## 2018 HIGHLIGHTS

- Started the first 3 games of the season and completed 53 of 89 atts. for 718 yds. and 5 TDs for a QB rating of 90.0 before being placed on the Injured Reserve List on 9/26.
- Completed 18 of 26 atts. (69.2 pct.) for 206 yds., 2 TDs and QB rating of 118.4 vs. Det. (9/16). His 118.4 QB rating was the highest as a member of the 49ers and the second-highest of his career (min. 10 atts.) [135.4 vs. Mia. (9/18/16)].
- In the first half vs. Det. (9/16), completed 10 of 14 atts. (71.4 pct.) for 119 yds., 1 TD and a QB rating of 120.8. His 71.4 comp. pct. marked his highest comp. pct. in the first half in his career. His previous first half career high was 69.2 pct. [18 of 26 (69.2 pct.) vs. Mia. (9/18/16) & 18 of 26 (69.2 pct) vs. Ten. (12/17/17)].

## CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Garoppolo is 1 of 5 QBs to win their 1st seven NFL starts since the merger in 1970.
- With wins in each of his 1st five starts with the 49ers [15-14 at Chi. (12/3/17); 26-16 at Hou. (12/10/17); 25-23 vs. Ten. (12/17/17); 44-33 vs. Jax. (12/24/17); 34-13 at LAR (12/31)], he became the 1st 49ers QB since the merger in 1970 to win each of his 1st five starts with the team.
- With wins at Chi. (12/3/17), at Hou. (12/10/17) and at LAR (12/31), he is the 3rd 49ers QB since the merger in 1970 to win each of his 1st three road starts. QB Elvis Grbac won each of his 1st four road starts from 1995-96 and QB Jim Plunkett won his 1st three starts on the road in 1976.

## GAROPPOLO'S GOLDEN NUGGETS

- Is a two-time Super Bowl champion (XLIX & LI) as a member of the New England Patriots.
- Registered 13,089 yards in total offense at Eastern Illinois, joining New Orleans Saints head coach Sean Payton (10,298 yards; 1983-86) as the only players in EIU history to generate at least 10,000 yards in total offense.
- Following his senior season at Eastern Illinois in 2013, was named the Walter Payton Award winner. The Award is given to the most outstanding offensive player in the Division I Football Championship Subdivision.
- In addition to Garoppolo, Eastern Illinois has produced a fair share of NFL products including Mike Shanahan, former Super Bowl winning NFL head coach and father of current 49ers head coach Kyle Shanahan, Chicago Bears general manager Ryan Pace, New Orleans Saints head coach Sean Payton and former Dallas Cowboys QB and current TV analyst Tony Romo.
- His brother, Mike, played linebacker at Western Illinois (2007-11).

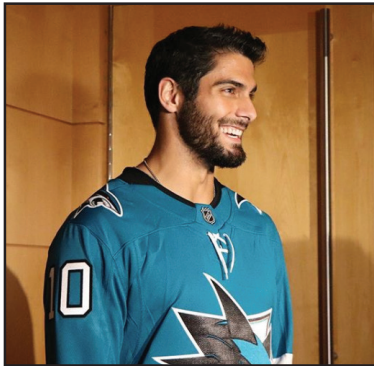
- Became just the 5th QB in the last 30 years to make his 1st regular season start in a season-opening night game (9/11/16 vs. Arz.). Packers QB Aaron Rodgers was the last (2008, win vs. Minnesota), with Chargers QB Philip Rivers (2006) and former NFL QBs David Carr (2002) and Brian Griese (1999) before him. He finished 24 of 33 for 264 yds. and 1 TD.
- Helped the Patriots set a NFL record for fewest INTs in a single season (2 INTs on 550 atts. in 2016).

## GOLDMINE

- Garoppolo attended the 12th Annual Tipping Point Community benefit in San Francisco with 49ers CEO Jed York and general manager John Lynch. The 49ers and Levi's Stadium provided an auction item that included a club suite for the 2019 College Football National Championship, which is being held at Levi's Stadium, along with access to 49ers practice.



- Garoppolo has quickly become integrated with the Bay Area and its sports franchises. Prior to Game 3 of the NHL's Western Conference Semifinals between the San Jose Sharks and Vegas Golden Knights, Garoppolo was tasked to be the "honorary locker room door opener" at SAP Center in San Jose. The Sharks ask celebrities and well-respected sports figures to be the ceremonial door opener as the team heads out for final warmups and pregame introductions.
- Along with former Patriots teammate Julian Edelman, Garoppolo surprised students at Central Elementary and Cedar Elementary schools in Hanover, NJ in June of 2016. The two spent time at both schools reading to kids, sharing the importance of homework, and learning a few new touchdown dances.



- In May of 2016, Garoppolo, in partnership with AccessSportAmerica, volunteered to help at a football clinic for disabled high school students at Harvard Stadium. During the clinic, Garoppolo gave tips to participants on passing, blocking and other essential football skills. Garoppolo enjoyed the clinic so much, he returned to Harvard Stadium again in 2017 to hang out with the AccessSportAmerica students. Garoppolo said he felt honored to volunteer with AccessSportAmerica, and contribute to their efforts to inspire higher function and fitness for people living with challenges and disabilities through high-challenge sports and training.
- For fans traveling to the San Francisco Zoo, they can keep an eye out for one of the zoo's snow leopards named Jimmy G, whom the zoo chose to name after the 49ers quarterback. The zoo received both a male and female snow leopard in early 2018 and quickly found a new name. You can find Jimmy G in the enclosure outside the Lion House near the Lion Fountain.



- Garoppolo's father, Tony, was a two-way starter in high school, playing offensive guard and defensive tackle despite his average build of 5-10, 180 pounds. Tony later embodied the blue-collar spirit he played with in his strenuous work as an electrician. "I wouldn't even see my dad some days because he was working so late and going to work so early," said Jimmy's brother, Mike. "That blue-collar approach really got imbedded in us. If you want to do something, you've got to work for it."

## GAROPPOLO'S TRANSACTIONS

Originally a 2nd–round (62nd overall) draft choice by NE in 2014...Traded to SF on 10/31/17...Signed a five–year extension through 2022 on 2/8/18...Placed on the Injured Reserve List on 9/26/18.

## 2017 (SAN FRANCISCO)

- Acquired via trade on 10/31, played in 6 games (5 starts) and completed 120 of 178 atts. for 1,560 yds., 7 TDs, 5 INTs and a QB rating of 96.2. Added 15 rushing atts. for 11 yds. and 1 TD.
- Set the franchise record for the most passing yds. (1,542) in his 1st five starts with the team.
- Threw a 10-yd. TD pass to WR Louis Murphy vs. Sea. (11/26). It marked the 1st TD pass of Garoppolo's career with the 49ers.
- In his 1st start as a member of the 49ers, completed 26 of 37 atts. for a then career-high 293 yds. at Chi. (12/3). According to the Elias Sports Bureau, his 293 passing yds. set the franchise record for most passing yds. by a player in his 1st start with the team.
- Trailing 12-14 with 5:27 left to play in the game at Chi. (12/3), he led a 14-play, 86-yd. drive to set up the game-winning FG by K Robbie Gould with 0:04 left on the clock. On the drive, he completed 5 of 6 atts. for 54 yds. and converted on three 3rd down plays.
- Completed 20 of 33 atts. for a then career-high 334 yds. and 1 TD, including a career-long 61-yd. completion to TE Garrett Celek at Hou. (12/10). He became the 3rd 49ers QB since the merger in 1970 to win each of his 1st two road starts. QB Elvis Grbac won each of his 1st four road starts from 1995-96 and QB Jim Plunkett won his 1st three starts on the road in 1976.
- Finished the game completing 31 of 43 atts. for a career-high 381 yds., 1 TD and at QB rating of 106.8 vs. Ten. (12/17). For the 2nd time in the three weeks, he engineered a game-winning scoring drive in the 4th qtr. Trailing Ten. 22-23 with 1:07 left in the game, Garoppolo worked the offense down the field, completing 3 of 5 atts. for 45 yds., setting up K Robbie Gould for the game-winning 45-yd. FG as time expired.
- With 381 yds. passing vs. Ten. (12/17), threw for over 300 yds. passing in consecutive games for the 1st time in his career [334 at Hou. (12/10/17)]. He became the 1st 49ers QB to register consecutive 300-yd. passing games since QB Jeff Garcia had three consecutive 300-yd. games in 2000 [323 at SD (12/3/00); 305 vs. NO (12/10/00) & 402 vs. Chi. (12/17/00)].
- Having thrown for 1,008 yds. in a three game span [293 at Chi. (12/3); 334 at Hou. (12/10); 381 vs. Ten. (12/17)], he became the 1st 49ers QB to throw for over 1,000 yds. in a three game span since QB Tim Rattay threw for 1,002 yds. over three games in 2004 [299 vs. StL (10/3/04); 417 vs. Arz. (10/10/04); 286 at NYJ (12/17/04)].
- With his 31 completions vs. Ten. (12/17), he became the 1st 49ers QB to have 30-or-more completions in a game since 12/20/15 [QB Blaine Gabbert vs. Cin. (30 of 50 for 295 yds., 1 TD and 3 INTs)].
- In the 1st half vs. Ten. (12/17), he completed 18 of 26 atts. for 189 yds., 1 TD and a passer rating of 102.9. His 18 completions were the most in a 1st half by a 49ers QB since Alex Smith went 18 of 29 vs. Jax. (11/29/09).
- Completed 21 of 30 atts. for 242 yds., 2 TDs and at QB rating of 102.4 vs. Jax. (12/24). He also scored the 1st rushing TD of his career on a 1-yd. run on the 1st drive of the game. His 102.4 QB rating was the highest against the Jaguars in 2017.

## 2016 (NEW ENGLAND)

- Appeared in 6 games (2 starts) and completed 43 of 63 pass atts. (68.3 pct.) for 502 yds. and 4 TDs.
- Made his 1st career NFL start at Arz. (9/11), going 24-33 for 264 yds., 1 TD and a passer rating of 106.1. Also rushed for 12 yds. on 4 carries.
- Completed 18 of 26 passing atts. for 232 yds. and a career-high 3 TDs vs. Mia. (9/18). Finished the game with a 135.4 passer rating.

## 2015 (NEW ENGLAND)

- Saw action in 5 regular season contests as a reserve and completed 1 pass on 4 atts. for 6 yds.
- Came in to complete 1 pass for 4 yds. at Mia. (1/3/16).

## 2014 (NEW ENGLAND)

- Appeared in 6 regular season games in relief of Patriots QB Tom Brady, completing 19 of 27 passes (70.4 pct.) for 182 yds. and 1 TD.
- Made his NFL debut at KC (9/29), competing 6 of 7 passes for 70 yds. and his 1st career TD pass.
- Played the entire 2nd half of the season finale vs. Buf. (12/28), completing 10 of 17 passes for 90 yds. Also rushed 4 times for 16 yds.

## COLLEGE

Started all 45 games that he appeared in for Eastern Illinois, where he completed 1,047 of 1,668 pass atts. (62.8%) for 13,151 yds., 118 TDs and 51 INTs. Also added 8 rushing TDs on 260 carries. Generated 13,089 yds. in total offense in his career and was responsible for 126 touchdowns. Also handled some punting duties, kicking 9 times for 287 yds. (31.9 avg). Finished 6th in Football Championship Subdivision annals with 118 TD passes and 7th with 13,151 yds. passing. Set the Ohio Valley Conference (OVC) records in comps. (1,047), yds. (13,151) and TDs (118). As a senior in 2013, was the Walter Payton Award winner, named FCS ADA National Offensive Player of the Year, was a Consensus First-Team All-American and was the OVC Male Athlete of the Year. That season, he appeared in 14 games and completed 375 of 568 passes (66.0%) for 5,050 yds. and 53 TDs. He also broke Tony Romo's single season and career passing records. In 2012, he earned Second-Team All-OVC Honors after going 331-of-540 for 3,823 yds. and 31 TD passes. Started all 11 games as a sophomore, throwing for 2,644 yds. and 20 TDs on 217 of 349 passing. In 2010, started the final 8 games of the season, passing for 1,639 yds. and 14 TDs, earning All-Ohio Valley Conference Newcomer Team honors.

- Attended Rolling Meadows (IL) HS and passed for 1,888 yds. and 16 TDs as a senior, earning northwest suburban all-area honors. Also rushed for 563 yds. and 7 TDs, helping to lead his team to mid-suburban east league championships and IHSA Class 7A play-off berth. As a junior, passed for 2,072 yds. and 18 TDs while completing 152 of 253 (60.1 pct.) passes and ran for 552 yds. and 7 TDs.
- Is the 3rd of four sons of Tony and Denise Garoppolo.
- Brother Mike played football at Western Illinois.
- Majored in management at Eastern Illinois.
- Born Jimmy Garoppolo (11/2/91) in Franklin Park, IL.
