LOOKING AHEAD

With a Win at St. Louis...

- The **49ers** would improve to 66-63-3 all-time against the Rams, including a 34-31-1 record on the road. San Francisco's 65 wins against the Rams are the most versus any opponent in franchise history.
- The **Niners** would improve to 11-9 all-time at the Edward Jones Dome, including wins in three straight.
- San Francisco** would move to 14-9-1 in the month of November since 2009. The team's .587 winning pct. in November ranks 5th in the NFC during that timespan (NO - .750; Dal. - .680; GB - .646; Atl. - .615).

- QB **Colin Kaepernick** would move to 3-1 as a starter at StL. In his last two starts at StL, he has registered 510 yds. and 5 TDs with an avg. QB rating of 119.8.

TAKE IT AWAY

- CBs **Kenneth Acker** and **Tramaine Brock** each registered 1 INT last week vs. Sea. Both have 3 INTs on the season, ranking t-4th in the NFL and t-2nd in the NFC.
- Acker** has registered 1 INT in back-to-back games. With 1 INT at StL, he would become the first member of the 49ers to record three consecutive games with an INT since 2011 [S Dashon Goldson - vs. StL (12/4/11), at Arz. (12/11/11) and vs. Pit. (12/19/11)].
- Since 2009, the **49ers defense** has registered 118 INTs, ranking 5th in the NFL (GB - 140; NE - 125; Buf. - 121; Arz. - 120).

GOLDEN NUGGETS

- Among rookie or first/second-year players, LB **Aaron Lynch** ranks 2nd in the NFL with 11.0 sacks since 2014 (StL DT Aaron Donald - 13.5).
- In his first career NFL start as a member of the Baltimore Ravens, WR **Torrey Smith** registered 5 receipts. for a game-high 152-yds. and 3 TDs at StL (9/25/11). His first 3 receipts. all went for TDs (74, 41 and 18 yds.) as he became the first rookie in NFL history to record 3 TD receipts. in a 1st qtr.
- WR **Anquan Boldin** is looking for his fifth-consecutive game vs. StL with 90-or-more rec. yds. He has a TD receipt. in 4 of his past 5 games at StL and 6 career 100-yd. games against the Rams.
- With 132 passing yds. against the Rams, QB **Colin Kaepernick** would eclipse the 10,000 passing yds. mark, becoming the 7th QB in franchise history to accomplish the feat (Joe Montana - 35,124; John Brodie - 31,548; Steve Young - 29,907; Jeff Garcia - 16,408; Y.A. Tittle - 16,016; Alex Smith - 14,280).

WHAT THEY'RE SAYING

St. Louis Rams Head Coach Jeff Fisher on the 49ers offense...

"Anquan is Anquan. He's hard to cover. He's a hard matchup. Torrey (Smith) is a great acquisition there who can go and he's proven he can make the big play down the field. That's with the tight ends and the run game."

St. Louis Rams Head Coach Jeff Fisher on RB Carlos Hyde...

"I'm really impressed with Carlos. He's going to be a problem for us for years to come. He's hammering it up in there. He's got vision and quickness and acceleration through the hole. He's a tough runner. He's a big, heavy back who's hard to get down once he gets to the second level."

St. Louis Rams LB James Laurinaitis on FB Bruce Miller...

"I have a ton of respect for Bruce, and the reason is that he's so versatile for them. He's a phenomenal blocker. When they ask him to lead up like a true fullback, he's really physical and he tries to get after you a little bit. He finishes every block. He's one of those players, so to speak, that you can't say he's just a fullback. That's not the case with him because he's super athletic and so, you constantly have to be aware of what he's doing and what his stance is and really have great vision because if you don't, he'll burn you."
