CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- Became the first rookie since 2000 to begin his career with 4 consecutive games of at least 10 tackles, according to Gamebook Statistics.

2018 HIGHLIGHTS

- Registered 12 tackles, 1 FF and 1 PD in his NFL debut at Min. (9/9). Became the first 49ers defender to register 10-or-more tackles, 1-or-more FF and 1-or-more PD in a single game since 2013 [NaVorro Bowman at Arz. (12/29/13)].
- With 10 tackles at LAC (9/30), he became the first rookie since 2000 to begin his career with four consecutive games of at least 10 tackles.
- Recovered a fumble by Cardinals TE Jermaine Gresham at Arz. (10/28), marking his 1st career FR.

GOLDMINE

- Warner and his teammates surprised guests of the CityTeam Men's Program and House of Grace on November 20, 2018, at Levi's Stadium. The group believed they were just taking a tour of the stadium, but they were in fact joining the 49ers players for a night full of exciting events. The guests received a makeover and haircut, selected a new outfit from Dockers, snapped a new headshot and then shared a Thanksgiving dinner with the 49ers players.



WARNER'S GOLDEN NUGGETS

- Caught the attention of BYU coaches after a die-hard BYU fan and family friend sent Warner's highlight tape to the coaches and was later offered a scholarship.
- At BYU, was roommates with his younger brother Troy, who plays cornerback for the Cougars.
- Warner participated in BYU's True Blue Heroes program, which visited the Utah state prison, and traveled to Harlem with BYU head coach Kalani Sitake, who spoke at schools in the area and held football clinics for Harlem Jets Athletics in New York. Said Warner, "Some of the prisoners follow football and actually know about some of the guys on the team. And they want to get better. So we speak to them about life and hardships. We talk about overcoming adversity. Hopefully, we help someone."

GOLDMINE (CONTINUED)

- The 49ers joined forces with Martha's Kitchen of San Jose as part of their Community Tuesday kickoff event on September 11, 2018. Warner and teammates took part in the event by serving dinner to nearly 200 residents in need, refilling beverages and bussing tables. Both the 49ers and Levi's Stadium partner with Martha's Kitchen throughout the year by donating excess food after stadium events. Martha's Kitchen's mission is to "feed the hungry with dignity, no questions asked, no judgements made."



- Warner and his fellow rookies participated in the annual 49ers Mentorship Academy on September 18, 2018. The Mentorship Academy, partnering with USA Football, is a three-step program designed to provide high school football players with the opportunity to develop the skills necessary to succeed and be leaders on and off the field. The rookie class invited the high schoolers to the team facility, where they shared opinions and lessons over a meal and fun competitions.



- Warner credits his mother, Laura, as the number one influence in his life. He notes that his mother raised him and his siblings all by herself while making sacrifices along the way. "She taught all of us about hard work," Warner said. On draft day, Laura was by Fred's side as he was selected by the 49ers in the third round. "She was right next to me," he said. "She got the first hug."



- Warner was one of 146 college football players nominated for the 2017 Allstate American Football Coaches Association Good Works Team, one of the most prestigious off-the-field honors in college football. "I don't come from the best background, but others come from much worse situations than me," he said. "So being on the platform that I'm on, to be able to give back and help other people, it's what I'm all about."

COLLEGE

Played in 49 games (42 starts) in four years at BYU and registered 264 tackles, 32.0 TFLs, 6.5 sacks, 7 INTs (returning 2 for TDs), 5 FRs, 3 FFs and 13 PDs. His 7 career INTs rank 2nd in school history among LBs. In 2017, was named a team captain and started all 13 games, notching 87 tackles, 9.0 TFLs, 1.0 sack, 1 INT, 1 FF, 1 FR and 5 PDs. As a junior, started all 13 games and notched 86 tackles, 10.5 TFLs, 1.5 sacks, 3 INTs (returning 1 for a TD), 2 FFs and 6 PDs. In 2015, played in all 13 games (12 starts) and tallied 67 tackles, 11.5 TFLs, 4.0 sacks, 2 INTs, 4 FRs and 1 PD. As a freshman, played in 10 games (4 starts) and registered 24 tackles, 1.0 TFL, 1 INT which was returned for a TD and 1 PD.

- Attended Mission Hills (San Marcos, CA) HS, where he was named Avocado East League Defensive Player of the Year and the All-San Diego Section Defensive Player of the Year. Also earned First-Team All-California honors from *USA Today*.
