GET TO KNOW 49ERS CO-CHAIRMAN DENISE DEBARTOLO YORK

Since Denise's father, Edward J. DeBartolo Sr., purchased the 49ers in 1977, she has been an integral part of 49ers football, including 44 playoff contests and five Super Bowl victories. The mother of four previously served as President of the Pittsburgh Penguins hockey team transforming it into a championship team, winning the Stanley Cup. She is one of only 12 women to have her name engraved on hockey's famed championship trophy.

As co-chair of the 49ers, Denise provides the resources and guidance to uphold the 49ers celebrated history.

Denise is an active member of the Pro Football Hall of Fame Committee, where she helps to oversee the League's ongoing support of the museum that pays tribute to the triumphs of professional football's greatest stars, including 28 legendary members of the San Francisco 49ers.

In addition to acting as Co-Chair of the 49ers Foundation, Denise is passionate about giving back to the community. She provides mentoring and tuition assistance for at-risk youth throughout all levels of education. Denise "adopted" Williamson Elementary School in Youngstown through the United Way Success after Six program, her donation sponsored the after school program. She also works with the local food bank and supports Rescue Mission, Akron Children's Hospital Mahoning Valley, Beatitude House, Youngstown Neighborhood Development, Angels for Animals, Alchemy Acres, YWCA Scholarship Program, Women in Entrepreneurship Program at Youngstown Business Incubator and made a substantial contribution to the new Youngstown State University Veteran's Resource Center. Over the last few years, and again this year, Denise has been the sponsor of the Ohio NonViolence Week in conjunction with the Simeon Booker Courage Award. Denise is also passionate about cancer-related causes, including The Serenity Garden at the Joanie Abdu Comprehensive Breast Care Center.

This months "Coach's Corner" comes from Offensive Assistant, Katie Sowers. Coach Sowers enters her third season in the NFL and second with the 49ers.


Getting To Know Some of Our Veteran WRs

Marquise Goodwin- #11


You may know Marquise Goodwin as number 11 on the field but there is a lot more to this talented player. Marquise Goodwin made the 2012 United States Olympic team in the long jump with a career-best mark of 27-04.25 at the US Olympic Trials. This jump would have been good enough to win the gold medal at the following Olympics. Goodwin ended up finishing 10th place at the Olympics. ALSO, while in High School, Goodwin set the national high school record in the long jump and still holds that record to this day. With this explosiveness, look for MG to be a deep field threat.

Pierre Garçon- #15

Not all of the big names in the NFL came from big schools. Have you ever heard of Mount Union College? This Division III school is where Pierre Garçon won two consecutive National Championships. There are a lot of young players that think they have to go to a big school to be successful but Pierre is proof that this is not true. Garçon is a prime example of determination and work ethic. This is one player who spends a lot of his free time on the jugs machine, getting better. This work has paid off tremendously because Garçon is currently ranked as one of the most sure-handed players in the NFL with one of the lowest drop rates since 2015.

What do you love about WON?


Being part of WON has been another great way to be connected to 49ers football outside the traditional game day experience and to meet other great women who enjoy and love 49ers football as much as I do.



THIS MONTH IN 49ERS HISTORY

A look at marquee moments throughout the team's rich history pulled from the 49ers Archives.



October 1, 1972

The 49ers defense pummeled quarterback Archie Manning, sacking him five times and intercepting four passes in a 37-2 rout of New Orleans at Tulane Stadium. Future Pro Football Hall of Fame cornerback Jimmy Johnson picked off two passes, defensive end Tommy Hart snagged one interception, and defensive back Mike Simpson returned an errant throw 32 yards for a touchdown. The Saints totaled just 84 yards of total offense. John Brodie completed 19 of 26 passes, including scoring tosses of six yards to receiver Gene Washington and five yards to tight end Ted Kwalick. New Orleans' lone score came when 49ers punter Jim McCann had a kick blocked out of the end zone for a safety.
