2018 HIGHLIGHTS

- Part of an offensive line that did not allow a sack on 22 passing atts. by QB Nick Mullens vs. Oak. (11/1). It marked the first time the team did not allow a sack since 12/31/17 at LAR (33 atts. - QB Jimmy Garoppolo).
- Richburg and the offensive line did not allow a sack on 39 atts. by QB Nick Mullens vs. NYG (11/12). It marked the first time since Weeks 3-4 of the 2000 season that the team did not allow a sack in consecutive weeks [34 atts. by QB Jeff Garcia at StL (9/17/00); 26 atts. by Garcia at Dal. (9/24/00)].

GOLDMINE

- Richburg participated in the NFL's "My Cause, My Cleats" campaign in 2017, wearing custom-designed cleats in support of the Wounded Warrior Project. Richburg has volunteered at several organization events, including the "Pros vs. Joes" video game initiative.



RICHBURG'S GOLDEN NUGGETS

- Richburg was also a standout in track and field at Bushland (TX) HS. He recorded a shotput throw of 60 feet, 1 inch, at the 2009 UIL State Championship, which set a school record and ranked fourth in state history.
- After graduating with a bachelor's degree in animal science, Richburg is now pursuing a master's degree in adult education.

GOLDMINE (CONTINUED)

- Richburg was actively involved in helping his local community while attending Colorado State. He helped with homework and reading at the Boys & Girls Club of Larimer County, spent time with low-income students at Linton Elementary and volunteered at Respite Care, which provides support for developmentally disabled children.

RICHBURG'S TRANSACTIONS

Originally a 2nd-round (43rd overall) draft choice by NYG in 2014...Placed on the Injured Reserve List on 11/4/17...Signed a five-year deal with SF on 3/14/18.



2017 (NEW YORK GIANTS)

- Started 4 games at C before being placed on the Injured Reserve List with a head injury on 11/4.

2016 (NEW YORK GIANTS)

- Started all 16 regular season games in addition to the NFC Wild Card Game at C.
- Anchored an offensive line that allowed just 22 regular season sacks, which was the third-least in the NFL behind Oak. (19) and Pit. (21).
- Helped the Giants offense register a season-high 397 net passing yds. vs. Bal. (10/16).
- Part of an offensive line that did not allow a sack at Phi. (12/22), while Giants QB Eli Manning recorded 63 atts.

2015 (NEW YORK GIANTS)

- Transitioned back to C and started all 15 games he saw action in.
- Protected Giants QB Eli Manning, who set a franchise record in comps. (387) and finished the season 4th among all QBs in passing atts. (618).
- Key member of an offensive line that finished sixth in the NFL in points per game (26.3) and 8th in total yds. per game (372.3).
- Part of an offensive line that allowed Eli Manning to throw for 350 yds. and 6 TDs at NO (11/1).
- Paved the way for Giants rushers to record 208 net rushing yds. vs. Phi. (1/3/16).

2014 (NEW YORK GIANTS)

- As a rookie, appeared in all 16 games (15 starts), contributing on the offensive line at LG.
- Provided time for a Giants offense that finished 7th in the NFL in passing yds. per game (267.0) and 10th in total yds. per game (367.2).
- Protected Giants QB Eli Manning as he set a franchise record in comp. percentage (63.1).
- Made his 1st start in his NFL debut at Det. (9/8).

COLLEGE

Started a school-record 50 games in 4 seasons at Colorado State. Made 13 starts at C as a senior in 2013 and garnered First-Team All-Mountain West Conference honors. Part of an offensive line that helped generate a school-record 470.8 total yds per game. Blocked for RB Kapri Bibbs, who set a school record with 1,741 yds. and a NCAA-leading 31 TDs, and QB Garrett Grayson, who passed for the most yds. in school history (3,696). As a junior in 2012, started all 12 games for the 3rd consecutive season and was named a finalist for the Rimington Trophy, which is given to the nation's most outstanding center. Started all 12 games as a sophomore in 2011 and earned Second-Team All-Conference honors. Started all 12 games as a redshirt freshman in 2010 and received Freshman First-Team All-America honors. Redshirted as a true freshman, but spent time with the track and field team and finished third in the shotput at the Don Barrett Duals in 2009.
