## LOOKING AHEAD

### With a Win vs. Minnesota...

- The **49ers** would win their fifth consecutive season opener for the second time in franchise history (1992-96).
- The **Niners** would improve to 47-25 on *Monday Night Football*, extending their record for most wins on Mondays. The team has won their last three home games on MNF and six out of their last seven as the home team.
- San Francisco** would take a 23-22-1 lead in the all-time series and defeat Minnesota for the first time since 2006.
- The **49ers** would move to 45-27-1 against NFC opponents since 2009. The team's current 44 wins against the NFC are tied for the 3rd-most in the NFL over that timespan (GB - 52; NO - 47; Sea. - 44).

- Boldin's 12,406 rec. yds. ranks 4th among active players (WR Reggie Wayne - 14,345; WR Andre Johnson, 13,597; WR Steve Smith Sr. - 13,262).

## QUICK HITS

- The **49ers** rank 4th in the NFL, allowing 98.4 rushing yds. per game since 2007 (Pit. - 91.1; Bal. - 94.6; Min. - 98.1). The team also ranks 2nd during that timespan with opponents averaging just 3.72 yds. per rush (Bal. - 3.59).
- S **Eric Reid** has registered 1 INT in each of his two season openers during his career. He intercepted Green Bay Packers QB Aaron Rodgers on 9/8/13, his first NFL game/start, and Dallas Cowboys QB Tony Romo on 9/7/14.
- TE **Vernon Davis** has registered at least 1 rec. TD in each of his past three season openers, including two last season against the Dallas Cowboys on 9/7/14.

## MONDAY NIGHT MASTERS

- In four career starts on *Monday Night Football*, QB **Colin Kaepernick** is 4-0 with 1,018 passing yds. and 9 TDs. He has registered three of his top five highest passer ratings on MNF.
- WR **Anquan Boldin** ranks 1st among active WRs with 10 career rec. TDs in 11 games played on *Monday Night Football*. He has registered at least 1 TD in each of his last five games on MNF.
- RB **Reggie Bush** earned NFC Special Teams Player of the Week honors after returning five punts for 176 yds. and 2 TDs on *MNF* vs. Min. (10/6/08) as a member of the New Orleans Saints.

## 49ERS HALL OF FAME

During halftime of the 49ers season opener on September 14 against the Minnesota Vikings, **Charles Haley** will be recognized as the 26th inductee into the Edward J. DeBartolo, Sr. San Francisco 49ers Hall of Fame. Established in 2009 and dedicated to Edward J. DeBartolo, Sr., the 49ers Hall of Fame was created to recognize players, coaches and executives who have made exceptional contributions to the organization.



Originally drafted by the 49ers in the fourth round (96th overall) of the 1986 NFL Draft from James Madison University, Haley played two stints for the 49ers, from 1986-1991 and 1998-1999. He appeared in a total of 106 regular season games (63 starts) with San Francisco, recording 326 tackles, 66.5 sacks, 14 forced fumbles and 34 passes defensed.

Haley began his NFL career at linebacker and led San Francisco in sacks in each of his first six seasons. He recorded four seasons with 10-or-more sacks with the 49ers, including 12.0 sacks as a rookie and a career-high and NFC-leading 16.0 sacks in 1990.

During his 49ers career, Haley was named NFC Defensive Player of the Year (1990), voted to three Pro Bowls (1988, 1990-91) and named All-Pro as a linebacker (1990). He started at left outside linebacker for the 49ers in the 1988, 1989, and 1990 NFC Championship games and helped San Francisco earn Super Bowl victories in back-to-back seasons (1988-89).
