San Francisco 49ers vs. Los Angeles Rams Game Notes Monday, September 12, 2016

With the Win ...

- San Francisco improved their all-time opening day record to 37-29-1. The 49ers have now won six consecutive season openers, setting the longest streak in franchise history.
- The 49ers improved to 67-64-3 all-time against the Rams, including a 34-32-2 record at home.
- San Francisco has now won eight consecutive games on *Monday Night Football*, setting the longest streak in franchise history.
- The 49ers won their 48th career game on Monday Night Football, the most in NFL history.
- Head coach Chip Kelly earned his third victory to open a season as a head coach in the NFL.
- Kelly improved his record to 5-1 as a head coach on *Monday Night Football*.
- Kelly improves to 2-0 in his career against the Rams.

First Time In Franchise History

- The **49ers defense** registered the first shut out in franchise history on opening day. It marked the first shut out by the team since 9/30/12 (34-0 at NYJ).

Stepping Up On D

- The **49ers defense** held the Rams to 185 total yds. (65 rushing, 120 passing), ranking 2nd in the NFL in Week 1.
- The 185 yds. by the Rams is the fewest allowed by the **49ers defense** since 12/13/15 [183 (39 rushing, 144 passing) at TB].

Big Margin Of Victory

- The 28 point win is the largest margin of victory by the 49ers since 10/27/13 (32 points; 42-10 at Jax.).

Moving The Chains

- The **49ers offense** registered 28 first downs, the most by the team since 10/7/12 (29 vs. Buf.).
- The **49ers offense** converted 8 of 17 3rd down atts. (47.1 pct.), highest 3rd down pct. since 10/11/15 [8 of 14 (57.1 pct.) at NYG].

Efficient In The Red Zone

- The **49ers offense** scored a TD on all 4 trips to the red zone.

Turning Defense Into Offense

- The **49ers defense** registered 2 INTs that the **49ers offense** was able to turn into 14 points.

Keeping The QB Up

- The **49ers offensive line** did not allow a sack on 35 atts. by QB **Blaine Gabbert**. It is the first time the 49ers did not allow a sack in a games since 11/8/15 (25 atts. by Gabbert, 1 att. by QB Colin Kaepernick vs. Atl).

Playing Clean Football

- The **49ers** committed just 2 penalties, the fewest in a game by the team since 11/9/14 (2 penalties at NO).

Ground & Pound

- The **49ers offense** rushed for 150 yds. and 2 TDs on 42 carries. It marked the most rushing yds. by the team since 9/14/15 (230 vs. Min.) and it's the most rushing atts. in a game since 9/28/14 (42 atts. vs. Phi.).
- RB **Carlos Hyde** rushed for 88 yds. and 2 TDs on 23 carries. It marked his fourth and fifth career rushing TDs on opening day, the most among running backs over the last three seasons. It also marked **Hyde's** second career 2 TD game (9/14/15 vs. Min.).
- RB **Shaun Draughn** added 7 carries for 18 yds. and 1 TD, the 4th of his career.

McDonald Finds The Endzone

- TE **Vance McDonald** hauled in an 8-yd. TD pass from QB Blaine Gabbert, the 4th TD recept. of his career.

Applying The Pressure

- With 1.0 sacks against the Rams, LB **Ahmad Brooks** moved into a tie with DT Dana Stubblefield for third on the franchise's all-time sack list with 46.5.

- DL **Arik Armstead** registered the third sack of his NFL career, taking down QB Case Keenum for a 5-yd. loss.

Feeling Picky

- According to Gamebook Statistics, the **49ers defense** registered 8 passes defended, the most in the NFL during Week 1.
- LB **NaVorro Bowman** registered the fourth INT of his career and the first since 12/29/13 at Arz.
- LB **Ray-Ray Armstrong** recorded the first INT of his NFL career.

**49ers Head Coach Chip Kelly

San Francisco 49ers vs. Los Angeles Rams**

Was that about as much as you could expect from your season opener?

“Yeah, I mean, obviously for the first game of the year there’s a lot of things you’re not sure of going into it. But, I think the most telling statistic for us that you’re really proud of going into the first game is that you have two penalties for 10-yards. One of them was mine because I screwed them up with the formation and the other one - our guys thought they jumped so they tried to touch them. So, to play that type of disciplined football, I thought was big. We also had created two turnovers and not only did we create two turnovers, we talk about response after the turnovers and to turn those two turnovers into 14 points was really big for us too. It’s a good day overall. There’s a lot of things we need to do better and that we need to build on, but it’s a lot easier when you win than when you lose to make those corrections.”

The Rams D-line is seen as one of the best in the game, they didn’t have a ton of plays with big impact. What was the key in neutralizing them?

“Well, I thought our offensive line did a nice job and again we knew going in that that was one of the better D-Lines in the NFL. [DT] Aaron Donald is probably the best inside defensive lineman in this league and we thought that was going to be a huge deal for us and I’ll give our guys credit for sustaining. There were some times there in the third quarter where they made some plays and split some gaps on us. We had some negative yardage plays, but I thought the coaching staff did a really good job of making adjustments and then turning that into 14 more points for us. For the first game against that front, until I see the film I would say I was pleased with how the O-line played.”

Somebody just tweeted that it was the first shutout in a season opener in 49ers history. I don’t know if that’s true, but whether or not, how about for you just to start your career here with a shutout win over a traditional rival?

“I think the credit goes, it’s not me. It’s our defense and our defensive staff. I think our defensive staff did a great job and I’ve thought our defense, we have to go against them and we’ve been going against them since April. I thought our defense is pretty good. I think we have a formidable front, probably one of the best inside linebackers in the game in [LB] NaVorro Bowman directing the show back there. I think our safeties, [S Jaquiski] Tarrt showed up today, [S Eric] Reid showed up today, [S Antoine] Bethea. I think [CB] Tramaine Brock and [DB] Jimmie Ward did a really good on the corners. We felt good about our defense going into this game, but you never know until you get a chance to go out there. To hold [Los Angeles Rams RB Todd] Gurley, who I think is one of the top backs in the league, to under 50-yards, I think that’s a good day for us defensively.”

That first series, you guys pretty much dominated. Your linemen and your linebackers.

“Yeah, they did a very nice job. Again, it’s something for us to build on. We have a short week here. We’ve got to get ready. We’ve got a very tough (game), going against the NFC representative in the Super Bowl in Carolina, at Carolina. So, we’ve got to get to work pretty quick here.”

You said there’s some things you needed to work on, can you be more specific?

“Yeah, we didn’t run the ball very well in the third quarter. We were in a little bit of a rut there. I think we can cover kickoffs a little bit better. Some of those kickoffs got out a little bit farther than we thought. The first two come to mind for me. Those are obviously things we’ve got to work on.”

What’s your assessment of QB Blaine Gabbert’s performance?

“I thought Blaine did a nice job. There’s probably a couple throws like you always want, you want back. But again, I thought he was very efficient with the ball. He did not turn the ball over, did not put the ball

in harm's way. I think he kept drives alive with his feet. Threw some real nice balls in some critical situations there when it looked we weren't getting going. We got going throwing the ball there. I thought [WR Jeremy] Kerley played well. The ball he threw to [TE] Vance [McDonald] was nice. The two side line throws, one to [WR] Torrey [Smith] and one to [WR Quinton Patton] QP was big for us. He got a lot of different guys involved in the passing game and I thought overall he did a good job."

When we last talked to you OL Anthony Davis was your starting right guard, what happened since then?

"As I looked at it going through it, it was really my decision and I told AD that we were just going to start [G Andrew] Tiller going into this game. We knew that was a pretty formidable front. We'll continue to grow A.D. Again, he's missed a lot of football and he's coming back. And, I'll give him credit, handling it like a professional. But, it was my decision in terms of starting Tiller in this game."

But, why didn't he practice on Saturday?

"There was just a miscommunication, but he was back on Sunday and he had a real good Sunday for us and was good today. Got a chance to get a couple snaps in there at the end."

There's obviously a report he was thinking of quitting the NFL, retiring again.

"It was just a miscommunication. I had a long talk with Anthony on Saturday and everything has been ironed out. He's good to go."

It was nothing more than a miscommunication?

"It was a miscommunication between myself and Anthony and we don't have a miscommunication any longer."

Regarding the Kaepernick situation. Before the game there was a somber scene. The story continues to move on and there has been support for his stance all over the country. What are your thoughts on that?

"I think again, like we've said from day one, we recognize their right to do it. It's their constitutional right. Our president said the same thing. That's part of what it's like to be an American, that you have the right to choose and that's what he's choosing to do. So, I think it's a very, kind of cut and dry situation to be honest with you."

DL Arik Armstead was pretty much in just third downs in the first quarter and you kind of worked him in more the second quarter. Is that just working him back?

"Yeah, just trying to work him back in, in terms of where he is. Obviously, he missed a little bit of time in camp and was really playing well for us before he got hurt. So, it wasn't like we were going to bring him back and throw him in there and give him 65 snaps. We feel like we've got some depth in our defensive line so to be able to get him back out there was a positive thing for us. I think he had a sack, so it was good just to get Arik's feet underneath of him. Obviously, he's going to be an integral part of what we're doing this season, so it was good just to get him back out on the field and obviously he produced in the limited amount of snaps that he had. So, hopefully we will continue to add snaps to him as we get him back full."

In the first half you guys went for it twice on fourth down. How much of that was just trying to be the aggressor and set the tone, or was it just field position?

"Field position mostly, we're not into that aggressor, non-aggressor. I don't think like that. I just knew what [K] Phil's [Dawson] distance was. The wind, it's unique and I've only been in here a short amount of time, Phil gave me a very good education on the wind patterns here as they kind of come off. If you look at the flags up high, they are blowing real high, but if you look at the ones in the corner, they aren't bad, but then when the wind comes in it hits the other side and starts to swirl and come back. Phil is

great and one of the things, he'll tell me exactly and he'll tell me in pregame because during the game he thinks he can hit every kick. So, we have a very calm, rational talk in pregame exactly where do we need to get the ball too. We were just a little shy of it. In that situation, just felt like if we went for it was a little better. I didn't want to punt. If you punt the ball is in the end zone. You're netting 13-yards or whatever the heck it is. I didn't think very long about making those decisions."

And on the one, Kerley made a nice catch. Did you expect him to be as involved just with the short period of time he's been with the team?

"I did, just because day one when he got here he just kind of kept showing up and you kind of say to yourself, I thought he was pretty good. And then, is it too good to be true? Obviously, losing [WR] Bruce Ellington like that and knowing that Bruce is out for the year, I'll give our personnel department credit for going out and finding a guy like that that kind of stepped in seamlessly. I think there was one route today that kind of screwed up on, but for the short time that we had him, for him to be able to kind of pick up everything we did, be our punt returner, be our kickoff returner and I don't know how many catches he had, but to go out there and contribute like he contributed, key fourth down catch there. I know he had a couple others. He probably had four or five on the day. How many did he have? Seven. We picked the guy up two weeks ago and he had seven catches. If we picked him up last week, he'd probably have 10 if we didn't screw him up."

On the first touchdown run RB Carlos Hyde had, how well executed was the blocking and obviously the running?

"It was both. Again, I thought we did a really good job of blocking it up. That play takes a little bit of patience. A lot of backs try to rush that and that's just Carlos. If you watch him, he kind of leaned and made it look like it was going outside and got the linebacker to go and then here came the guard and here came the backside tight end. So, it's a combination of both. But, I thought we got a really good push up front running behind [T] Joe [Staley] and [G] Zane [Beadles]. They got a good push. Tiller was on the pull and then the second tight end (Garrett Celek) pulling through. I thought Vance did a really good job on the linebacker and then Carlos to fit right up inside. It's kind of like how you draw it up."

Is Carlos Hyde OK?

"Who's that?"

Carlos was looked at by the trainers.

"I wasn't aware of that. So, maybe you can ask him."

What did you think, you guys excelled at stopping Los Angeles Rams RB Todd Gurley?

"I thought we had a good plan. I thought our guys executed it well."

Was the plan to stop Gurley and make somebody else beat you?

"Yes. I think that anytime that you go against a back that is that dynamic, you have to start there. If you can't stop the run in this league, you struggle to stop anything. The guys up front did a great job. We played good team defense and guys executed."

You mentioned being entirely un-scouted for the most part entering Week 1. What are the challenges that face you now that teams have film on you as a sample of what to look at?

"We have more. We still have more. We didn't unload every bullet that was in the chamber tonight."

It seemed like you were pretty aggressive with 49ers S Eric Reid tonight. What was it about him that translates skill-wise in terms of bringing him on a blitz?

"He is big, he is physical and he is fast. He did a good job tonight timing it up. We tell our guys that we are only going to blitz the guys that are going to win. Eric is a guy that can go win."

Was that something you guys worked a lot on in practice but not in the games?

"Absolutely. Our offensive guys probably don't like how much we blitz them throughout practice. Yes it is something that we work a lot on."

What was your biggest takeaway from the game?

"The biggest thing I took away from the game is we were 4-for-4 in the red zone. We got the victory and we're going on to play Carolina. We're going to film here today and see what we need to work on. There were some ups and downs throughout the game but the biggest thing is we kept fighting, kept chipping away and got the W. That's all that matters in this league."

You had some success early, making some things happen running the ball. How much do you think that maybe loosened some things up for you guys to run the ball more?

"We came into the game saying take what the defense gives you. They were kind of dropping their zones, playing some tight man-to-man coverage and there were some running lanes up in the middle of the field. Anytime you can convert third downs, get yourself into second-and-short, third-and-manageable with your feet, that's something that you have to do and I have to capitalize on."

What's kind of your philosophy in just managing yourself, making sure you're not taking too many hits when you do take off?

"There were some times I definitely should of and could of slid. We'll probably watch those on film and see where I could slide. But, you know, I was just playing the game and trying to get first downs and you're going to take some shots every now and then. You just want to try and minimize those as a quarterback."

How good was your offensive line tonight because it seemed like Los Angeles Rams DT Aaron Donald was particular frustrated toward the end of the game?

"They were doing a great job. They fought their tails off all game long. We knew it was going to be a 60-minute fight with those guys because their front seven is so talented. The O-Line did a great job opening up holes for our running backs and giving me time to throw the ball."

By going for two fourth downs, do you think you kind of set the tone in the sense that you guys were clearly the aggressors at that point?

"Yeah. When we're on offense, we want to be offensive. [Head coach] Chip [Kelly] and our coaching staff do not shy away from going on fourth down, especially kind of in that fringe territory whether you punt it or kick a long field goal. We were 1-for-2 on fourth down. The first one, just got to bring the ball up or hand it off to the running back and slam it up in there. But, [WR Jeremy] Kerley did a great job on the second one converting on that ball down the sideline. Anytime you go for it on fourth down, you want to convert because those are huge momentum plays for the football team."

When you talk about taking advantage of your opportunities, what does it mean for your guys to get an opening night win against the Rams on a nationally televised game?

"It's huge. Any time you can get a conference win, a divisional opponent win, first game of the year W, it's a big momentum builder for the football team."

I think the biggest thing for this offense is the third down conversions and the success the offense had in that time was something you had struggled with before. What's your comfort level in knowing the situation and how do you think you've improved in them?

"Yeah. Any time you can convert on third downs and extend drives, the odds and percentages of scoring increase greatly. I think we were fifty percent on third down tonight. That's good but there's always things that we can improve on and improve that statistic. The biggest thing that I took away from that is we were 4-for-4 in the red zone with four touchdowns and that's huge. Any time you can convert red zone attempts to touchdowns and do that a hundred percent of the time, that's good football."

Without obviously having a chance to study the film, how do you feel you played?

"Yeah, I've got to watch the tape. Solid there in the first half. Started slow there in the third quarter but finished there strong with the two touchdown drives and that's what you look for. When we got things rolling, when we were executing at a high level, we just kind of got to find ways that we can get started faster there in the third quarter. That's always a challenge that you have as an offense. How do you start faster or how do you get those long, extended drives right off the jump? We'll watch the film, evaluate it and just get better from it."

Are you more comfortable with the running game or was there some struggle with the passing game?

"We were just executing the plays that were called. I'm comfortable with the run game and the pass game and our offensive line did a great job in both aspects. So, whatever Chip wants to call, we're going to execute it to the best of our ability."

Not to knock the running backs that you had last year but this was the first time you got to play with RB Carlos Hyde. How did that change your approach and what you were able to do knowing that the defense had a high-level running back to--?

"Carlos is a tremendous asset to this football team. What he can do running the football and catching the ball out of the backfield, it's a unique talent. Him and [RB] Shaun [Draughn], they're a tremendous one-two punch and you saw it tonight, how those two guys play complementary football and both ran extremely hard. Caught the ball well out of the backfield and got some tough yards against a good defense."

Running the offense that you are, how much trust do you guys need to develop with each other and have you developed in that read-option scheme?

"Yeah. It's about doing what the defense gives you. The looks change every play. You're never going to get the same look twice and we just got to be on the same page. They got to trust me that I'm going to make the right read because it's so driven by the quarterback. As we continue to go through these games throughout the season, that trust is going to continue to build."

How have you been able to develop a rapport so quickly with Jeremy Kerley? I mean, he's only been here a couple weeks. What can you say about what he's been able to do in a short time?

"Yeah, it's been like a week and we've just tried to catch him up to speed as fast as possible. He's been in the league quite a few years and just the mindset that he approached every day in practice showed today. Coming in on such short notice, mastering this offense, knowing exactly where he needs to be to catch the ball. Coming out with quite a few catches tonight and some big third down conversions, it was a good thing to see and we're just going to continue to get better."

What are your thoughts on what's going on with QB Colin Kaepernick and S Eric Reid? Is there the sense that it's really bringing about some change, some discussion?

"Yeah. It's good to kind of spark that discussion but I'm here to play football. I'm focused on the game. Everybody can do whatever they please before the football game but I'm locked in trying to get victories."

How close have you guys gotten? You play, practice together. Have you guys gotten to be pretty good friends because you share obviously a lot of information and probably bounce off each other a little bit too?

"Who is that?"

With Colin, I'm saying. What's the relationship like as quarterbacks, as competitors? How much fun are you having working with him on the field just this last year and last year as well?

"With Kap?"

With Kaepernick, yeah.

"The quarterback room's great. The quarterbacks are all in there to get each other better. Whatever we have to do to help this team win, that's what that room is going to do and we're all competitors. We all love our jobs and right now, we're just trying to find ways to get wins and that's it."

You start your season with a shutout. For you, you return to the field having missed the preseason. You must have enjoyed yourself tonight.

"Yeah, it was fun to be a part of that victory in the first game."

Were you on any sort of pitch count?

"We had a game plan for how they were going to use me in the game. I played a lot of passing situations and I rotated in there on first and second downs, too."

Just to get some of the housekeeping stuff out of the way – the shoulder came out feeling good?

"I'm feeling good. [It was a] good way to start the season and I'm looking forward to the other games and continuing to get better."

The front seven got pressure consistently, whether it was you and 49ers LB Ahmad Brooks combining. You guys had a couple of sacks and numerous quarterback hits. Do you feel like 49ers Defensive Coordinator Jim O'Neil is a guy that likes to bring the heat?

"Oh yeah. He for sure wants to get after people on the point of attack, so I love being a part of that."

Seeing 49ers DL DeForest Buckner out there on the field – is that enjoyable to be with him?

"Yeah, it was awesome playing in our first game together since college. Being back out there with him, it was really fun trying to make something happen together."

What were the coaches telling you at the end of the game? Maybe the win is locked up, but how important was it to keep the shutout?

"Oh, it was huge. Any time you can get a shutout, you want to shoot for that and keep attacking the whole game."

Building confidence going into Week 2 against the Carolina Panthers?

Yeah, I think that first win in that fashion will give us some confidence. If we can carry that into Game 2, watch some film and learn from what we did wrong and what we can improve, hopefully we can that in to Carolina."

49ers S Antoine Bethea Postgame Quotes – September 12, 2016 San Francisco 49ers vs. Los Angeles Rams

How important is the win, but defensively can you talk about the interceptions and sacks early and the shutdown? What strikes you most about this defensive performance to start the season?

"Just the shutout and the defense. You always want to create turnovers and get the ball back to the offense. We were able to get some pressure on the quarterback and we held a good running back to 47 yards. This is definitely a game we can build off of."

That's a big thing if you can hold Todd Gurley from going north to south and keeping him side to side. How was this front seven and defensive secondary able to do that together?

"It's a team game. We talk about trusting one another and that's what we did tonight. Everybody did their job playing gaps sound, playing fundamentally sound and tackling well."

When you look at this front seven for the 49ers, it starts with three outside linebackers for the season. A lot of people might be surprise at so few. Do the sub-packages in the room rotating in and out kind of become second nature to everyone?

"I think that's a good thing about the players we have on our team. We can give you different personnel and give you different looks. Guys can play their positions well. It's definitely going to pay dividends for us in helping us disguise our looks for opposing quarterbacks."

How about the two interceptions by the inside linebackers?

"I know, we were talking about that. They're up on us right now, but it's definitely a good thing, some friendly competition always helps."

The 49ers haven't pitched a shutout since 2012. How much pride do you take in accomplishing that?

"A lot of pride. The last couple drives, that was one of the main things we were saying. We wanted to pitch the shutout in our first game and we did that. It's early, but it's definitely something we can build off of."

What was the key to stopping Gurley?

"In my time being in the league, you always want to keep a team one dimensional. When they have you on the ropes and they're running and passing, it's tough as a defensive coordinator to call plays. My goal coming into the game was to stop Gurley and we did a great job of that. When they went back to pass we were able to get pressure on them."

How does a win like this in such dominating fashion set up the next few weeks to come?

"It sets the tone for us, but at the end of the day we're going on the road next week to a good team. It definitely sets the tone. We definitely have some things we can correct. Last year we came out, had a great showing the first game and laid an egg the second game. I think that mindset is much different."

What can you correct defensively?

"You can always correct things. Granted we played well and shut them out, but there are definitely some things we can correct."

Why was it so important for the defense to come out so strongly?

"For one, [RB] Todd Gurley's looked at as one of the elite running backs in this league. And on defense, we take that personal. We take it with a lot of pride and try to go out there and play with a lot of pride. The defense had to carry the weight this week and I think we did that."

You guys played so many different guys. It seemed like everyone played well. How much did everybody just feed into that? One guy makes a play, which leads to another guy and so on.

"Before the game, I was just asking everyone, if you're your brother's keeper step up to the plate, put your hand in and let's go out there and get this victory. Any position that you're in, it doesn't matter if you're starting or on special teams, just own that position. I think everyone committed to that and went out and played well. I feel like this was a full team effort today."

At what point did you guys start talking about shutout? Did you go into this game thinking that was a realistic possibility or did that dawn on you in the second half?

"Not at all. We went out expecting the Rams to play better than they did, expecting the Rams to get the ball in their playmaker's hands, and the coaches did a great job with preparing us for this week with alert in certain formations and certain plays that they like to do out of different personnel. We just ran around to the ball. We did everything that we were supposed to do."

You are basically in the same exact spot that you were last year after an opening night win against Minnesota and then traveling to play a team on extra rest that played in that Thursday Night game. What have you learned from last year that you hope to take into Week 2?

"We'll try to forget this one as quick as possible and move on to Carolina. A lot of guys that were on this team last year understand what we did last year after the first game, and we'll try not to let that happen again. So, celebrate tonight, enjoy it. [Head Coach] Chip [Kelly] said we have to be in tomorrow. So, we're moving on to Carolina tomorrow."

What did you say after the game to the guys, if anything?

"I didn't say anything, but I let them know that we have a long season ahead. Don't get too high, just stay even keeled and just try to keep building and get better as a team each and every week."

How many interceptions have you made with your knees before tonight?

"I don't think any. Big [NT] Mike Purcell said that was his interception. I just had a little more vertical. Me and Mike got that pick today. So, it was a good job."

What advantages did you see tonight for that linebacker rotation with LB Ray-Ray Armstrong and LB Gerald Hodges?

"I don't want to say advantage, but I think we did a great job with understanding who was in the game at certain times. The coaches did a great job with making sure we had the right personnel group on the field at the right time and it worked out. You don't really usually see that. But like I said, that competition is going to continue on and both of them did a great job today. So, we'll go learn from the tape and move on."

First impression of defensive coordinator Jim O'Neil's game plan and the execution of the game plan?

"Well, I've played the Rams twice every year my whole career. So, his installation was dead on. He was definitely keyed in on what they like to do. So, he did a great job with just letting us know what to look for and things like that. We all work together. I think that's the best thing that happened today."

You guys came out with such great energy tonight. Is that just a result of the way your team came together in training camp? And LB Eli Harold was talking about how QB Colin Kaepernick's remarks actually acted as a positive factor in bringing your team together as a group.

"We started off as the underdogs. Nobody expected us to win a game this year, or something crazy. And I just say to the guys, it's not what anyone outside of the organization says about us, it's about what we say about us. If we keep that mindset and understand we're the ones out there contributing and playing together and understand we are a strong-knit team, we can accomplish anything. So, that's the reason why we play with so much energy. Understanding it's us 53 together and it takes all of us."

The guys up front, the combinations, in regards to working back in, what did you see from those guys today?

"You know guys just understanding the situation of the game. The Rams do a lot on first and second down where you can get some tips. Guys did a great job with understanding, or expecting, the run to come or when the pass was coming and keeping me, [LB] Gerald [Hodges] and [LB] Ray-Ray [Armstrong] free. So, like I said, it's a long year. Teams are going to watch this game and see what they can get on us or get done. So, we just got to stay on it and not get complacent."

Can you walk us through that first touchdown? It seemed like you hesitated and then the seas parted for you to run through?

"On that play, all week in practice, the big emphasis on that play was to be patient. And, you also have to be patient because you have two blockers, you have two pullers coming around. So, you have to wait for your second puller to come around to figure out what he's going to do, if he's going to go up inside or outside. So, just being patient. I actually thought the run was going to go outside and I just saw it split apart like the Red Sea, and my eyes got big and I got rolling."

Did that stutter step help you with the patience?

"Yeah, I've been practicing that all the way back when we were practicing against Houston. I had a run, not similar to it, but I had a run where I had to be real patient and I ended up breaking on it. So, that run you just have to be really patient. On all of the runs you have to be patient, but on that run you really have to be patient because you have your second puller coming around."

You've talked about that, the need to be slow to the hole, but quick through it. How do you develop that or is that something that's just kind of innate?

"I think it's just natural. Just being a running back, you know that you have to be patient on your runs and setup your blocks so that you're able to make holes open up, and then you just burst through it. So, I think that's just natural just being a running back."

You talked about being a good fit in the system and having run something similar in college. Is that how it played out for you tonight?

"No, I don't feel like I'm in college. I feel like I'm in the NFL."

No, I know, but the fit, the system you run?

"Yeah, you're right, not necessarily though. I think with [head] coach [Chip] Kelly, the way he runs his scheme, with the run plays we have to set our blocks. In college I was just able to just go downhill and run through. It was a lot easier. It wasn't really about being patient, it was about going fast. So, I think now with coach Kelly's scheme, you have to be patient with your runs. You have to setup your blocks so you can hit the hole and make seams."

You guys pretty much beat them with the running game, was that the initial plan?

"The plan was just to get after them, whether it was passing the ball or running the ball. I figured that they would stack the box. So, I was just really hoping we were able to make catches outside, and [QB] Blaine [Gabbert] did a great job of making plays. With him making plays out to the receivers, that just opens up the lanes for me."

You surprised by how much QB Blaine Gabbert ran today?

"No, I tell him all the time, Blaine this is me and you. We have to work together. And, if we are on the same page, we will kill teams with this read option. I'm like, you can run it just as good as I can run it. So, don't be afraid to pull it and go make a play. Before the game I told him, if you feel like you can go beat the defensive end to the sideline then go make a play. Don't just rely on me all the time. It's a two-man game with us when we run the read option. I was happy though. He was pulling it in, he was getting yards. It just put more pressure on the defense."

How much did the negativity in the offseason actually help to bring this team together because you guys came out with such energy tonight early?

"We didn't really pay attention to the negativity at all. We just have been focused as a group. People count us out every game. People counted us out before the season even started. So, we just stay together as a group. We go out here and we work together just like a brotherhood. It's us against the world. So, we just keep that mindset."

Has it been easy to buy in to Chip Kelly's philosophy? It's not an easy thing going from all these different coaches the last two years.

"To me, it was easy to buy in to it because I kind of ran something similar to it at Ohio State and I saw what we did with it at Ohio State. So, for me it was easy to buy in. And I would tell guys in the beginning, really buy in to this system. If you really buy in to this, this offense can be unstoppable. So, it's just one game, we got a win and we have a really good opponent coming up. So, we really have to lock in this week."

You mentioned earlier this week that you were kind of the overlooked back last year in the Monday Night game and this week again. Did you think you sent a message tonight at all?

"I don't really care about me sending a message to anybody. I'm here to do my job and that's to run the ball, catch the ball and pass block. And help my team win games, put my team in a position to win games. Tonight, offensively, I think we did a great job of just having drives, putting drives together, getting down in the red zone, not just kicking field goals, but actually scoring touchdowns."

Between their move to L.A., the frustration on the field and the fan's emotion tonight, do you see L.A. becoming your next big rival?

"I don't really pay too much attention to the whole rival thing. It's just an opponent in our division that we have to beat. So, I don't really pay too much attention about the rival."

What led to some of the inconsistencies in the passing game?

“We were probably slower than we normally are. I don’t think there were too many mistakes in terms of being outside. It’s just about going out there and getting it done.”

It seemed like so much of this offense was about getting the ball out quickly so it might take longer for those deeper routes to develop. Is that something this offense still needs to improve or work on?

“Yeah, absolutely. Game 1, that’s the most important thing. Just glad to start this way when we have a short week coming up, so we’re going to have our hands full.”

“That’s impressive. The best mistakes that happen in terms of penalties are ones about effort. The false starts are the ones that really kill you. You can deal with something like a guy was holding, just trying to get the job done. We did a great job and that’s something we definitely try to practice, being as disciplined as possible.”

Opening Comments:

“Well, that wasn’t what we expected, certainly not what I expected for our first game. Back in LA we’ve got some work to do, obviously, very disappointed in the outcome. I thought the 49ers did a nice job in all three phases. They’re well coached and we didn’t get things done. And you know as I told the players, there’s 15 other teams obviously that lost this weekend. Some of them are pretty good. I happen to think these guys in this locker room are pretty good. So, we have a short week and that’s good and bad, but we have to get this thing corrected and get on with things. So, you know obviously disappointed in the lack of offensive production. It’s third down efficiency, scoring and the run game was not there tonight. I’ll credit their defense, but those things were problematic for us last year. I believe we would improve in those areas, but we just didn’t show up when we had to show up. I was a little disappointed in the defense. Although with the defense we made adjustments at half-time, settled down, got numerous back-to-back three and outs, and that gave us an opportunity to get some starts, you know, get some drive starts offensively, but we just couldn’t get the blitz. Came through healthy and you know, we’ll go home and get ready for Seattle. Questions?”

What were the biggest, besides third downs, offensively, that troubled you? Was it just the fact that you couldn’t get the running game going?

“Well, it was the run game, yeah. I mean the line of scrimmage was loaded up and you know, they’re well coached and we couldn’t get it going. And when we can’t get a run game going you know, nothing else falls after that. So, that was a concern, but you know we had numerous third and fourth and sixes in this game, and we just couldn’t get it, we couldn’t keep drives alive or make plays for that matter. I mean, we flashed a little bit early, but you got to make big plays down the field. You know, coming into the game [San Francisco 49ers] Blaine [Gabbert] was a concern of mine, just his legs. You know, he obviously shows what he can do. He can pull it down and run and break your back. You know we lost, it’s not an excuse.”

Were there also, it looked like some miscommunication sometimes when Los Angeles Rams QB Case Keenum was throwing to a spot, receiver depth might have been off a little bit, did you notice anything like that?

“I’ll have to look at it, but yeah when you play that poorly on offense there’s some stuff that goes wrong.”

Was there ever any thought of maybe going to Los Angeles Rams QB Sean Mannion?

“I thought about it. You know, I thought about it, but I wanted Case to finish it. It’s for no other reason than just to get Sean some experience, but I just let Case finish it. And I’d have done the same thing had [Los Angeles Rams QB] Jared [Goff] been in too, I would let Case finish it. This doesn’t change anything as far as the quarterback’s concerned.”

So you’re saying that you’re going to continue with Case as the starter for now?

“That’s right.”

And if this continues?

“Well I’ll adjust, but I don’t expect it to continue.”

Also, at the end the loss of composure, Los Angeles Rams Aaron Donald--?

“You know, really it’s so frustrating. You know, and I talked to him you know he’s really disappointed, he apologized, and he’s just such a talented player. He’s frustrated, and he just lost his poise there. You

know, he just wants to win. You know, and he's a great football player and so you know, it's a learning experience for some of the younger guys, but he'll be fine."

What about Los Angeles Rams LB Alec Ogletree on that play prior to that when he hit San Francisco 49ers Blaine Gabbert across the head?

"I didn't see it."

So, you're not aware of what Ogletree did specific to that?

"No. I'll look at the tape."

Did Aaron give you his apology, or did he address the team?

"He apologized, yeah. And if you don't know Aaron, then get to know him. He's a great person. He's frustrated and lost his poise."

What kind of extra pressure does this put on you guys next week, with your home opener back in LA for the first time in 22 years?

"You know, it's the same. It's no different. Well, I guess I should say it's probably, yes it would have been different had we gone into the home opener 1-0, but we're not. But, it's still Seattle, and you know we played them pretty well the last few years, and we're going to have to play them good enough to win."

Los Angeles Rams owner Stan Kroenke came into the locker room afterwards. Did he talk to you about how the game went, when Mr. Kroenke came in? Did you guys talk about this?

"Did we talk about this?"

Did you guys talk about the game, how it went?

"Uh, yeah I spoke with him. As a matter of fact he's still in there. I'm going to go talk to him now. You think I'm going to tell you what we discussed?"

I was hoping.

"No, next question."

Were you aware that Los Angeles Rams WR Kenny Britt and Los Angeles Rams DE Robert Quinn raised their fists during the anthem today?

"I was not, no."

Was it anything that they discussed, or you had discussed before today's game with San Francisco 49ers QB Colin Kaepernick being in it?

"No, I addressed the importance of the anthem once again. And I said, you know I just asked them, that they would be considerate, that there'd be no surprises to me. So, that wasn't hard."

Does this count as a surprise? What was your reaction?

"I wasn't aware, so I don't know."

Just overall, I mean when you've got seven months to get ready for an opener, and to come out and have the team play as poorly as it did early, I mean what goes into that in your mind? You've been around this game a long time.

"Yeah, I mean shoot it's one of those things that happened. I can't remember being on the other side of a shutout. So, you know we had a pretty good field goal at the end, and you guys can talk about it later, but yeah it's disappointing. You know, so again this group's not going to make excuses either. We've moved four times in the last seven months, OK? So, there's no reason for the lack of production or

execution. You know if I'd seen it coming, we would've done something different. I thought we were doing really well."

Could you give us your thoughts on what early on was a stumbling block for the offense and why you guys could not get on track?

"I mean, I'd have to look at it drive by drive, but it's the little things. That's what's frustrating is that, little thing here, little thing there. Obviously third downs, I haven't seen the stats or anything, but we've got to stay on the field. Whatever it is that's causing it, we have to go look at the film. It's frustrating because that's not us. We're good on third down and we work hard on third down. I think we put a lot of pressure on our defense."

When you can't get the running game going, how much more difficult does that make it for you guys as a group offensively? Is there anything you guys could do to get that running game going?

"It feeds off each other. Passing, it helps when you can run the ball and when you're running the ball it helps open it up for the pass. They complement each other well and when one's not going it's tough to get the other. It was a tough night."

How tough was it to get the ball down the field? It looked like a lot of the routes timing-wise you guys were going more horizontal than vertical.

"They did a good job of mixing it up. San Francisco did with coverage over the top and mixing it up with the single I. You have to give them a lot of credit. They did a really good job especially on third down. A lot of looks that we haven't seen before, but it's not an excuse though. We still have to convert. There were some chances to convert, and it's tough."

What did you see on that fourth quarter interception?

"They gave us a look that I wasn't, I'm trying to think. Which one are you talking about?"

The fourth quarter one.

"Oh, it was just forcing it in there. It was a bad decision. I thought I was going to check down, but we lost our back on that play, and [Los Angeles Rams TE] Lance [Kendricks] popped. It was a bad decision when we're in scoring position like that. I can't put my team in that situation. It was a very poor decision on my part."

How disappointing was this for you personally with your first ever season opening start?

"Well, I'm not happy. It's not something that I'll go out and think about, but this team deserves better plays from its quarterback and I intend on doing that. That's one thing that is not going to define me. It was a big stage and it would have been fun to win on Monday night to start the season, but it's a long season. This is not us, offensively, this is not us. We're going to come to work tomorrow and get ready to beat the Seahawks."

As a leader on this team and you see the way things went with the loss of composure at the end with Los Angeles Rams DT Aaron Donald getting ejected, does anything need to be said or is this more like we got this out of our system, let's go ahead and play better and more professionally?
