Jacksonville Jaguars (1-2) at Cincinnati Bengals (0-2-1)
Sunday, Oct. 4, 2020 / 1 p.m. ET / Paul Brown Stadium

THE OVERVIEW

In Week 4, the Jacksonville Jaguars (1-2) travel to Cincinnati to face the Bengals (0-2-1) at Paul Brown Stadium on Sunday, Oct. 4 at 1 p.m. ET. From 1995-2001, the Jaguars and Bengals competed twice per season in the AFC Central and have faced off 22 times in the regular season. Jacksonville leads the series, 13-9, and is 2-0 against Cincinnati since Head Coach **Doug Marrone** took over in 2017. The Jaguars beat the Bengals, 27-17, on the road in Week 7 of the 2019 season.

RECORD BREAKING ROOKIE

Through three games in 2020, RB **James Robinson** ranks fourth in the AFC in scrimmage yards (339) and second among NFL rookies. Robinson, an undrafted rookie out of Illinois State, is the only undrafted player in NFL history to post at least 300 scrimmage yards and multiple TDs through three career games, and his 339 scrimmage yards are the most ever by an undrafted player through three career games. He joins RB **Kareem Hunt** as the only players over the last 10 seasons to gain at least 300 scrimmage yards and score at least three rushing TDs in their first three career games.

Robinson's 210 rushing yards are the most by an undrafted rookie in NFL history in Weeks 1-3, and he is also one of four Jaguars in franchise history to turn in at least 300 scrimmage yards through Weeks 1-3, joining RB **Maurice Jones-Drew** (three times), WR **Jimmy Smith** (three times) and RB **Fred Taylor** (two times).

CINCINNATI CONNECTION

Sunday marks TE **Tyler Eifert**'s first time playing his former team since signing with the Jaguars in 2020 free agency. Eifert was drafted by Cincinnati in 2013 (21st overall) and played in 50 games with the Bengals, totaling 185 receptions for 2,152 yards. He has caught 11 TD passes at Paul Brown Stadium since 2013, trailing only Bengals WR **A.J. Green** (22) in that span.

Eifert caught a career-high 13 TDs in 2015 en route to a Pro Bowl appearance under the direction of current Jaguars Offensive Coordinator and then-Bengals Offensive Coordinator **Jay Gruden**. From 2011-13, Gruden served as the offensive coordinator for Cincinnati when the team had three consecutive postseason berths. In his three years as offensive coordinator, the Bengals' offense improved in points-per-game from 18th (2011) to 12th (2012) to sixth (2013).

WEEK 4 QUICK HITS

- Since 2019, only three quarterbacks have thrown at least 12 TDs and two-or-fewer INTs in road contests: QB **Gardner Minshew II**, Chiefs QB **Patrick Mahomes** and Packers QB **Aaron Rodgers**. Minshew threw for 255 yards and one TD in a victory at Cincinnati in 2019.
- Including the postseason, the Jaguars are 6-1 against AFC North opponents since **Doug Marrone** became head coach in 2017. Jacksonville is 2-0 against Cincinnati (+26 point differential) with victories in 2017 and 2019 during that span. In 2020, the Jaguars play all four AFC North teams.
- Through three games, LB **Myles Jack** is tied for the NFL lead with 33 tackles. Jack is one of just two players (Vikings LB **Eric Kendricks**) to post double-digit tackles in all three games this season.
- The Jaguars are the only team in the NFL to have two players in the top 10 in scrimmage yards among rookies. RB **James Robinson** ranks second with 339 scrimmage yards (210 rushing and 129 receiving) while WR **Laviska Shenault Jr.** ranks 10th (105 receiving yards and 48 rushing yards).
- DE **K'Lavon Chaisson** won the 2020 College Football Playoff National Championship alongside Bengals QB **Joe Burrow** at LSU. Burrow (first overall) and Chaisson (20th overall) were two of the Tigers school-record five first-round selections in 2020.
- DE **Josh Allen** registered his first sack of 2020 in Week 3 against Miami when he dropped QB **Ryan Fitzpatrick** for a 4-yard loss. Allen has now registered 11.5 sacks in 19 games, the most by any Jaguars player through their first 19 games and the second-most of any player in the NFL who entered the league in 2019 or later. He recorded 1.0 sack at Cincinnati last season.

BY THE NUMBERS

5

Five rookies in the NFL have totaled at least 300 scrimmage yards in Weeks 1-3 of a season since 2011: RB **Dalvin Cook** (2017), RB **Kareem Hunt** (2017), RB **Saquon Barkley** (2018), RB **Clyde Edwards-Helaire** (2020) and RB **James Robinson**.

7

Jaguars Offensive Coordinator **Jay Gruden** oversaw an offense in Cincinnati that had seven Pro Bowl selections during his three-year tenure as the Bengals offensive coordinator (2011-13), including one by current Jaguars TE **Tyler Eifert** and three by WR **A.J. Green**. The Bengals averaged 24.3 points from 2011-13, the 10th-most in the NFL during that span and improved in points-per-game every season.

WR **Laviska Shenault Jr.** has caught 11 passes this season. Shenault's 11 receptions are the second-most in Jaguars history through a player's first three career games and the fourth-most among all rookie wide receivers in the NFL this season.

TE **Tyler Eifert** caught 13 TDs in 2015 en route to Pro Bowl honors with the Bengals. Eifert's 13 TDs are the second-most in a single season in Bengals history and were the fifth-most in the NFL in 2015.

LB **Myles Jack** has a 90.1 grade according to Pro Football Focus, the best grade of all NFL linebackers. Through three games, Jack has totaled a NFL-leading 33 tackles, one pass defensed and 1.0 sack. Jack totaled five tackles and one INT in last season's victory against Cincinnati.

The Jaguars have posted a +95 point differential against AFC North teams including the postseason since **Doug Marrone** took over in 2017. Jacksonville is 1-0 against Baltimore (+37), 1-0 against Cleveland (+12), 2-0 against Cincinnati (+ 26) and 2-1 against Pittsburgh (2-1).

129

RB **James Robinson** has totaled 129 receiving yards through three games, the third-most in the NFL and the most in franchise history by a running back through the first three weeks of the season.

404

Since 2017, LB **Joe Schobert** has totaled 404 tackles, the third-most in the NFL in that span. Schobert has started all three games at middle linebacker for the Jaguars and posted 26 tackles this season.

1,269

OL **Jawaan Taylor** has played in 100 percent (1,269) of the Jaguars' offensive snaps since entering the NFL in 2019. Taylor has started at right tackle in every game and made the Pro Football Focus All-Rookie Team in 2019.

1,748

WR **Keelan Cole Sr.** has totaled 1,748 receiving yards since entering the NFL in 2017 as a rookie free agent, the seventh-most among all undrafted players in that span. Cole has caught nine TD passes and the Jaguars are 8-1 in games Cole has recorded a TD, including in their victory at Cincinnati in 2019.

• Jacksonville's .591 winning percentage against Cincinnati is the team's second-best mark against any opponent in franchise history. The Jaguars' .727 home winning percentage against the Bengals is their best home figure versus any opponent faced at least 10 times at TIAA Bank Field.

• Prior to losing four consecutive games against Cincinnati since 2008, Jacksonville went 11-2 (.846) against the Bengals from Dec. 1, 1996-Oct. 9, 2005, the best head-to-head stretch against any opponent of 10-plus games in franchise history.

• From Nov. 8, 1998-Sept. 17, 2000, the Jaguars won five consecutive games versus Cincinnati, the third-longest winning streak against any opponent in team history (Baltimore - eight games from 1996-99; Cleveland - six games from 1995-2000).

• Since **Doug Marrone** was named the Jaguars' head coach in January 2017, Jacksonville is 6-1 against the AFC North with a +95-point differential, including the postseason. In franchise history, the Jaguars are 49-35 in regular season games against AFC North opponents, the team's best mark against any division. From 1995-2001, the Jaguars were in the AFC Central with the Browns, Bengals and Steelers.

The Jaguars have a series advantage against every team in the AFC North: the Steelers (14-12), Browns (12-5), Bengals (13-9) and Ravens (12-9), including the postseason.

HISPANIC HERITAGE MONTH

In celebration of Hispanic Heritage Month, the Jacksonville Jaguars joined the First Coast Hispanic Chamber of Commerce (FCHCC) on Tuesday, September 21 to recognize 10 future leaders and giving back to more than 200 deserving local families in the Jacksonville area.

The Jaguars annually sponsor the FCHCC's gala to recognize 10 exceptional Hispanic and Latino students with college scholarships. When the gala was postponed due to COVID, the Jaguars, FCHCC and the scholarship recipients partnered with Feeding Northeast Florida (FNEF) to create today's food distribution event in recognition of September also being Hunger Awareness Month.

According to FNEF, between March and July of this year, 10.8 million meals have been distributed throughout Northeast Florida, which is an 82 percent increase in need from last year as a result of the pandemic. Through the support of the Jaguars and other corporate partners, more than 200 Hispanic and Latino families received a two-week supply of groceries from Feeding Northeast Florida including free produce, dairy and paper products.

Former Jaguars WR **Arrelious Benn** and his wife joined Jaxson de Ville and members of THE ROAR in volunteering for the food distribution alongside the scholarship recipients.

"We're here to be servant leaders in these trying times with COVID," said Benn. "Things aren't normal for people in their everyday lives. For us to help them with their groceries and their needs and to be here representing the Jaguars along with the kids who won the awards is just amazing."



CARING FOR THE COMMUNITY

Jacksonville Jaguars Owner **Shad Khan** and the Jaguars Foundation worked together with players, coaches and partners to respond to the worldwide COVID-19 crisis in a variety of ways:

- Owner **Shad Khan** committed \$1 million to local organizations including the Florida First Coast Relief Fund at the United Way of Northeast Florida, Feeding Northeast Florida, Clara White Mission and the American Red Cross.
- Head Coach **Doug Marrone** and General Manager **David Caldwell** contributed \$8,000 each to the 2020 NFL Draft-A-Thon, joining thousands of NFL fans across the nation. Jacksonville received more than \$100,000 from the worldwide fundraiser to support local efforts via the United Way of Northeast Florida.
- The Jaguars distributed 55,000 masks to citizens, nonprofit shelters, feeding programs and the Duval County Public Schools. Jaguars legend **Tony Boselli**, who himself recovered from COVID-19, participated in a team-produced public service announcement urging the public to wear masks.
- Daily's and the Jaguars distributed \$30,000 in gift cards to health care workers, first responders, educators, veterans and more.
- OL **Tyler Shatley** gifted \$10,000, matched by the Jaguars Foundation for a total of \$20,000 to help provide 1,500 prepared meals delivered daily to senior citizens in partnership with Florida Blue and Feeding Northeast Florida to support restaurants providing meals for first responders and healthcare workers.
- CB **Tre Herndon** and his girlfriend, **Treyleanna Robinson**, gifted more than 10,000 meals to via Feeding Northeast Florida.
- WR **Chris Conley**, alongside his goldendoodle, Waffles, put his video game skills to good use by taking part in a Twitch Stream-Aid online Fortnite tournament, raising \$9,300 for the World Health Organization.
- K **Josh Lambo** partnered with Pet Paradise and other organizations, to cover a portion of the adoption fees and six months of dog food for any dogs adopted from Jacksonville Beach shelter Furever Urs.
- LB **Leon Jacobs**, whose mother has worked as a nurse for more than 20 years, helped provide an all-day food truck to employees at LA+USC Medical Center.
- Jaguars players and the Jaguars Foundation partnered with Academy Sports to donate 650 balls, frisbees, jump ropes and other pieces of athletic equipment to local nonprofits to distribute to area children and encourage exercise even while attending school virtually from home.

SOCIAL JUSTICE



BLACK LIVES MATTER

Following widespread outrage over the death of George Floyd while in police custody in Minneapolis, and joining in a nationwide push for racial equality, Jaguars ownership, players, coaches and front office staff began taking steps to create positive change on the First Coast.

On June 3, Owner **Shad Khan** penned a personal op-ed, sharing his own experience with discrimination as a Muslim-American and announcing his commitment to work alongside the team to level the playing field for all to have equal access to the American dream.

"Racism, in all its forms, will kill," said Khan. "It kills people, it kills communities, it kills dreams, it kills hope. For many Americans, now is the moment. Never has that been clearer. I don't want to waste this moment."

Jaguars players took action June 5, as they led an organization-wide march to raise awareness for racial injustice against the Black community. More than 250 members of the Jaguars organization, including players, coaches, front office staff and their families, started at TIAA Bank Field at 9:04 a.m. and proceeded to the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office while wearing Black Lives Matter t-shirts.

WR **Chris Conley** addressed the crowd and called attention to markers of racism still present in Jacksonville. "We cannot allow comfortability with revisionist history to disarm our minds and weaken our convictions," said Conley. "A Confederate monument sits a couple of blocks from here, praising the south's dark past."

Three days later, a Confederate monument was removed from a downtown Jacksonville park. Conley challenged those in attendance and those watching from home to continue the fight. "This is only the beginning here in Jacksonville. Let's make sure that we maintain this momentum so this is not a moment and this is a movement."

As a team, Jaguars players are working on several plans this season to educate and engage the community on a variety of important topics, including voting and legislative reform, youth education through arts and sports, financial stimulus and police and community relations.

On Tuesday, Sept. 1, the Jacksonville Jaguars launched an organization-wide commitment to voter education organized by players and coaches and designed to encourage fans to "Get in the Game" with a call for civic engagement. The season-long campaign kicked off with a public service announcement encouraging voter registration and will continue through Election Day with activations via social media, on game day, through grassroots activities and national partnerships.

"You can look at voting as a privilege, and as a naturalized U.S. citizen, you can be assured that I do," said Jaguars Owner **Shad Khan**. "But I also see it as a civic responsibility. If we're serious about being better in our communities and throughout our nation, and all voices being heard and respected, we have to participate in the electoral process. No exceptions. It's our duty to cast a ballot. If you haven't registered to vote, please do by October 5. If you're registered, please vote."

The campaign began with a non-partisan, "Get in the Game" public service announcement featuring Jaguars players and coaches, including Head Coach **Doug Marrone** and QB **Gardner Minshew II**, calling for fans in Florida to register to vote by the October 5 deadline. The Jaguars have also created www.jaguars.com/vote as a resource for the community looking for more information on voter registration and key deadlines.

Jaguars front office employees have the option to "Get in the Game" and further support the voters of Duval County by taking training from the Duval County Supervisor of Elections office to serve as poll workers on Election Day. Employees can participate in this day of service and have the opportunity to donate their time to the Jaguars Foundation.



The Jaguars began the season with a big opening-day win over the division-rival Indianapolis Colts, coming from behind with two scores in the final 6 minutes to claim a 27-20 victory at TIAA Bank Field. QB **Gardner Minshew II** completed 19 of his 20 passes on the day for 173 yards, with scoring throws to WRs **DJ Chark Jr.**, **Laviska Shenault Jr.** and **Keelan Cole**, while undrafted rookie RB **James Robinson** ran for 62 yards in his NFL debut. Indianapolis started fast with a seven-play, 63-yard drive resulting in a 7-0 lead on RB **Nyheim Hines**' 12-yard scoring run. The Jacksonville offense started slowly with punts on its first two possessions, while the defense rose up with a fourth-down stop at the Jacksonville 3-yard line on the Colts' second drive. The defense then changed the momentum on the next series when rookie CB **CJ Henderson** picked off QB **Philip Rivers** and returned it 22 yards to the Colts 27. That set up Minshew's 6-yard TD pass to Chark to tie the score at 7-7. Indianapolis responded with an 11-play, 75-yard drive capped by Rivers' 8-yards touchdown pass to Hines, but the Jaguars answered with a 75-yard drive of their own to tie the game at 14-14 on Shenault's 15-yard scoring catch with 1:38 remaining in the first half. The Colts regained a 17-14 lead on the final play of the half: a 38-yard field goal by rookie K **Rodrigo Blankenship**. In the third quarter Blankenship hit the left upright with a 30-yard attempt, and Jacksonville capitalized with K **Josh Lambo** nailing a 50-yard field goal for a 17-17 tie with 3:30 left in the quarter. Blankenship bounced back to make a 25-yard field goal on the ensuing possession to regain the lead at 20-17, but the Jaguars were not done. Their 75-yard march included three runs and three passes as well as a 15-yard horse collar penalty to get to the Indy 22, from where Minshew hit Cole for a 22-yard TD to give the Jaguars their first lead of the day at 24-20 with 5:56 remaining. Rivers then threw his second INT of the day, this time to S **Andrew Wingard**, to set up Lambo's second field goal of the day from 46 yards for a 27-20 lead with 2:50 left. The Jacksonville defense stopped the Colts eight plays later on 4th-and-5 from the Jacksonville 26 to seal the win.

The Jaguars trailed 14-0 early after yielding touchdowns on the Titans' first two drives, sparked by a 63-yard completion on the game's first play, but a second-half rally with three consecutive touchdown drives of their own tied the game at 30-30 with 7:25 remaining in the fourth quarter. From there the teams exchanged punts before Tennessee marched to the Jacksonville 31-yard line, where K **Stephen Gostkowski** kicked the eventual game-winning field goal from 49 yards with 1:36 left. With no timeouts remaining the Jaguars tried to rally, but on the third play of the possession QB **Gardner Minshew II**'s pass was batted at the line and intercepted by LB **Harold Landry** to seal the 33-30 win. Just before halftime K **Josh Lambo** had kicked a 35-yard field goal with :12 remaining to cut the Tennessee lead to 21-10, but Gostkowski - after a short squib kick by Lambo off a Titans player - converted a 51-yard field goal on the half's final play to make it a 14-point margin at 24-10. The Jaguars had five red zone drives and scored four TDs and one field goal, while Tennessee tallied four touchdowns on its four such possessions. The Titans also had the game's only turnovers, with CB **Kristian Fulton** and Landry picking off Minshew passes. While RB **Derrick Henry** was limited to 84 rushing yards on 25 carries, Jaguars rookie RB **James Robinson** turned in his first 100-yard day with 102 yards on 16 carries, a 6.4-yard average.. Minshew completed 30 of 45 passes for 339 yards with touchdown strikes to TE **Tyler Eifert**, WR **Keelan Cole Sr.** and RB **Chris Thompson** as the Jaguars outgained Tennessee, 480 yards to 354. TE **Jonnu Smith** caught two of QB **Ryan Tannehill**'s career-best four TD passes.

For the third week in a row the Jaguars got off to a slow start and fell behind early, this time in a 31-13 Thursday Night loss to the Miami Dolphins. Miami entered the game at 0-2, but TD drives of 84 and 80 yards on a combined 29 plays on their first three possessions gave them a 14-0 first-quarter lead which grew to 21-7 by the middle of the second period. Dolphins QB **Ryan Fitzpatrick** completed his first 12 passes, including touchdown throws to WR **Preston Williams** and TE **Mike Gesicki**. The Jaguars found the endzone on their second possession, marching 75 yards in nine plays with RB **James Robinson** scoring on an 11-yard run up the middle, which made it 14-7 early in the second quarter. The Dolphins' ensuing touchdown by Gesicki made it 21-7 before Jacksonville was stopped on its next drive when QB **Gardner Minshew II** was sacked for a 10-yard loss on 4th-and-6 at the Miami 36. It would be the first of three failed fourth-down plays for the Jaguars. In the second half Miami extended its lead to 28-7 on Fitzpatrick's 1-yard run which followed a Minshew fumble at the Jacksonville 5-yard line. The Jaguars' next drive ended in a failed 4th-and-11 at the Miami 33, but they found the endzone on their next opportunity with Robinson's second TD run from 1 yard out to get within 15 at 28-13 before newly-activated K **Brandon Wright** missed the extra point. A third fourth-down stop on Jacksonville's next possession, with a 6-yard sack on 4th-and-5 from their own 26-yard line, set up a K **Jason Sanders** 30-yard field goal for the final 31-13 margin. A Minshew interception ended the Jaguars' final drive of the night at the Miami 3. Minshew completed 30 of his 42 passes for 275 yards and was sacked four times, while Fitzpatrick finished 18 of 20 for 160 yards with two TDs.
