## FIRST AND 10

- Chicago is facing the Bengals for the first time since the 2017 season, a 33-7 Bears victory at Paul Brown Stadium in Cincinnati.
- Chicago is 5-6 all-time against the Bengals.
- The Bears are 67-30-4 all-time in home openers, the most victories of any franchise in home openers.
- The Bears enter the 2021 season with the third-toughest schedule based on opponent winning percentages from 2020 (Pittsburgh .574; Baltimore .563; Chicago .550).
- Head coach **MATT NAGY** is 9-3 in September games in his three-plus seasons as head coach. His only three losses are season openers in 2018, 2019 and 2021.
- Bears **QB ANDY DALTON** is facing his former team for the second time after starting in Cincinnati for the Cowboys last December. Dalton spent nine seasons as the starting quarterback for the Bengals, leading the team to the postseason in each of his first five seasons. He went 70-61-2 as the starting QB for the Bengals, the most wins by a quarterback in franchise history.
- Dalton left Cincinnati as the Bengals all-time leader in career passer rating (87.5), 300-yard passing games (28), winning percentage (.533), completions (2,757), touchdowns (204) and touchdown/interception ratio (1.73).
- Last week **TE JIMMY GRAHAM** became the sixth tight end in NFL history to record 700 career receptions. He also joins the company of Hall of Fame tight ends Tony Gonzalez and Antonio Gates as the only three TEs to eclipse 700+ career receptions, 8,000+ yards and 80+ TDs.
- RB DAVID MONTGOMERY** rushed for 108 yards on 16 carries (6.8 avg) in Week 1 at the Rams. He became the first Bears RB to rush for 100+ yards in a season-opener since Matt Forte did so at Green Bay in 2015. Montgomery now has a streak of seven consecutive regular-season games with a TD, dating back to Week 12 of the 2020 season.
- K CAIRO SANTOS** currently has a streak of 27 consecutive field goals made in the regular season, a Bears record, and a streak that started in Week 3 last year at the Falcons.

## NEW FACES • KEY FREE AGENT ACQUISITIONS

## ANDY DALTON | QB



Signed by the Bears as an unrestricted free agent in March ... has started 142 of 144 games, throwing for 33,764 yards, 218 touchdowns and 126 interceptions while completing 62.2 percent of his passes ... also has 22 career rushing touchdowns, the fourth most in the NFL among quarterbacks since entering the league in 2011 ... spent nine seasons as the starting quarterback for the Bengals, leading the team to the postseason in each of his first five NFL seasons ... boasts a record of 74-66-2 as a starter, left Cincinnati as the Bengals all-time leader in career passer rating (87.5), 300-yard passing games (28), winning percentage (.533), completions (2,757) and touchdowns (204).

## DAMIEN WILLIAMS | RB



Signed by the Bears as an unrestricted free agent in March ... opted out of the 2020 season due to COVID-19 ... Has appeared in 85 games with 13 starts over six NFL seasons with the Dolphins (2014-17) and Chiefs (2018-19); has rushed for 1,355 yards and 14 touchdowns on 306 carries and caught 142 passes for 1,136 yards and 10 TDs ... also has 369 rushing yards and six scores and 189 receiving yards and five scores in six postseason contests ... his 11 career postseason touchdowns are the second most among active players (Rob Gronkowski, 14) ... scored six total touchdowns during the 2019 postseason and 10 overall postseason touchdowns for his career with Kansas City.

## JASON PETERS | OL



Has played in 213 career games with 203 starts, including six postseason starts ... has the second-most Pro Bowl nods in Eagles history ... earned All-Pro honors following the 2007, '08, '10, '11, '13 and '14 campaigns ... was named to the first team in 2011 and 2013 ... has 2 career TDs: blocked a punt and recovered it in the end zone (12/19/04 at Cin.) and caught J.P. Losman's first career TD pass (9/11/05 vs. Hou.) ... in 2014, was named a second-team AP All-Pro ... was part of an Eagles offensive line in 2013 that blocked for the NFL's leading rusher, LeSean McCoy, who finished with a franchise-best 1,607 rushing yards ... also helped the Eagles set a team record with 6,676 total yards.

## MARQUISE GOODWIN | WR



Signed by the Bears as an unrestricted free agent in April ... Sat out of the 2020 NFL season due to COVID-19 pandemic ... Has recorded 13 TD receptions during his NFL career, 8 of which have gone for 40 or more yards ... since entering the NFL in 2013, has registered 140 receptions for 2,323 yds. His 16.6 rec avg. is the 5th-highest in the NFL among active receivers (min. 100 rec.).

## NEW FACES • KEY FREE AGENT ACQUISITIONS

## JEREMIAH ATTAOCHU | LB



Signed by the Bears as an unrestricted free agent in March ... An eighth-year player who has appeared in 74 career games (23 starts) with the Chargers (2014-17), Jets (2018) and Broncos (2019-20) ... collected 128 total tackles (102 solo), 20.5 sacks, three forced fumbles and one fumble recovery during his first seven NFL seasons ... Played in 13 games with five starts for the Broncos last season ... recorded his most sacks since his 2015 campaign with 5.0; added 29 combined tackles, six tackles for loss, eight QB hits and one forced fumble while appearing in 13 games.

## ANGELO BLACKSON | DL



Signed by the Bears as an unrestricted free agent in March ... Has played in 85 games with 30 starts for the Titans, Texans and Cardinals; enters his seventh NFL season and first with the Bears in 2021 ... selected by the Titans in the fourth round (100th overall) of the 2015 NFL Draft ... Appeared in all 16 games (nine starts) last season with the Arizona Cardinals and matched career highs with 24 tackles and 2.5 sacks also had career highs with three tackles for loss and eight QB hits.

## CHRISTIAN JONES | LB



Signed back with the Bears as a UFA in March ... Enters his eighth NFL season in 2021 and his fifth with the Bears ... has appeared in 108 career games (73 starts), recording 405 tackles (265 solo), 7.0 sacks, 17 tackles-for-loss, 17 quarterback hurries, 16 passes defended and four fumble recoveries ... last season he appeared in 16 games (13 starts), posting 50 tackles (29 solo) and one pass defense.

## JESSE JAMES | TE



Recently signed by the Bears on July 27 ... Has appeared in 88 games (54 starts) and has 150 receptions for 1,460 yards and 11 touchdowns ... in 2019, caught 16 passes for 142 yards (8.9 avg.) in his debut season with the Lions ... one of five tight ends in the NFL to average at least 14.0 yards per catch on 30+ receptions in 2018 ... left Pittsburgh ranked sixth in receptions (120), seventh in touchdowns (nine) and eighth in receiving yards (1,189) among all-time Steelers tight ends.

## NEW FACES • 2021 DRAFT CLASS

**JUSTIN FIELDS | QB • OHIO STATE**

Selected by the Bears with the 11th overall pick in the first round of the 2021 NFL Draft ... posted a record of 20-2 as Ohio State's starting quarterback from 2019-20, including a 9-2 record against ranked opponents ... two-time Big Ten Offensive Player of the Year ... two-time First Team All-Big Ten ... 2020 *Chicago Tribune* Silver Football Award winner ... 2019 Heisman Trophy finalist ... accounted for 78 touchdowns in his two seasons (63 passing, 15 rushing), throwing for 5,373 yards (10th at OSU); also threw for 63 touchdowns (second at OSU) and completed 68.4 pct. of his passes (second at Ohio State) with just nine interceptions ... also rushed for 867 yards and 15 touchdowns.

**TEVEN JENKINS | OL • OKLAHOMA ST.**

Selected with the 39th overall pick in the 2021 NFL Draft ... Jenkins is the 12th Cowboy selected by the Bears in franchise history and the first since TE Alonzo Mayes in 1998 ... is the highest offensive tackle drafted by the Bears since Gabe Carimi was drafted in the first round in 2011 ... had 35 career starts for the Cowboys, helping pave the way for All-Americans Mason Rudolph, James Washington, Tylan Wallace and Chuba Hubbard, who led the nation in rushing in 2019 with 2,094 yards ... Jenkins only allowed two sacks in those 35 career starts, according to *Pro Football Focus* ... 2020 First Team All-Big 12 (Coaches/AP) ... placed on IR before the start of the season.

**LARRY BOROM | OL • MISSOURI**

Chicago selected offensive lineman Larry Borom from Missouri with the 151st pick in the fifth round, becoming the ninth offensive lineman drafted by Pace since 2015 ... 2020 All-SEC Second Team (PFF) ... started all eight games that he played in 2020, anchoring down the right side of the line at RT ... was ranked among the nation's elite lineman by *Pro Football Focus*. com, grading him as the 16th-best tackle in the nation (87.0) and the SEC's top pass-blocking OT (84.5) ... started 11 of 12 games during his redshirt sophomore season in 2019 ... played in all 13 games as a redshirt freshman in 2018, seeing time on special teams and along the offensive line.

**KHALIL HERBERT | RB • VIRGINIA TECH**

Selected with the 217th overall pick in the sixth round of the 2021 NFL Draft ... Herbert played four seasons at Kansas from 2016-19 before playing last year at Virginia Tech ... in 46 career games, he rushed for 2,918 yards and 22 touchdowns on 475 carries and caught 34 passes for 297 yards and 1 TD ... in 2020, 5-9, 205-pounder played in 11 games for Virginia Tech, rushing for a career-high 1,183 yards and eight TDs on 155 carries and catching 10 passes for 179 yards and one TD ... became the first Hokie since 2015 to rush for 1,000 yards with his tally of 1,204 in 2020 ... earned Second Team All-ACC as an all-purpose performer and Third Team as a running back.



## NEW FACES • 2021 DRAFT CLASS

**DAZZ NEWSOME | WR • NORTH CAROLINA**

The Bears used their second selection of the sixth round to select Newsome at pick No. 221 in the 2021 NFL Draft ... Newsome appeared in 43 games over four seasons for the Tar Heels, catching 188 passes for 2,435 yards and 18 touchdowns ... had a breakout junior year in 2019, establishing career highs in all receiving categories with 72 receptions, 1,018 yards and 10 TDs ... in 2020, Newsome logged 54 catches for 684 yards and six TDs ... he also returned punts the past three years at North Carolina, averaging 11.1 yards with one touchdown on 48 returns ... suffered an injury in the offseason ... was waived at the end of training camp before re-signing with the team as a member of the practice squad.

**THOMAS GRAHAM JR. | DB • OREGON**

The Bears used their third and final selection of the sixth round to select Graham at pick No. 228 ... opted out of the 2020 season at Oregon due to COVID-19 ... appeared in 40 games over three seasons at Oregon, registering 183 tackles, eight interceptions, 10.5 tackles-for-loss and 32 pass breakups ... as a junior in 2019 he earned PFF All-Pac-12 second team, Coaches Pac-12 All-Conference honorable mention and PFF Pac-12 Team of the Week (Week 10) ... was waived at the end of training camp before re-signing with the team as a member of the practice squad.

**KHYIRIS TONGA | DL • BYU**

Selected in the seventh round of the 2021 draft ... Appeared in 50 games in four seasons at BYU, registering 130 tackles, 15.0 tackles-for-loss, 7.5 sacks, 12 pass breakups and two forced fumbles ... In 2020, played in 11 games and recorded 36 tackles and 3.5 tackles-for-loss while establishing career highs with 3.5 sacks and five pass breakups.

- QB **JUSTIN FIELDS** rushed for his first NFL touchdown with 4:14 left in the third quarter on in Week 1 at the Rams. Dating to 1960, Fields is the first Bears rookie quarterback to rush for a touchdown in a season opener. He was the Bears seventh quarterback overall to score a rushing touchdown in Week 1 and it marked the 13th overall rushing TD by a Chicago quarterback in Week 1.
- WR **ALLEN ROBINSON II** ranks fifth in the NFL among wide receivers with 2,432 receiving yards over the past three-plus seasons (Diggs 2,734; Hopkins 2,655; Moore 2,448; Cooper 2,442).
- Robinson has at least one reception in all 89 career games. He owns 16 games of 100+ receiving yards and has eight career multi-touchdown performances.
- Robinson is tied for first in Bears annals with five 10+ reception games with Brandon Marshall and Alshon Jeffery.
- WR **DARNELL MOONEY** set a Bears record for most receptions by a rookie wide receiver by snagging 61 in 2020. He also recorded 631 yards and had four touchdowns.
- RB **DAVID MONTGOMERY** has a streak of seven consecutive regular season games with a touchdown dating to Week 12 of the 2020 season.
- Montgomery rushed for 108 yards on 16 carries (6.8 avg) in Week 1 at the Rams. He became the first Bears RB to rush for 100+ yards in a season-opener since Matt Forte did so at Green Bay in 2015. Montgomery now has a streak of seven consecutive regular-season games with a TD, dating back to Week 12 of the 2020 season.
- Montgomery finished the 2020 season with 1,508 yards from scrimmage (1,070 rushing) and was one of five players in the NFL with over 1,500+ yards from scrimmage. Montgomery was also the only NFL running back with more than 1,000 rushing yards and 400 receiving yards.
- Montgomery tied for third among NFL running backs with the most games with at least 100 scrimmage yards in 2020: Derrick Henry, TEN - 10; Dalvin Cook, MIN - 9; Nick Chubb, CLE - 8; David Montgomery, CHI, 8.
- In Week 1 at the Rams, TE **JIMMY GRAHAM** became the sixth tight end in NFL history to record 700 career receptions. He joins the company of Hall of Fame tight ends Tony Gonzalez and Antonio Gates as the only three TEs to eclipse 700+ career receptions, 8,000+ yards and 80+ TDs.
- Graham ranks second among NFL tight ends since 2010 with 8,350 receiving yards, 700 receptions and 82 receiving TDs (Gronkowski 88). He also ranks fourth in NFL history among tight ends with his 82 career TD catches.
- Last season Graham ranked second in the NFC among tight ends with his eight TD catches and tied for fourth among all tight ends.
- Six-time Pro Bowl LB **KHALIL MACK** returns for his fourth season in Chicago in 2021. His 22 forced fumbles since the start of 2015 are the most in the NFL during that span.
- Mack has recorded at least 1.0 sack in 23 games for the Bears, with the Bears going 16-6 in those games (7-2 in 2018, 5-2 in 2019 and 4-3 in 2020). He has 66.5 sacks since the start of 2015, the third most in the NFL in that span, and has 21.0 3rd-quarter sacks since the start of 2015, the most in the NFL.
- In 14 primetime games with the Bears, Mack has 11.0 sacks, eight forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and two interceptions, one which was returned for a touchdown.
- Mack had a team-high nine sacks in 2020 and is one of two players in the NFL (Aaron Donald) with at least eight sacks in each of the last six seasons. Since entering the NFL in 2014, he is one of seven players with at least 70 sacks (70.5) and is tied with Chandler Jones for the league lead with 23 forced fumbles during that span.



GAME NOTES

- In his first season with the Bears, LB **ROBERT QUINN** registered three forced fumbles, and his 27 career forced fumbles are tied with Chandler Jones (27) for the most among active players. He is the only player in the NFL with multiple forced fumbles in each of the past eight seasons.
- LB **ROQUAN SMITH** led the team with 139 tackles last season, his third-consecutive season with at least 100 tackles, and ranked second in the NFL with a career-high 18 tackles for loss. Since entering the league in 2018, he is one of five players with at least 300 tackles, 20 tackles for loss and 10 sacks.
- DB **JAYLON JOHNSON** led all rookies and tied for sixth in the NFL with 15 passes defended in 2020.
- DB **EDDIE JACKSON** has six defensive touchdowns in his career, the most in the NFL since he entered the league in 2017. The first two came in the same game vs. Carolina (10/22/17), a 75-yard fumble return and a 76-yard interception return. His third score was a 65-yard fumble return at Buffalo (11/4/18). His fourth was a 27-yard interception return vs. Minnesota (11/18/18) and the fifth was the very next week, a 41-yard interception return at Detroit on Thanksgiving (11/22/18). His sixth was an 8-yard fumble return at the Rams last season.
- **K CAIRO SANTOS** finished the 2020 season with a streak of 27 consecutive field goals made between Weeks 3-17, breaking both the Bears single-season and all-time record for consecutive makes.
- Head coach **MATT NAGY** is 11-7 against the NFC North in his head coaching career, including 10-2 against the Lions and Vikings.
- Nagy finished the 2020 season one win behind former coach Lovie Smith (29) for the most wins by a Bears head coach through three seasons.
- Nagy has a 16-6 record when the Bears offense scores more than 24+ points since 2018.
- Nagy has a 21-9 record when the Bears offense scores more than 20+ points since 2018.
- Nagy is 9-3 in September games, the only losses were Week 1 in 2018, 2019 and 2021. Last year was the Bears first undefeated month of September since 2010.



LB **Khalil Mack** has 30.0 sacks in his first three-plays seasons with the Bears. He had 9.0 in 2020 to go along with 11 TFL.

- Only 49 games into his Bears' coaching tenure, Matt Nagy has strung together six win streaks of three or more games, ranking fourth all-time among Chicago coaches.
- The Bears are 5-1 on short weeks under Matt Nagy (coming off Monday night or playing on Thursday night).

- In 2018, Bears linebackers coach Bill McGovern coached the linebackers for the New York Giants alongside Bears secondary coach Deshae Townsend and Bengals defensive coordinator Lou Anarumo, who at the time was the defensive backs coach.

- Chicago's offensive coordinator Bill Lazor previously served as the offensive coordinator for the Cincinnati Bengals (2017-20) while Bengals special teams coordinator/ assistant head coach Darrin Simmons coached the special teams unit (2013-present).
- Bears assistant defensive backs coach Mike Adams and Bengals assistant special teams coach Colt Anderson both played safety for the Indianapolis Colts. Adams from 2014-16 and Anderson from 2014-15.
- Chicago head coach Matt Nagy served as the offensive quality control coach (2011-12) for the Philadelphia Eagles while Bengals assistant special teams coach Colt Anderson played safety for the team (2010-13). A few other Bears were former Eagles at the time, including offensive line coach Juan Castillo who served as the defensive coordinator (2011-12), linebackers coach Bill McGovern who coached the outside linebackers (2013-15), and offensive coordinator Bill Lazor who worked with the Eagles quarterbacks (2013).
- Bears assistant wide receivers coach Chris Jackson played receiver for the Green Bay Packers (2002-03) while Bengals senior defensive assistant Mark Duffner was the Packers linebackers coach (2003-05).
- Bears defensive coordinator Sean Desai crossed paths with Bengals linebackers coach Al Golden at Temple University and at the University of Miami (Fla.). At Temple, Desai served as a graduate assistant, special teams coordinator, and outside linebackers coach during his three-year tenure with the program (2007-10) while Golden was the team's head coach (2006-10). In Miami, Golden was the resumed role as head coach (2011-15) and Desai worked as the assistant director of football operations (2011).
- Bengals cornerback Trae Waynes played for the Minnesota Vikings from 2015-19. At the same time, both Bears quarterbacks coach/pass game coordinator John DeFilippo and tight ends coach Clancy Barone held coaching roles within the organization. DeFilippo was the Vikings offensive coordinator in 2018 while Barone was the tight ends coach (2017) before becoming the co-offensive line coach (2018). Bengals offensive lineman Riley Reiff also worked closely with Coach Barone, as he played on the Vikings offensive line from 2017-20.
- Bears linebacker Robert Quinn crossed paths with Bengals wide receiver Mike Thomas when the two played for the Los Angeles Rams together from 2016-17.
- Chicago quarterback Andy Dalton and Cincinnati cornerback Chidobe Awuzie were teammates in Dallas during the 2020 season.
- Bears receiver Allen Robinson II (2014-17) and Bears defensive back Taushan Gipson Sr. (2016-18) were teammates with Bengals quarterback Brandon Allen (2016) when the three played for the Jacksonville Jaguars.
- Chicago linebackers coach Bill McGovern coached the linebackers (2016-19) for the Giants while Bengals cornerback Eli Apple played for the organization (2016-18).
- Bears secondary coach Deshae Townsend served as the secondary coach for the Tennessee Titans while Bengals Quinton Spain played guard.

## NOTING THE 2021 SCHEDULE

**BEARS OPEN UP IN PRIMETIME**

The Bears opened up the season at SoFi Stadium in Inglewood, Calif., the site of Super Bowl LVI, against the L.A. Rams on Sunday Night Football in Week 1. It marked the fourth straight year facing the Rams, all coming in primetime, with the last three in Los Angeles.

The Bears have opened the regular season in primetime on seven previous occasions, going 3-4 in those games:

**ALTERNATING HOME/AWAY**

Chicago will alternate home and road games throughout the season for the first time in franchise history.

**TWO ON MONDAY NIGHT**

For the second consecutive year the Bears will play two games on ESPN's Monday Night Football: Week 9 at the Pittsburgh Steelers and Week 15 at home vs. the Minnesota Vikings. Last season the Bears played at the Rams and were home against the Vikings. Prior to last year, the last time the Bears played two MNF games was the 2016 season, falling to the Eagles in Week 2 at home before defeating the Vikings in Week 8 on Halloween night. Chicago also played two MNF games in 2014, 2013, 2012 (3 games), 2011 and 2010.

**TURKEY DAY IN DETROIT**

The Bears will face NFC North rival Detroit on Thanksgiving Day for the third time in the last four years. Chicago defeated the Lions 23-16 at Ford Field on Turkey Day in 2018 and again in 2019, 24-20. The Bears own an all-time record of 19-15-2 on Thanksgiving, including a 10-8 record vs. the Lions. Chicago has won its last three games on Thanksgiving (2015 at GB, 2018 & 2019 at DET).



*In Week 1, the Bears will travel to face the Rams in Los Angeles for the third straight year in primetime, and for the second time at SoFi Stadium.*

**SUNDAY NIGHT FOOTBALL AT LAMBEAU**

The Bears and Packers will continue their streak of playing at least one game a season in primetime, a streak which dates back to the 2006 season. The 2018 meeting at Green Bay marked the eighth consecutive season in which Bears traveled to Lambeau Field for a primetime matchup, with the 2021 season marking the 10th time in 11 years playing under the lights at Lambeau. The 2019 game in Green Bay marked the first day game for the Bears at Lambeau since 2010.

**BEARS TAKE ON NFC WEST, AFC NORTH DIVISIONS**

Chicago will square off against all four teams from the NFC West and AFC North Divisions this season in addition to the New York Giants (home), Tampa Bay Buccaneers (away) and Las Vegas Raiders (away). The Bears are 147-107-10 (.576) all-time against the NFC West and 35-24-1 (.592) against the AFC North. Chicago last faced the NFC West in 2018, winning all four against the Cardinals, Seahawks, Rams and 49ers, and the AFC North in 2017, when Chicago also won all four meetings against the Steelers, Ravens, Bengals and Browns.

## NOTING THE 2021 SCHEDULE

**BEARS PLAY HOST TO RAVENS/BENGALS, VISIT PITTSBURGH/CLEVELAND FOR FIRST TIME SINCE 2013**

Making their first regular-season trips to Soldier Field since the 2013 season are the Ravens and Bengals. The Bears will also travel to Pittsburgh and Cleveland for the first time since the 2013 season. The last time the two teams squared off at Heinz Field was in 2013, a 40-23 victory on Sunday Night Football. The Bears have won the last three meetings with the Steelers and Browns and their last two against the Ravens and Bengals.

**BACK LOADED DIVISION GAMES**

Four of Chicago's six NFC North division games will be played between Weeks 12-18. Chicago does not face a division opponent until Weeks 4 and 6 at home against Detroit and Green Bay, respectively. After Week 6, Chicago will not play a division opponent until Thanksgiving.

**FAMILIAR CLOSER**

The Bears close out the regular season with a trip to Minnesota for the sixth time in the last eight seasons. The Bears have closed out the regular season against the Vikings 12 times in club history. Previously, the Bears traveled to Minnesota to close out the regular season four straight seasons from 2016-19.

General Manager

Ryan Pace, the 2018 *Sporting News* NFL Executive of the Year, is in his seventh season as general manager of the Chicago Bears in 2021. He is the sixth general manager in franchise history after being hired on January 8, 2015.

Following the 2017 season, Pace took the organization in a different direction and sought to find the next head coach to lead the Bears into the future. On January 8, 2018, Pace hired Matt Nagy as Chicago's 16th head coach. And since his hiring, Chicago has compiled a record of 28-20, an NFC North title and two playoff appearances. A total of 14 players have been selected to the Pro Bowl over the past three seasons.

With Nagy in place, Pace used all avenues available to start bolstering a young and promising roster. He made a splash on the first day of free agency in March 2018 with the signing of wide receiver Allen Robinson II and awarding players such as defensive back Kyle Fuller and defensive lineman Eddie Goldman with multi-year extensions in 2018.

Pace and his staff kept the momentum going during 2018 NFL Draft, selecting three ESPN.com All-Rookie Team honorees in linebacker Roquan Smith (Round 1, 8th overall), offensive lineman James Daniels (Round 2, 39th overall) and defensive lineman Bilal Nichols (Round 5, 145th overall). He also traded up in the second round to draft wide receiver Anthony Miller (Round 2, 51st overall), who finished second among all rookie wide receivers with seven touchdown receptions in 2018. Smith, meanwhile, would go on to record the second-most tackles (122) by a Bears rookie. Nichols made an immediate impact, recording 3.0 sacks, while Daniels started the final 10 games at left guard.

But Pace saved his boldest move for last. With the 2018 season opener looming – 8 days away to be exact – Pace acquired All-Pro linebacker Khalil Mack in a trade with the Oakland Raiders, making him the highest paid defensive player in NFL history, and a move that turned Chicago's already top-10 defense into the league's most dominant unit that season. Mack did not disappoint, leading the Bears with 12.5 sacks and six forced fumbles as Chicago's defense led the NFL in takeaways (36), interceptions (27), fewest first downs (17.3 pg), fewest rushing yards allowed (80.0 pg) and fewest points allowed (17.7 ppg) and finished third in turnover margin (+12), points off takeaways (107) and yards per game allowed (299.7).

The Bears finished 12-4 during the 2018 regular season, going on win streaks of three, four and five games, and captured the club's first NFC North title since 2010. Nagy would go on to earn Associated Press and PFWA Coach of the Year honors while setting a record for the most wins by a first-year head coach in franchise history.

Eight players, including Mack, were named to the 2019 Pro Bowl following the season. Joining Mack were defensive backs Eddie Jackson and Fuller, defensive tackle Akiem Hicks, punt returner Tarik Cohen, quarterback Mitchell Trubisky and offensive linemen Cody Whitehair and Charles Leno Jr. Mack, Fuller, Jackson and Cohen also were named Associated Press All-Pro.

In recognition for his efforts throughout the 2018 season, Pace became the third Bears executive to win Executive of the Year honors and the first since Michael McCaskey in 1985.

In 2019, Pace signed Whitehair and Jackson to multi-year extensions, making Jackson the NFL's highest paid safety, while 2019 free agent acquisition Cordarrelle Patterson joined Jackson, Fuller and Mack as 2020 Pro Bowl selections. Patterson also was named an Associated Press All-Pro for the fourth time after leading the league in kick returns. Meanwhile, rookie running back David Montgomery finished the season with 889 rushing and 185 receiving yards to become the ninth Bears rookie to top 1,000 yards from scrimmage in their rookie season and tied for the team lead with seven total touchdowns. His 889 yards and six touchdowns on the ground were both second in the NFL behind Oakland's Josh Jacobs (1,150 yds, 7 TDs) among rookie RBs.

Pace and his staff were active once again during the 2020 offseason, first with the re-signing of linebacker Danny Trevathan, before making several key free agent acquisitions with the signing of veteran tight end Jimmy Graham and linebacker Robert Quinn and trading a compensatory fourth-round pick to the Jaguars for veteran quarterback Nick Foles. Other notable additions included offensive lineman Germain Ifo and defensive back Tashaun Gipson Sr.

With two second round picks in the 2020 draft, Pace selected two players who made immediate impacts in Notre Dame tight end Cole Kmet and cornerback Jaylon Johnson out of Utah. Chicago did not pick again until Saturday's fifth round, where they selected three players in linebacker Trevis Gipson out of Tulsa, defensive back Kindie Vildor out of Georgia Southern and

wide receiver Darnell Mooney out of Tulane. Mooney would go on to set a Bears record for most receptions by a rookie wide receiver with 61.

This past offseason, Pace revamped his quarterback room. First, he acquired veteran free agent Andy Dalton before making yet another splash a month later in the draft, trading up nine spots in the first round to select Ohio State quarterback Justin Fields with the 11th overall pick. He traded up again the next day to grab offensive lineman Teven Jenkins out of Oklahoma State on day two. In addition to Dalton, other key free agent acquisitions included running back Damien Williams, defensive back Desmond Trufant and wide receiver Marquise Goodwin.

In 2017, Pace continued his track record of drafting rookies who make an immediate impact on the team. Trubisky (No. 2 overall) set Bears rookie records for passing yards (2,193) and completions (196). Cohen became the first NFL rookie since Gale Sayers (1965) to score touchdowns via rushing, receiving, passing and punt return in a single season. He also tallied the third most receptions (53) by a Bears rookie in club history. Jackson finished the season with two interceptions and became the first player in NFL history to return both a fumble recovery and an interception for 75+ yard touchdowns in a single game in a win over the Panthers.

After a stellar rookie season in 2016, RB Jordan Howard, a fifth-round pick by Pace in 2016, became the first player in franchise history to rush for over 1,000 yards in each of his first two seasons (1,313 in 2016 & 1,122 in 2017) and also became the fastest player in Bears history to rush for 2,000 yards (24 games), besting Walter Payton's previous mark of 26. Hicks, a 2016 free agent acquisition, earned a four-year contract extension in September 2017.

In Pace's first two seasons as Bears GM, five Bears were selected to the PFJWA's All-Rookie team (Adrian Amos, Leonard Floyd, Goldman, Whitehair and Howard), tied for the most in the NFL in that time.

In his first season overseeing Chicago's roster, Pace was tasked with turning over a roster that ranked as one of the oldest in the NFL (average 27 years, 39 days old). He trimmed that average to just over 25-years old in two seasons. The Bears fielded a competitive team, improving by one game over their previous year's record, despite the youth movement. The 2015 Bears were involved in 11 games decided by one score (5-6 record in those games) despite leading the NFL with nine rookie starters (three on offense, six on defense). The Bears defense improved from 30th in 2014 (377.1 yards per game) to 14th in 2015 (345.1 ypg) despite starting a league-most six rookie starters who combined for 41 starts, second most to the Saints 44 defensive rookie starts.

Pace joined the Bears after spending 14 seasons (2001-14) as a member of the Saints organization, including 13 in the player personnel department. He spent his final two seasons (2013-14) with the Saints as director of player personnel. In that role, Pace helped manage the team's college and pro scouting operations including all facets of scouting and evaluation of college and pro prospects along with New Orleans' roster.

Pace spent six seasons as the club's director of pro scouting (2007-12), which included overseeing the club's pro scouting staff. His duties involved recommending player acquisitions by evaluating the Saints roster and potential free agents, monitoring all transactions, researching possible trade opportunities, assessing player talent from other professional leagues and directing the advance scouting of future opponents. He also helped the Saints prepare for the draft following the regular season by assisting in the evaluation of top college prospects.

The Flower Mound, Texas native got his start in New Orleans' player personnel department as a scouting assistant in 2002, a role he held for two years before working as a pro scout from 2004-06. During that time he evaluated free agents and collegiate players entering the NFL Draft as well as scouted upcoming opponents. He joined the Saints in 2001 supporting the coordination of all game day, training camp and stadium operations.

Over Pace's 13 seasons in the New Orleans personnel department (2002-14), the Saints compiled a 115-93 (.553) record. Since 2006, the Saints reached the playoffs five times, won three division titles, played in two NFC Championship games (2006 and 2009) and won the franchise's first Super Bowl title (Super Bowl XLIV). The Saints pro scouting department helped build a Super Bowl championship club by using all avenues at their disposal: signing free agents QB Drew Brees, FB Heath Evans, LB Scott Fujita, CB Randall Gay, C Jonathan Goodwin, CB Jabari Greer, WR Lance Moore and DE Anthony Hargrove and trading for TE Jeremy Shockey, LB Jonathan Vilma, LB Scott Shanle and TE David Thomas. Pace has also worked to acquire players such as NT Brodrick Bunkley, G Ben Grubbs, LBs Curtis Lofton, RB Darren Sproles. Over his last two seasons with the Saints their draft classes included regular starters LT Terron Armstead (2013, third round), WR Brandin Cooks (2014, first round), S Kenny Vaccaro (2013, first round) and WR Kenny Stills (2013, fifth round).

In 2008, he was selected by the club to attend the NFL's Stanford Business School's Executive Education Program for Managers. He was a part of the franchise in 2005 while the club dealt with immense adversity having to guide itself through several moves in base operations in the wake of Hurricane Katrina.

Pace played collegiately as a defensive end at Eastern Illinois (1995-99), serving as team captain as a senior, graduating with a bachelor's degree in marketing.

Pace and his wife, Stephanie, have a daughter, Cardyn.

## MATT NAGY (1978-2000)

Matt Nagy is in his fourth season with the Chicago Bears in 2021 after being named the 16th head coach in franchise history on January 8th, 2018.

Nagy, the 2018 *Associated Press* and PFWA Coach of the Year, has compiled a record of 28-21 in his first three-plus seasons with one division championship and two playoff appearances. Nagy also has enjoyed success within the division, going 11-7 against the NFC North, including a 10-2 mark against the Vikings and Lions. In addition, his .580 win percentage is the second highest among Bears coaches since the 1970 merger, trailing only Mike Ditka and his .631 win percentage.

The Bears finished the 2020 pandemic-stricken season 8-8 and clinched their second playoff berth in three seasons, falling to the No. 2-seed New Orleans Saints in the Wild Card round. The Bears started the season 5-1, their best start to a season since 2012, before hitting a six-game skid. Nagy and the Bears rebounded, however, and finished the season strong, winning three of their last four to clinch a playoff berth. Chicago's offense found its rhythm over the final six games, averaging 30.2 points per game, including a four-game stretch with 30-plus points for the first time since 1965.

The season saw its share of individual highlights with LB Khalil Mack and KR Cordarrelle Patterson being named to the Pro Bowl, bringing the total to 14 selections in his first three years as head coach. Wide receiver Allen Robinson II led all Bears receivers for the second straight season with 102 receptions, 1,213 yards and six touchdowns, eclipsing 100 receptions for the first time in his career. It marked the first 100-catch season by a Bears wide receiver since 2013. Running back David Montgomery tied for fifth in the NFL and ranked third in the NFC with 1,070 rushing yards and eight touchdowns. Over the last six weeks of the season, Montgomery rushed for 598 yards with seven rushing touchdowns and one receiving score. Linebacker Roquan Smith led the Bears with 139 combined tackles and finished the season as the only NFL defender to record over 100 tackles, 10 TFL and at least 2.0 sacks and two interceptions. Kicker Cairo Santos finished the season with a streak of 27 consecutive field goals made, breaking the Bears single-season and overall record for consecutive makes.

The Bears finished the 2019 season 8-8 in a year that saw Robinson become the first 1,000-yard receiver for the Bears since 2014. He finished the season with a career-high 98 receptions for 1,147 yards, becoming one of only three Bears in franchise history to haul in 95+ receptions and record over 1,100 yards in a season. He also led the team with seven TD receptions, the second most in his career. QB Mitchell Trubisky finished the season with 3,138 passing yards, marking back-to-back 3,000-yard seasons, a feat accomplished just twice before in franchise history.

The Bears also were a force on the defensive side of the ball once again under Nagy and first-year defensive coordinator Chuck Pagano, allowing 18.6 points per game, the fewest in the NFC and No. 4 overall in the NFL.

Four players were named to the Pro Bowl following the season in Mack, DB Eddie Jackson, Patterson and DB Kyle Fuller.

Nagy orchestrated a remarkable turnaround for the Bears in his first year in 2018, taking a 5-11 team in 2017 and transforming them into NFC North champions, capturing AP and PFWA Coach of the Year honors for his efforts. The Bears, who won nine of their last 10 that season, finished the regular season 12-4, the most wins since the 2006 NFC Championship season (13-3), and the most by a Bears head coach in their inaugural season in franchise history. In doing so, Chicago secured the NFC's No. 3 seed and hosted a playoff game for the first time since the 2010 NFC Championship game.

The Bears finished 5-1 vs. the NFC North in 2018, their best mark in division play since 2010, sweeping both the Lions and the Vikings, and finished the regular season 7-1 at home, their best home record since 2005. The Bears averaged 26.3 points per game, fourth-best in the NFC. They scored 24 or more points 11 times, the most since 1995 and were the only team to hold a second-half lead in every regular-season game in 2018.

On the defensive side of the ball, the Bears ranked No. 1 in the NFL in takeaways (36), interceptions (27), INT returns for touchdowns (5), three-and-out percentage (.268), fewest first downs allowed (278/17.3 pg), fewest rushing yards allowed (80.0 pg) and fewest points allowed (17.7 ppg).

Eight players (Mack, Jackson, Fuller, Akiem Hicks, Tarik Cohen, Trubisky, Cody Whitehair and Charles Leno Jr.) were named to the 2019 Pro Bowl following the season while four (Mack, Jackson, Fuller, Cohen) also earned All-Pro honors.

In 2017, Nagy completed his fifth and final season in Kansas City and his first as offensive coordinator. He was promoted to OC following the 2016 season after serving as co-offensive coordinator with Brad Childress. Prior to that, Nagy spent three seasons as the Chiefs QBs coach.

In his first season as offensive coordinator in 2017, Nagy guided a Chiefs offense that ranked No. 5 in the NFL in total offense with 375.4 yards per game en route to a 10-6 record and an AFC West Division title. The Chiefs also finished sixth in the NFL in points per game (25.9), seventh in passing (256.5), ninth in rushing (118.9) and led the NFL with the fewest giveaways (8). The Chiefs also were one of the most explosive offenses in 2017, tying for fifth in the NFL with 69 plays from scrimmage of 20+ yards.

Quarterback Alex Smith finished the 2017 regular season fourth in the AFC in passing with 4,042 yards to go along with 26 touchdowns – both career highs – and only five interceptions. Also under Nagy's tutelage, rookie running back Kareem Hunt led the NFL in rushing with 1,327 yards and eight touchdowns and tied for first in the NFL with 12 rushes of 20 or more yards,

earning Pro Bowl honors in the process. Travis Kelce also earned Pro Bowl honors, leading all NFL tight ends with 83 receptions and finishing second among tight ends with 1,038 yards and eight touchdowns. Nine of his 83 grabs went for at least 25 yards, second most in the league behind only New England's Rob Gronkowski (11). Additionally, wide receiver Tyreek Hill ranked seventh in the NFL with 1,183 yards to go along with seven touchdowns and tied for third with 15 receptions of 25 or more yards – trailing only Pittsburgh's Antonio Brown (16) and Houston's DeAndre Hopkins (17).

In his five seasons with the Chiefs, Nagy worked closely with Smith, who owned a 65.1 completion percentage in the five seasons working with Nagy, ranking first among all Chiefs QBs with at least 700 passing attempts.

In 2016, Nagy helped the Chiefs to a 12-4 regular-season record, the club's first AFC West title since 2010, the No. 2 overall seed in the AFC and a first-round bye. Overall, Nagy helped the Chiefs to the postseason four times in his five seasons with the club.

In his first year with the Chiefs, Nagy worked with Smith in a season that brought him five 100.0-plus quarterback ratings, one of which was a perfect rating of 158.3 at Oakland. Focusing on ball protection, he coached Smith to an AFC-low seven interceptions with a minimum of 300 attempts and a 1.4 interception percentage, also the lowest in the AFC. Smith also earned his first Pro Bowl selection following his first season with the Chiefs in 2013.

Before joining the Chiefs coaching staff, Nagy spent three years on the offensive staff of the Philadelphia Eagles, serving two seasons as the franchise's offensive quality control coach (2011-12). He was promoted to that role after he served as a coaching assistant during the 2010 campaign. His initial experience with the Eagles came in 2008 and 2009 when he served as a coaching intern during Eagles training camp.

A former quarterback for the Arena Football League, Nagy played six seasons for the New York Dragons (2002), Carolina Cobras (2004), Georgia Force (2005-06) and Columbus Destroyers (2007-08). During his career, Nagy completed 65.5 percent of his passes for 18,866 yards, 374 touchdowns and a quarterback rating of 115.1.

Nagy played collegiately at Delaware, setting more than 20 career passing records at the time, including career marks for passing yards (8,214) and touchdowns (58). He ranks second for most career attempts (895) and most career completions (502) behind former Delaware star Joe Flacco. Nagy earned All-America honors as a senior for the Blue Hens after setting single-season records in attempts (379), yards (3,436) and touchdowns (29).

After graduating from Delaware with a degree in health and physical education, Nagy gained coaching experience at several local high schools, as he served as an assistant coach at Manheim Central (2001), the quarterbacks coach at Cedar Crest (2002-03) and the offensive coordinator at Palmyra Area High School (2008-09).

He and his wife, Stacey, have four sons: Brayden, Tate, Jaxon and Jett.
