is also considered one of the league’s best blocking tight ends.

Lewis was selected by the Jaguars with the 28th pick in the first round of the 2006 draft out of UCLA. The California native spent his first 12 NFL seasons with Jacksonville, earning Pro Bowl and second-team All-Pro honors in 2010 after establishing career highs with 58 receptions, 700 yards and 10 TDs.

Entering his 18th NFL season, Lewis seeks to break the record for most seasons played by a tight end, which he currently shares with Tony Gonzalez and Jason Witten at 17.



## NEW FACES IN 2023 • 2023 DRAFT CLASS

**Darnell Wright | OL • Tennessee****First Round (10th Overall)**

The Bears traded down from No. 9 to 10 in the first round of the NFL Draft and selected Tennessee offensive tackle Darnell Wright. In the deal, the Bears obtained a fourth-round choice in next year's draft from the Eagles.

Wright appeared in 47 games with 42 starts over four seasons at Tennessee. The versatile 6-6, 335-pounder did not allow a sack in his final 19 games with the Volunteers. Last year Wright was a unanimous first-team all-SEC selection after starting all 13 games at right tackle. He was one of only 14 FBS offensive linemen with more than 850 snaps played and no sacks allowed with an efficiency of 99.0 or better, according to Pro Football Focus.

**Gervon Dexter Sr. | DL • Florida****Second Round (53rd Overall)**

The Bears bolstered their defense by choosing Florida defensive tackle Gervon Dexter Sr. with the 53rd pick in the second round of the draft.

The 6-6, 312-pounder appeared in 36 games with 24 starts over three seasons with the Gators, registering 125 tackles, 10.5 tackles-for-loss, 5.0 sacks and two interceptions. Last season Dexter started all 13 contests, compiling a career-high 55 tackles, 4.0 tackles-for-loss, 2.0 sacks and one interception.

Dexter played the three-technique position at Florida, an integral spot in the Bears defense under coach Matt Eberflus and defensive coordinator Alan Williams.

**Tyrique Stevenson | CB • Miami****Second Round (56th Overall)**

The Bears moved up to No. 56 in the second round of the NFL Draft and selected Miami cornerback Tyrique Stevenson. The Bears sent the 61st overall pick and a fifth-round pick (No. 136 overall) to Jacksonville in the deal.

In his junior and senior seasons at Miami, Stevenson totaled 68 tackles, 4.0 tackles-for-loss, 14 passes defended and three interceptions. In 2022, he was selected Third-Team All-ACC and in 2021 was an All-ACC honorable mention.

Before his time with the Hurricanes, the 6-foot, 204-pounder spent his freshman and sophomore seasons at Georgia, recording 47 tackles, two TFLs and five passes defended.

**Zach Pickens | DL • South Carolina****Third Round (64th Overall)**

The Bears added to the defense by selecting South Carolina defensive tackle Zach Pickens with the 64th pick in the third round of the draft.

The 6-4, 300-pounder appeared in 47 games with 32 starts in four seasons for the Gamecocks, registering 131 tackles, 11.5 tackles-for-loss and 7.5 sacks.

Last year, Pickens was honored as South Carolina's Most Outstanding Senior, team MVP and defensive MVP. He also was presented the Rex Enright Team Captains Award after starting all 12 games and registering 42 tackles, 4.0 tackles-for-loss and 2.5 sacks.

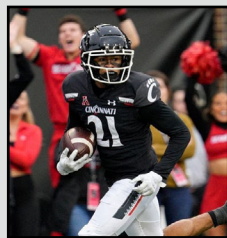
**Roschon Johnson | RB • Texas****Fourth Round (115th Overall)**

The Bears added to their offense on Day 3 of the NFL Draft, selecting Texas running back Roschon Johnson with the 115th overall pick.

The 6-2, 225-pounder played in 47 career games through four seasons with the Longhorns, making five starts. Johnson ranks 18th on Texas' all-time rushing list with 2,190 yards on 392 carries. The Port Arthur, Texas native tallied 23 career rushing touchdowns during his time with the Longhorns.

Johnson played with star running back Bijan Robinson, who was selected No. 8 overall by the Falcons, for three years at Texas. While Robinson served as the Longhorns' starter during that time, Johnson didn't let that alter his habits.

**Tyler Scott | WR • Cincinnati**

**Fourth Round (133rd Overall)**

The Bears selected Cincinnati receiver Tyler Scott with the 133rd pick in the fourth round of the draft.

The speedy 5-11, 185-pounder appeared in 30 games in three seasons with the Bearcats, catching 87 passes for 1,439 yards and 14 touchdowns. Last season Scott was named second-team American Athletic Conference after establishing career highs in all receiving categories with 54 receptions, 899 yards and nine TDs.

After playing running back throughout his career at Norton High School in Ohio, Scott was switched to receiver upon arriving at Cincinnati in 2020.



**Noah Sewell | LB • Oregon**

**Fifth Round (148th Overall)**

The Bears selected their first defensive player of Day 3 by picking Oregon linebacker Noah Sewell with the 148th pick in of the draft.

The 6-2, 253-pounder played in 33 games for the Ducks and made 31 starts in three seasons. Sewell recorded 215 career tackles, 19.5 tackles-for-loss, 7.5 sacks, 11 passes defended, three forced fumbles and two interceptions.

As a sophomore in 2022, Sewell was selected to the Pac-12 All-Conference second team by coaches and made the Phil Steele All-Pac-12 first team. He was also a Polyne-sian College Football Player of the Year Finalist and a Butkus Award semifinalist.



**Terell Smith | DB • Minnesota**

**Fifth Round (165th Overall)**

The Bears picked Minnesota cornerback Terell Smith with the 165th selection in the fifth round of the draft.

The 6-1, 215-pounder played in 37 games over five seasons for the Golden Gophers, registering 109 tackles, 6.5 tackles-for-loss, four interceptions and 16 pass breakups. Last year Smith was named Honorable Mention all-Big Ten after starting all 13 contests and producing 38 tackles, 4.5 tackles-for-loss, two interceptions and five pass breakups.



**Travis Bell | DL • Kennesaw State**

**Seventh Round (218th Overall)**

The Bears drafted Kennesaw State defensive lineman Travis Bell in the seventh round with the No. 218 overall pick. With the selection, Bell became the first NFL Draft pick in Kennesaw State history.

The 6-0, 310-pounder spent five years with the Owls, playing in 44 games and totaling 11 sacks and 24.5 tackles-for-loss.

In 2022 as a graduate student, he totaled a career-high 30 tackles and 1.5 sacks. As a senior in 2021, Bell was named to the All-Big South Conference Second Team.



**Kendall Williamson | DB • Stanford**

**Seventh Round (258th Overall)**

With the second-to-last pick in the draft, the Bears selected Stanford safety Kendall Williamson in the seventh round at No. 258 overall.

The 6-foot, 203-pounder appeared in 44 games over five seasons for the Cardinal, compiling 213 tackles, 11.0 tackles-for-loss, 1.5 sacks, one interception, 13 pass breakups, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery.

Last season Williamson played in 10 contests and recorded 50 tackles, 2.5 tackles-for-loss, one interception, three pass breakups and one forced fumble.

### CHICAGO BEARS est. 1920



#### DID YOU KNOW?

The Bears are one of two charter members of the NFL that still exist (along with the Arizona Cardinals). The franchise started in 1920 in Decatur, Ill. as the Decatur Staleys of the American Professional Football Association, which would become the NFL in 1922.

#### TEAM HISTORY

- The Bears played in Wrigley Field, the famous home of the Chicago Cubs baseball team, from 1921 to 1970.
- The Bears' oldest rivalry is with the Arizona Cardinals. The two teams played each other for the first time in 1920.
- The Bears were the first team to buy a player from another team, paying \$100 for Ed Healey from Rock Island in 1922.
- The Bears won four NFL championships in the 1940s, including a 73-0 victory over Washington in 1940.
- Despite winning nearly 60 percent of their games in the 1950s, the Bears did not win an NFL title and made only one playoff appearance. They finally broke a 17-year championship drought with a 14-10 win over the New York Giants in 1963.
- The Bears won their first and only Super Bowl in 1986 when they defeated the New England Patriots, 46-10.

#### TEAM HISTORY

- The Chargers were founded by Barron Hilton in Los Angeles in 1959. Due to competition from the Los Angeles Rams, the team moved 120 miles south to San Diego in 1961.
- As part of the AFL, the Chargers enjoyed high-scoring years from 1961 to 1965, winning four AFL West titles and one AFL championship.
- When coach Don Coryell took over in 1978, the Chargers went on to win the AFC West division in 1979, 1980, and 1981 and made two AFC Championships.
- In 2016, the Chargers announced that they were moving back to Los Angeles for the 2017 season after 56 years in San Diego.

**Game Recap: Bears fall to Chargers 17-16**

**Mitchell Trubisky vs. Los Angeles, 2019**

22-yard field goal, taking a 3-0 lead early in the second quarter.

With the defense continuing to hold the Chargers in check, the Bears marched from their own 29 to the Los Angeles 9, thanks in part to Trubisky's pinpoint 35-yard pass to Miller. But the Bears once again were unable to score a touchdown, instead settling for Pineiro's 25-yard field goal that gave them a 6-0 lead with 4:16 remaining in the second quarter.

The Chargers responded quickly to take a 7-6 lead. On back-to-back plays, Rivers completed a 43-yard pass to Mike Williams—who split Fuller and Eddie Jackson—and Melvin Gordon followed with a 19-yard touchdown run.

The Bears answered as David Montgomery burst through the line for a 55-yard run, the team's longest play from scrimmage of the season. But they once again failed to get into the end zone, this time on four plays from inside the 5.

Pineiro's 19-yard field goal as time expired in the first half gave the Bears a 9-7 lead, but they were booed by their fans heading into the locker room.

While failing to get into the end zone in the first half, the Bears offense performed much better than it had in recent games, compiling 218 yards and 13 first downs while possessing the ball for 19:22.

The Bears finally got into the end zone when they opened the second half with an impressive 11-play, 75-yard drive that culminated in Montgomery's 4-yard TD run, which widened the margin to 16-7. Trubisky completed an 8-yard pass to Miller on fourth-and-one and a 31-yarder to Allen Robinson II to the 4.

The Chargers responded by matching the length of the field before settling for Chase McLaughlin's 20-yard field goal, which cut the deficit to 16-10 with :37 left in the third quarter. The kick came after Trevathan and Roquan Smith teamed up to stop Austin Ekeler for no gain on third-and-goal from the 2.

The Chargers had a golden opportunity to take the lead when Casey Hayward intercepted Trubisky's underthrown pass intended for Trey Burton and returned the pick 38 yards to the Bears' 20.

But Allen dropped what would have been a 24-yard touchdown reception and McLaughlin missed a 42-yard field-goal attempt wide right.

Trubisky then committed a turnover for the second straight possession, losing his grasp of the ball while scrambling to avoid the pass rush.

The Chargers recovered the fumble at the Bears' 26 and converted the takeaway into the go-ahead points as Ekeler caught an 11-yard touchdown pass from Rivers to put Los Angeles ahead 17-16.

**NOTING THE 2023 SCHEDULE****NFC NORTH OPENER**

The Bears opened up the 2023 schedule at home versus the Green Bay Packers in Week 1. It marked the 20th meeting between the two clubs in Week 1 and the fifth time opening up at Soldier Field. The Sept. 10 matchup was the first time since a 2019 meeting at Soldier Field that the two teams met in Week 1. It was also just the fourth daytime meeting between the two clubs in a season-opener dating back to the start of the 1920 season, with the most recent matchup coming in 2015.

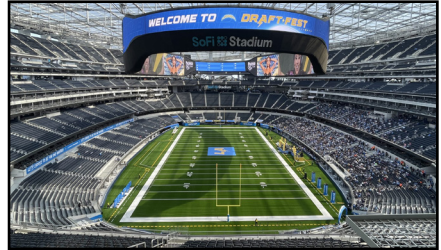
The Bears own 57 opening day victories (57-43-5), the second-most by any NFL franchise (Green Bay; 59-41-3).

**BEARS TAKE ON NFC SOUTH, AFC WEST DIVISIONS**

Chicago will square off against all four teams from the NFC South and AFC West Divisions this season in addition to the Cleveland Browns (away), Arizona Cardinals (home) and Washington Commanders (away). Chicago last faced the NFC South in 2020, going 3-1 with wins against the Falcons, Buccaneers and Panthers and a loss vs. the Saints. The last time Chicago played the AFC West was also in 2019, going 1-3 with a win against the Broncos, and losses to the Chargers, Chiefs and Raiders. The Bears traveled to Kansas City for the first time since the 2015 season. The Bears-Chargers meeting in Los Angeles will be the first-ever West coast meeting between the two clubs inside SoFi Stadium.

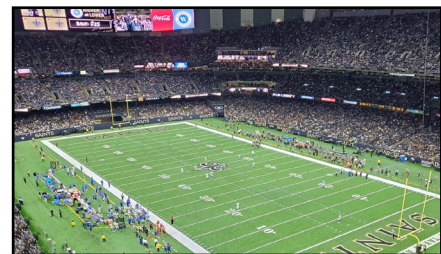
The Bears will make a trip to SoFi Stadium in Week 8 for an October 29 matchup with the Los Angeles Chargers. It will mark the club's third appearance inside SoFi stadium and the first time playing the Chargers in Los Angeles. The Bears last played a road contest versus the Chargers in 2015, then playing at Qualcomm Stadium in San Diego.

From October 23 to December 9, the Bears will have played one home game, a Week 10 matchup with the Carolina Panthers. After hosting the Las Vegas Raiders on October 22, the Bears will make road trips in consecutive weeks to face the Los Angeles Chargers and New Orleans Saints, host Carolina, and then travel to Detroit and Minnesota before a Week 13 Bye Week. The Bears will host Detroit coming out of the bye and travel to Cleveland in Week 15 before hosting two of three games at home to close out the season. The Arizona Cardinals will come to Chicago on Christmas Eve and the Atlanta Falcons will come to Chicago on New Years Eve.

**LATE BYE WEEK**

The Bears will enjoy their bye in Week 13, the second to last week a team can have a bye week. Dating Back to the start of the 1999 season, this marks the third-latest bye week for the Bears after having Week 14 Bye Weeks in 2022 and 1999. The last three years the Bears have had byes in Week 14 (2022), Week 10 (2021) and Week 11 (2020).

The Bears will only leave Chicago once throughout the month of December. They will host the Detroit Lions in Week 14, travel to Cleveland in Week 15 and host consecutive home games with the Arizona Cardinals (Week 16) and Atlanta Falcons (Week 17).

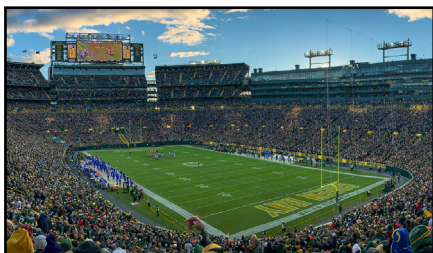
**SEASON FINALE IN GREEN BAY**

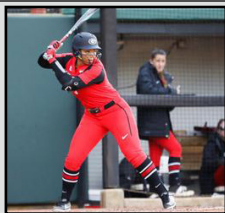

Bears quarterback Justin Fields is the brother of collegiate softball player Jaiden Fields. Jaiden, entering her graduate senior season at the University of Georgia, has played in 115 games (96 starts) with the Bulldogs over the course of her career, playing both in the outfield and at first base. Jaiden helped Georgia to its fifth appearance in the Women's College World Series in 2021, with seven home runs and a .315 batting average on the season.



**Equanimeous & Amon-Ra St. Brown**

Bears wide receiver Equanimeous St. Brown is the oldest of three brothers, each of whom have played at the collegiate level or higher. Their father, John Brown, is also a bodybuilder who has won two Mr. Universe and three Mr. World Championships. Osiris, the middle child, was a member of the Stanford University football team from 2017-20. Amon-Ra, the youngest of the trio, played at the University of Southern California from 2018-20, where he racked up 178 career catches for 2,270 yards (12.8 avg) and 16 TDs. Amon-Ra went on to be selected in the fourth round (112th overall) of the 2021 NFL Draft by the Detroit Lions, where he posted 90 catches for 912 yards and five touchdowns in his rookie season.



**Khalil Herbert and Brothers, Khari & Treyvion**

Bears running back Khalil Herbert has two siblings with experience competing in collegiate athletics: Khari Herbert and Treyvion Foster. Khari competed in track & field at Saint Augustine's University in Raleigh, North Carolina, as a sprinter both during his undergraduate and graduate studies (2015-17). Treyvion played wide receiver at Stanford University for two seasons (2015-16). Khalil, the youngest of the trio, played running back at both the University of Kansas (2016-19) and Virginia Tech (2020).



**Tremaine Edmunds & Family**

Bears linebacker Tremaine Edmunds is one of three second-generation Edmunds to play in the National Football League, following in the steps of their father, Ferrell, a two-time Pro Bowl tight end for seven NFL seasons with the Miami Dolphins (1988-92) and Seattle Seahawks (1993-94).

The three brothers were all in high school together for one year. Tremaine, 25, and Terrell, 26, would eventually become the first pair of brothers to be selected in the first round of the NFL Draft (2018). Older brother Trey, 28, a running back, had entered the league a year earlier as an undrafted free agent with the Saints.



**Jack & Bryan Sanborn**

Bears rookie linebacker Jack Sanborn is the brother of University of Wisconsin linebacker Bryan Sanborn. Bryan, who enters his redshirt sophomore season, was on the same roster as his brother during the 2021 season. The duo hail from the Chicago suburbs as well, both having attended Lake Zurich High School in Lake Zurich, Ill.



**Dave & Mike Borgonzi**

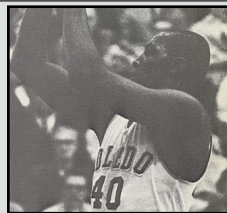

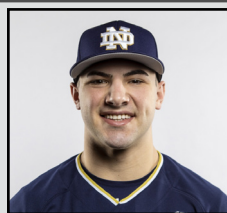

**Dominique Robinson & Family**

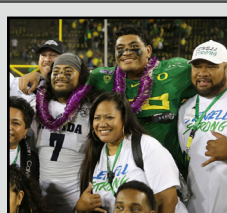

Prior to his arrival in Chicago, Bears general manager Ryan Poles spent 13 seasons within the Kansas City Chiefs organization. In total, Poles helped guide the Chiefs to two Super Bowl appearances, one title, two AFC championships and seven AFC West division championships. The Chiefs made two Super Bowl appearances during Poles' time in Kansas City, claiming Super Bowl LIV with a 31-20 win over San Francisco. The Chiefs returned to the main stage the following season but came up short, 31-9, to the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. Holding several front office roles, his final season with the Chiefs in 2021 was also his first as the club's Executive Director of Player Personnel. Prior to the 2021 season, he spent three years as the club's Assistant Director of Player Personnel (2018-20), one season as the Director of College Scouting (2017), four seasons as the College Scouting Coordinator (2013-16) and three seasons as the College Scouting Administrator (2010-12). Poles originally joined the Chiefs in 2009 as the team's Player Personnel Assistant.

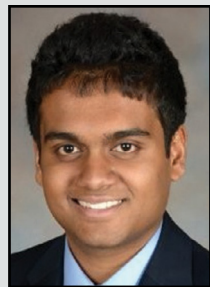
**Tyke Tolbert | Pass Game Coordinator/Wide Receivers**

Ryan Poles enters his second season in Chicago after being named the club's seventh general manager in franchise history on Jan. 25, 2022.

Poles, 37, recently completed his first season with the Bears where he and head coach Matt Eberflus were instrumental in restructuring the club's roster to not only make the team younger, but also setup to remain competitive for the coming years. With one of the youngest on-field rosters in 2022, the Bears posted a league-high 6,721 snaps from first-year players. Offensively, the club finished the 2022 season with record-setting rushing performances from quarterback Justin Fields, while also setting a team rushing record with a league-best 3,019 rushing yards, the most ever by a Bears offense since the start of the 1920 NFL season. Defensively, with the youngest on-field defense in the NFL, the club finished the season ranked among the Top-10 in several categories: completions allowed (323, 6th), interception percentage (2.9%, 8th), interception yards (201, 9th) and fourth down conversions (six, 1st) to name a few.

Chicago opened the 2022 season with several new faces on the roster following a mix of trades, free agent signings and waiver claims. The Bears Week 1 roster featured 11 rookie debuts, the most by any team in the NFL this past season. Part of the young roster was credited to Poles' 2022 draft class, which featured 11 selections in total. The club's 2023 draft class also featured a large group with 10 total selections. The 2022-23 Bears draft classes were the first time since the start of the modern seven-round draft era that the Bears had consecutive classes with 10+ picks.

As the club enters the 2023 season, it will include a mix of veteran talent acquired through both trades and free agency. Offensively, Poles added depth to the wide receiver room when the club struck a deal with Carolina, sending the club's No. 1 overall draft pick to the Panthers in exchange for several picks and veteran wide receiver DJ Moore. Chicago's 2023 free agent class on the defensive side of the ball was highlighted by linebackers Tremaine Edmunds and T.J. Edwards in addition to defensive lineman DeMarcus Walker, each of whom bring added veteran experience to a young roster.

Prior to his arrival in Chicago, Poles spent 13 years within the Kansas City Chiefs front office. In his 13th and final season with the Chiefs in 2021, he was named the club's Executive Director of Player Personnel. Prior to the 2021 season, Poles served for three seasons as the club's Assistant Director of Player Personnel (2018-20), a season as the Director of College Scouting (2017), four seasons as the College Scouting Coordinator (2013-16) and three seasons as the College Scouting Administrator (2010-12). Poles originally joined the Chiefs in 2009 as the team's Player Personnel Assistant.

During his 13 years in Kansas City the Chiefs captured one Super Bowl title, two AFC championships and seven AFC West division championships.

Poles oversaw all aspects of the college scouting across the country for the Chiefs while assisting with the pro personnel process and preparing for free agency. He also assisted General Manager Brett Veach with the coordination of the NFL Draft and overseeing the team's out-of-town area scouts. Poles was instrumental in helping the Chiefs land top draft prospects such as All-Pro Patrick Mahomes and Travis Kelce. In 2021, the Chiefs tied for second in the NFL with six Pro Bowl selections in Mahomes, Kelce, Tyreek Hill, Orlando Brown, Chris Jones and Tyrann Mathieu and tied for first in the NFL with seven selections in 2020. In total, from 2009-21, the Chiefs had 69 Pro Bowl selections with 28 different players.

Prior to joining the Chiefs, Poles served as a Recruiting Assistant for his alma mater, Boston College (2008-09), after signing with the Chicago Bears as an undrafted free agent in 2008.

The Canandaigua, N.Y., native played offensive tackle for five seasons for Boston College (2003-07), protecting former NFL QB Matt Ryan and playing alongside Bears Co-Director of Player Personnel, Trey Koziol. Poles was honored with the Paul Cavanaugh Award in 2007 as the student-athlete with total commitment to football both on and off the field and for his dedication to volunteerism, ethics and community. He played his prep football at Canandaigua Academy in Canandaigua, N.Y.

Poles also was named to two "40 Under 40" lists in the past three years: Ingram's Magazine in 2019 and by The Athletic in 2021.

Poles graduated from Boston College in 2007 with a degree in Communications. He and his wife, Katie, have two children: Mason and Jordyn.

Ian Cunningham enters his second season in Chicago after being named Assistant General Manager on Jan. 29, 2022.

Cunningham brings 14 years of NFL front office experience to the Bears' personnel staff. He comes to Chicago after most recently serving as Director of Player Personnel for the Philadelphia Eagles, a position he was promoted to at the beginning of the 2021 season. Prior to his promotion, Cunningham worked as the Assistant Director of Player Personnel (2019-20) and oversaw the college scouting department from 2017-18 as the Director of College Scouting.

A two-time Super Bowl Champion (XLVII and LII) as a member of the Baltimore Ravens' and Eagles' front office, Cunningham's NFL front office career began in 2008 when he was hired in Baltimore as a Player Personnel Assistant. After five seasons as an assistant, he worked as a Southeast Area Scout for the Ravens for two seasons (2013-14) before taking on additional responsibility as the Southeast/Southwest Area Scout from 2015-16.

As the Director of College Scouting during the 2017-18 seasons in Philadelphia, Cunningham was instrumental in both identifying and selecting several key members of the Eagles' current roster, including TE Dallas Goedert, CB Avonte Maddox, OL Jordan Mailata, DE Josh Sweat and undrafted free agent linebacker, T.J. Edwards. Collectively, the group has accounted for 236 games played and 138 starts over the past four seasons.

The 2019 season marked Cunningham's first as Philadelphia's Assistant Director of Player Personnel, a promotion he held for two seasons before the club named him Director of Player Personnel at the start of the 2021 season. The Eagles' 2021 Draft class featured two Top-40 picks in Devonta Smith (1st, 40th overall) and Landon Dickerson (2nd, 37th overall). Both emerged as key contributors to the Philadelphia offense making a combined 29 regular-season starts. Smith appeared in all 17 games and made 16 starts, immediately becoming the team's top target with team-leading figures in receptions (64), receiving yards (916) and receiving touchdowns (10). Smith's 916 receiving yards also broke an Eagles rookie record, passing Desean Jackson's 912 receiving yards in 2008. Dickerson also proved worthy of being a top selection, making 14 starts on an offensive line that helped the Eagles average a league-best 159.7 rushing yards per game. Dickerson appeared in 859 offensive snaps and allowed just two sacks on the season.

Prior to joining the front office ranks, Cunningham was an offensive lineman who signed with the Kansas City Chiefs in 2008 as an undrafted free agent. He graduated from the University of Virginia in 2007 with a bachelor's degree in psychology, before going on to earn his master's in education in 2008. A four-year letter recipient for the Cavaliers, Cunningham tallied 31 starts and earned honorable mention freshman All-America accolades from Rivals.com as well as ACC All-Freshman Team recognition from The Sporting News.

Cunningham is originally from Carrollton, Texas, where he attended Hebron High School. The high school standout earned numerous all-state and all-area honors and participated in the 2003 U.S. Army All-American game.

Matt Eberflus enters his second year in Chicago after being named the 17th head coach in franchise history on January 27th, 2022. Eberflus enters the 2023 season with 31 years of coaching experience, including 14 in the National Football League.

In his first year as head coach, Eberflus' partnership with Ryan Poles was instrumental in the organization's restructure of the club's staff, roster and overall culture. The Bears found success in several areas throughout the 2022 season: On the offensive side of the ball, the Bears finished the 2022 season with record-setting rushing performances from quarterback Justin Fields while also setting a team franchise rushing record with a league-high 3,019 rushing yards, the most ever by a Bears offense since the start of the 1920 NFL season.

Defensively, Eberflus helped guide the youngest on-field roster in the NFL, as Bears defensive rookies led all teams with 3,538 total snaps. Despite a young roster, the Bears' defense finished the season ranked among the Top-10 in several categories: completions allowed (323, 6th), interception percentage (2.9%, 8th), interception yards (201, 9th) and fourth down conversions (6, 1st) to name a few. Individually, safety Eddie Jackson saw a bounce-back season prior to being placed on IR. In Weeks 1-12 before suffering an injury, Jackson ranked third among all NFL safeties in solo tackles (59), fifth in total tackles (80) and his four interceptions were tied for second in the NFL and the most by a Bears safety since the start of the 1991 season.

Prior to his arrival in Chicago, Eberflus had most recently completed his fourth season as defensive coordinator for the Indianapolis Colts in 2021. Under Eberflus the Colts were the only NFL defensive unit to be ranked in the top-10 in scoring, run defense and takeaways in each of the past two seasons. The Colts finished in the top-10 in the NFL in run defense and takeaways in all four of his years, top-10 in scoring defense in three of the four and were the least penalized defense in the league in 2019 and 2021.

Eberflus' impact in Indianapolis was immediate. After inheriting a Colts defense that finished 30th in the NFL in both scoring and total yards in 2017, Eberflus helped the unit improve to 10th in scoring and 11th in yards in his first year in 2018. After finishing with a 4-12 record in 2017, the Colts rebounded to earn a wild card berth with a 10-6 mark in 2018, beating the Texans in the first round of the playoffs before losing to the Chiefs in the divisional round.

With a coaching background rooted in the linebacker position, Eberflus helped develop linebacker Darius Leonard into one of the most productive linebackers in the NFL. Since being selected by the Colts in the second round of the 2018 NFL Draft, Leonard is a three-time Associated Press All-Pro and three-time Pro Bowler. His career totals include 538 tackles, 30 tackles for loss, 15.0 sacks, 11 interceptions, 30 passes defended, 17 forced fumbles and seven fumble recoveries. Leonard went on to win 2018 AP Defensive Rookie of the Year in 2018 under Eberflus' guidance.

In 2021, the Colts tied for first in the NFL in fumble recoveries (14) and tied for third in both interceptions (19) and opponent three-and-out percentage (.227). They also tied for fourth in red zone takeaways (4), ranked fifth overall in forced fumbles (17) and ninth in points allowed (21.5).

Three years ago in 2020, the Colts finished in the top-10 in numerous categories, including total defense (332.1 yards per game, eighth), rush defense (90.5 yards per game, second), interception rate (2.67, eighth), takeaways (25, tied-fifth), first downs allowed per game (20.6, eighth), goal-to-go percentage (70.0, tied-ninth), points per game allowed (22.6, tied-10th) and safeties (three, tied-first). It marked the first time since 1971 that the Colts finished in the top-five in run defense and the first time since 2007 that Indianapolis ranked in the top-10 in total defense.

In 2019, the Indianapolis defense was stout against the run and finished seventh in the league after allowing 97.9 yards per game. It marked the first time that the Colts, who ranked eighth in rush defense in 2018, finished the year ranked in the top-10 in run defense in back-to-back seasons since 1976-77. The Indianapolis defense also ranked in the top-10 in interceptions (15, seventh) and takeaways (23, tied-10th).

In 2018, Eberflus was part of a Colts team that finished with a 10-6 regular season record, won in the AFC Wild Card Round and had an appearance in the AFC Divisional Round. Indianapolis became the third team in NFL history to start a season 1-5 and make the playoffs. Additionally, the Colts were the second team in NFL history to start a



season 1-5 and win a playoff game.

Inheriting a defensive roster infused with youth in 2018, Eberflus guided a Colts defense that finished 11th in the league in total defense. The unit also ranked eighth in rush defense, which was the team's best mark since 1995 (sixth). Indianapolis finished 10th in the NFL in points allowed and registered the second-most tackles for loss in the league (91). The Colts were one of only three teams to not allow a 100-yard rusher despite facing five of the top-10 rushers in the NFL. The Indianapolis defense forced at least one turnover in a league-most 15 games, including multiple turnovers in seven games. They also forced a turnover in each postseason contest. For his efforts, Eberflus finished third in the voting for the 2018 Associated Press NFL Assistant Coach of the Year.

Eberflus began his NFL career with the Browns as a linebackers coach (2009-10) before spending seven seasons with the Cowboys as linebackers coach (2011-17)—and adding passing game coordinator to his duties in 2016-17.

From 2016-17, the Cowboys boasted one of the league's best rushing defenses, including No. 1 overall in 2016. In 2017, he guided a linebacker group that accounted for 34 percent of the tackles for the league's No. 8 ranked defense (318.1 yards per game) and rushing defense (104.0 yards per game).

In 2011, Eberflus' first season in Dallas, he inherited a group that was spearheaded by All-Pro DeMarcus Ware, who registered 19.5 sacks, good for second in the NFC and the NFL and tops amongst all linebackers in the league, en route to his sixth consecutive selection as a Pro Bowl starter.

Before entering the NFL, Eberflus was a college coach for 17 years. He started his career at Toledo, his alma mater, as a student assistant (1992), graduate assistant (1993), outside linebackers coach (1994-98), defensive backs coach (1999-2000) and recruiting coordinator (1994-95).

After leaving Toledo, Eberflus spent eight seasons as defensive coordinator at Missouri from 2001-08, serving as the team's associate head coach/defensive coordinator/safeties coach (2006-08) and defensive coordinator/defensive backs coach (2001-05). While with Missouri, Eberflus helped guide the Tigers to the Big 12 North Division title in 2007 and 2008, compiling a 22-6 record over that span.

As a player, Eberflus was a four-year letterman and three-year starting linebacker at Toledo. He earned first-team All-MAC honors and led his team in tackles as both a junior and senior. As a senior he was voted team captain and was awarded the Nicholson Award as the team's Most Valuable Player. Eberflus earned a degree in education in 1993 and was inducted into Toledo's Athletic Hall of Fame in 2004.

Eberflus and his wife, Kelly, have two daughters, Grace and Giada.

**Walter Payton Man of the Year Nominee | Jaylon Johnson**

**Brian Piccolo Award | Jack Sanborn**

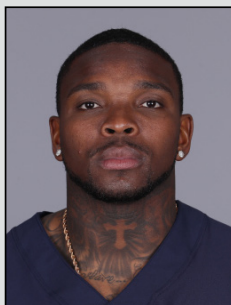


Bears players vote for teammates who best exemplify the courage, loyalty, teamwork, dedication and sense of humor of Brian Piccolo, a Bears running back who died from embryonal cell carcinoma on June 16, 1970, at the age of 26.

Sanborn signed with the Bears last year as an undrafted free agent from Wisconsin. The Lake Zurich, Ill., native excelled after becoming a starter following the midseason trade of linebacker Roquan Smith to the Ravens. Before sustaining a season-ending ankle injury in Week 15, Sanborn made six consecutive starts and recorded 59 tackles, five tackles-for-loss, 2.0 sacks and one fumble recovery.

Sanborn was the Bears' first undrafted rookie to win the Piccolo award since Mickey Pruitt in 1988. Asked about his journey, Sanborn said: "When I look back on it, it's very humbling, very humbling to be here and at the same time I know there's still a lot of work to be done."

**Ed Block Courage Award | Eddie Jackson**



The prestigious awards are presented to one player on all 32 NFL teams who best exemplifies a commitment to sportsmanship and courage and serves as an inspiration in the locker room. The award recipients, who are voted for by their teammates, symbolize professionalism, great strength and dedication, and they are considered community role models.

**2023 HALL OF FAME NOMINEES**

**Sixteen former Bears nominated for Hall of Fame**



Sixteen former Bears players are among 173 Modern-Era nominees for the Pro Football Hall of Fame's Class of 2024.

The group is led by record-breaking return specialist **Devin Hester**, who has been one of 15 Modern-Era finalists each of the past two years.

Four primary former Bears named Modern-Era nominees include center **Olin Kreutz**, linebacker **Lance Briggs**, cornerback **Charles Tillman** and receiver **Brandon Marshall**, who's in his first year of eligibility.

Other Modern-Era nominees who played for the Bears but spent most of their careers with other teams are quarterback **Doug Flutie**; running backs **Thomas Jones** and **Glynn Milburn**; receiver **Muhsin Muhammad**; guards **Ruben Brown** and **Josh Sitton**; defensive ends **Julius Peppers** and **Jared Allen**; defensive tackle **Ted Washington**; linebacker **Brendon Ayanbadejo** and punter **Brad Maynard**.

In addition, nineteen Finalists will be presented to the full 50-member Pro Football Hall of Fame Selection Committee during its annual meeting to choose the Class of 2024. Those candidates will consist of 15 Modern-Era Players Finalists, the recently named Seniors Finalists Randy Gradishar, **Steve McMichael** and Art Powell and Coach/Contributor Finalist Buddy Parker.

**DEVIN HESTER**



Devin Hester was selected as one of 15 modern-era finalists for the Pro Football Hall of Fame's Class of 2023 After playing eight of his 11 NFL seasons with the Bears. The most prolific return specialist in league history, he holds NFL records with 19 kick-return touchdowns, 14 punt-return TDs and 20 return touchdowns, which includes punts, kickoffs, missed field goals, fumbles and interceptions.

Selected by the Bears in the second round of the 2006 draft out of Miami, he was voted to three Pro Bowls, won 13 special teams player of the week awards and was named to the NFL's All-Decade Team for the 2000s.

**STEVE MCMICHAEL**



Steve McMichael has been named one of three Senior finalists for the Pro Football Hall of Fame's Class of 2024. McMichael played 13 seasons with the Bears from 1981-93, appearing in a franchise-record 191 straight games. The charismatic Texas native affectionately known as "Mongo" ranks second in team history with 92.5 sacks, helped the Bears win six division champions and was an instrumental part of the 1985 Super Bowl XX championship defense that many consider to be the best in NFL history.

Individually, McMichael was a two-time first-team All-Pro, a three-time second-team All-Pro and a two-time Pro Bowler. He was named the 19th best player in Bears history in 2019 by writers of the Chicago Bears Centennial scrapbook. McMichael's 95.0 career sacks rank fourth in NFL history by a defensive tackle.

## 2023 HALL OF FAME NOMINEES

### OLIN KREUTZ



Olin Kreutz was chosen by the Bears in the third round of the 1998 draft out of Washington. He was voted to six Pro Bowls during his 13 seasons in Chicago from 1998-2010, anchoring the offensive line while winning four division championships and one conference title.

The Washington product appeared in 191 games with 183 starts with the Bears, one shy of Hall of Fame running back Walter Payton's franchise record.

Kreutz's 191 games as a Bear rank second in Bears history to long snapper Patrick Mannelly, while his 183 starts are one behind all-time Bears leader Walter Payton.

### LANCE BRIGGS



The Chicago Bears selected Briggs in the third round (68th overall) of the 2003 NFL Draft.

During his 12 years in Chicago from 2003 to 2014, Briggs had appeared in 173 NFL games (170 starts), logging 15.0 sacks, 16 interceptions, 84 passes defended and 18 forced fumbles.

He also appeared in six postseason games for the Bears, highlighted by the club's Super Bowl run following the 2006 regular season.

Briggs was a seven-time Pro Bowler, appearing in the league's annual event from 2005-2011.

A Sacramento native, he played collegiately at the University of Arizona from 1999-2002.

### CHARLES TILLMAN



Charles Tillman served as the Chicago Bears' number one corner and anchored the secondary of numerous elite defenses that carried Chicago to a Super Bowl berth in 2006 and NFC Championship game in 2010.

He set team records with nine defensive touchdowns, eight interception return TDs and 675 interception return yards. His 36 interceptions are the most by a cornerback in team history and third most overall behind safeties Gary Fencik (38) and Richie Petitbon (37).

Known for smacking the ball away from opponents, a technique dubbed the "Peanut Punch," Tillman forced 42 fumbles in 12 seasons, including a career-high 10 in 2012 when he was voted to his second straight Pro Bowl.

### BRANDON MARSHALL



Brandon Marshall, who made 970 receptions for 12,351 yards and 83 TDs, had 279 receptions and 31 touchdowns over three seasons in Chicago, reaching the Pro Bowl in 2012 and 2013 and finishing with 3,524 receiving yards as a member of the team. His 118 catches for 1,508 yards in 2012 are both franchise records.

**PRO CAREER:** Enters his third season with the Bears in 2023...Selected by the Bears with the 11th overall pick in the first round of the 2021 NFL Draft; the Bears acquired the 11th overall selection after completing a trade with the New York Giants...Became just the third Ohio State quarterback in the common draft era to be selected in the first round of an NFL draft, joining Art Schlichter (No. 4 overall pick in 1982) and Dwayne Haskins (No. 15 overall pick in 2019)...Became the 31st Buckeye to be selected by the Bears and the first since Marcus Freeman in 2009...Has completed 451 of 750 passes for 5,313 yards and 35 touchdowns while rushing for an additional 1,800 yards and 11 scores...Has played in 33 career games (31 starts).

**2023 SEASON (BEARS):** Started in all games...Led all rushers with 59 yards in Week 1 vs. Packers...Surpassed former Bears QB Jim Harbaugh (1,609) for second on the Bears All-Time QB Rushing List...Fields (1,622) now only sits behind Bobby Douglass (2,470)...Completed 24/37 passes for 216 yards and one touchdown, including 10 passes in the first half for 96 yards, the sixth-most passing yards in a first half in his career...Finished Week 6 completing 16-of-29 passes for 211 yards and a touchdown while finding the endzone on a one-yard rush on Chicago's opening drive to cap off a six-play, 75-yard drive...Found former Bears wide receiver Chase Claypool over the middle for a 20-yard touchdown pass, finishing off an eight-play 90-yard drive, the longest so far of the season...Reached 400 career completions in Week 3 against the Chiefs, becoming the fifth Bears quarterback to reach 400 career completions in his first 30 games...Fields finished Week 4 against the Broncos completing 28-of-35 passes for 335 yards and four touchdowns, marking career-highs in all three categories...His 132.7 passer rating also set a new career-high...Completed 16-17 passes for 231 yards and three touchdowns in the first half in Week 4...Per @ESPNStatsInfo, since 2000, Fields' 16-16 start was the most consecutive completions to start a game by any Bears quarterback...Was also the most passing yards for Fields in a first half in his career. Fields' 158.3 quarterback rating was also the highest in a first half of his career...Eclipsed 40 total touchdowns and 30 passing touchdowns for his career with three in the first half (two touchdown passes to tight end Cole Kmet and one to wide receiver DJ Moore)...First quarter passing totals in Week 5 (145 yards) topped his career high in first quarter passing, surpassing the previous mark of 93 yards vs. Detroit in Week 4 of the 2021 season...The 145-yard start is the sixth highest first quarter passing total by any Bears quarterback dating back to 1920, and the most since Jay Cutler in 2011...Fields finished the first half with three touchdown passes for the second straight game...Became the first Bears quarterback since at least 1991 to pass for three-plus first half touchdowns in consecutive weeks. Eclipsed 1,700 rushing yards and 5,000 passing yards in his career in the first quarter...Finished the game completing 15-of-29 passes for 282 yards and four touchdowns and also rushed 11 times for 57 yards...Recorded his 45th career touchdown in the second quarter with a four-yard pass to Kmet and his 35th passing touchdown in the fourth quarter to Moore...Per@SportsCenter: he is the 4th QB since the 1970 merger to have 5,000 passing yards and 1,500 rushing yards within their first 30 QB starts...Reached 1,800 rush yards for his career in Week 6 against the Vikings...Has thrown a touchdown in nine consecutive games.

**2022 SEASON (BEARS):** Started in 15 games during the 2022 season...Helped lead the Bears to a Week 1 victory vs. San Francisco during Week 1, finishing the game with a pair of touchdowns and 121 yards on 8-of-17 passing, also adding 28 yards on the ground...Completed a 51-yard pass to WR Dante Pettis to put Chicago on the board...Dating back to 1920, it was the fourth-longest touchdown pass in a Bears season-opener and the first touchdown of 50-yards or more in Week 1 since 2011 when Matt Forte hauled in a 56-yard completion from Jay Cutler...Added to the scoring column with a second touchdown pass to Equanimeous St. Brown with 12:50 to go in the 4th quarter, marking the ninth passing touchdown of Fields' career...In Week 2 at Green Bay, Fields finished 7-of-11 with 70 yards in the air as well as eight rushes for 20 yards and a touchdown...His touchdown vs. the Packers wrapped up the Bears first drive of the game, a seven-play, 71-yard drive that gave Fields his first rushing score of the season...In Week 3 vs. Houston, finished 8-of-17 with 106 yards while also rushing eight times for 47 yards, he also logged a 29-yard rush...Finished 11-of-22 with 174 passing yards in Week 4 at New York, while also rushing seven times for 52 yards...Completed a 56-yard pass to wide receiver Darnell Mooney (1st, 5:00)...Stands as the longest completion on the season for Fields and the second-longest of his career, trailing only a 64-yard completion to Mooney at Detroit last season (Oct. 3)...In Week 5 at Minnesota, finished the afternoon 15-of-21 passing for 208 yards and one touchdown, while also adding eight rushes for 47 yards on the ground...That translated to a career-best passer rating of 118.8 as well as a completion percentage of 71.4, which is also the highest he's recorded in a game in his career (min: 10 attempts)...His 208 passing yards are the fifth-most he's had in a game in his career...Finished Week 6 against the Commanders 14-of-27 passing for 190 yards and a touchdown pass, while also rushing 12 times for 88 yards, the second-highest rushing yardage total of his career...He broke off a 39-yard run with 1:06 remaining in the fourth quarter, which stands as the longest rush of his career...In the Week 7 win against the Patriots, he finished the night completing 13-of-21 passes for 179 yards and two touchdowns (passing TD, rushing TD)...Also recorded a game-high 82 rushing yards on 14 attempts...Was his second performance with both a rushing and passing TD in the same game (vs. SF, 10/31/21)...In his 17th career start, Fields becomes one of five Bears QBs since the start of the 2000 season to log multiple games with both a rushing and pass TD in the same game, joining Jay Cutler (6), Mitchell Trubisky (6), Cade McNown (3) and Rex Grossman (2)...Finished 17-of-23 with 151 passing yards and two touchdowns against Dallas in Week 8...He also rushed eight times for 60 yards and a rushing touchdown...His performance yielded a passer rating of 120.0, which is the highest he's had in a game in his career...His three rushing touchdowns in 2022 are the most by a Bears quarterback since Jim Harbaugh rushed for four in 1993. He finishes Week 8 with 424 total rushing yards, which is the second-most among all NFL quarterbacks, and the second-most in franchise history by a Bears quarterback through the first eight games of the season, trailing only Bobby Douglass, who had 556 yards in 1972...Had one of the best performances of his career in Week 9 vs. Miami, completing 17-of-28 passes for 123 yards and three touchdowns, while also rushing 15 times for 178 yards and a touchdown...finished with a passer rating of 106.7, which is the third highest of his career and his second straight game with a passer rating above 100...His rushing performance breaks Michael Vick's previous single-game record of 173 rushing yards and now stands as the highest rushing total by any NFL quarterback in a regular-season game in NFL history...He also passed Chicago's Bobby Douglass' 127-yard rushing performance on Dec. 17, 1972 to become the Bears' single-game franchise record-holder...He is the first player since at least 1950 to record 150+ rushing yards and 3+ passing touchdowns in a single game (@NFLResearch)...Fields joins Buffalo's Josh Allen, Cincinnati's Joe Burrow and Baltimore's Lamar Jackson as the only players entering Week 9 to record at least three touchdown passes and a rushing touchdown in the same game...Fields beat everyone to the endzone on the opening drive of the second half with a 61-yard scramble, the third Bears touchdown of the afternoon...That rushing touchdown was both the longest rush ever by a Bears quarterback (Vince Evans, 58-yard rush in 1980) and the longest touchdown run by a Bears quarterback (Bobby Douglass, 57-yard TD run in 1972)...Completed 11-of-15 pass attempts in the first half, which is tied for the most completions he's had in a first half in his career...It's also the fourth time in his career he's had 10+ completions

going into the half ... Followed up historic Week 9 performance with another great game against the Lions in Week 10, finishing with 147 yards on 13 rushes and two touchdowns while also completing 12-of-20 passes for 167 yards and two touchdowns ... He became the first quarterback in Bears franchise history to post back-to-back games with 100+ rushing yards, and he's the first Bears player to rush for 100+ yards in consecutive games since Jordan Howard did so on Dec. 24, 2016 and Jan. 1, 2017 ... His last two games have yielded a combined 325 rushing yards, which is the most total rushing yards in a two-game span by a quarterback in NFL history, surpassing Lamar Jackson's 268 combined yards which he recorded Oct. 13, 2019 through Oct. 20, 2019 ... Has rushed for 555 yards over his last five games played, which is the most by any quarterback in that span and the most by a quarterback in the Super Bowl era ... His performance today stands as the highest rushing yardage total by a quarterback against the Lions in NFL history, surpassing Randall Cunningham, who recorded 110 rushing yards against Detroit on Nov. 11, 1986 ... Scored the fourth Bears touchdown of the afternoon on a 67-yard rush to give him his second rushing score of the game ... His touchdown run breaks the franchise record for the longest rush ever by a Bears quarterback and the longest touchdown run by a Bears quarterback that he set just one week ago, when he rushed for a 61-yard touchdown against the Dolphins ... Per *STATS Research*, Fields is the first quarterback in NFL history with a 60+ yard rushing touchdown in consecutive games ... He's also just the seventh offensive player to do so since 1994, the last player being Saquon Barkley on Dec. 22, 2019 and Dec. 29, 2019 ... In Week 11 at Atlanta, Fields led the team on the ground for the third straight game, finishing with 85 yards and a rushing touchdown on 18 attempts, while also going 14-of-21 for 153 yards and a passing touchdown ... Against the Packers in Week 13, finished 20-of-25 passing for 254 yards in addition to seven rushes for 71 yards and a touchdown ... His 80.0 completion percentage is a single-game career-best (min: 10 attempts), and his 254 passing yards are the third-most he's had in a game in his career ... He broke off a 56-yard touchdown run with 3:10 remaining in the first quarter to put the Bears ahead 10-0 ... Now has eight rushing touchdowns on the season, tied with Philadelphia's Jalen Hurts for the most by a quarterback this season ... In Week 15, vs. Philadelphia, became the third quarterback in NFL history to rush for 1,000+ yards in a single season, joining Lamar Jackson and Michael Vick ... Ended the afternoon 14-of-21 passing with 152 yards and two touchdowns, while also rushing 15 times for 95 yards ... He finished with a passer rating of 119.5, which is the second-best passer rating he's recorded in a single game in his career ... It marks his fifth consecutive game with 70+ rushing yards, which is the longest streak by any QB since at least 1950 (@NFLResearch) ... Finished Week 16 vs. Buffalo 15-of-23 for 119 yards and a touchdown pass, while also rushing seven times for 11 yards ... In Detroit in Week 17, finished 7-of-21 for 75 yards, one TD pass and one INT, while also rushing 10 times for 132 yards ... His 132 rushing yards brings his season total to 1,143 on the season, which moves him ahead of four-time Pro Bowler Michael Vick (1,039 rushing yards in 2006) for the second-most rushing yards by a quarterback in NFL history, trailing only Lamar Jackson's 1,206 yards from 2019 ... His 285 yards marked his second highest total of season ... Inactive Weeks 16-18.

**PRO CAREER:** Is one of only three tight ends in NFL history (Tony Gonzalez, Jason Witten) to start 200-plus regular-season games (222) and post 400-plus receptions (434)...Playing in his 18th season in the NFL, passing Gonzalez and Witten for the most in NFL history among tight ends...Has played in 258 career regular-season games, No. 3 among tight ends in league history...Has appeared in 15-plus regular-season games in 14 of his 17 seasons in the league.
