

San Francisco 49ers at Chicago Bears Game Notes Sunday, December 3, 2017

Goulden Return

- In his first game back in Chicago, K **Robbie Gould** tied his career high with 5 made FGs [5-5 at Arz. (10/1/17)], including the 24-yd. game-winning FG with 0:04 left in the game.
- **Gould** became the first player to make 5 FGs at Soldier Field since 12/28/12 (Car. K Justin Medlock 5 for 5).

Keep Moving The Chains

• The **49ers offense** went 10 of 18 on third down (55.6 pct.). The 10 third down conversions by the 49ers were the most by team since 10/28/07 [10 of 19 (52.6 pct.) vs. NO].

Let's Go For A Sunday Drive

The 49ers offense engineered a 16-play, 70-yd. drive that took 8:19 off the clock and was capped off by a 34-yd. FG by K Robbie Gould. The 8:19 drive was the longest drive by the 49ers in terms of time since 9/20/15 [at Pit. – 17-play, 58 yd. (8:53); 47-yd. FG by K Phil Dawson].

Hold The Rock

• The **49ers offense** held the ball for 38:47, the highest time of possession by the team in a single game since 9/28/14 vs. Phi. (42:17).

A Start To Remember

- QB **Jimmy Garoppolo** completed 26 of 37 atts. for a career-high 293 yds. in his first start as a member of the 49ers. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, his 293 passing yds. set the franchise record for most passing yds. by a player in his first start with the team.
- According to the Elias Sports Bureau, **Garoppolo** is 1 of 7 active QBs to win each of his first 3 starts [Drew Brees (2002), Ben Roethlisberger (2004), Mark Sanchez (2009), Brock Osweiler (2015), Carson Wentz (2016) & Trevor Siemian (2016)].
- Trailing 12-14 with 5:27 left to play in the game, **Garoppolo** led a 14-play, 86-yd. drive to set up the game-winning FG by K Robbie Gould with 0:04 left on the clock. On the drive, **Garoppolo** completed 5 of 6 atts. for 54 yds. and converted on three third down plays.

Goodwin's Good Hands

• WR **Marquise Goodwin** set a new single game career high with 8 recepts., and also finished with a game-high 99 rec. yds.

Taylor Sets Career-Highs

• WR **Trent Taylor** finished the game setting single game career highs in recepts. (6) and rec. yds. (92).

Nowhere To Go

- The **49ers defense** held the Bears to 147 net yds. (62 rushing; 85 passing), marking the fewest net yds. the 49ers defense has allowed in a game since 11/19/12 [vs. Chi. 143 yds. (85 rushing; 58 passing)].
- The **49ers defense** allowed 8 first downs, the fewest first downs the team has allowed in a game since 11/29/10 (at Arz. 8 first downs).
- The Bears ran 36 plays on offense, the fewest against the 49ers since 10/20/91 vs. Det. (35 plays).

Dume's Day

- LB Elvis Dumervil brought down Bears QB Mitchell Trubisky for a 3-yd. loss. It extended Dumervil's team lead to 5.5 sacks on the season and 104.5 for his career.
- **Dumervil's** 104.5 career sacks ranks t-26th in the NFL history with Neil Smith and Kevin Carter.
- With the sack on Trubisky, **Dumervil** has now brought down 50 different NFL QBs. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is one of 4 active players with at least 0.5 sack of 50 different quarterbacks [DE Julius Peppers (74); LB Terrell Suggs (68); DE Dwight Freeney (63)].

In The Marsh

• DL **Cassius Marsh** registered a strip-sack of Trubisky, marking his first FF and sack as a member of the 49ers. He now has 5.0 sacks and 3 FFs for his career.
