San Francisco 49ers vs. Seattle Seahawks Sunday, December 16, 2018

With The Win...

- The 49ers improved to 16-25 all-time against the Seattle Seahawks.
- San Francisco has now split the season series against the Seahawks for the first time since 2013.
- Today marked the first overtime win San Francisco since 1/3/16 [W, 19-16 (OT) vs. StL].

Good As Gould

- K **Robbie Gould** connected on all 4 FGAs and 2 PATs, including the game-winning 36-yd. FG in OT. This marked Gould's 6th-career game-winning FG in OT and his first since 11/17/13 as a member of the Chicago Bears vs. Bal.
- With 14 points on the day, **Gould** has become the 23rd kicker in NFL history to register at least 1,500 points in their career (1,513).
- **Gould** has now scored 111 points this season, marking the first time he scored 100-or-more in consecutive seasons (145 points in 2017) since he accomplished the feat in 6 straight seasons from 2006-11). He is also the first member of the 49ers to score 100-or-more points in consecutive seasons since 2013-14 [K Phil Dawson – 140 points (2013) and 108 points (2014)].
- **Gould** has now connected on 19 consecutive FGAs, which tied for the 3rd-longest streak in franchise history.

Richie Rich

- WR **Richie James Jr.** registered a 97-yd. kickoff return for a TD. It marked the first time a member of the 49ers registered a kickoff return for a TD since WR Ted Ginn Jr. registered a 102-yd. kickoff return for a TD vs. Sea. (9/11/11).
- **James Jr.** became the first 49ers rookie to register a kickoff return for a TD since 1981 [RB Amos Lawrence – 92-yd. KR TD at LAR (11/22/81)].
- **James Jr.'s** kickoff return for a TD was just the 4th in the NFL this season (Jakeem Grant, Mia.; Darius Jennings, Ten. & Cordarrelle Patterson, NE).

98 Degrees

- The **49ers offense** engineered a 10-play, 98-yd. drive that was capped off by a 41-yd. TD pass from QB Nick Mullens to TE **Garrett Celek**, marking team's longest drive since 2002 when the 49ers capped off a 12-play, 99-yd. drive with a 6-yd. TD run by RB Kevan Barlow at Sea. (10/14/02).

It's Time... It's Time... It's Celek Time

- TE **Garrett Celek** hauled in a 41-yd. TD recept., his 2nd TD of the season and 12th of his career, to punctuate a 98-yd. TD drive. He finished the game with 2 recepts. for 61 yds. and 1 TD.

Jolly Ol' Saint Nick

- QB **Nick Mullens** completed 20 of 29 atts. for 275 yds., 1 TD and a QB rating of 110.6.
- This season, **Mullens** threw for 689 yds. against the Seahawks [414 yds. at Sea. (12/2/18)], the most passing yds. allowed by any QB in a single-season since their franchise inception in 1976.

- In a tie game, late in the 4th qtr. and OT, the **49ers defense** forced the Seahawks offense to punt on each of their final 3 possessions of the game, including setting up the 49ers offense for the game-winning FG in OT.

Buckner's Best

- DL **DeForest Buckner** registered a career-high 11 tackles and 2.0 sacks on the day. He extended his single-season career high to 11.0 sacks, becoming the first member of the 49ers to register double-digit sacks since LB Aldon Smith finished with 19.5 sacks in 2012.

- Buckner has now registered 2.0-or-more sacks in three games this season, the most in a single season by a member of the 49ers since LB Aldon Smith registered three games with 2.0-plus sacks in 2013.

**Head Coach Kyle Shanahan

San Francisco 49ers vs. Seattle Seahawks**

Opening comments:

“CB Akhello Witherspoon left with a knee sprain. He’ll have an MRI tomorrow. [DB Tarvarius] T Moore left, but he returned, ribs. That was it. Go ahead.”

The knee sprain suggests that it’s not an ACL or anything really serious. Is that true?

“I hope not. They haven’t ruled it out yet, so I’m not sure.”

Even though most of your team wasn’t around for this long losing streak to Seattle. What do you think it means to them just to snap that and to beat a division rival like that?

“It means a ton. Not all of us have been here since 2013, but a lot of us were here last year. We were all definitely here two weeks ago. It’s a division rival. We’re also very sick about the way we lost two weeks ago. I was really proud of the guys just not saying anything. I just knew it meant a lot to our guys. Especially after two weeks and to the fans and everything since 2013. I hated having to answer those questions all week. I definitely didn’t want to go a whole ‘nother year doing it. This was our last opportunity to end that and I’m glad we don’t have to hear that again.”

What does this say about your group that you guys can get blown out two weeks ago and bounce back and put together a game like this?

“That’s how the NFL is. I look at the blowout and I think it’s just the difference of a few plays before it gets out of hand. That’s how every week is and you can’t over react when things are like that. You have to play good football. We definitely played better today, but there were times when we weren’t perfect, whether it was one side of the ball that struggled at one time, the other one stepped it up. Especially special teams making that play with the kick return, especially the way they started the third quarter two weeks ago, so I know that felt good for [WR] Richie [James Jr.], especially having the fumbled punt at the end of the second quarter two weeks ago. A lot of guys stepped it up in all three phases and it was a great team win.”

How much confidence do you have in RB Jeff Wilson Jr. carrying the ball in that final drive considering his history of fumbling the last two games, also today in the first half?

“It was tough, especially how it’s gone since he’s been in and what happened today, but [RB Matt] Breida went out on that last drive, so you don’t have much of a choice with it and now that he went in and the way he finished running and the fact that he did hold on to the ball, it was great to him. When he started off that fumble early, then dropped a screen pass, we were going to keep Breida in as much as possible. Then Jeff went in at the end because Breida got hurt and it was awesome the way it ended because now that should give him some confidence and make him ready to get out next week.”

What was it for Breida? Ankle again?

“Yeah, I forgot to say that because it happened at the end and nobody mentioned it to me before I came in. I don’t think it was that big, but that’s why he wasn’t in those last two plays.”

How was QB Nick Mullens performance?

“Similar to the last few weeks. Very efficient, made the plays that were there. Made a few off-schedule plays too. Did a great job escaping the rush on a blitz one time when they brought more than we blocked. Was hoping we could make some of those plays at the end and not go to overtime. They got us on a few protection issues though. Nick ended up holding onto the ball. At least not turning it over. So I was happy with Nick. Gave us a chance to win. I was happy with all the guys.”

After losing the way you did a couple weeks ago, to see Seattle score first and then respond immediately with that touchdown from Richie. How important was that early in the game?

“Very important. It always is, we knew it was going to be a battle today regardless of how the score went. They are a good team and they were coming in playing hard like they always do. We knew we were going to be ready today also. We knew it was going to come down to the wire. Didn’t know it was going to be overtime. Was glad it was. I think it was our first overtime win and gives us a little experience with that too.”

What’d you think of DL DeForest Buckner today?

“From what I saw, I mean every time I watched out there it seemed like he was making plays. I definitely saw the sack he had. Looked like he played well in the run game. The way they run the ball, they don’t give you a ton of opportunity in the pass game and it looked like he definitely effected it so I was really happy with DeFo and we’ll see again when I watch the tape later tonight.”

How pleased were you with the defense overall considering the way they set the edge today? Got home on Seattle Seahawks QB Russell Wilson a few times? Considering how they played two weeks ago, they gave up seven plays for 110-yards on the edge.

“Overall, I was very happy with the defense. By no means were they perfect. They got their edge on a couple. Got it on the third and one. Then they ran the ball well, but that’s what that team does. What I was excited about was our defense never let them break them down, even when they gave up some plays. I thought the goal line stand was very close. I know that guy made a helluva run to get in at the end, but our guys just battled. They didn’t worry about any bad play, just one play at a time. They did it all game. I was really disappointed when they had the stand at the end that the offense had a chance to go down and answer and finish and the offense didn’t. We ended up punting it back to them, going to overtime and then the defense did the same thing. They stopped them, gave the offense another chance and then the offense finished. The defense did a helluva job all day.”

The second half the last game, Mullens seemed to get it going a little bit. How much do you think, whether Xs and Os, or confidence-wise, do you think that helped him seeing them again today?

“The more guys play and the more success they have, the more confidence they get. He did a great job that second half throwing the ball two weeks ago. I thought we had a lot more success throwing the ball today. We struggled on third downs form what I remember today in the second half and we didn’t get to stay on the field as long and get those opportunities. I think Nick is getting better the more he plays.”

Can you assess the Tarvarius Moore performance filling in for Akhello?

“Didn’t want him to get his opportunity because of injury, but he’s been playing tough all year. It was good to just throw him out there and see how he did. I thought raised up to the challenge very well. He played aggressive in his man coverage. He’s not scared to tackle at all. Got beat a couple times, which corners do and he didn’t shy away. He’s not scared to be out there. He competes and I was happy with him out there.”

How big were DeForest Buckner’s sacks and on that second one are there many defensive tackles in the league who are chasing down Russell on the sideline?

“No, it’s tough and sacks are huge verse them. When you get a sack it’s very hard to recover from that on any type of drive for an offense and the way that they run the ball and how efficient they are in it, you’ve got to get some negative plays and you don’t get too many opportunities at it. So, when you can get to him and sack him, keep him from doing those off schedule plays, a lot of times it’s the difference between winning and losing with a quarterback like that.”

What'd you think of defensive coordinator Robert Saleh's athleticism during the celebration of that sack?

"I missed it, but I'm sure it wasn't very impressive."

K Robbie Gould is going to be a free agent. I assume he's a guy you'd like to have back?

"Yeah, definitely."

He's made 69, maybe I'm botching it, 69-72 field goals since he's been here.

"Yeah, he should make them all, right? I'm just joking. That's what I say to Robbie too. Of course we want Robbie back. He's been great for two years. It's nice for a coach, that when you get to the end of that, I'm not thinking about him missing it at all."

What'd you think of LB Fred Warner's penalty that was called on him, the roughing the passer, and then the very next series, Nick looked like he got hit a couple times late, didn't get the benefit of that whistle. What were your thoughts on that series of events?

"I think they're different categories of how they do it. I'm sure that they gave Fred the one for landing on him, which the rule is what it is, but I definitely don't think it was anything malicious or anything that hurt Russell at all. I'm sure he was surprised and then the one that Nick had, I didn't see it clean. I don't think it was landing on him. I think there was a possible helmet to the chin. So, I think that'd be two different deals, but I'm not talking much about it."

I assume CB Richard Sherman must be excited about this win. Have you had a chance to talk to him since the game ended?

"Yeah, I just saw him in the locker room. Anytime you get to play against your former team, especially a team that he had a career like he did for them, I know he was happy. Talked to him in there, just gave him a hug, didn't say much, but it's a big deal for guys and I was really happy for Sherman to get that."

Can you take us through that long pass to WR Dante Pettis in the fourth quarter that was right on the money?

"Yeah, it was man coverage. It's a play that we like against man coverage. As long as I just held the safety, then I like Dante on the matchup. He did a great job of giving me space to throw it and made a great catch with a wet ball. So, it was a great play."

Among the positive things CB Richard Sherman just had to say about you, he said he felt like you really established yourself and you're a guy that he hopes is a big part of the future plans here. Do you feel like you've proved that, not only to yourself, but to the league?

"I think I can play in the league, that's for sure. I believe that. But, as far as the extra stuff goes, I don't really worry too much about it. You know, today I was focused on the game one play at a time and really just trying to end the streak against the Seahawks. It's pretty cool that we got to do that as a team today."

How has your confidence grown in the last few weeks? How confident do you feel now?

"You can't play if you're not confident. So, I always take the field as a confident player. I'm confident in my teammates, as well. Everybody worked together really well today. I've said it to you guys so many times, but when everybody is focusing on their specific assignment, working together, that's when we're best. That makes me most confident. So, that's how it felt today. Confidence; the more you play, the more you do it, the better you feel. Always confident, that's for sure."

On the same topic, how much do you think the success you guys had in the second half against the Seahawks a couple weeks ago, how big was that coming in today knowing that you could do it against that defense?

"I think the previous game against Seattle helped us a lot. I really felt like there were places we could attack them. Even in the first game, we just didn't do a very good job of it. So, we were excited coming in. We knew it was going to be a dog fight. We knew they were confident. We were confident. Obviously, the rivalry and things like that. Those are the games you get pumped up to play in. Like coach said last night, I don't even have to tell you all anything. If you're not pumped up for this, then something's wrong with you. So, that's kind of how I felt going into the game and how we felt. We knew it was going to be a dog fight. I was just so proud that we found a way to win. Might not have been the prettiest. Everybody worked well together. When we were passing the ball, that was cool. But when we didn't do good passing the ball, we ran the ball well. Then, when we didn't convert on offense, the defense stepped up and then the special teams touchdown. So, if you want to look at a textbook, collective team win, I believe that was it."

The last two drives of regulation didn't go well. But as you said, you guys somehow scrapped together, found a way to move in overtime. What was the conversation like in between regulation and overtime to get that to work?

"We worked great as a team. Everybody had each other's back. Offense didn't do well; the defense did great when they needed to. That's how you play winning football. If somebody is not doing good, the next guy steps up and does something. It was cool."

Was there an offensive adjustment you guys made from regulation to overtime to get that to work?

"Nothing too specific. Obviously, we had good field position in overtime. It was really cool to see us run the ball to win the game. I don't know how well we ran the ball previously. [RB] Jeff [Wilson Jr.] with the fumble, for him to step up and get two or three really important carries. There's a lot of cool stories about overcoming adversity in this game. So, for us to be able to run the ball to win the game, I think the O-Line and myself take a lot of pride in that. That was really cool to see."

Speaking of Jeff, considering that he did fumble earlier in the game and he's fumbled three times over his last three games, how much confidence do you guys have in him, giving him the ball? I know RB Matt Breida was out.

"We believe in Jeff. He came in undrafted and has done everything to earn his opportunity. He's doing a great job of taking advantage of that opportunity. Had some tough moments today, but the fact that he could fight back, be resilient and get those two great carries to seal the game, that's awesome. It shows what type of player he is and the type of team we are. We're never going to back down and he definitely didn't today."

Where does this win rank among your all-time achievements in your life?

"Mine? That's a great question. I really don't know. I'm pumped for the fans, as far as what is it? It's been a while. But, for us to beat the Seahawks is a pretty big deal I feel like. So, I hope the fans are pumped up, as happy as we are. It's a big-time rival, a big-time win. Had a great time playing with my brothers out there, man. That's the biggest thing. Offense, defense, special teams worked hand-in-hand. Everybody played with great energy, jumping around, celebrating. That's how you're supposed to play the game. We did that today."

Head Coach Kyle Shanahan said he feels like every week he sees you getting better. Do you feel that? If so, how?

"I try to. I try to get better every week. That's definitely the goal. What you do in the past doesn't matter. It's all about what you do today and the next day and the future. It's definitely a goal of mine to get better every single day. Feel more comfortable out there. Obviously, experience helps. You could say the experience helps and I feel more comfortable. I'm just enjoying playing."

How has the bond been with San Francisco 49ers DL DeForest Buckner? You guys have played together every year except for one since you went to Oregon.

"We've been playing together for seven years. Seven of the last eight. It's been great. It's a unique situation to have to be playing with somebody for so long and kind of grow together and always be there through the ups and downs. It's been a pretty cool experience."

How do you push each other? Is there an off-field or on-field competition?

"It's encouragement and helping each other. Teaching each other things we've learned and passing it along. Having good communication out there from playing together so long. Definitely encouraging each other is the main thing."

What does this mean to you guys to win two straight games and the resiliency of this team?

"It's huge. That's the number one thing about our team. Even though the season is not going the way that we want, we're still fighting and still trying to win. How much did this win mean for San Francisco 49ers CB Richard Sherman?

"He came in the locker room extremely excited. We were happy for him to beat his old team. He spent his whole career up there. It was a big win for him and a big win for us."

What do you think it says about this team that after getting beat pretty soundly a couple weeks ago by the Seattle Seahawks, to come back just a couple weeks later and pull it off?

“We took it personally. They flat-out embarrassed us two weeks ago. Everybody from top-to-bottom wasn’t happy about it. We knew it was going to be a dog fight coming in this week. The game started kind of like another 49ers – Seahawk game. They scored quickly, it was 6-0. Was there a feeling of, ‘Here we go again against this team--?’

“No, no. If you could’ve been in this locker room before the game, we were so juiced up before this game that nothing could’ve fazed us, and it showed.”

People would say you’re a 3-10 team, why such excitement about this game?

“Whenever you get any win it’s exciting, especially when you’ve had as many losses. Just to see the light at the end of the tunnel. You’re like, ‘We need to get something going.’ It was kind of like how last year went at the very end of the season. Things haven’t gone our way this year, but there’s still fight in us, a lot of fight in us. We’ll never give up, we’ll never lay down. I don’t think most teams are like that. I think that’s the type of character that we have on this team. The kind of guys that [49ers GM] John [Lynch] and [49ers head coach] Kyle [Shanahan] brought in. We will never give up.”

I think Kyle Shanahan talked about the fact that you had lost ten straight games to the Seattle Seahawks during the week. Nothing something he was hiding, obviously. Was his message, ‘Let’s not extend this for another year so we don’t have to keep talking about that’?

“Yeah, I mean our focus wasn’t completely on that. We don’t focus on, ‘Hey, we haven’t beat it.’ This is a game. We have to win. We have to do whatever we can to win. That’s the attitude we all carry into every game, no matter who the team is.”

As a group, collectively the tight ends seem to be playing really well right now. How do you assess how much you guys have grown within this scheme and gotten more comfortable?

“In our room, we hold ourselves very accountable. A very high level. We try to play to the best of our ability in practice and our [San Francisco 49ers assistant head coach tight ends] coach [Jon Embree] gets after us. He’s an amazing coach, tight ends coach. We’ve proved over the past year that tight ends can perform in this offense, and now that we’ve been doing well, Kyle’s continued to call plays to help get the tight ends involved more.”

You get the Walter Payton Man of the Year nominee award in pregame, you cross 1,500 points for your career and then hit the winner in overtime. How much does this day mean to you?

"It's been a crazy couple of days since I got the nomination. Obviously, it's an honor. I'm really humbled. I know what that award means not only to this organization, there's been a lot of guys who have been in the running for it, but also what it means to the National Football League. Coming from Chicago and knowing the Payton family and understanding what he did on and off the field, and having a good understanding of what he symbolized is something I try to model myself after, especially playing there. Today, getting the award is pretty unique. The organization takes such pride in giving back in the area. Today was probably the hardest conditions I've had in two years here to kick. I know how much this means for [San Francisco 49ers CB Richard Sherman] Sherm. I know how much this means for our fans. We hadn't won against Seattle since 2013. For us to get a win and have some positivity going towards the end of the season with a lot of young guys will help us for next year."

How do you adjust on the fly when field conditions change dramatically?

"The field crew has done an awesome job ever since I've been here. [Head groundskeeper Matthew] Greiner and his staff have been unbelievable. The field held up great today and played well the whole game. As far as field conditions, it wasn't a conversation. As far as the wind, it changed pretty much the entire time. I thought the coaches did a great job managing the entire game from start to finish."

How do you track the wind? Is it just the flags?

"This place is difficult. Sometimes the flags will go one way but you feel something different. We had a 33-yard field goal on the right hash that was supposed to go right to left. The flags were going that way. I played it right center and it just stayed there. I wasn't too happy about that. Thank God it was 33 yards and I snuck in the upright."

On a game-winning field goal attempt in overtime, is it mentally the same approach as any other field goal?

"Yeah. I've had a lot of success against the Seahawks, surprisingly. My rookie year, the kick that put me on the map was a 49-yard field goal in the playoffs against [former Seattle Seahawks head coach] Mike Holmgren. Those guys were playing really well with [former Seattle Seahawks QB] Matt Hasselbeck and [former Seattle Seahawks RB] Shaun Alexander. We had [Seattle Seahawks head coach] Pete Carroll come in a few years later. At home in Chicago, I hit the game winner against them. I enjoy playing the Seahawks. Opening comments:

“It’s interesting how these games take a turn sometimes and you have to look at the numbers and see what happened in the game. This was really a clear game and we just hurt ourselves so much with this penalty thing that it just took our chances away. We ran the football, we converted on third down, we held them on third down, time of possession, so many things we were plus in, the turnover ratio. There were so many things and that’s how we play. But, really uncharacteristically, we had 148 yards in penalties, 10 in the second half which is crazy. I don’t know how that could happen. But, that really kind of spelled it today because it was a good, close game. They played really well. They did a nice job. The offense did a nice job, particularly in the first half. We got better as the game went on defensively and all of that. But, there was just too much to overcome and that was a difficult game. It was obviously a really important championship opportunity for us and there’s some huge lessons for our team. We have to make sure we can’t hurt ourselves and when that happens, it’s hard to overcome and we didn’t today. So, hats off to those guys. It’s a big win for them. They did a nice job today.”

What happened to Seahawks FS Bradley McDougal?

“His knee flared up. On a particular play, he jammed it to the ground and it just flared up and he couldn’t respond.”

Is there a silver lining at least in the sense that you know you will be able to get that playoff berth? It’s just a matter of having to do it in the next few games.

“We’re well aware of that, but just not today. There’s no silver linings in this day today.”

Is there disappointment in not getting that playoff berth against a team that you handled pretty well two weeks ago?

“We didn’t play the same. We did a lot of things the same, but in the areas that made a difference, we got so far behind the sticks with the penalties. We hit the big play that put us in the position to go kick the field goal at the end, but we got a big penalty in the end. So, it’s just a different game. They are never the same. It’s always a different game. It’s not because you did this, it’s going to go this way or that way. You have to go play and see what happens.”

Seahawks RB Chris Carson had over 100 yards and that touchdown run.

“Chris ran great today, really. We ran the ball well today and I thought the whole approach to what we tried to get done was there again and I don’t have any problems with it. I thought Chris looked great today. He was physical and tough and he busted out. He caught the ball well too and really had a big contribution.”

With the penalty on Seahawks CB Shaquill Griffin, did you have a good look on that?

“I did not. I can’t tell you, I don’t know. But, it surely happened right at the crucial times. The hold happens on the big play, that’s the big play for us to get out of there and it was unfortunate. But, that’s the way it goes sometimes. It’s not because we’re not trying. The guys are busting their tails to get it done, but it just went too far I guess.”

How’s Seahawks G Jordan Simmons?

“He’s got a sore knee. At this point, they would say it’s a first-degree sprain. Don’t know what that means for him coming back so we’ll just have to wait and see when we get back and all of that.”

Seahawks G Ethan Pocic obviously got called for a couple of holding penalties. What did you think?

“Well, he didn’t work out very well. He didn’t work out very well. I haven’t seen the calls or anything like that so I can’t tell you, but we have to be in position and keep our hands inside and not give them a chance to call it. [Seahawks G J.R.] Sweezy would say the same thing on a couple that he had. It’s just how it goes. Unfortunately, it kind of came right when we’d make a big play and bam, get knocked back. So, we got behind the sticks. I thought we handled that really well throughout to not get in trouble more. But, it’s just the kind of game it was. The margin of error was so slight that it didn’t work out for us.”

A layman might look at this and see four wins in a row and you come in here against a 3-10 team. Maybe it was preparation or the intensity wasn’t there. What did you think about it?

“I don’t think any of that is what happened. I think we were sloppy with the penalties situation. All of the numbers match up to how we played. The running numbers, the third down numbers were the best we’ve had in quite a while. Defense kept the numbers down, played really well in the second half. So, we did a lot of good things like we normally do. Two of the last three weeks, we’ve had four penalties. So, we had 14 today for 148 yards, it’s really hard to overcome that and we weren’t able to in a close game.”

Not playing without Seahawks FS Bradley McDougald for the second half, what did you think of how that went?

“Well, we played okay in the second half. I think immediately following his departure from there, we were a little shaky. I don’t think we were as confident with our calls. I think we gave up some stuff that we wouldn’t normally give up. I think we settled down well and we kept it under wraps in the second half. Really, the second half defense was a good job.”

The pass rush really got going the last couple series.

“Yeah, those two drives in regulation, we got after it and really did what we needed to do. I thought you could feel the crescendo of the game, we were building up for a chance to set it up to win it. Obviously, we have to pass it better late.”

Getting Seahawks WR Doug Baldwin going like you did in the first half--?

“Thank you for bringing that up. Doug played phenomenally today. That was a great game. Incredible plays and [Seahawks QB Russell Wilson] Russ found him well and hooked up with him. But, Doug was spectacular today.”

What was, you completed the long pass to Seattle Seahawks RB J.D. McKissic there, and it looks like it's going to be good and then it gets called back, just--?

"Yeah, I thought J.D. did a great job. It was a great call by [Seattle Seahawks offensive coordinator Brian] Schotte [Schottenheimer], and he made a great catch and just a huge play. Got the holding penalty and that was kind of the tail of the day, I guess. We had too many penalties. We have got to be sharper. We have got to be cleaner. It's a disappointing loss, because we felt like we could have played better in that sense. The last few drives there, even in overtime, we were able to get some big plays and then, we got some penalty calls. It's part of the game, but when it comes down to crunch time we have got to be great. We've got to be rock solid and we will be moving forward. I think that sometimes in a season, in life, or whatever it may be, you go through times to help prepare you for what's to come. So, hopefully we can use this to prepare us to be that much sharper throughout the next game, and the game after that, and then we'll see what happens. But, use as much as we can learn from this film and study it, and figure out as a collective effort where we can get better as a team. That's the great challenge. That's the challenge that you either look forward to or you don't look forward to, and I think this team, I know this team looks forward to that. We will respond in the right way. The good thing is we get to go back home. We're playing the Chiefs in a tough, tough game that's going to be an exciting game, and the only thing we can look forward to is that next moment. We have high expectations of ourselves and I think that's because of how we practice, how we prepare, just how many great character guys we have on our team and just the hard work that we put into everything. The only way is to respond the right way, and how we're going to prepare for the next game."

Did the 49ers have an answer then for everything you guys did or would you say it was lack of preparation? How would you define why the Niners were able to win this game?

"I definitely think we prepared at a high level. I thought we played a really good game of back-and-forth. They played really well today. We played well. Just to be honest with you, all it really came down to were some penalties here and there, and we had some penalties that really kind of kicked us back, but it is what it is. We have got to be better. We have got to be sharper, and we're going to do that as a team and we're going to make sure we do everything we can to continue to tighten up and make sure that doesn't happen."

Is it at all alarming that you have the playoffs at stake and get in to take care of business and have so many mistakes like you did today?

"I think that it's a moment, and how do you use it is going to be the key, right? I think that for us, before today there's still three games left. Where we want to go didn't stop today, wasn't going to stop next week or hopefully wasn't going to stop the last week. Like I said, I think that what we can do, and what we're going to do, is use everything that we've gone through throughout the season. And, if you really think about some of our losses, right? I mean, think about it. The thing that's really kind of just kicked us in the butt is the long distances. When we get those, and we just got to eliminate that part of it. I think we move the ball really well. I think we run it when we need to. I think we make big plays. [Seattle Seahawks WR] Doug Baldwin was great tonight. Guys were making plays. I thought [Seattle Seahawks T] Duane Brown had that big block, when [Seattle Seahawks RB] Chris Carson gets in that end zone, that's winning football. That's championship football. Those are the things that are going to happen. We've just got to tweak a few things. There's no panic mode. I think our heads are down and ready to work, and that was going to be our mentality either way, because that's the way it has to be. Like I said, you got to give credit to the 49ers. I think they played a great game today. They made a lot of great plays on both sides of the ball and everything else. We made up with some great plays and it was a

back-and-forth. I mean, we knew it was going to be like that and unfortunately, we weren't able to pull through when we needed to."

You mentioned Doug. What kind of difference does he make when he's out there?

"Yeah, he makes a huge difference. I mean, he's a player and we've played so much ball together. He's one of my favorite running backs to play with just because, he's a competitor. He knows how to do everything right. He's smart as it gets. He's as talented as it gets. He's been a joy to play with over my first six, seven years now. He's special in that way any time he's out there. You want your best players for sure to be out in the field. He makes a difference and his presence is out there. Like I said, I thought he had a great week of practice being able to battle through some things and be able to come out and have an unbelievable performance tonight."

Is there anything you can put your finger on that led to all those penalties today?

"I've got to watch the film I think before anything else, but I think that we've just got to be great fundamentally. It really comes down to it. That's usually when we get a penalty here and there, and like I said, when you're playing tough, playing hard, we're never going to mistake playing hard, but sometimes those things happen, right? That's what makes the game of football so tough. When you're going against some really good players on their defensive side upfront especially, some things will happen. So, we just have got to eliminate some of that and continue to just focus on what we can do to control the game."

On the third down in overtime, did you slip before you were trying to get rid of the ball? The one you ended up throwing with Seattle Seahawks WR David Moore outside on the sideline to complete.

"I'm trying to remember which one. I don't remember or recall. I don't think I slipped. I mean, I may have a little bit but I don't recall which play you're talking about."

Is that the first place you wanted to go with the ball or did you happen to notice Doug down the slide?

"Yeah, we had kind of both options, trying to take a shot and counted third-and-long I think there, right? Yeah, so we were trying to take a shot, trying to get one of those guys a goal ball kind of thing, see if we could make a big play. Unfortunately, it didn't happen. I thought Dave did a really good job fighting for it, almost making it. And, the next time we came out, I believe it was the next drive, we came out and then J.D. had that awesome play down the sideline, too. Like I said, we were right there and for the rest of the season every moment matters. Every play counts. It's like that all year, but this is where great players show up. This is where great teams show up. This is where when you face a little bit of adversity, there is going to be adversity, and you got to be able to know how to respond to it. "Finish up strong. Take it one game at a time."

On that touchdown run, where did the second effort come from?

"Just my playing style, I guess. I don't want to be denied by one person. [Seattle Seahawks WR] Doug Baldwin was telling everybody to fight and don't let anybody stop you from getting into the end zone. So, I took it personally."

What was the difference today compared to the last game against the 49ers?

“They came to play some ball. That’s all. We didn’t execute. We gave them too much in penalties. We had, what, 150 yards in penalty yards? You see down the stretch the whole second half, we kept ourselves in check. Towards the end of the first half, we killed ourselves with penalties. On defense, we gave them too many pass interference calls. With special teams, we didn’t execute. We gave them some personal fouls. Even on offense, we gave them those holding calls late down the stretch. When you give up 50-plus yards on the last four drives, offense and defense, over 100 yards of penalties, the game is going to turn. We’re going to make it harder. We all know that shouldn’t have even been a game. At the end of the day, we made it a game by giving them those penalties.”

Does it feel like a step back? You guys had won four straight, these guys are 3-10, and you guys come and lose with a playoff berth on the line?

“I don’t feel like it’s a step back. I just feel like everyone needs to wake up. I feel like I need to wake up, the rest of the team, the coaches, everyone needs to wake up. We want to finish this out strong, like we’ve been talking about. I feel like it has to be a joint effort. Everybody has to step up and be accountable. At the end of the day, the plays have to be called and the players have to make the plays. Period. If the plays aren’t being called like they need to be called, then someone has to be held accountable for it. If the player is not making the play, then the player needs to be held accountable for it. Someone has to be accountable at the end of the day.”

Why did this game look different from the game against San Francisco a couple of weeks ago?
