Appeared in 50 games (47 starts) in five years at West Virginia (2015-19). Started all 12 games at LT as a senior in 2019 and was named Big 12 Conference Co-Offensive Lineman of the Year and First-Team All-Big 12 and AP Third-Team All-America. As a junior in 2018, started 12 games at right tackle and was part of an offensive line that paved the way for the Mountaineers to average 512.3 yds. of total offense per game, ranking



2nd in the Big 12 and 8th nationally. Started 13 games as a sophomore in 2017 and was part of the offensive line that helped the offense average 309.3 passing YPG, which ranked 13th nationally.
