LOOKING AHEAD

With a Win vs. New Orleans...

- The **49ers** would improve to 49-25-2 all-time against the Saints, including a 24-11-2 record at home.
- **San Francisco** would win its second-consecutive game against New Orleans and four out of the last five overall matchups.
- Head coach **Chip Kelly** would improve to 2-1 as a head coach against the Saints.

SALUTE TO SERVICE

This week's 49ers vs. Saints contest serves as San Francisco's **Salute to Service game**. The Niners will host 150 military personnel from the Army, Air Force, Coast Guard, Marine Corps and Navy to present the field-sized American Flag during the National Anthem, while Harrier Jets from nearby Moffett Air Force Base will perform the flyover to culminate the National Anthem.

Halftime will feature a celebration to honor the Marine Corps 100 years of service to the San Francisco Bay Area, and seven prerecorded messages from 49ers fans from various military bases around the world will be played throughout the game. Additionally, the 49ers Museum presented by Sony will open an exhibit focusing on the military experience of 49ers players, coaches, and executives and explore how their football careers were interrupted, delayed, or even initiated by their time in the service.

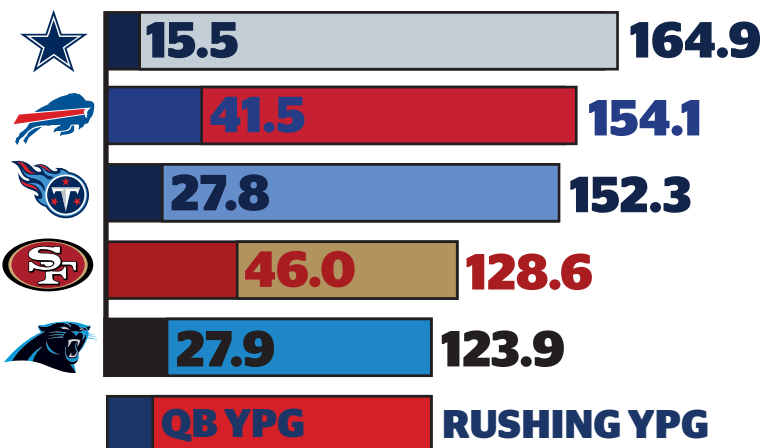
Throughout the year, the 49ers take part in visiting with servicemen and women, military enlistments at Levi's Stadium, hosting wounded veterans, and providing military fan packs to 49ers soldiers throughout the world.



GROUND AND POUND

- In 2016, the **49ers offense** has averaged 128.6 rushing yds. per game, ranking 4th in the NFL. In Week 7 vs. TB, the Niners rushed for a season-high 160 yds. on 28 atts. (5.7 avg.).
- Of that 128.6 rushing average, **49ers QBs** have averaged 46.0 rushing yds. per game, the most by QBs in the NFL.

MOST RUSHING YPG IN THE NFL, 2016



- In his two starts this season, QB **Colin Kaepernick** has rushed 17 times for 150 yds. (8.8 avg.), the 7th-highest rushing total among QBs in the NFL. In Week 7 vs. TB, Kaepernick rushed for 84 yds. on 9 atts. (9.3 avg.), the 3rd-highest regular season single game rushing total of his career.
- With 18 rushing yds. this week vs. NO, **Kaepernick** would become the 15th player in 49ers franchise history to reach 2,000 career rushing yds.
- The **49ers** have registered 10 rushing TDs in 2016, tied for the 3rd-most in the NFL and are 1 of 4 teams to record double-digit rushing TDs on this season (Buf. - 14; Dal. - 12; NE - 10).
- The **Niners** are averaging 31.4 rushing atts. per game this season, the 2nd-most in the NFL (Dal. - 33.7).
- RB **Carlos Hyde** leads the team and is tied for 4th in the NFL with a career-high 6 rushing TDs.
