TITANS-FALCONS SUPPLEMENTAL NOTES

TITANS LOOK TO STAY UNBEATEN AFTER THE BYE UNDER VRABEL: The Titans were off last week following their Week 6 trip to London. They return to the field this week against the Atlanta Falcons at Nissan Stadium.

Since Mike Vrabel was hired as head coach in 2018, the Titans have not lost a game following their bye, going 5-0.

Over the past five seasons, the Titans are one of four NFL teams that have won every game following their bye week, along with the Kansas City Chiefs, Buffalo Bills and Pittsburgh Steelers. The Steelers are the lone team from the group that has already played—and won—after a bye week in 2023.

HENRY LEADS FRANCHISE IN GAMES WITH 100 SCRIMMAGE YARDS & TD: Against the Ravens in London, Derrick Henry

rushed for 97 yards and a touchdown. He added 16 receiving yards to account for 113 total scrimmage yards.

Henry's most recent performance gave him two games in 2023 in which he hit 100 scrimmage yards (rushing yards and receiving yards) and scored a touchdown. He also did so on Oct. 1 against Cincinnati with 133 scrimmage yards and a rushing touchdown. In his career, Henry has authored 35 games in which he has accounted for 100 scrimmage yards and at least one touchdown, surpassing Eddie George (33) for most such games in franchise history.

Since Henry entered the NFL as a second-round draft pick in 2016, his 35 games with a minimum of 100 scrimmage yards and a touchdown lead the NFL. The closest total to Henry's is 30 by San Francisco's **Christian McCaffrey**.

AUTRY AMONG NFL'S BEST AT BLOCKS: Against the Ravens, Titans defensive lineman Denico Autry blocked an extra point attempt by Justin Tucker. It was Autry's NFL-leading 11th total blocked kick since entering the NFL in 2014, including seven blocks on extra points, three on field goals and one on a punt.

Autry has blocked a kick in each of his first three seasons in Tennessee. Prior to this season, he had a blocked field goal against Miami on Jan. 2, 2022 and a blocked extra point at Green Bay on Nov. 17, 2022. In the franchise's "Titans era" (1999–present), Autry now has more total blocked kicks for the team than any other player. Seven other players had two.

Since the beginning of the 2000 campaign, only two NFL players—defensive tackle **Shaun Rogers** (17) and defensive end **Julius Peppers** (13)—have blocked more total kicks than Autry. Current Falcons defensive lineman **Calais Campbell**, who the Titans are scheduled to face this week, ranks fourth since 2000 with nine total blocked kicks.

Autry and Campbell are the active NFL leaders in total blocked kicks.

FOLK CAN BREAK NFL RECORD AS HE APPROACHES TEAM MARK: Since joining the Titans in a trade on Aug. 29, Nick Folk has made all 16 field goals and all eight extra points he has attempted. He is one of three qualifying NFL players (minimum one attempted field goal per team game) who has not missed a field goal or an extra point this season, along with Pittsburgh's Chris Boswell and Kansas City's Harrison Butker.

Six games into his Titans career, Folk is within range of the franchise's all-time record for consecutive field goals made. His 16 straight field goals are tied for the eighth-longest streak in franchise history and within four field goals of the franchise record of 20. **AI Del Greco** established the benchmark from 1998 to 1999, and **Rob Bironas** later matched the record on three different occasions.

Folk's 16 consecutive field goals made to start a season are the most in franchise history.

Additionally, Folk enters the game with a streak of 70 consecutive field goals made on attempts from less than 40 yards. If he makes his next such attempt, he will set a new NFL record.

Folk hit three field goals against the Ravens—all under 40 yards—and in doing so, he tied the record set by Ravens kicker **Justin Tucker**, who made 70 straight field goals from under 40 yards from 2016 to 2020. Folk's last miss from that range was a 31-yarder against New England on Oct. 5, 2017, when he played for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.
