### NOTABLE STORYLINES

• In three days, the Browns (0-1) return to FirstEnergy Stadium for the first time since last season to face the AFC North rival Cincinnati Bengals (0-1) in a celebration of the league's 100th birthday on Thursday, Sept. 17, at 8:20 p.m. ET. The Week 2 matchup features the NFL's two current Ohio teams, a tribute to the birthplace of the NFL in nearby Canton.

• The last time these two met, the Bengals came out with a 33-23 victory to end the 2019 regular season, but Cleveland took the first game to split the series. The Browns are 3-1 opposite the Bengals since 2018 and 3-0 at home.

• The Browns have gone undefeated on Thursday Night Football since 2018, with their two wins ranking tied for third in the NFL and tied for first in the AFC since that time. With both wins taking place in FirstEnergy Stadium, only Cleveland, New England, Seattle and Houston have been a perfect 2-0 at home on Thursdays since that time.

• Last week, the Browns dropped their season opener to the Baltimore Ravens on the road, 38-6. Reigning MVP Lamar Jackson completed 20 of 25 passes for 275 yards and three touchdowns on the day to help put the Browns away. The Browns also committed three turnovers and missed a field goal and extra point.

• RB **Nick Chubb** posted 60 rushing yards on 10 carries Sunday afternoon. He now ranks second in rushing yards in Browns history for a running back in his first three years, passing Kevin Mack's 2,504 mark set from 1985-87. The total also ranks sixth by an active player in 33 career games or fewer.

• Chubb combined with RB **Kareem Hunt** for 132 of Cleveland's 138 rushing yards in Week 1, outgaining the speedy Ravens by 31 yards on the ground. Hunt's 13 attempts for 72 yards led all rushers on the day and was, statistically, his most productive outing since 2018.

• QB **Baker Mayfield** tossed for 189 yards on 21 completions and one touchdown. His 7,741 career passing yards rank second by a Brown in his first three years, while his career completions (648) and his 50th career touchdown last week also placed him second in the category.

• The Browns defense hasn't allowed a 300-yard passer, or 300 net yards passing by an opponent, in 23 straight games. The streak is the longest active one of its kind and is tied for the NFL's eighth-longest streak since 2010.

**KEVIN STEFANSKI: 0-1, FIRST SEASON AS A HEAD COACH, FIRST WITH THE BROWNS.** Kevin Stefanski was named the 18th full-time head coach in Cleveland Browns history on January 13, 2020 after 14 seasons in various roles with the Vikings. Stefanski joined the Vikings in 2006 as an assistant to the head coach and elevated up the coaching ladder, serving as assistant quarterbacks coach (2009-13), tight ends coach (2014-15) and one season (2016) coaching running backs. From 2017-18, he coached the quarterbacks and added the role of interim offensive coordinator for the final three games of 2018, before being named the team's offensive coordinator in 2019.

**ZAC TAYLOR: 2-15, 2ND SEASON AS A HEAD COACH, 2ND WITH THE RAVENS.** Zac Taylor was appointed head coach of the Cincinnati Bengals on February 4, 2019. He began his NFL coaching career with the Miami Dolphins serving as QBs coach and offensive coordinator from 2012-15. A one season stint as offensive coordinator and QB coach for the University of Cincinnati in 2016 before returning to the NFL in 2017. Taylor spent time in Los Angeles part of the Rams organization in 2017 (asst. WR) and QB coach (2018). Taylor played football at the collegiate level at Wake Forest (2002-03), Butler Community College (2004) and the University of Nebraska (2005-2006).

• Browns offensive coordinator **Alex Van Pelt** served as the Bengals QBs coach from 2018-19.

• Browns senior football advisor **Ryan Grigson** was drafted by the Cincinnati Bengals in the sixth round of the 1995 NFL Draft.

• Bengals QB **Joe Burrow** is a native of Athens, OH and played at Ohio State from 2015-17.

• Bengals S **Vonn Bell**, DE **Sam Hubbard**, G **Michael Jordan** and C **Billy Price** played at Ohio State.

• Bengals defensive quality control coach **Jordan Kovacs** is a native of Curtice, Ohio.

• Bengals C **Billy Price** is from Austintown, Ohio.

• Browns special teams coordinator **Mike Priefer** (2006-08) served on the Kansas City staff with Bengals WR coach **Bob Bicknell** (2007-09).

• Browns DT **Sheldon Richardson** played with Bengals K **Randy Bullock** for the Jets in 2015.

• Browns WR **Odell Beckham Jr.** (2014-18) and DE **Olivier Vernon** (2016-18) played with Bengals OT **Bobby Hart** (2015-16) for the Giants.

• Bengals QB **Joe Burrow** played at LSU with LB **Jacob Phillips** and CB **Greedy Williams**.

## WHAT TO LOOK FOR THIS WEEK

## TEAM

- Browns look to defeat Cincinnati for the third consecutive season at home.
- The Browns defense is looking to secure its 24th straight game without allowing a 300-yard passer.
- A win would mark the third consecutive year the Browns have gone undefeated at home on Thursday Night Football.

## QB BAKER MAYFIELD

- With 28 completions, will have the most by a Brown in their first three years, passing Tim Couch (632) and Bernie Kosar (675).
- With five passing touchdowns, will surpass QB Eli Manning (54) for touchdown passes by a first overall draft pick in their first three seasons, trailing Matthew Stafford (60), Cam Newton (64), Jared Goff (65), Jameis Winston (69), Peyton Manning (85) and Andrew Luck (86).

## RB NICK CHUBB

- Needs three rushing touchdowns to surpass RB Isaiah Crowell for most rushing touchdowns in first three seasons by a Browns player.
- Nine rushes for 20+ yards will rank him third in NFL history, passing Hall of Famer RB LaDainian Tomlinson (31) over a player's first three seasons.

## DE MYLES GARRETT

- Needs 3.5 sacks to have the most sacks by a Brown in their first four seasons, breaking Reggie Camp's mark of 34.

## WR JARVIS LANDRY

- He and teammate WR Odell Beckham Jr. look to extend their active streaks of 96 and 76 consecutive games with at least a pair of receptions, respectively. All time, Landry's streak of 96 games ranks sixth.

## DT SHELDON RICHARDSON

- Needs two tackles for 400 on his career.
- Three and a half sacks will give him 30 for career.

## WR ODELL BECKHAM JR.

- Needs two receiving touchdowns to reach 50 for his career.
- Needs one first down reception for 300 on his career.

## DE OLIVIER VERNON

- Needs a 0.5 sack for 55 on his career.

## OFFENSIVE STARTERS

**WR JARVIS LANDRY** Finished the season opener at Bal with a team-high five receptions and 61 receiving yards...Led the Browns in receiving in 2019, nabbing 83 catches for 1,174 yards...Eclipsed 1,000 yards receiving for the third time in career and five consecutive seasons with 80 or more receptions...Five time Pro Bowl selection (2015-19)...Named the team's 2019 Walter Payton Man of the Year.

**LT JEDRICK WILLS JR.** Made NFL debut and first career start at LT Week 1 at Bal before exiting with injury (leg)...Entered the league as the 10th overall pick by the Browns in the 2020 NFL Draft out of Alabama...2019 First-team All-SEC...Started 29 games at RT, including 28 consecutive to end his career as part of a team that advanced to the National Championship (2018-19) two out of his three seasons on campus.

**LG JOEL BITONIO** Started at LG at Bal and did not miss an offensive snap...Present for all offensive snaps since 2016...Started all 80 games appeared in since being drafted by the Browns in the second round (35th overall) of the 2014 NFL Draft...Back-to-back Pro Bowl selections (2018-19)...All-Pro second-team in 2018 and 2019.

**CJC TRETTER** Continued streak of not missing any offensive snaps since joining the Browns as an unrestricted free agent in 2017 with a start in the season opener Week 1 at Bal...Has played in 80 games, starting the previous 49...Signed three-year contract extension mid-2019 season...Helped protect Baker Mayfield throw for more than 3,500 passing yards in consecutive seasons...Voted President of the NFL Players Association in 2020.

**RG WYATT TELLER** Started season opener against Bal at RG and played 100% of offensive snaps...Acquired by the Browns in a trade from Buffalo in September 2019...Appeared in 15 games, starting the final nine at RT last season...Has started 17 of 24 career games...Helped protect RB Nick Chubb finish second in the NFL last season in rushing yards (1,494)...Fifth-round pick by the Bills in the 2018 NFL Draft.

**RT JACK CONKLIN** Made Browns debut, starting at RT at Bal, playing in every offensive snap...Has started all 58 regular and five postseason games played in...Signed to the Browns this offseason as an unrestricted free agent...Eighth overall pick by the Titans in the 2016 NFL Draft.

**TE AUSTIN HOOPER** Made Browns debut, starting at TE at Bal, snagging two receptions for 15 yards...Signed by the Browns as an unrestricted free agent in 2020...Set career-highs in 2019 with 75 receptions for 787 yards and six touchdowns...Has 29 starts in 60 games and started three of five playoff games...Two-time Pro Bowl selection (2018-19)...Originally a third round (81st overall) selection by the Falcons in 2016.

**WR ODELL BECKHAM JR.** Seventh-year pro caught three passes for 22 yards at Bal...Has played in 76 games, starting 72 and started one postseason game played...Continued streak of recording 2-or-more receptions in every game played (76) with three at Bal...Eclipsed 1,000 yards receiving in five of his first six seasons, missing 2017 with an ankle injury...Third-fastest player in NFL history (67 games) to reach 6,000 career receiving yards, behind Lance Alworth (62) and Julio Jones (64)...Produced career totals of 467 receptions for 6,533 receiving yards and 48 touchdowns.

**QB BAKER MAYFIELD** Completed 21 of 39 passes for 189 yards and a touchdown Week 1 at Bal...First overall selection by the Browns in 2018...Became the ninth player in NFL history to record at least 20 TDs in each of his first two seasons...Has started 30 of 31 games played...Became the first Browns QB in 2019 to start all 16 games in a season since Tim Couch in 2001...One of two Browns to reach 3,500 passing yards in consecutive seasons.

## PROBABLE STARTERS

**RB NICK CHUBB** Second on team with 60 yards on 10 carries...60-yard performance Week 1 at Bal places him second in franchise history with 2,550 rushing yards in a player's first three seasons, trailing Jim Brown (3,798)...Finished second in the league last season in rushing with 1,494 yards (led all rushers through Week 16)...2019 Pro Bowl starter...First Brown ever with at least 1,000 scrimmage yards in each of first two seasons...Set a Browns rookie record with 996 rushing yards in 2016...Second round (35th overall) pick in the 2018 NFL Draft by the Browns.

**FB ANDY JANOVICH** Made Browns debut Week 1 at Bal, spending most of his time on special teams...Traded to the Browns in the offseason from Denver in exchange for a 2021 seventh-round pick...Has appeared in 50 games, making the starting lineup 19 times...Career log includes 13 rushes for 51 yards a touchdown, 22 catches, 233 receiving yards and one touchdown reception.

# THE 299 CLUB

Dating back to Week 12 in 2018, the Browns have not only stopped opposing quarterbacks from reaching 300 passing yards against them, but they've also kept all opponents at 299 net yards passing or fewer since that time. The team's streak of 23 games without allowing a 300-yard passer or 300 net yards passing is the longest active streak, 10 games ahead of the Baltimore Ravens. It's also tied with the Chicago Bears for the eighth-longest streak in the league since 2010.



## HOME SWEET HOME

The 2019 Browns won four consecutive games at FirstEnergy Stadium, their longest home winning streak since 2007 when the club won seven consecutive games. Additionally, the club's .500 winning percentage at home tied for the third highest at FirstEnergy Stadium (since 1999).

Last season was the first time the franchise won at least half of its home games in two straight years since 1992-94.

Additionally, 2018-19 marked the first time the franchise has reached at least six wins in consecutive years since 2001-02.

The Browns look to continue their AFC North success in 2020, after notching their first season (2019) in which they defeated all three AFC North division opponents at least once and the first time the franchise beat the Ravens and Steelers in the same season.

The Browns were also 3-3 in divisional play, tied for their second-highest winning percentage (.500) in the division since the formation of the AFC North in 2002.

The Browns defeated the Bengals in Week 14 last year for the team's third consecutive win over the opponent. It marked the first time a Browns team has done so since 2001-02 (three). It was also the first time the franchise secured at least three wins against the division in consecutive seasons since its formation in 2002.

### THREE-HEADED MONSTER

The Browns have dangerous combinations of players on offense, including being the **only team in the NFL since last season to have two receivers with at least 1,000 receiving yards and a running back with at least 1,500 rushing yards.**

The duo of Landry and Beckham Jr. are also **one of just three pairs of teammates to have at least 1,000 receiving yards on 70-plus receptions since 2019.**

Landry, Beckham Jr. and Chubb also make the Browns **one of only seven teams to have at least three players with 1,000-plus scrimmage yards since last year.**



# BROWNS NOTEBOOK

**4.85**

The Browns offense has combined for 4.85 rushing average since last season, the fourth highest average in the NFL. With 138 yards on the ground in Week 1, the team currently ranks tied for eighth in the league in rushing yards. The Browns also place fifth among all teams with a 5.11 rushing average in 2020.

**THE LONG HAUL**

The Browns have posted 56 rushes for 10-plus yards and 13 rushes for 20-plus yards since last season, ranked 10th and tied for eighth, respectively, in the league since 2019. Additionally, the team's two carries for 20-plus yards and five for 10-plus yards in Week 1 place second and tied for fourth, respectively, this year.

**MAGIC TOUCH**

Since last year, the Browns rank fifth in the NFL with an 8.0 scrimmage yards-per-touch average.

**THE MORE YOU CAN DO**

The Browns are one of only three teams since 2019 to have two running backs record at least 35 receptions in Nick Chubb and Kareem Hunt. The pair are also one of three pairs of running backs in the NFL to post at least 280 receiving yards dating back to last season.





RB **Nick Chubb** posted 60 rushing yards on 10 carries Sunday afternoon. He now ranks **second in rushing yards in Browns history for a running back in his first three years**, passing Kevin Mack's 2,504 mark set from 1985-87. The total also ranks **sixth by an active player in 33 career games or fewer.**

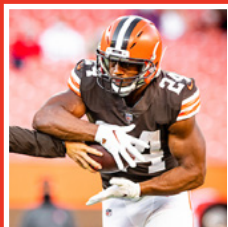

With three rushes for 10-plus yards last week, Chubb now ranks second by a Brown since 1991 in carries for 10-plus yards with 70. His 29-yard carry in the second quarter against the Ravens also placed him tied for first with Isaiah Crowell in the same timeframe with 23 carries for 20-plus yards.

Last offseason, Chubb teamed up with VKTRY Gear to provide 500 free pairs of insoles to frontline healthcare workers.

## 50 FEAT

Week 1 marked 24th time Chubb posted at least 50 rushing yards in a game since 2018. The marker is the tied for the third most in the NFL since that time. It placed Chubb seventh among all active running backs in their first 33 games and four games behind Jim Brown (28) in Browns history.

Among all-time active running backs in their first three years, Chubb's 24 games tie Alvin Kamara (2017-19) for 14th and rank second in Browns history.

Chubb's career 5.10 rushing average is the highest by a Brown through his first 33 games (minimum of 100 attempts) and is tied for the ninth highest by an active NFL running back in the same category.

WR Jarvis Landry posted a team-leading five receptions for 61 yards last week. The receiver has now totaled 569 career receptions, **13th in a player's first seven years in NFL history.**

Additionally, Landry's 61 receiving yards elevated his receiving yards total, dating back to last season, to 1,235. The total is the **NFL's 10th-best tally** since that time.

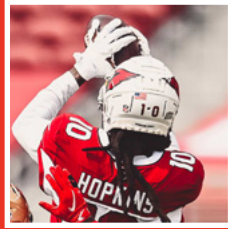

Since his sophomore season in 2015, Landry has reeled in double-digit receptions in nine games, tied for the league's fifth-best total in that span. He's also caught 11 passes or more in four games, tied for seventh in the NFL.

**Garrett** has compiled 30.5 sacks in just 38 games – already the **third most** by a Browns player in his first four seasons. The 30.5 sacks are also **second** behind Von Miller (35) for the most among active players in 38 games or less and is **seventh** among all players in the same category in league history. He's also amassed 105 tackles, 33 tackles for a loss and six forced fumbles. Garrett, who posted 10 sacks in 10 games last year, is the **only player in Browns history** to post multiple double-digit sack seasons.

- In his fourth year of serving on the Waterboys organization and his second as the active player captain. The foundation works to bring clean water to communities in need in East Africa. In his role as captain, Garrett leads a team of active NFL players committed to using their platform to engage their fans in the clean water crisis. Since its launch, Waterboys has funded 83 wells serving more than 350,000 people. Roughly 844 million people around the world are without basic water access – more than twice the population of the United States. In 2020, traveled to Tanzania for a two-week trip to help install wells.

In Week 1, QB **Baker Mayfield** tossed 189 yards on 21 completions and one touchdown. His 7,741 career passing yards rank **second** by a Brown in his first three years, while his career completions (648) and his 50th career touchdown last week also placed him **second** in the category.

In his sophomore campaign last year, Mayfield finished **fourth** in team history in passing yards (3,827) and **second** in completions (317) in a season. He also became the **first** Brown to reach the 3,000-yard passing plateau in consecutive seasons since Bernie Kosar in 1986-87.

In the third quarter of Week 2 last season, Mayfield connected with Beckham Jr. for an 89-yard touchdown. It was the fourth-longest pass play in Browns history and the team's longest since QB Brandon Weeden connected with WR Josh Gordon for 95 yards on Dec. 1, 2013.

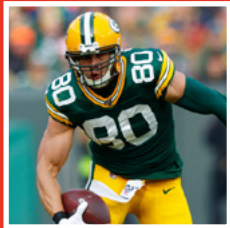

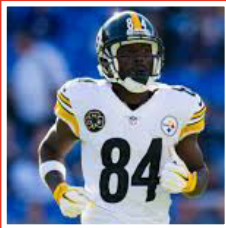

MULTI-TD GAMES IN A PLAYER'S FIRST SEVEN YEARS (ACTIVE)



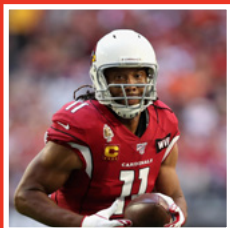

## BILL WILLIS COACHING FELLOWSHIP

The Browns created the Bill Willis Coaching Fellowship in 2020, which is intended for a rising minority coach with a focus on the offensive side of the ball. In the program, the coach spends a full season with Cleveland's coaching staff and assist coaches with week-to-week game plans and talent evaluations. The fellowship also provides the coach with a plethora of resources to network with other coaches, gain valuable knowledge on the implementation of NFL-level coaching methods and improve their path to a professional coaching career.

The team created the fellowship to provide opportunities and experience to minority coaches, who have historically faced barriers in their pursuit of entry-level positions and promotions. The fellowship was named after Willis, who along with teammate Marion Motley, overcame many obstacles to become two of the first African-American professional football players in the modern era. Willis played with the Browns from 1946-53 and was enshrined into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 1977.

Ashton Grant was named the first-ever recipient of the Bill Willis Coaching Fellowship on July 14, 2020.

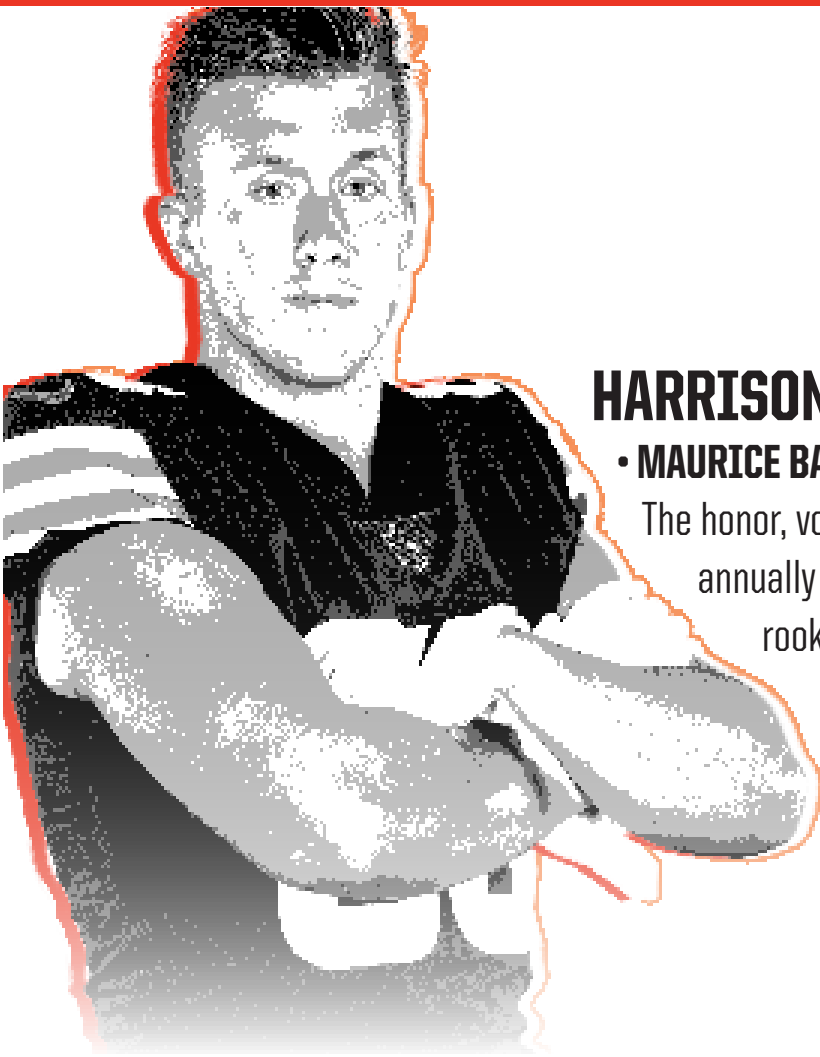

# THE ROOKS



Kevin Stefanski was named the 18th full-time head coach in Cleveland Browns history on January 13, 2020. He spent the previous 14 seasons with the Minnesota Vikings, where he moved up the coaching ladder from assistant to the head coach to offensive coordinator.

Stefanski joined the Vikings in 2006 as an assistant to the head coach and remained with the organization under three different head coaches. After serving as assistant quarterbacks coach from 2009-13, Stefanski spent two seasons (2014-15) coaching the tight ends and one season (2016) as running backs coach. From 2017-18, he coached the quarterbacks and added the role of interim offensive coordinator for the final three games before being named the team's offensive coordinator in 2019.

In 2019, the Vikings posted a 10-6 record and earned their first road playoff win since January 9, 2005, after defeating the Saints, 26-20, in New Orleans. Three offensive players were selected to the Pro Bowl as RB Dalvin Cook and FB C.J. Ham were each named to their first career Pro Bowl with Cook voted a starter. QB Kirk Cousins was also named to the Pro Bowl.

In his first full year under Stefanski, Cousins set a single-season career high for passer rating with a 107.4 mark, fourth best in the NFL in 2019. Cousins also finished with a career-low six interceptions, while adding 26 touchdowns and a 69.1 completion percentage, fourth in the NFL in 2019. He set a Vikings record for completions in a season with 425 and finished with the second-most passing yards (4,298) and passer rating (107.4) in Vikings history.

With 1,135 rushing yards, Cook became the eighth player in Vikings history to rush for 1,000 yards in a single season and the first since Adrian Peterson in 2015. Despite missing the final two games of the season, Cook finished fourth in the NFL with 13 rushing touchdowns and seventh in scrimmage yards with 1,654.

WR Stefon Diggs set a career high with 1,130 receiving yards, giving him back-to-back 1,000-receiving yard seasons for the first time in his career. Diggs finished fourth in the NFL with an average of 17.9 yards per reception in 2019.

Stefanski was elevated from quarterbacks coach to interim offensive coordinator in Week 15 of the 2018 season and promptly guided the unit to two of its best showings of the season. In his first game calling plays, Minnesota scored a season-high 41 points and recorded 418 yards of offense en route to a 41-17 victory over the Dolphins.

As quarterbacks coach in 2017, the Vikings were forced to go to their backup, Case Keenum, early in the season after starter Sam Bradford went down with an injury. Keenum, who had completed 58 percent of his passes previously owned a 9-15 career record as a starter, went on to complete nearly 68 percent of his throws with 22 touchdowns and seven interceptions while leading the Vikings to a record of 11-3.

In his lone season coaching the running backs in 2016, the Vikings battled injuries along the offensive line and to RB Adrian

Peterson that caused the runner to miss 13 games. The running game leaned on veterans Jerick McKinnon and Matt Asiata as the duo combined for 941 yards and eight rushing touchdowns.

As tight ends coach, Stefanski helped develop Pro Bowl TE Kyle Rudolph. In 2015, his unit helped clear the way for Adrian Peterson to lead the NFL in rushing with 1,485 yards.

Stefanski was elevated to assistant quarterbacks coach in 2009, where he had a hands-on role in one of the most successful offense seasons in Vikings history. Veteran QB Brett Favre signed with the team in mid-August and finished the season with 4,202 passing yards and 33 touchdowns. The Vikings finished the season 12-4 and won the NFC North.

Stefanski spent 2006-08 working directly with Head Coach Brad Childress on administrative duties and special projects. Stefanski first worked with Childress during Eagles training camp in 2005 as part of the team's operations department.

Stefanski spent the 2005 season at his alma mater, Pennsylvania, as assistant director of football operations, coordinating all aspects of the Quakers' day-to-day operations.

A team captain as a senior in 2003, Stefanski was part of one of the most successful stretches in the history of the Quaker football program. The team won three Ivy League titles (2000, 2002 and 2003), and went 10-0 in 2003 to become the first undefeated Penn team in a decade. During Stefanski's tenure, the squad posted a 42-7 overall record and a 32-3 mark in Ivy League play and he was twice honored as an Honorable Mention All-Ivy choice in 2002 and 2004.

Stefanski earned a bachelor's degree in communications from Pennsylvania and attended St. Joseph's Prep in Philadelphia.

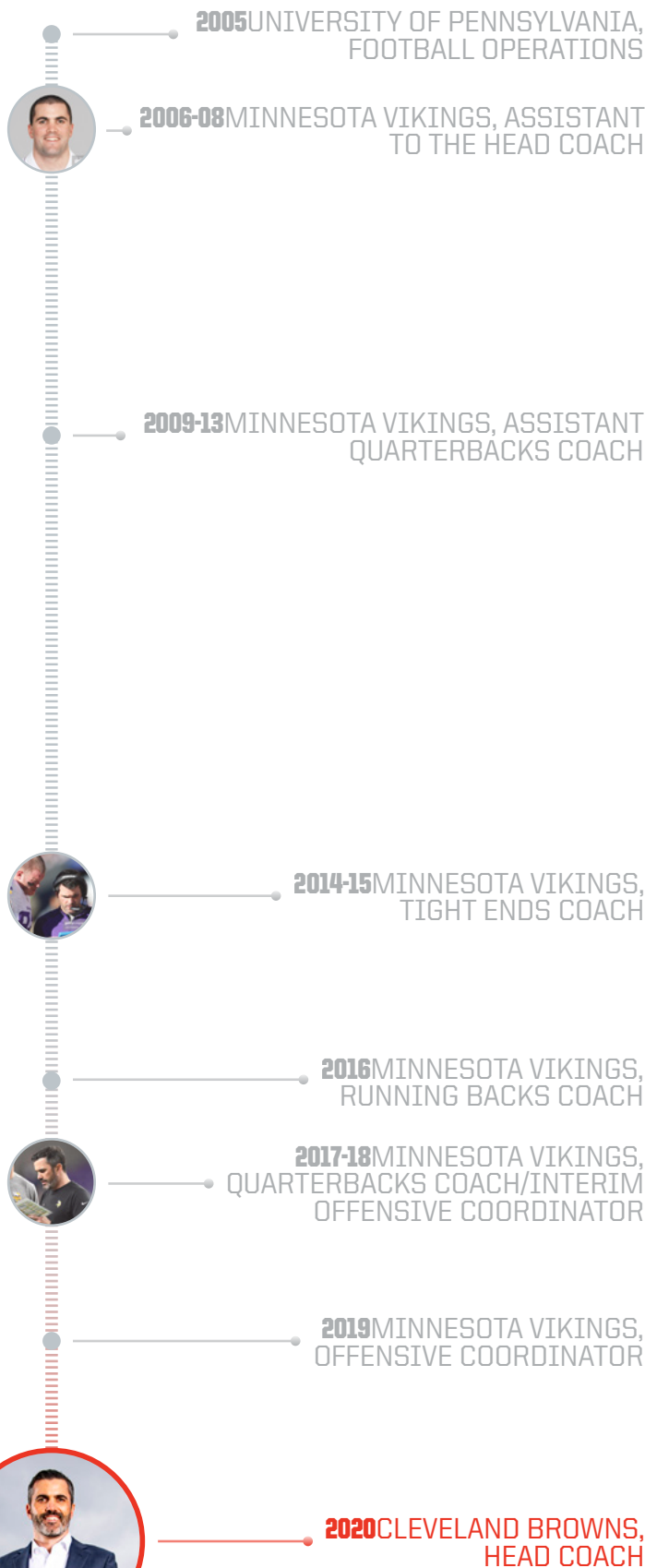
The Stefanski family has made a name in athletics as Kevin's father, Ed, was a basketball standout at Penn and works in the front office of the Detroit Pistons. He has previously held executive positions with the NBA's New Jersey Nets, Philadelphia 76ers, Toronto Raptors and Memphis Grizzlies.

Stefanski and wife, Michelle, have a daughter and two sons.
