- NFL players had the opportunity to participate in the NFL's annual My Cause, My Cleats campaign during a designated home game between Weeks 13-15 of 2018. Reed Jr. and his teammates represented their respective causes with custom-designed cleats in an effort to raise awareness and funding. The National Multiple Sclerosis Society aims to help people affected by MS so they can live their best lives in an attempt to stop MS in its tracks, restore what has been lost and end MS forever.



- Reed Jr. and his teammates joined Levi's in support of breast, colon and pediatric cancer warriors at the Crucial Catch Fashion Show presented by Dignity Health in October of 2018. 49ers players and cancer warriors took to the runway to show off their attire and share their stories of strength and courage with the audience.



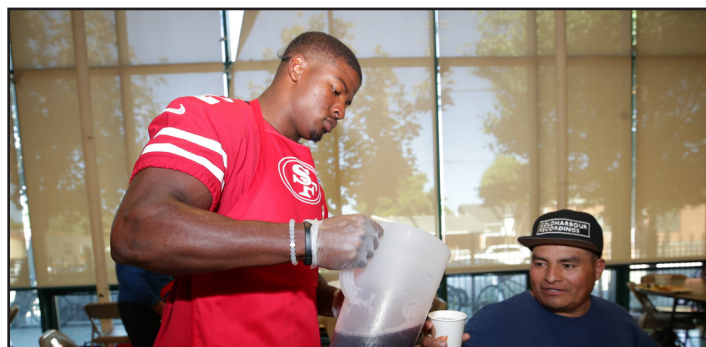
- Reed Jr. played his final college football game against UCLA in the 2017 Cactus Bowl. While at the bowl game, he and his teammates were given fresh gear for their participation in the game. Later in the week, Reed wore his new white shoes while visiting a local Salvation Army in Phoenix, AZ. He struck a bond with Israel, a seven year-old who he could tell came from a bad background. Reed Jr. made his new friend's day by taking off his new shoes and giving them to him. He was happy to walk home barefoot, as he said that he was content in making someone else's day.

REED JR.'S GOLDEN NUGGET

- Reed Jr., having zero offers from a Division I school out of high school, walked on at Fresno State for one season before transferring to Cerritos College (Norwalk, CA). At Cerritos, Reed lived in a two-bedroom apartment with seven other teammates and split time sleeping on the couch and the floor. He then transferred to Kansas State, where he played under head coach Bill Snyder for two seasons and went on to earn All-America honors.

GOLDMINE (CONTINUED)

- The 49ers joined forces with Martha's Kitchen of San Jose as part of their Community Tuesday kickoff event in September of 2018. Reed Jr. and teammates took part in the event by serving dinner to nearly 200 residents in need, refilling beverages and bussing tables. Both the 49ers and Levi's Stadium partner with Martha's Kitchen throughout the year by donating excess food after stadium events. Martha's Kitchen's mission is to "feed the hungry with dignity, no questions asked, no judgements made."



- Reed Jr. and his fellow rookies participated in the annual 49ers Mentorship Academy on September 18, 2018. The Mentorship Academy, partnering with USA Football, is a three-step program designed to provide high school football players with the opportunity to develop the skills necessary to succeed and be leaders on and off the field. The rookie class invited the high schoolers to the team facility, where they shared opinions and lessons over a meal and fun competitions.

2018

- Saw action in 15 games and registered 37 tackles, 1.0 sack and 1 FF. As a returner, recorded 11 kick returns for 332 yds. (30.2 avg.).
- Returned the opening kickoff of the 2nd half vs. Det. (9/16) 90 yds., marking the longest kickoff return since WR Kyle Williams registered a 94-yd. kickoff return on 9/23/12 at Min. Finished the day with 4 KORs for 159 yds. (39.8 avg.). His 39.8 KOR avg. is the highest by the 49ers (min. 3 KORs) since 9/11/11 [WR Ted Ginn Jr. - 4 KORs for 176 yds. (44.0 avg.) vs. Sea.].
- Brought down Broncos QB Keenum for a sack of 5 yds. vs. Den. (12/9), marking the first sack of his career. Also added a career-high 12 tackles and his first career FF of Keenum on the sack.

COLLEGE

Played in 24 games (23 starts) in two years at Kansas State and registered 122 tackles, 5.0 TFLs, 7 INTs, 3 FFs, 2 FRs and 32 PDs. Also recorded 26 KORs for 837 yds. (32.2 avg.) and 1 TD as well as 17 PRs for 253 yds. (14.9 avg.) and 1 TD. In 2017, earned First-Team All-Big 12 honors at both DB and kick returner/punt returner. Also named Honorable Mention Big 12 Special Teams Player of the Year. Started all 11 games in which he played and notched 47 tackles, 4.5 TFLs, 4 INTs, 1 FF, 2 FRs and 13 PDs. Also tallied 17 KORs for 582 yds. (34.2 avg.) and 1 TD along with 17 PRs for 253 yds. (14.9 avg.) and 1 TD. His 34.2 KOR avg. ranked 3rd in school history and 4th in Big 12 history, while his 14.9 PR avg. was tied for the 6th best avg. in school history. As a junior, was named Big 12 Defensive Newcomer of the Year and earned First-Team All-Big 12 honors. Played in all 13 games (12 starts) and recorded 75 tackles, 0.5 TFLs, 3 INTs, 2 FFs and 19 PDs while also notching 9 KORs for 255 yds. (28.3 avg.). In 2015, attended Cerritos College (Norwalk, CA) where he played in 11 games and notched 42 tackles, 2 INTs and 3 PDs and helped lead the Falcons to a National Division Northern Conference championship and berth into the Southern California Regional Playoffs. As a freshman, redshirted at Fresno State.

PERSONAL

- Attended Independence (Bakersfield, CA) HS, where he earned all-league honors for two straight years.
- Totaled 6 INTs and 5 FFs while he amassed 1,150 total yds. and 13 TDs on offense as a senior.
- Became the first person in school history to earn team MVP honors in both football and basketball.
- Born Dennis Duane Reed (11/11/96) in Bakersfield, CA.
- Majored in history and criminology.
