### NOTABLE STORYLINES

• The Cleveland Browns (4-2) are back in action this week, traveling to Paul Brown Stadium for the final Battle of Ohio matchup of 2020 against the Cincinnati Bengals (1-4-1). The Browns have won the last four out of the last five meetings and look to sweep the Bengals for the first time in the same season since 2018.

• This year, the Browns are averaging a league-leading 169.5 rushing yards per game, while the defense has added 12 takeaways, the most in the NFL.

• At 4-2, HC **Kevin Stefanski** is off to the best start by a new Browns head coach since Butch Davis in 2001, while his 4-record is the best among all new head coaches in the NFL this season.

• The AFC North-leading Pittsburgh Steelers (5-0) jumped on the Browns early and didn't let up last week at Heinz Field, sending the Browns back to Cleveland with a 38-7 loss and a 4-2 record. QB **Baker Mayfield**, dealing with a chest injury that limited him in practice throughout the week, threw for 119 yards, a touchdown and two interceptions. His day came to an end late in the third quarter, when he was replaced by veteran QB **Case Keenum** with the Browns trailing by 24. Keenum completed five passes for 46 yards.

• TE **Austin Hooper** led all Browns receivers with five catches for 52 yards, his third straight game with at least five receptions. The streak is the second longest of his career and is the longest active streak by a tight end in the NFL this year.

• DE **Myles Garrett** extended his streak of games with at least one sack to five, the first such streak by a Brown since 1995 (Anthony Pleasant). He tied Pleasant and Reggie Camp in 1984 for the longest streak in team history. His active streak of five games is the longest in the NFL and a new personal best.

• Garrett's lone sack in Week 6 gave him 37.5 in his career, passing Von Miller for the fifth-most sacks by a player in his first 43 career games. His total also passed Miller for the fourth most by a first-round draft pick in his first 43 career games. His 37.5 career sacks tied Carl Hairston for fourth on the Browns' all-time list.

• Garrett has recorded seven-plus sacks in the first six games of a season for two consecutive years, the first time this has

ever been done by a Brown. His streak of two seasons is the only active one in the NFL and is the first time it has been done in the NFL since Miller from 2016-17.

• WRs **Jarvis Landry** and **Odell Beckham Jr.** each extended their active streaks of games with two-plus receptions to 101 and 81 consecutive games, respectively, the longest active streaks in the league.

**KEVIN STEFANSKI: 4-2, FIRST SEASON AS A HEAD COACH. FIRST WITH THE BROWNS.** On January 13, 2020, the Cleveland Browns announced the hiring of Kevin Stefanski as the 18th full-time head coach in franchise history. The 38-year old spent the past 14 seasons in various roles with the Minnesota Vikings. Prior to Cleveland, Stefanski joined the Vikings in 2006 as an assistant to the head coach and elevated up the coaching ladder, serving as assistant quarterbacks coach (2009-13), tight ends (2014-15) and lone season (2016) coaching running backs. From 2017-18, he coached the quarterbacks and added the role of interim offensive coordinator for the final three games in 2018 before being named the team's offensive coordinator in 2019. Stefanski played defensive back at University of Pennsylvania.

**ZAC TAYLOR: 3-18-1, 2ND SEASON AS A HEAD COACH, 2ND WITH THE BENGALS.** Zac Taylor was appointed the 10th head coach of the Cincinnati Bengals franchise on February 4, 2019. He began his NFL coaching career with the Miami Dolphins serving as QBs coach and offensive coordinator from 2012-15. A one-season stint as offensive coordinator and QB coach for the University of Cincinnati in 2016 before returning to the NFL in 2017, Taylor spent time in Los Angeles part of the Rams organization in 2017 (asst. WR) and 2018 (QB coach). Taylor played football at the collegiate level at Wake Forest (2002-03), Butler Community College (2004) and the University of Nebraska (2005-2006).

## NOTABLE CONNECTIONS

- Pro Football Hall of Fame coach **Paul Brown** was the Browns' first head coach and general manager. Brown coached the Browns from 1942-62, before later founding the Cincinnati Bengals and becoming the Bengals' first head coach and general manager. Brown coached the Bengals from 1968-75.
- Bengals DL coach **Nick Eason** served as a coaching intern for the Browns in 2013. Eason also played for the Browns from 2004-06.
- Bengals K **Austin Seibert** was drafted by the Browns in the fifth round (170th overall) of the 2019 NFL Draft. Seibert played in 17 career games with Cleveland.
- Browns offensive coordinator **Alex Van Pelt** served as the Bengals QBs coach from 2018-19.
- Browns senior football advisor **Ryan Grigson** was drafted by the Cincinnati Bengals in the sixth round of the 1995 NFL Draft.
- Bengals QB **Joe Burrow** is a native of Athens, Ohio and played at Ohio State from 2015-17.
- Bengals S **Vonn Bell**, DE **Sam Hubbard**, G **Michael Jordan** and C **Billy Price** played at Ohio State.
- Bengals defensive quality control coach **Jordan Kovacs** is a native of Curtice, Ohio.
- Bengals C **Billy Price** is from Austintown, Ohio.
- Browns special teams coordinator **Mike Priefer** (2006-08) served on the Kansas City staff with Bengals WR coach **Bob Bicknell** (2007-09).
- Browns DT **Sheldon Richardson** played with Bengals K **Randy Bullock** for the Jets in 2015.
- Browns WR **Odell Beckham Jr.** (2014-18), DE **Olivier Vernon** (2016-18) and LB **B.J. Goodson** (2016-18) played with Bengals OT **Bobby Hart** (2015-17) for the Giants.
- Bengals QB **Joe Burrow** played at LSU with Browns LB **Jacob Phillips**.
- Browns CB **Denzel Ward** (2015-16) played at Ohio State with Bengals QB **Joe Burrow** (2015-17), S **Vonn Bell** (2013-15), G **Sam Hubbard** (2014-17), G **Michael Jordan** (2016-18) and C **Billy Price** (2013-17).
- Bengals RB **Joe Mixon** (2015-16), HB **Samaje Perine** (2014-16), LB **Jordan Evans** (2013-16) and K **Austin Seibert** (2015-18) were teammates with Browns QB **Baker Mayfield** (2015-17) at Oklahoma.

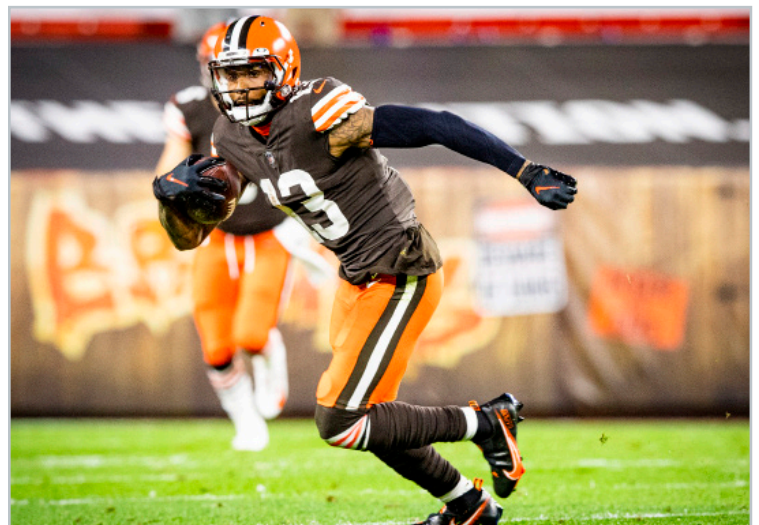

## QB BAKER MAYFIELD

- One passing touchdown away from 60 in his career.

## DE MYLES GARRETT

- One forced fumble from having the most by a Brown since 2000 (10) and a new single-season career high (four).
- Is 2.5 sacks from 40 in his career.
- Looking to extend active streak of consecutive games with at least one sack to six, first by a Brown in history and first in the NFL since T.J. Watt last year.
- Half-sack away from sole possession of fourth on the Browns all-time list.

## WR JARVIS LANDRY

- He and teammate WR Odell Beckham Jr. look to extend their active streaks to 102 and 82 consecutive games with at least a pair of receptions, respectively.

## DT SHELDON RICHARDSON

- One forced fumble away from 10 in his career.
- Is 1.5 sacks away from 30 in his career.

## WR ODELL BECKHAM JR.

- Is 13 receptions away from 500 in his career.
- Is 170 receiving yards away from 7,000 in his career.

## OFFENSIVE STARTERS

**WR JARVIS LANDRY** Leads team in catches with 24, tied for first with 319 receiving yards and second in first down receptions (15) through first six games...Continued longest active NFL streak with at least two receptions in a game to 101...Five-time Pro Bowl selection (2015-19)...Browns 2019 Walter Payton Man of the Year.

**LT JEDRICK WILLS JR.** Started in all six games this season at LT, playing all offensive snaps the past five and protecting an offense that accumulated 942 rushing yards in the first five weeks, most in the franchise since 1963 (1,042)...10th overall pick by the Browns in the 2020 NFL Draft out of Alabama.

**LG JOEL BITONIO** Longest-tenured Brown part of an offensive line that helped protect QB Baker Mayfield set a season-high 247 passing yards Week 5 vs. Ind...Started every game this season on the offensive line at LG and has not missed an offensive snap since 2016...Started all 85 games appeared in since being drafted by the Browns in the second round (35th overall) of the 2014 NFL Draft.

**C JC TRETTER** Has played 100% of offensive snaps since joining the Browns in 2017...Made 54th career start in 85 games Week 6 at Pit...Has helped QB Baker Mayfield complete 371 of 588 passes for 4,309 yards with 29 touchdowns at FirstEnergy Stadium, stamping a 12-6 record since 2018...Signed three-year contract extension mid-2019 season...Voted NFLPA President in 2020.

**RG WYATT TELLER** Inactive (calf) Week 6 at Pit...Missed his first snaps of the season after sustaining a calf injury in the first quarter of Week 5 vs. Ind...Has started 21 of 28 career games...Fifth-round pick by the Bills in the 2018 NFL Draft...Acquired by the Browns in a trade from Buffalo in September 2019.

**RT JACK CONKLIN** Made 62nd career start Week 6 at Pit...Five games started at RT this season (Weeks 1, 3-6) after being active, but not seeing play Week 2 vs. Cin (ankle/finger)...Has started 62 regular season and five postseason games...Signed to the Browns this offseason as an unrestricted free agent...Eighth overall pick by the Titans in the 2016 NFL Draft.

**TE AUSTIN HOOPER** 22 receptions for 205 yards on the season (third on team)...Currently holds a three-game streak of collecting at least five receptions...Hauled in his first touchdown catch as a Brown at Dal...Signed by the Browns as an unrestricted free agent in 2020...Has 34 starts in 65 games and started three of five playoff games...Two-time Pro Bowl selection (2018-19)...Originally a third-round (81st overall) selection by the Falcons in 2016.

**WR ODELL BECKHAM JR.** Concluded Week 6 matchup at Pit with two catches for 25 yards...Has the most passing yards by a wide receiver since 2014 with 144...Continued stretch of snagging 2-or-more receptions in every game played to 81 (second active in NFL)...Scored 50th career touchdown on a 37-yard throw from WR Jarvis Landry Week 4 at Dal...Has played in 81 games, starting 77 and started one postseason game played...Produced career totals of 487 receptions for 6,830 receiving yards, 51 touchdowns and one rushing touchdown.

**QB BAKER MAYFIELD** Threw for a season-high 247 passing yards, connecting on 21 of 37 passes and two touchdowns Week 5 vs. Ind...Season numbers include 1,095 yards on 103 of 170 passing, 10 touchdowns and a 84.3 QB rating...12-6 career record at FirstEnergy Stadium...Reached 1,000 passing yards and 10 touchdowns in all three seasons...First overall selection by the Browns in the 2018 NFL Draft...Has started 34 of 35 games played.

**RB KAREEM HUNT** Tied for AFC lead with six total touchdowns among non-QBs (three rec, three rush), third in AFC in rushing yards (387) and leads team with 93 carries...Also 13 receptions for 80 yards and three TDs (tied for league high among RBs)...Two rushing touchdowns at Dal was first multi-TD rushing game since at Cle, 11/4/18...Originally drafted by the Chiefs in the third round (86th overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft.

**FB ANDY JANOVICH** Appeared at FB in all games this season...Rushed for a career-high two attempts for four yards Week 5 vs. Ind...Traded to the Browns this offseason from Denver in exchange for a 2021 seventh-round pick...Has appeared in 55 games...Career log includes 15 rushes for 55 yards, a touchdown, 23 catches, 233 receiving yards and one touchdown reception.

**RG EVAN BROWN** Played in Week 6 at Pit after being inactive (coach's decision) Weeks 3-5, seeing time on special teams...Has played in seven regular season games...Third season after signing with the Giants as an undrafted free agent in 2018 and spending time with Miami in 2019.

**TE HARRISON BRYANT** Started Weeks 1 and 3 at TE, playing in every game this season...Tallied a season-high four catches for 37 yards Week 4 at Dal...Scored first NFL touchdown on a three-yard pass vs. Was...Eight catches for 70 yards and a touchdown this season...2020 John Mackey Award winner...Fourth-round pick by the Browns from Florida Atlantic.

**TE STEPHEN CARLSON** Appeared in all six games this season, third on team with four special teams stops...Scored a two-point conversion after a recovered blocked PAT Week 4 at Dal...Elevated to active roster after spending first eight weeks of the 2019 season on the Browns' practice squad.

**C NICK HARRIS** Saw action Week 6 at Pit on special teams after being active Weeks 1-2, but no playing time...Fifth-round selection by the Browns in the 2020 NFL Draft...Started 40 of 50 games for his career at Washington...First team All-Pac-12 in 2018 and 2019.

**WR RASHARD HIGGINS** Fifth-year pro scored his second touchdown of the season on a 13-yard pass Week 6 at Pit...Made first start Week 5 vs. Ind and grabbed first touchdown of the season after being inactive (coach's decision) Weeks 3-4...Five catches for 53 yards in 2020...58 games played (seven starts) over five-year career...81 receptions for 1,069 yards and nine touchdowns in career...Fifth-round selection (172nd overall) by the Browns from Colorado State in 2016.

**RB DONTRELL HILLIARD** Set a career high with 29 rushing yards Week 6 at Pit...Undrafted free agent signed by the Browns out of Tulane in 2018...Browns primary kick returner for the 2019 season...Elevated to active roster after spending first three weeks of the season on the Browns' practice squad.

## BILL WILLIS COACHING FELLOWSHIP

The Browns created the Bill Willis Coaching Fellowship in 2020, which is intended for a rising minority coach with a focus on the offensive side of the ball. In the program, the coach spends a full season with Cleveland's coaching staff and assist coaches with week-to-week game plans and talent evaluations. The fellowship also provides the coach with a plethora of resources to network with other coaches, gain valuable knowledge on the implementation of NFL-level coaching methods and improve their path to a professional coaching career.

The team created the fellowship to provide opportunities and experience to minority coaches, who have historically faced barriers in their pursuit of entry-level positions and promotions. The fellowship was named after Willis, who along with teammate Marion Motley, overcame many obstacles to become two of the first African-American professional football players in the modern era. Willis played with the Browns from 1946-53 and was enshrined into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 1977.

Ashton Grant was named the first-ever recipient of the Bill Willis Coaching Fellowship on July 14, 2020.



# CATCHING FIRE

The Browns offense has combined for 4.82 rushing average since 2018, the second-highest average in the NFL. The unit has also posted 4,811 rushing yards (fifth) and 38 rushing touchdowns (tied for eighth) in that span.

**THE LONG HAUL**

The Browns have posted 86 rushes for 10-plus yards and 23 rushes for 20-plus yards since last season, both ranked second in the league. Additionally, the team's 12 carries for 20-plus yards and 35 for 10-plus yards through Week 6 place tied for first and first, respectively, this year.

Since 2000, the 35 carries for 10-plus yards are ranked fourth by a team, while the 12 carries for 20-plus yards are tied for third by a team through the first six weeks of a season.

**CAN'T STOP, WON'T STOP**

The Browns have proven to be hard to take down since 2019, posting 1,658 rushing yards after contact since last season (third in the NFL). This year, the team ranks first in the category with 608 rushing yards after contact, the second-most YAC through the first six weeks of a season by any team since 2000. The team's 506 rushing yards after contact are also 184 yards better than the next closest team at 424 (Tennessee Titans).

**MAGIC TOUCH**

Since last year, the Browns rank tied for seventh in the NFL with a 7.9 scrimmage yards-per-touch average.

In Week 2, Chubb posted 133 scrimmage yards and two scrimmage touchdowns, while Hunt added 101 scrimmage yards and another pair of scrimmage touchdowns. It's the first time since the 2010 Giants in Week 13 (Brandon Jacobs and Ahmad Bradshaw) two running backs on the same team have posted 100-plus scrimmage yards and two-plus scrimmage touchdowns in a single game.

**RUN FOR THEIR \$**

When Hunt rushed for his first touchdown of the game in the second quarter of Week 4, he and Chubb became the third set of RB teammates each with at least four-plus touchdowns through four games in the Super Bowl era.



DE Myles Garrett



notched his **fifth** consecutive game with a **sack** last week, the longest active streak in the NFL and a new career high. He currently ranks **second** in the NFL with seven sacks, adding three forced fumbles (**tied for second**) and two opponent fumble recoveries (**tied for first**). The pair of fumble recoveries also rank Garrett **first** in total takeaways among all defensive linemen. Additionally, Garrett is **tied for fifth** in the league in quarterback hits (11) and **tied for second** in pressures (19). He now has 37.5 sacks in his career, the **fifth-most sacks** by a player in his first 43 career games and the **fourth most** by a first-round draft pick in the same span. Garrett is currently **tied for fourth** in sacks in Browns history.

Garrett has registered 15.5 sacks in the month of October since 2017, tied for second in the league. He also ranks tied for second in the league in October since 2018 (11.5) and since last year (eight).

### SMART STREAK

Garrett has had a sack in five consecutive games this year, the first time that's been done in the same season by a Brown since 1995. It's the longest active streak in the league and is a career high. His active streak marks just the third time a Brown has had a sack in four straight games.

### JURASSIC MYLES

Since entering the league in 2017, Garrett is fifth in the NFL with 37.5 sacks (second in the AFC), despite playing in at least seven less games than any player in the top 10. Additionally, Garrett's 0.87 sacks per game in the same span rank third in the NFL.

### BEYOND FOOTBALL

- Active with Open Doors Academy in Cleveland and participated in a poetry workshop with ODA kids during this year's training camp.
- In support of families that lost a loved one to police brutality, Garrett covered funeral costs for David McAtee, who was shot and killed by police in Louisville, Ky. in May.
- In his fourth year of serving on the Waterboys organization and his second as the active player captain. The foundation works to bring clean water to communities in need in East Africa. In his role as captain, Garrett leads a team of active NFL players committed to using their platform to engage their fans in the clean water crisis. Since its launch, Waterboys has funded 83 wells serving more than 350,000 people.

Garrett is just the 16th player since 1982 to have at least 37.5 sacks and nine forced fumbles in his first four years. He's seen action in just 43 career games, fewest on the list, with the next highest number of games played being 52. Garrett is the only NFL player since 1982 to have reached those numbers in 43 career games or fewer.

Garrett's nine career forced fumbles are already the most among Browns in history who have played in four seasons and are tied for the most among all Browns since 2000. His career total is tied for eighth in the league since he entered it in 2017.

Garrett has posted 19 sacks in 22 games played on the road since 2017, sixth in the NFL, while his 18.5 in 21 games played in Cleveland are tied ninth in the span. His six forced fumbles at home are tied for the third most by a player since 2017.

With 2.5 sacks this week, Garrett could become the fourth-fastest player in history to reach 40 career sacks (44) games, behind Reggie White (35 games), Aldon Smith (38 games) and Derrick Thomas (42 games). He would also become the fastest Brown to reach the mark, 32 games ahead of the current record holder (Michael Dean Perry, 76 games).

Last week, RB **Kareem Hunt** posted 13 rushing attempts for 40 yards, along with two receptions for 17 yards. It marked Hunt's **sixth consecutive game with 50 scrimmage yards**, making him one of only 10 players to have such a streak



this season. Hunt has posted 20 career games with 50-plus scrimmage yards and a scrimmage touchdown since 2017 and **his teams have gone 17-3 during those instances.**

His 14 receiving touchdowns since 2017 are tied for third by a running back since that time. Hunt has totaled seven games with at least 50 scrimmage yards and two touchdowns, tied for ninth among all players in the NFL since 2017. He's also **tied for fourth in the NFL** with five games consisting of at least one receiving touchdown and one rushing touchdown since 2017.

WR Jarvis Landry caught three passes for 40 receiving yards last week at Pittsburgh. The game was also his **101st consecutive game catching at least two passes**, the longest active streak in the NFL and the fifth longest streak in NFL history. Landry also become No. 8 on the list of receivers with the **most receptions in the first seven years of their careers**, passing Anquan Boldin (586) and Andre Johnson (587).



## CATCHING ON

**7th** Landry is eighth in NFL history for receptions in a player's first seven years (588). His 581 receptions total ranks fifth in NFL history in a player's first 100 games.

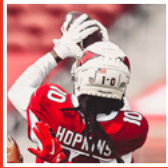
In his 100th career game in Week 4, Landry recorded five receptions for 48 yards and tossed his first career touchdown pass on the Browns' first drive of the game, a 37-yard pass to WR Odell Beckham Jr. (his 50th career receiving score). The pass was Landry's sixth attempt in his career and first touchdown. He now has 109 passing yards since 2014, third in the NFL by a WR since that time, behind WRs Mohamed Sanu (135) and Beckham Jr. (144). He's also 2-2 for 100 yards and a touchdown in his last two passing attempts. It was the first touchdown pass by a Browns WR since Mohamed Massaquoi in Week 16 of 2010 and the longest passing touchdown by a Browns WR in history.

## 500 CLUB

With 588 career receptions, Landry is one of just four players to have 575-plus catches since 2014, including Antonio Brown (580), Julio Jones (638) and DeAndre Hopkins (619).

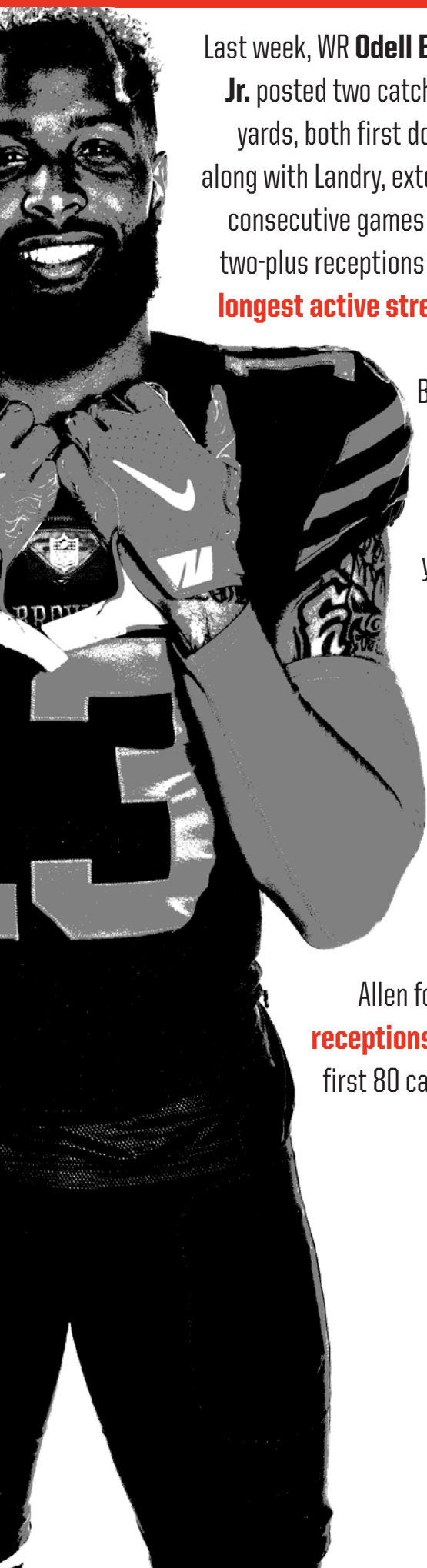

## A DAY TO REMEMBER

Week 4's contest was one of WR Odell Beckham Jr.'s most prolific performances as a Brown, recording five catches for 81 yards and two touchdowns, along with two rushing attempts for 73 yards and his first career rushing score. His 50-yard rushing score was the longest by a non-running back in Browns history. He tied his career high with three total touchdowns in the game and became the fourth NFL receiver with at least two receiving touchdowns and a rushing touchdown in a single game since 2000. He received his 50th career touchdown pass from Landry in the game, 37 yards for the longest recorded touchdown pass by a receiver in Browns history. He also became the first Browns player with a 30-yard receiving touchdown and 50-yard rushing touchdown in the same game since 1966 (Leroy Kelly).

## TWO TUDDIES

With at least two receiving scores in 12 games since entering the league in 2014, Beckham Jr. ranks tied for third in the NFL in that category in an active player's first seven years. Since being drafted, he's also second to Antonio Brown's 15 games and is tied for seventh all time for most multi-touchdown games in a player's first 70 contests and tied for sixth in a player's first 80 games.

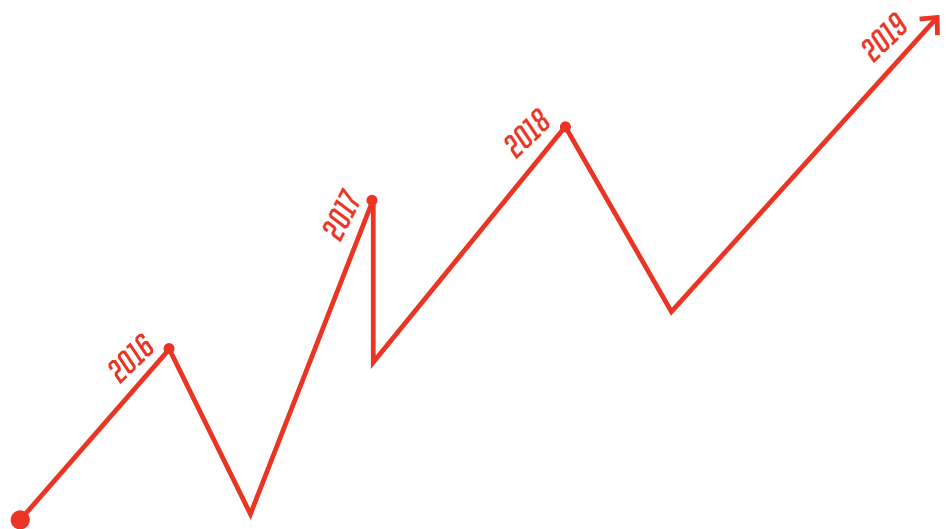

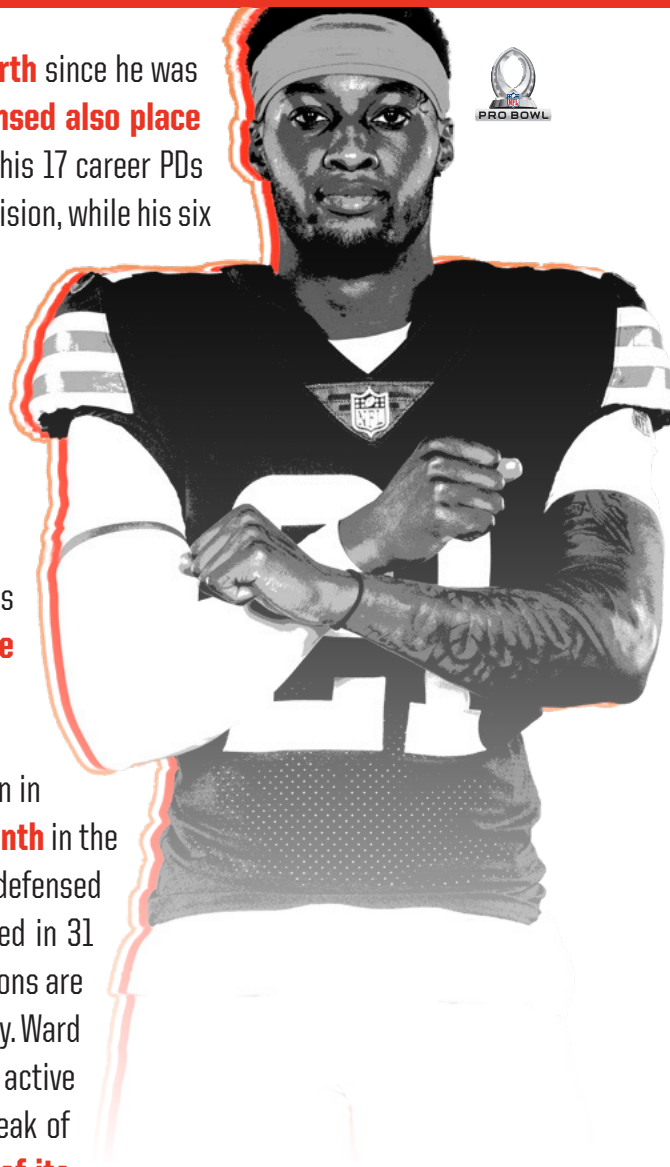


CB Denzel Ward has posted the **most interceptions versus the AFC North** since he was drafted in 2018 with five. His **six total takeaways and 17 passes defended also place first**. His one interception returned for a touchdown is **tied for first** and his 17 career PDs against the AFC North are the **most in the NFL** by a player versus his own division, while his six total takeaways are tied for first in the same category.

In Week 2, he and CB **Terrance Mitchell** each notched three passes defended, **tying a career high** for Ward. The three pass breakups apiece tied Mitchell and Ward for the sixth most among all players in a single game this season.

This year, Ward **leads the team** with eight pass breakups, **tied for fourth in the NFL** and **tied for the most in the AFC**. He's also added an interception.

Ward's 30 career passes defended are **fifth** by a Brown in his third year or younger since 2000 and are tied for **ninth** in the NFL since he entered the league in 2018. His 30 passes defended are also the **second most** by a Brown who has played in 31 career games or less since 2000 and his six interceptions are **tied for seventh** in Browns history in the same category. Ward is also tied for the **seventh-most** passes defended by an active player in 31 career games or less since 2000. His active streak of five games with at least one pass breakup is **the only one of its kind** in the NFL currently.



The longest-tenured member of the Browns, **G Joel Bitonio hasn't missed an offensive snap the past three seasons.**

S **Tavierre Thomas** notched five special teams tackles in the team's win over Dallas in Week 4, the **second most by any NFL player** in a game this season. They were also the most by a Browns player since Leigh Bodden recorded five in 2004. Thomas is tied for **third in the NFL** with six special teams tackles this year.



DE **Olivier Vernon** has 54.5 career sacks since 2012 and 30 against the AFC, **eighth** among all defensive ends against the AFC in that span.



DE **Adrian Clayborn**'s career-high mark of **six sacks in a single game** (2017) is tied for the **most ever by a player in NFL history**. His two forced fumbles and fumble recovery in the same contest make him the **only player in history** to have **six sacks, two forced fumbles and fumble recovery** in the same game. # THE ROOKS





Kevin Stefanski was named the 18th full-time head coach in Cleveland Browns history on January 13, 2020. He spent the previous 14 seasons with the Minnesota Vikings, where he moved up the coaching ladder from assistant to the head coach to offensive coordinator.

Stefanski joined the Vikings in 2006 as an assistant to the head coach and remained with the organization under three different head coaches. After serving as assistant quarterbacks coach from 2009-13, Stefanski spent two seasons (2014-15) coaching the tight ends and one season (2016) as running backs coach. From 2017-18, he coached the quarterbacks and added the role of interim offensive coordinator for the final three games before being named the team's offensive coordinator in 2019.

In 2019, the Vikings posted a 10-6 record and earned their first road playoff win since January 9, 2005, after defeating the Saints, 26-20, in New Orleans. Three offensive players were selected to the Pro Bowl as RB Dalvin Cook and FB C.J. Ham were each named to their first career Pro Bowl with Cook voted a starter. QB Kirk Cousins was also named to the Pro Bowl.

In his first full year under Stefanski, Cousins set a single-season career high for passer rating with a 107.4 mark, fourth best in the NFL in 2019. Cousins also finished with a career-low six interceptions, while adding 26 touchdowns and a 69.1 completion percentage, fourth in the NFL in 2019. He set a Vikings record for completions in a season with 425 and finished with the second-most passing yards (4,298) and passer rating (107.4) in Vikings history.

With 1,135 rushing yards, Cook became the eighth player in Vikings history to rush for 1,000 yards in a single season and the first since Adrian Peterson in 2015. Despite missing the final two games of the season, Cook finished fourth in the NFL with 13 rushing touchdowns and seventh in scrimmage yards with 1,654.

WR Stefon Diggs set a career high with 1,130 receiving yards, giving him back-to-back 1,000-receiving yard seasons for the first time in his career. Diggs finished fourth in the NFL with an average of 17.9 yards per reception in 2019.

Stefanski was elevated from quarterbacks coach to interim offensive coordinator in Week 15 of the 2018 season and promptly guided the unit to two of its best showings of the season. In his first game calling plays, Minnesota scored a season-high 41 points and recorded 418 yards of offense en route to a 41-17 victory over the Dolphins.

As quarterbacks coach in 2017, the Vikings were forced to go to their backup, Case Keenum, early in the season after starter Sam Bradford went down with an injury. Keenum, who had completed 58 percent of his passes previously owned a 9-15 career record as a starter, went on to complete nearly 68 percent of his throws with 22 touchdowns and seven interceptions while leading the Vikings to a record of 11-3.

In his lone season coaching the running backs in 2016, the Vikings battled injuries along the offensive line and to RB Adrian

Peterson that caused the runner to miss 13 games. The running game leaned on veterans Jerick McKinnon and Matt Asiata as the duo combined for 941 yards and eight rushing touchdowns.

As tight ends coach, Stefanski helped develop Pro Bowl TE Kyle Rudolph. In 2015, his unit helped clear the way for Adrian Peterson to lead the NFL in rushing with 1,485 yards.

Stefanski was elevated to assistant quarterbacks coach in 2009, where he had a hands-on role in one of the most successful offense seasons in Vikings history. Veteran QB Brett Favre signed with the team in mid-August and finished the season with 4,202 passing yards and 33 touchdowns. The Vikings finished the season 12-4 and won the NFC North.

Stefanski spent 2006-08 working directly with Head Coach Brad Childress on administrative duties and special projects. Stefanski first worked with Childress during Eagles training camp in 2005 as part of the team's operations department.

Stefanski spent the 2005 season at his alma mater, Pennsylvania, as assistant director of football operations, coordinating all aspects of the Quakers' day-to-day operations.

A team captain as a senior in 2003, Stefanski was part of one of the most successful stretches in the history of the Quaker football program. The team won three Ivy League titles (2000, 2002 and 2003), and went 10-0 in 2003 to become the first undefeated Penn team in a decade. During Stefanski's tenure, the squad posted a 42-7 overall record and a 32-3 mark in Ivy League play and he was twice honored as an Honorable Mention All-Ivy choice in 2002 and 2004.

Stefanski earned a bachelor's degree in communications from Pennsylvania and attended St. Joseph's Prep in Philadelphia.

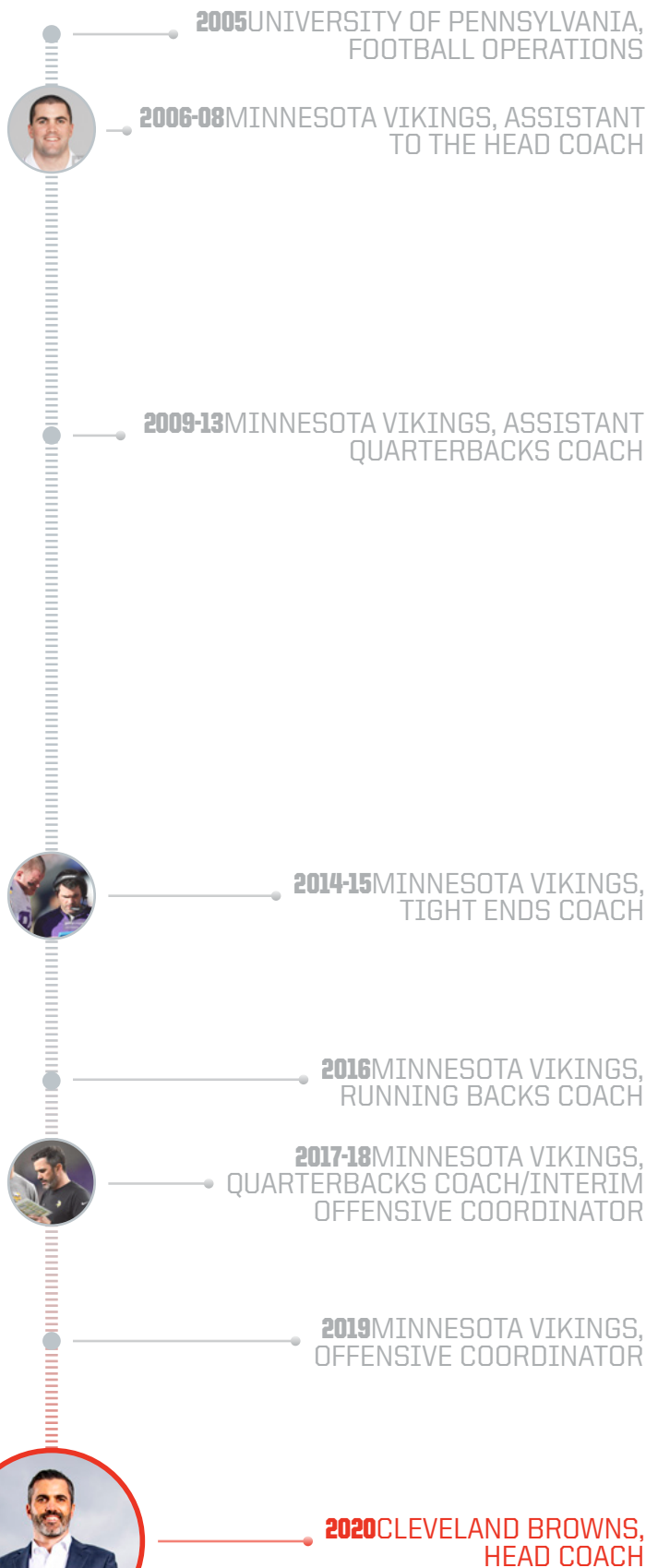
The Stefanski family has made a name in athletics as Kevin's father, Ed, was a basketball standout at Penn and works in the front office of the Detroit Pistons. He has previously held executive positions with the NBA's New Jersey Nets, Philadelphia 76ers, Toronto Raptors and Memphis Grizzlies.

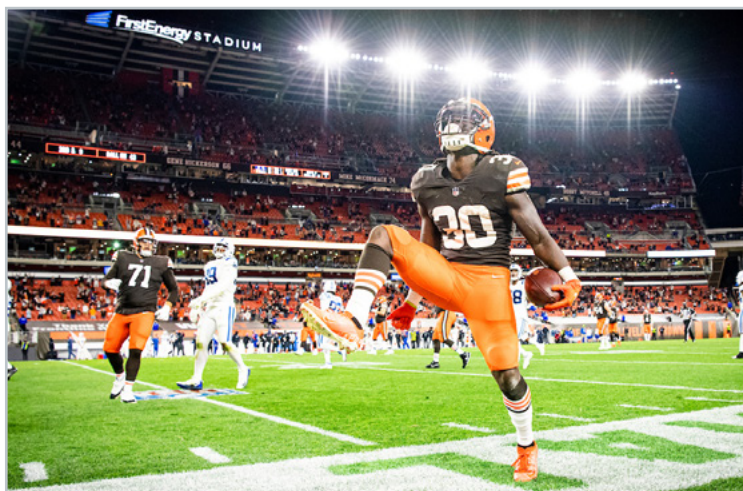
