NOTABLE STORYLINES AND GAME INFORMATION

- The Browns (4-4) meet a second consecutive AFC North foe in the Cincinnati Bengals (5-3) this Sunday at Paul Brown Stadium, following a 15-10 loss to the Pittsburgh Steelers last week. Week 9 will be the 96th matchup between the two teams, with the Bengals leading the all-time series 51-44. Last season, however, the Browns swept the season series with the Bengals and have won five of the last six outings.

- QB Baker Mayfield returned to action last week after missing the previous game with a shoulder injury. In his career, Mayfield owns a 5-1 record against the Bengals and has completed 107 of 165 passes (64.8 percent) for 1,529 yards with 17 touchdowns and a 111.4 rating. Last season, he completed 38 of his 51 passes (74.5 percent) for 516 yards with seven touchdowns, two interceptions and a 129.6 rating in two wins against Cincinnati.

- The Browns own one of the league's top rushing attacks in 2021. The unit ranks first in the NFL in several categories, including rushing yards (1,289), rushing touchdowns (14), rushing average (5.16) and rushing first downs (74). Despite missing two games, RB Nick Chubb ranks third in the NFL with 584 rushing yards, while RB D'Ernest Johnson has added a rushing touchdown in each of the past two games.

- The 3,060 total net yards produced on offense through Week 8 are the second most by any Browns team in history, behind the 1981 team that put up 3,208.

- DE Myles Garrett is leading the NFL with 10.5 sacks this season. He has recorded at least one full sack in each of the past four games. He is the only Browns player to produce two seasons with at least double-digit sack totals and he has done it in each of the past four seasons. The Browns defense is leading the AFC (third in NFL) in sacks with 22.

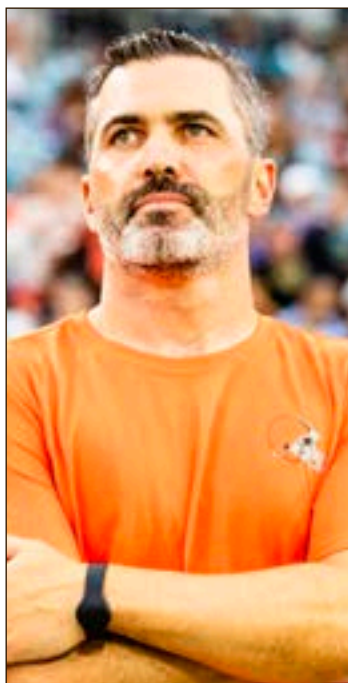

STEFANSKI

KEVIN STEFANSKI: 15-9, SECOND SEASON AS A HEAD COACH. SECOND WITH THE BROWNS. On January 13, 2020, the Cleveland Browns announced the hiring of Kevin Stefanski as the 18th full-time head coach in franchise history. In his first season with the Browns, he led the club to their first playoff appearance since 2002 and first playoff victory in 26 years, earning him AP Coach of the Year. The 38-year old spent 14 seasons in various roles with the Minnesota Vikings prior to Cleveland. Stefanski joined the Vikings in 2006 as an assistant to the head coach and elevated up the coaching ladder, serving as assistant quarterbacks coach (2009-13), tight ends (2014-15) and lone season (2016) coaching running backs. From 2017-18, he coached the quarterbacks and added the role of interim offensive coordinator for the final three games in 2018 before being named the team's offensive coordinator in 2019. Stefanski played defensive back at University of Pennsylvania.

ZAC TAYLOR: 11-28-1, 3RD SEASON AS A HEAD COACH, 3RD WITH THE BENGALS. Zac Taylor was appointed the 10th head coach of the Cincinnati Bengals franchise on February 4, 2019. He began his NFL coaching career with the Miami Dolphins serving as QBs coach and offensive coordinator from 2012-15. A one-season stint as offensive coordinator and QB coach for the University of Cincinnati in 2016 before returning to the NFL in 2017, Taylor spent time in Los Angeles part of the Rams organization in 2017 (asst. WR) and 2018 (QB coach). Taylor played football at the collegiate level at Wake Forest (2002-03), Butler Community College (2004) and the University of Nebraska (2005-2006).

OFFENSIVE STARTERS

WR JARVIS LANDRY Eighth year-vet registered five receptions for 65 yards Week 8 vs. Pit...Returned to play Week 7 vs. Den after being on injured reserve Weeks 3-6...Five-time Pro Bowl selection (2015-19)...Only player in NFL history with at least 70 catches in each of his first seven NFL seasons...His 652 career receptions place him with DeAndre Hopkins (730), Julio Jones (691), Travis Kelce (657), and Antonio Brown (654) as the only five players to have 650-plus catches since 2014.

LT JEDRICK WILLS JR. Part of Browns offensive line that has helped the Browns' rank first in the league with 14 rushing touchdowns...Inactive (ankle) Weeks 5-6...Second-year player out of Alabama...Named to PFWA's 2020 NFL All-Rookie team.

LG JOEL BITONIO Started 100th career game Week 5 at LAC...Earned third consecutive Pro Bowl nod last season and became the first Browns guard named to three consecutive Pro Bowls since Hall of Famer Gene Hickerson (1966-71)...Longest-tenured Brown has not missed an offensive snap since the start of the 2017 season...Started all 103 games appeared in since being drafted by the Browns in the second round (35th overall) of the 2014 NFL Draft.

C JC TRETTER Has played 100% of offensive snaps since joining the Browns in 2017...Part of an offensive line that contributed to the team's NFL-best 1,289 rushing yards this season...Voted NFLPA President in 2020.

RG WYATT TELLER Earned second-team All-Pro honors in 2020...Part of offensive line that blocks for league's best 14 rushing touchdowns this season and tied for second since 2020 with 35...Fifth-round pick by the Buffalo Bills in 2018 and was traded to Cleveland prior to the start of the 2019 season.

RT JACK CONKLIN Returned from knee injury Weeks 6-7 in Week 8 matchup vs. Pit...Inactive (knee) Weeks 6-7...Sixth-year pro started first five games this season at RT...Awarded first team Associated All-Pro honors in 2016 and 2020...Helped block for RBs Nick Chubb and Kareem Hunt rush for over 100 yards in 19 games dating back to the 2020 season.

TE AUSTIN HOOPER Converted a two-point conversion Week 5 at LAC...Recorded his first touchdown reception of the season Week 3 vs. Chi...Started every game at TE this season...Two-time Pro Bowl selection (2018-19)...Third-round pick by Atlanta in 2016...Joined the Browns as an unrestricted free agent in 2020.

WR ODELL BECKHAM JR. Tied for game-high five receptions Week 6 vs. Ari, adding 79 yards...Inactive (knee) first two games of the season...Eighth-year vet has eclipsed 1,000 receiving yards in five of his seven seasons, only missing the mark in 2017 and 2020 when injuries limited him to four (2017) and seven games (2020)...Three-time Pro Bowler from 2014-16.

QB BAKER MAYFIELD Threw for 225 yards on 20-of-31 passing vs. Pit after being inactive (shoulder) Week 7 vs. Den...His 81 touchdown passes are fifth on the team's all-time list and sixth most by a No. 1 overall pick in their first four seasons...First-overall pick by the Browns in the 2018 NFL Draft.

RB NICK CHUBB Led team in rushing efforts with 16 attempts for 61 yards vs. Pit after being inactive (calf) Weeks 6-7...Third in NFL with 584 rushing yards...Earned back-to-back Pro Bowl nods (2019-20)...PFWA All-AFC teams 2019-20...Second-round pick in 2018 and signed three-year contract extension in 2021.

FB JOHNNY STANTON IV Scored first career receiving touchdown on second-ever catch Week 7 vs. Den...Played in four games since joining the Browns in 2020...Spent time on the practice squads in Minnesota (2019) and Cleveland (2020-21)...Originally signed by Minnesota as an undrafted free agent in 2018.

TE HARRISON BRYANT Started Week 3 vs. Chi and Week 5 at LAC this season...Named to PFWA's 2020 NFL All-Rookie team...Nine catches for 117 yards this season...Led all NFL rookie tight ends with three receiving touchdowns last season...Fourth-round selection (115th overall) by the Browns in the 2020 NFL Draft.

G MICHAEL DUNN Inactive (coach's decision) Weeks 3-4...Played on special teams vs. Hou after being inactive (back) Week 1 at KC...Started first-ever NFL contest in AFC Wild Card against Pit...Spent nine weeks on the Jacksonville Jaguars' practice squad in 2018.

RB DEMETRIC FELTON Carried the ball for the first time in career and finished Week 7 vs. Den with two rushes for 13 yards and three receptions for 13 yards...Recorded 103 punt return yards Week 3 vs. Chi, the most by a Brown since Sept. 20, 2015...Scored first NFL touchdown on first NFL reception Week 2 vs. Hou...Appeared in all eight games this season...Drafted by the Browns in the sixth round (211th overall) of the 2021 NFL Draft.

G HJALTE FROHOLDT Inactive (coach's decision) Weeks 7-8...Appeared in first game as a Brown Week 5 at LAC and played on special teams...Signed off the Houston Texans' practice squad during Week 5...Originally a fourth-round draft pick by the Patriots in 2019.

G BLAKE HANCE Started at RT Week 7 vs. Den...Started at LT Weeks 5-6...Filled in for LT Jedrick Wills Jr. on multiple occasions Weeks 2-3...First-year player spent Weeks 1-16 on the Jets' practice squad prior to joining the Browns during Week 17 last season...Made NFL debut in AFC Wild Card game against Pit...Spent the entire 2019 season on the Jacksonville Jaguars' practice squad.

WR RASHARD HIGGINS Started at WR Week 8 vs. Pit...Sixth-year vet scored his first touchdown of the season Week 5 at LAC...Appeared in all eight games this season...One of the Browns' longest tenured players...Appeared in 75 games with 13 starts since entering the league as a fifth round (172nd overall) selection by the Browns in 2016.

T JAMES HUDSON III Started at RT Week 6 vs. Ari...Filled in for LT Jedrick Wills Jr. Week 4 at Min and RT Week 5 at LAC after Jack Conklin injured his knee...Spent all of his playing time on special teams Weeks 2-3...Inactive (coach's decision) Week 1 at KC...Fourth-round (110th overall) selection by the Browns in the 2021 NFL Draft.

RB D'ERNEST JOHNSON Scored second career rushing touchdown Week 8 vs. Pit...Started first NFL game Week 7 vs. Den and scored first NFL touchdown, also rushing for a career-high 146 yards on 22 carries...Appeared in every game this season...Played in all 16 contests last season and averaged 25.1 yards as the team's primary kick returner.

QB CASE KEENUM Started his first game since Dec. 29, 2019 in Week 7 matchup vs. Den and completed 21-of-33 passes (63.6%) for 199 yards and a touchdown without an interception for a rating of 90.3...Saw action Week 6 vs. Ari and completed a pass for six yards...Ninth-year pro has appeared in 72 regular season games (63 starts) and two postseason games (both starts)...Came to the Browns as an unrestricted free agent in 2020.

RB JOHN KELLY Spent offseason, training camp and preseason with Cleveland...Member of Browns' practice squad Weeks 1-6...Signed to Cleveland's active roster prior to Week 7...Saw action on offense and special teams Weeks 3 and 7-8...Originally drafted by the Los Angeles Rams in the sixth round (176th overall) of the 2018 NFL Draft...Came to Cleveland as a practice squad member in 2020.

TE DAVID NJOKU Leads team in receiving yards with 323...Collected a career-high 149 receiving yards Week 5 at LAC...Originally a first-round (29th overall) pick by the Browns in the 2017 NFL Draft.

WR DONOVAN PEOPLES-JONES Inactive (groin) Week 8 vs. Pit...Did not play Week 7 vs. Den after injuring groin during pregame warm-ups...Second-year wide receiver garnered career highs in receiving yards (101), and touchdowns (two) on four receptions Week 6 vs. Ari...Appeared in 18 games in two seasons with the Browns...Sixth-round (187th overall) selection by the Browns in the 2020 NFL Draft.

WR ANTHONY SCHWARTZ Made NFL debut and recorded his first career reception on first NFL target Week 1 at KC...Finished at KC with three catches for 69 yards, and his 60 yards in the first quarter was the most by a Browns rookie in the first quarter of a game...Selected by the Browns in the third round (91st overall) of the 2021 NFL Draft.

DEFENSIVE STARTERS

DE MYLES GARRETT NFL leader in sacks with 10.5...His 53.0 career sacks are second most sacks in franchise history...Two-time Pro Bowler's 22.5 sacks in the month of October are the most sacks by a player in October since 2017...2020 Browns Walter Payton Man of the Year is lone Brown with multiple double-digit sack seasons, reaching the mark in each of the past four seasons...Named to the 2020 PFWA All-NFL team and Sporting News 2020 All-Pro Team selection.

DT MALIK JACKSON 10-year vet tallied his first sack (half-sack) of the season Week 3 vs. Chi...17 tackles, a half-sack, and three pass breakups (tied for third on team) this season...Signed to the Browns this offseason after spending the previous two seasons with the Eagles...2018 Pro Bowler.

DT MALIK MCDOWELL Collected second-career sack Week 8 vs. Pit...Started the past seven games and tallied 15 tackles with two sacks and a fumble recovery this season...First-year player signed to the Browns in May...Selected by the Seattle Seahawks in the second round (35th overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft.

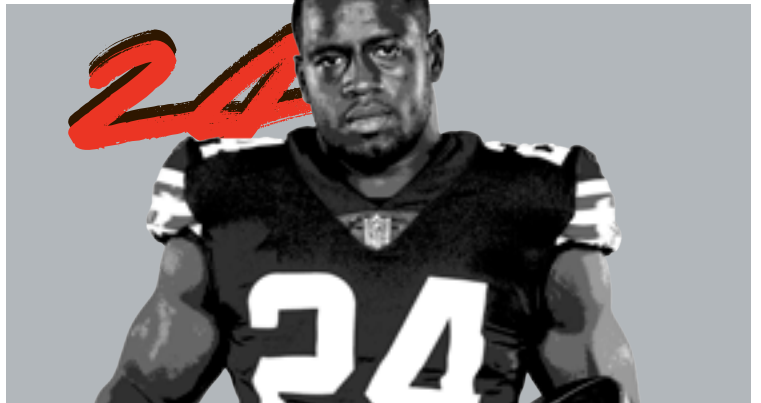

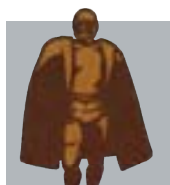

A LOOK AT THE 2021 CLEVELAND BROWNS

- The Browns' 161.1 rushing yards per game are **first in the NFL through the eighth week of the season** and their 152.6 average in the same category is **third in the league since 2020**.
- The team has a 5.16 rushing average entering Week 9, **the best mark in the NFL**. Since 2020, the Browns have a 4.92 average, **fourth in the league**.
- The team is **first in rushing yards (1,289) in 2021 and third (3,663) since last year**.
- The Browns are **first in the NFL with 74 rushing first downs and third (207) since last year**.
- **The Browns' 32.0 first-down percentage is seventh in the NFL in 2021**, while their 32.2 percentage in the same category since last year is ninth.
- The Browns have **rushed for 100 yards or more in 19 games** since last season, tied for second in the NFL, and in six games in 2021, also tied for second. The team is **14-5** in those games since last year.
- The Browns have posted the **most rushing touchdowns in the NFL this season with 14** and are third since 2020 (35). The 14 rushing touchdowns are also sixth in team history through eight weeks and are tied for the third most by any NFL team in the first eight weeks of a season since 2000 (seven teams).
- The Browns have rushed for at least 150 yards in six games this season, **tied for the third-most games in franchise history through eight games**.
- The team's 183 points scored are **the seventh most by a Browns team through the first eight weeks of a season since the merger**.
- The Browns' 3,060 total net yards are **the second most by a Browns team through the first eight weeks of a season in club history**.
- The Browns have scored at least 10 points in each of their last 16 games **the sixth-longest streak by the team since the merger**.
- With an average of 382.5 total net yards per game, **the 2021 Browns rank first in the category in team history**.
- The Browns' 3,193 scrimmage yards are **the second most by the team in the first eight weeks of a season in club history** (3,320 in 1981).
- The 2021 Browns rushing attack **has the NFL lead with 41 rushes for at least 10 yards**.
- The Browns are **third in the NFL in sacks (first in AFC)** this season (22).

- The Browns rank third in the NFL, allowing 84.8 rushing yards per game and sixth with 678 rushing yards allowed. The 678 rushing yards allowed are the **second fewest allowed by the team in the first eight games of a season** (674 in 2017).
- The **Browns special teams are second in the NFL** in punt return yards this season with 214, **tied for first (Detroit) in the NFL** in opponent average start on kickoff (22.3) and **is tied for second in the league** with 10 tackles inside the 20 on kickoffs.
- The Browns have posted **222 rushes for 10-plus yards and 60 rushes for 20-plus yards** since 2018, third and second in the NFL, respectively. Additionally, the team's 31 carries for 20-plus yards and 115 for 10-plus yards since last season are second and first, respectively, in the NFL. The Browns also registered 10 rushing attempts for 50-plus yards since 2018 (tied for second) and four since last year (tied for first).
- The Browns offense has combined for a 4.81 rushing average since 2018, **the third-highest average in the NFL**. The unit has also posted 7,457 rushing yards, fourth in that span.
- The Browns have proven to be hard to take down since 2019, posting 3,998 rushing yards after contact since that time (third in the NFL). **Since last year, the team ranks second** in the category with 2,580. The Browns are first in 2021 (961).
- The 2020-21 Browns offensive line places **tied for third (Buffalo) in average time to throw (2.97)** in the NFL since last season.



DE **Myles Garrett** continued to reach the quarterback in Week 8, contributing a sack and **upping his league-leading season total to 10.5. His 10.5 sacks on the year broke his franchise record for most sacks in the first eight games of a season set in 2019 (10).** Garrett also reached 53 career sacks in the game, the **second most in team history** and only trailing Clay Matthews (62) in team annals. In Week 6, Garrett collected his 50th (50.5) career sack. Only Reggie White (40) and Derrick Thomas (54) have reached the milestone faster than Garrett, who did it in his 57th game. His Week 3 outing this season was a record-setting day, posting a career-high 4.5 sacks, a new single-game Browns record. His 4.5 sacks surpassed Andra Davis' four, a record that stood since 2003. **His 53 career sacks are the most by an active player in his first 59 career games** and the third most in NFL history in the category, behind Hall of Famers Reggie White (70) and Derrick Thomas (55). Additionally, he's posted the second-most sacks by a No. 1 overall pick in his first five years, behind Bruce Smith (57.5). His total is also tied for fifth (Khalil Mack) among all active first-round picks in the same span. Garrett is **currently the only player in the NFL to have an active streak of four consecutive seasons with double-digit sacks and he is the only player in Browns history to accomplish the feat.**

THE GARRETT FILE

Garrett has 22.5 sacks in October since he was drafted in 2017 and 18.5 since 2018, first and second in the NFL, respectively. His 15 sacks in October since 2019 are the most in the NFL, as are his 11 since 2020. His six last year tied his total from Sept. 2019 for the most by a Brown in any given month in history. His six sacks also tied for fifth among all active players in the month of October in history.

Since entering the league in 2017, Garrett is fourth in the NFL with 53 sacks (second in the AFC), despite playing in the least amount of games than any other player in the top five (59 with Chandler Jones).

- His nine career strip-sacks are the most by a Brown since 2000.

- Tied for the fourth-most games with more than one sack in the NFL since 2017 (13).

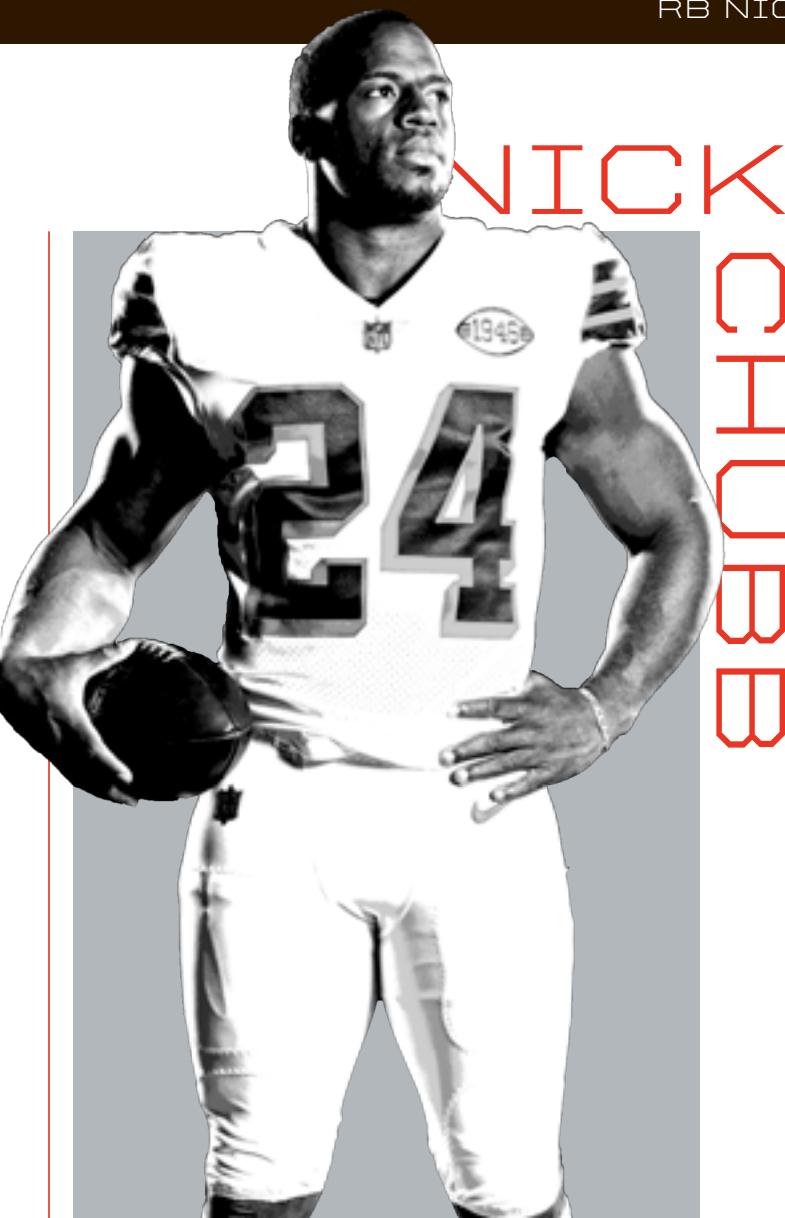

RB **Nick Chubb** is currently **third in the NFL with 584 rushing yards, despite missing last two contests.** Additionally, his 5.51 rushing average (fifth), 28 rushing first downs (tied for sixth), 17 rushes for 10-plus yards (tied for third) and six rushes for 20-plus yards (first) all rank in the top 10 in the NFL. **Chubb is already second on the club's all-time rushing list among Browns in their first four years with 4,141 rushing yards, as well as second in the same category with 32 rushing touchdowns.** He's also sixth on the Browns all-time rushing yards list, as well as on the rushing scores list. Chubb signed a three-year contract extension with the team in August.

HUNDO

Chubb has 19 100-yard rushing games in his career, second in the NFL since 2018 and are the most by a player in his first four seasons since that time. His 19 games are also the third most by an active player in his first 50 career games and the Browns are 14-5 when Chubb rushes for 100 yards. The 19 games are also the third most by a Brown in his career. Chubb has the third-most games since 2018 with 100 rushing yards and a touchdown (12) and passed Mike Pruitt for sole possession of third on the Browns' all-time list in the same category in 2021.

50 FEAT

Chubb has reached 50 rushing yards in 39 games since he was drafted in 2018, the second most by a Brown in his first four years, only behind Jim Brown (41). The 39 games are also the most among all Browns in their first 50 games.

BIG-PLAY BACK

Chubb ranks first by a Brown since 1991 in carries for 10-plus yards with 118 and has the most carries for 20-plus yards (40) and 50-plus yards (eight) in the same timeframe. Since entering the league in 2018, Chubb ranks third in the NFL with 117 rushes for 10-plus yards, first with 40 rushes for 20-plus yards and tied for second with eight rushes for 50-plus yards.

ANYTHING BUT AVERAGE

Chubb's career rushing average (5.27) through his first four years is tops in Browns history (min. 750 attempts). It's also the second highest since 2018 (Lamar Jackson, 6.07) and is the highest among all running backs (min. 300 attempts).



QB **Baker Mayfield** returned to action last week, completing 20 passes for 225 yards. His 20 completions (1,068) passed Jeff Garcia (1,049) and Brett Favre (1,067) for 22nd on the list of most completions by a player in their first 53 games. Mayfield has 81 career touchdowns throws and surpassed Matthew Stafford and Drew Bledsoe (80) for sixth most by a No. 1 overall pick in their first four years in Week 6. He also ranks **fifth in Browns history in career passing touchdowns and is currently eighth in the NFL with 8.33 yards per attempt.**

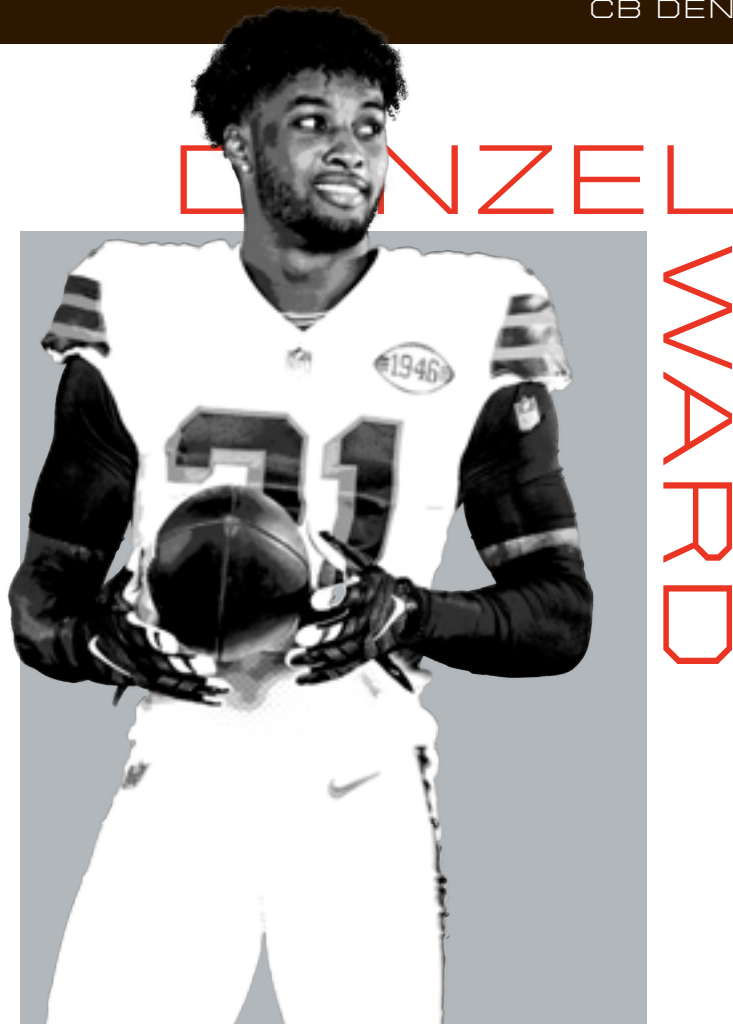
Mayfield's career passer rating of 89.9 is the highest in team history, while his passing yards (12,814) place fifth, his completions (1,068) place third and his touchdowns (81) place fifth. His completions are already a team record by a quarterback in his fourth year or younger, as well as his passing yards. His passing touchdowns total place second behind Otto Graham (86).

SEASON STREAKS

Mayfield threw at least 20 touchdown passes in each of his first three seasons, the first Brown to do so. He was also the second Brown to reach the streak and the first since Brian Sipe's streak of three seasons from 1978-80. He tossed at least 3,500 passing yards for the third consecutive year in 2020, the first Brown to record the streak since Sipe from 1979-81 and just the second Brown ever. Mayfield was the first Brown to start his career with three straight seasons of 3,500 passing yards. Additionally, Mayfield threw 300 passing completions for the third consecutive year last year, the first Brown ever to record the streak. He was the first Brown to start his career with three straight seasons of 300 passing completions.

KEEP AWAY

Mayfield didn't throw an interception in five games from Games 8-12 last year, a new career high and tied for the second-longest streak by a Brown since 1970 (first time Vinny Testaverde in 1995). It was also tied for the second-longest streak in the league last year. The Browns were 4-1 in those games and the Browns were 7-2 last year when Mayfield didn't throw an interception. The team is also 15-4 all time in such games. His nine games without throwing an interception last year were a single-season career high. He also didn't throw an interception for 187 consecutive passing attempts last year, spanning seven games. The Browns were 5-2 during that stretch and it was the fourth-longest streak in franchise history.



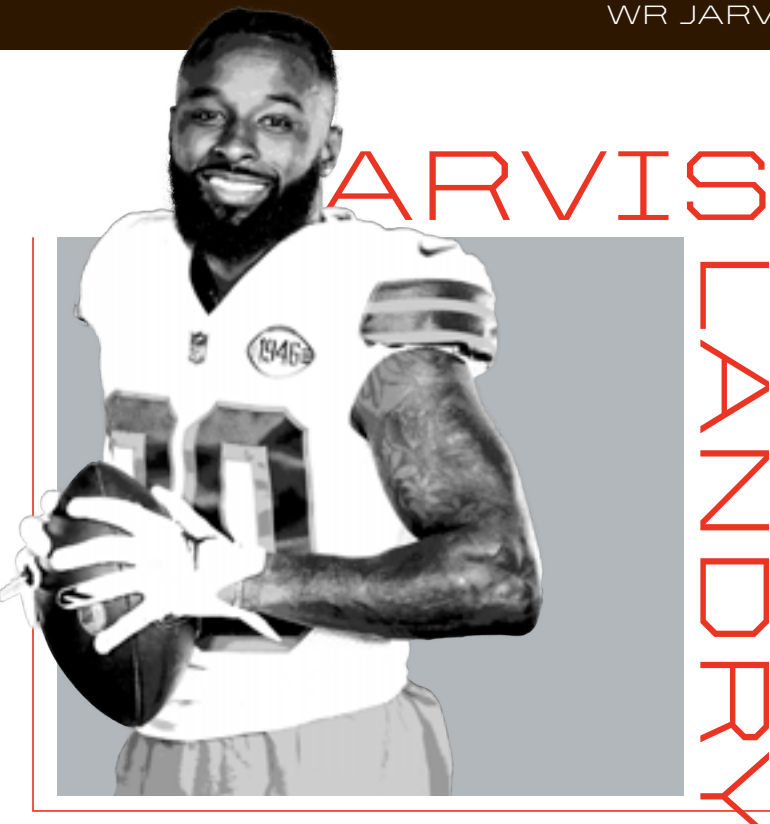
CB **Denzel Ward** is ranked **tied for seventh in the NFL in passes defended since last season (21)**. He was the only player in the NFL last year to have three or more passes defended in three games and is tied for second in the NFL with five games of three-plus pass breakups since 2018. He became the first Brown in his third year or younger to post at least three passes defended in three or more games since Joe Haden in 2011. His five career games with three passes defended rank tied for third in team history and the Browns are 4-0-1 in those contests. His six career games with at least a pair of pass breakups and an interception are **tied for third in team history and are tied for the second most in the NFL since 2018**. Ward finished last year tied for second in the NFL with 18 passes defended, despite only playing in 12 games. He became the first player since 2000 to tally at least 18 pass breakups in as few as 12 games in a single season.



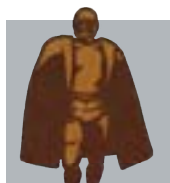

- Ward became the **first Brown since Joe Schobert in Week 12 of 2019** to have at least four passes defended and an interception in a game in Week 11 last year.
- Ward posted five games with multiple passes defended last year, **the first time that's been done by a Brown since Buster Skrine (five) and Joe Haden (seven) in 2014**.

ONLY 22 OTHER PLAYERS SINCE 1970 HAVE HAD SUCH A STREAK IN THEIR FIRST THREE YEARS. WARD IS ALSO THE THIRD BROWN IN THE SAME CATEGORY TO ACCOMPLISH THE FEAT, JOINING JOE HADEN AND ERIC WRIGHT. OVERALL, WARD IS THE FOURTH BROWN TO HOLD THE STREAK.



WR **Jarvis Landry** led the team in receptions and receiving yards last week with five catches for 65 yards. Prior to being placed on IR following week 2, his **coveted streak of games with at least a pair of receptions came to an end**, reaching 111 consecutive games. Landry had one catch before he exited the game with a knee injury in the first quarter and did not return. The streak ended as the fourth-longest of its kind in NFL history. **Landry is the first player in history to have at least 70 catches in each of his first seven seasons.** Additionally, Landry has registered at least 70 receptions, 750 receiving yards and three touchdowns every year he's been in the league (seven), **tied for the eighth-longest streak in history and tied with DeAndre Hopkins for the longest active streak.** The streak has only been reached 12 other times in history and is the first time a player has done it in each of his first seven seasons.



CATCHING ON

Landry ranks ninth in NFL history for most receptions in a player's first 115 career games (652) and sixth in a player's first 100 games (581).

A RECORD YEAR

In Week 15 last year, Landry started his 100th career game and caught his 587th pass as a starter, the ninth-most receptions by a player in his first 100 starts since 1948. His 587 receptions tied for second with Brandon Marshall, trailing Marvin Harrison (598), in the same category in the first seven years of a player's career. His total is fourth since 2014 in the first 100 starts of a player's career, behind Julio Jones (668), DeAndre Hopkins (627) and Antonio Brown (589).

After throwing a touchdown pass in Week 4 and rushing for a touchdown in Week 17 last year, he became the first Brown with a rushing, receiving and passing touchdown in a season since Eric Metcalf in 1989 (10th time in franchise history).

Finished his seventh NFL season with 636 career receptions, the second most by a player in his first seven years in history. He also became just the fourth player in NFL history to reach 630 career receptions in his first seven seasons and the first player since he was drafted in 2014 to hit the mark.

TWO AT A TIME

Since Week 2 of his rookie season in 2014 until Week 2 this year, Landry caught at least two passes in 111 consecutive games. His streak was the best in the NFL since 2014 and was the second longest that's active.

With 652 career receptions, Landry is one of just five players to have 650-plus catches since 2014, including DeAndre Hopkins (730), Julio Jones (691), Antonio Brown (654) and Travis Kelce (661).

Since the 1970 merger, Landry is the only player to have at least 370 receiving first downs (374) and 15 rushing first downs (16).

Landry's 3,344 career yards after catch rank second since he entered the league (Travis Kelce, 3,978).

In his 100th career game in Week 4 last year, Landry tossed his first career touchdown pass, a 37-yard pass to WR Odell Beckham Jr. He has 146 passing yards since 2014, first in the NFL by a WR since that time. It was the first touchdown pass by a Browns WR since Mohamed Massaquoi in Week 16 of 2010 and the longest passing touchdown by a Browns WR in history. He's completed all four of his passes last year, becoming the first NFL wide receiver to complete four passes in a season since Terrelle Pryor in 2016 and the first receiver to complete at least four passes and have a perfect completion percentage in NFL history.

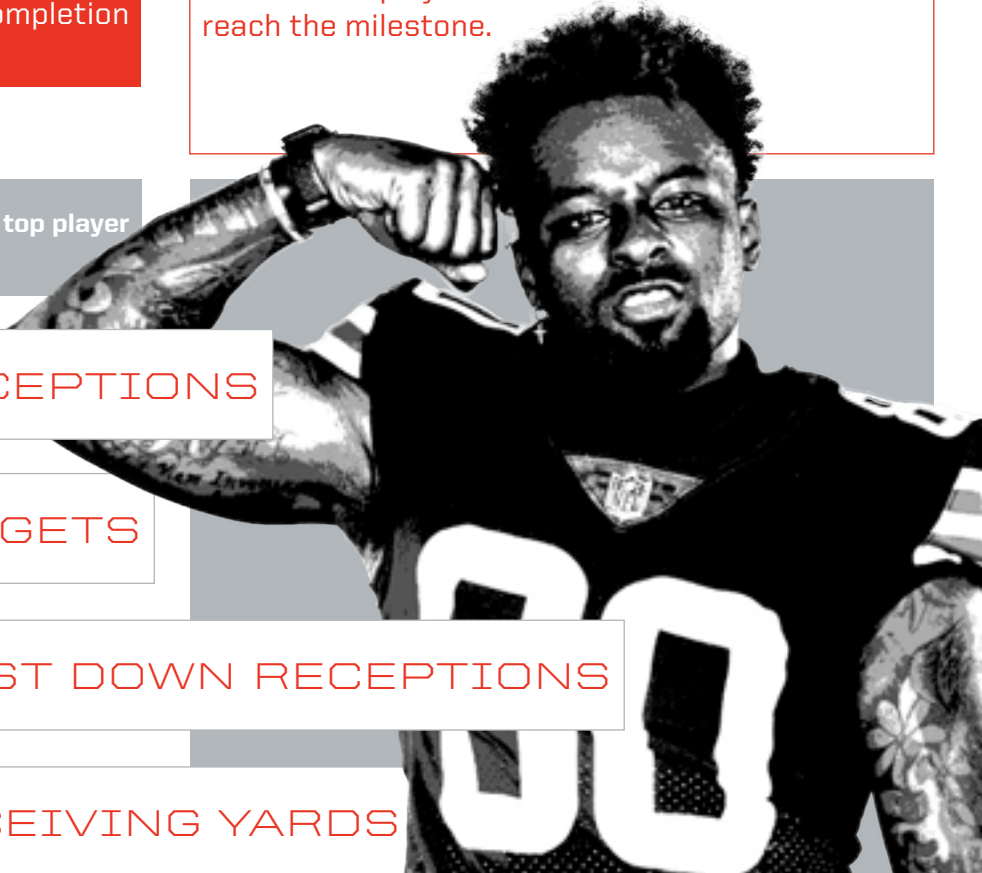

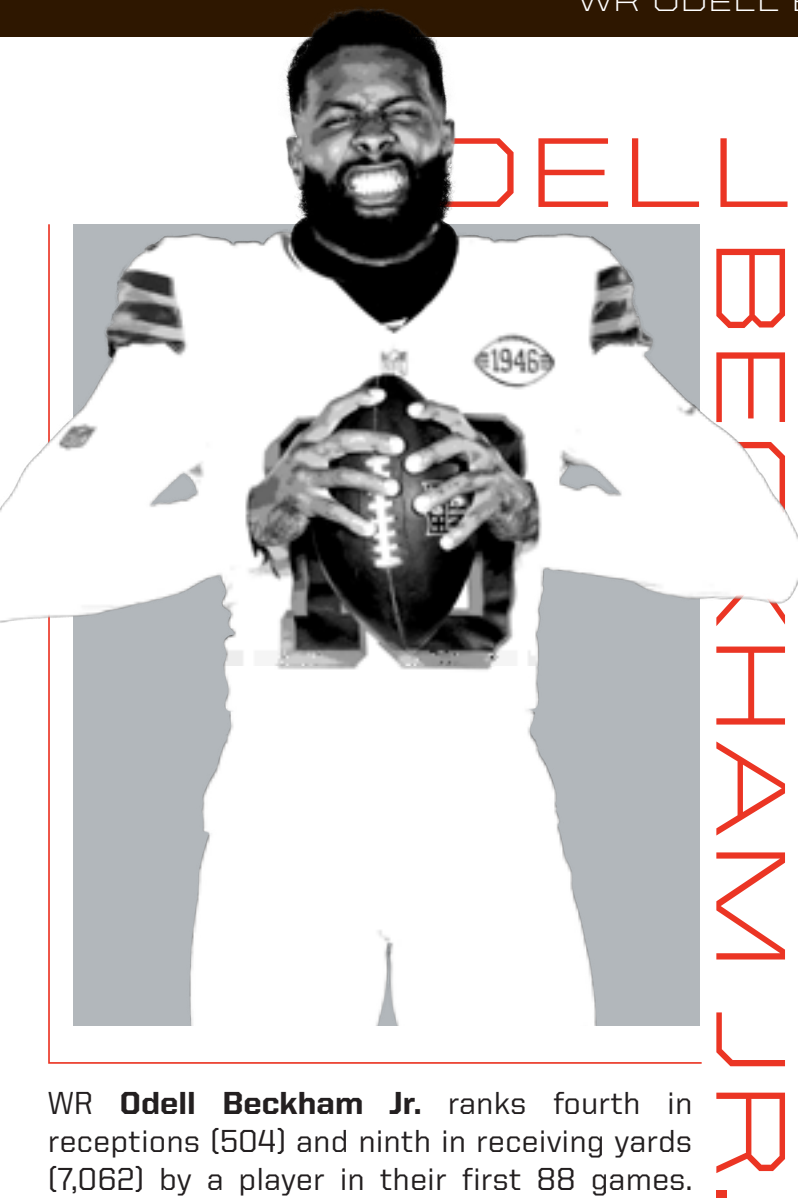

Landry reached 7,000 career receiving yards (7,145) last year, just the 30th player to reach the mark in his first seven seasons in NFL history and became the seventh player since he was drafted in 2014 to reach the milestone.





WR **Odell Beckham Jr.** ranks fourth in receptions (504) and ninth in receiving yards (7,062) by a player in their first 88 games. Prior to his injury last season, he had the third-longest active streak of consecutive games with two-plus receptions (81) in the league. In Week 5, he played in his 80th career game and caught five passes for 58 yards, **passing Torry Holt for the second-most receiving yards by a player in his first 80 career games in NFL history (6,805).** He also eclipsed Keenan Allen for the third-most receptions by a player in his first 80 career games in NFL history (485). Despite playing in just 88 career games, Beckham Jr. is still **10th in the NFL in receiving yards and seventh in receiving touchdowns (51) since being drafted in 2014.** He's also fourth in the NFL since that time in seasons with at least 1,000 receiving yards (five).

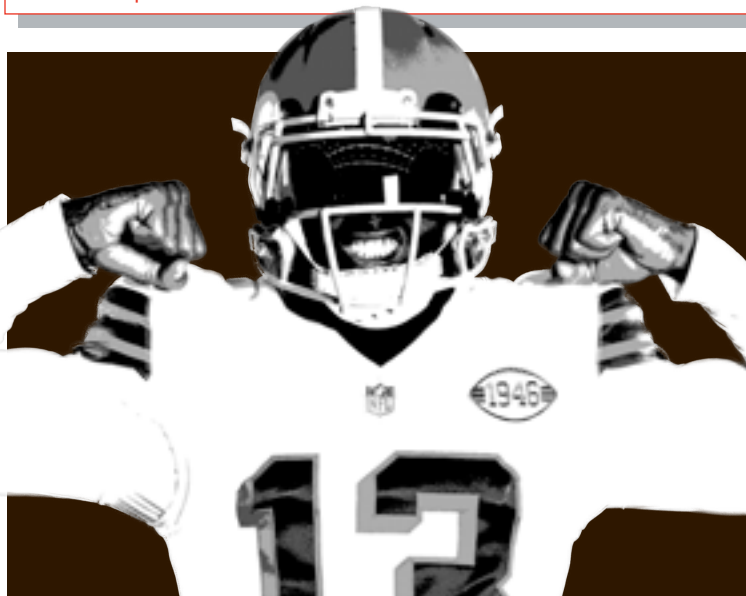

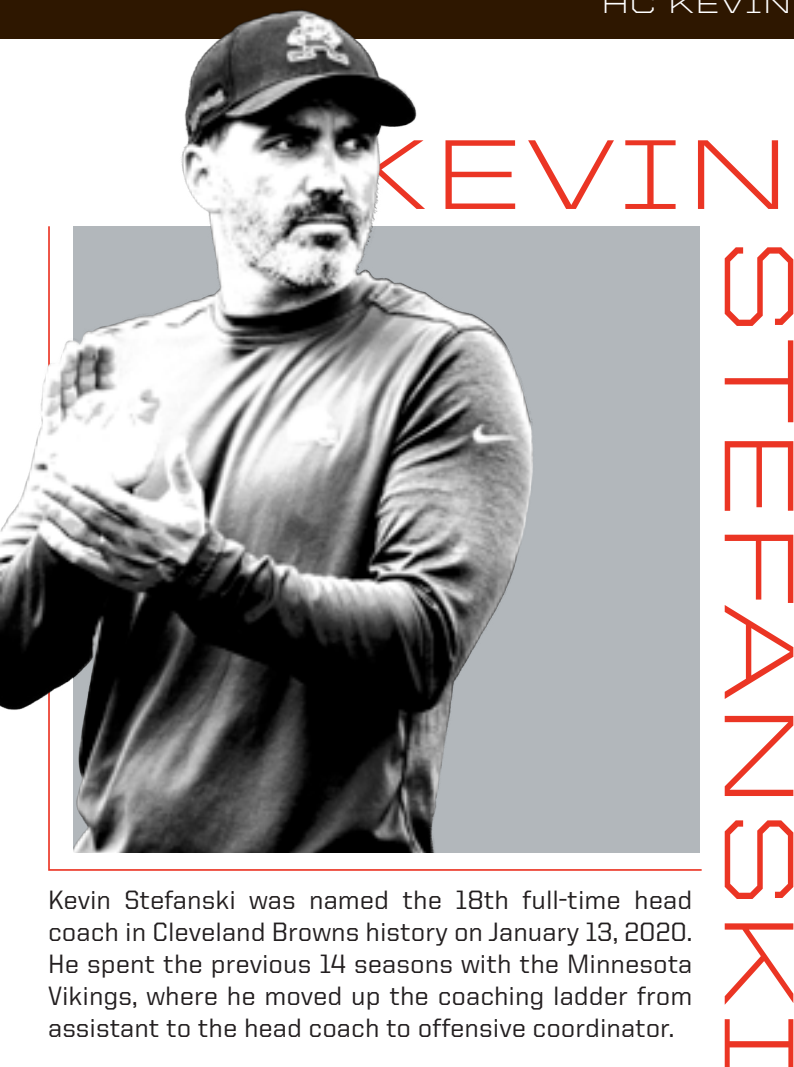
A DAY TO REMEMBER

Week 4's contest last season was one of WR Odell Beckham Jr.'s most prolific performances as a Brown, recording five catches for 81 yards and two touchdowns, along with two rushing attempts for 73 yards and his first career rushing score. His 50-yard rushing score was the longest by a non-running back in Browns history. He tied his career high with three total touchdowns in the game and became the fourth NFL receiver with at least two receiving touchdowns and a rushing touchdown in a single game since 2000. He received his 50th career touchdown pass from Landry in the game, 37 yards for the longest recorded touchdown pass by a receiver in Browns history. He also became the first Browns player with a 30-yard receiving touchdown and 50-yard rushing touchdown in the same game since 1966 (Leroy Kelly).

TWO TUDDIES

With at least two receiving scores in 12 games since entering the league in 2014, Beckham Jr. ranks seventh in the NFL in that category in an active player's first eight years. Since being drafted, he's tied for fourth among all players in games with multiple touchdowns.





Kevin Stefanski was named the 18th full-time head coach in Cleveland Browns history on January 13, 2020. He spent the previous 14 seasons with the Minnesota Vikings, where he moved up the coaching ladder from assistant to the head coach to offensive coordinator.

In his first season with the Browns, Stefanski led the team to their first playoff appearance since 2002 and first playoff victory in 26 years. He notched the most wins (11) by a first-year Browns head coach since Hall of Famer Paul Brown had 12 in the team's inaugural season in 1946. Stefanski's winning percentage (.688) was the best since Blanton Collier (.714) in 1963 and the third-best overall in franchise history. Stefanski's 11 regular season wins were the most by a first-year head coach in 2020 and marked just the 11th time since 1970 a first-year coach has won 11 or more games. Stefanski was named the NFL Coach of the Year and joined Forrest Gregg (1976) as the second coach in franchise history to earn the honor.

Stefanski's first season was unlike any other in NFL history as he and the club had to navigate the new realities and protocols presented by the COVID-19 pandemic. During his first offseason program, he and the staff had to install a new offensive and defensive system entirely virtual. Stefanski and his coaching staff didn't meet most of the players in-person until training camp, which was completely revamped to adhere to the league's protocols. During the second half of the season, the Browns dealt with numerous stops and starts to their schedule, including complete closures of the team facility, because of positive COVID-19 tests.

Despite the new norms, Stefanski who serves as the team's play-caller, helped the Browns offense to some of its best numbers in generations. Cleveland's 408 points were its second-most in franchise history, while the club also finished with its second-

best total in scrimmage touchdowns (48) and tied for the second-most first downs (355). The Browns finished third in the league in rushing with an average of 148.4 yards per game (the team's best since 1978).

Stefanski helped several Browns earn individual honors as DE Myles Garrett and RT Jack Conklin were named first-team All-Pros by the Associated Press, while G Joel Bitonio and G Wyatt Teller each earned second team honors. Garrett, Bitonio and RB Nick Chubb were selected to the Pro Bowl.

He didn't just bring the team together on the field, he also brought them together in the community. As protests for social justice erupted all across the country during the summer of 2020, Stefanski carved out meeting time to allow the players time to discuss how they felt in the moment. They were also given time off during the funeral of George Floyd, whose controversial death spurred the movement. Stefanski then empowered them to "get in the arena" and use their platform to make a difference however they saw fit.

Stefanski joined the Vikings in 2006 as an assistant to the head coach and remained with the organization under three different head coaches. After serving as assistant quarterbacks coach from 2009-13, Stefanski spent two seasons (2014-15) coaching the tight ends and one season (2016) as running backs coach. From 2017-18, he coached the quarterbacks and added the role of interim offensive coordinator for the final three games before being named the team's offensive coordinator in 2019.

In 2019, the Vikings posted a 10-6 record and earned their first road playoff win since January 9, 2005, after defeating the Saints, 26-20, in New Orleans. Three offensive players were selected to the Pro Bowl as RB Dalvin Cook and FB C.J. Ham were each named to their first career Pro Bowl with Cook voted a starter. QB Kirk Cousins was also named to the Pro Bowl.

In his first full year under Stefanski, Cousins set a single-season career high for passer rating with a 107.4 mark, fourth best in the NFL in 2019. Cousins also finished with a career-low six interceptions, while adding 26 touchdowns and a 69.1 completion percentage, fourth in the NFL in 2019. He set a Vikings record for completions in a season with 425 and finished with the second-most passing yards (4,298) and passer rating (107.4) in Vikings history.

With 1,135 rushing yards, Cook became the eighth player in Vikings history to rush for 1,000 yards in a single season and the first since Adrian Peterson in 2015. Despite missing the final two games of the season, Cook finished fourth in the NFL with 13 rushing touchdowns and seventh in scrimmage yards with 1,654.

WR Stefon Diggs set a career high with 1,130 receiving yards, giving him back-to-back 1,000-receiving yard seasons for the first time in his career. Diggs finished fourth in the NFL with an average of 17.9 yards per reception in 2019.

Stefanski was elevated from quarterbacks coach to interim offensive coordinator in Week 15 of the 2018 season and promptly guided the unit to two of its best showings of the season. In his first game calling plays, Minnesota scored a season-high 41 points and recorded 418 yards of offense en route to a 41-17 victory over the Dolphins.

As quarterbacks coach in 2017, the Vikings were forced to go to their backup, Case Keenum, early in the season after starter Sam Bradford went down with an injury. Keenum, who had completed 58 percent of his passes previously owned a 9-15 career record as a starter, went on to complete nearly 68 percent of his throws with 22 touchdowns and seven interceptions while leading the Vikings to a record of 11-3.

In his lone season coaching the running backs in 2016, the Vikings battled injuries along the offensive line and to RB Adrian Peterson that caused the runner to miss 13 games. The running game leaned on veterans Jerick McKinnon and Matt Asiata as the duo combined for 941 yards and eight rushing touchdowns.

As tight ends coach, Stefanski helped develop Pro Bowl TE Kyle Rudolph. In 2015, his unit helped clear the way for Adrian Peterson to lead the NFL in rushing with 1,485 yards.

Stefanski was elevated to assistant quarterbacks coach in 2009, where he had a hands-on role in one of the most successful offense seasons in Vikings history. Veteran QB Brett Favre signed with the team in mid-August and finished the season with 4,202 passing yards and 33 touchdowns. The Vikings finished the season 12-4 and won the NFC North.

Stefanski spent 2006-08 working directly with Head Coach Brad Childress on administrative duties and special projects. Stefanski first worked with Childress during Eagles training camp in 2005 as part of the team's operations department.

Stefanski spent the 2005 season at his alma mater, Pennsylvania, as assistant director of football operations, coordinating all aspects of the Quakers' day-to-day operations.

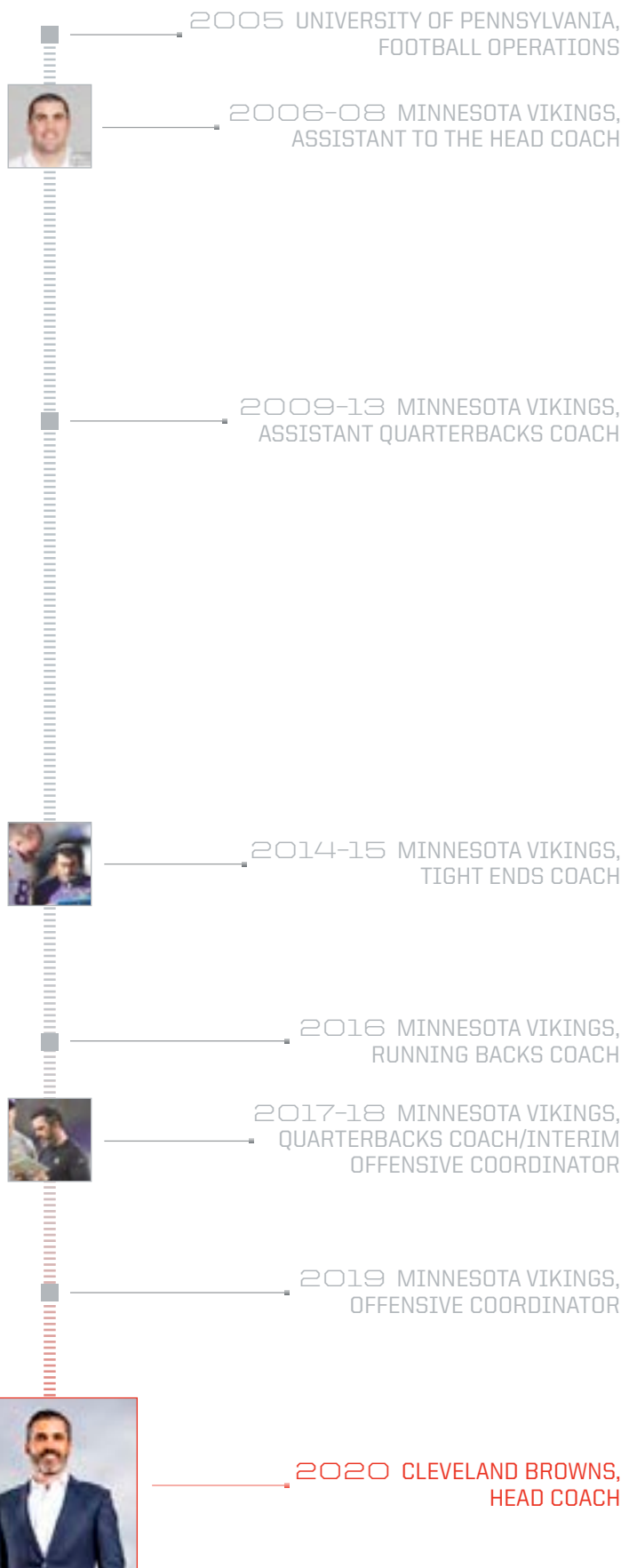
A team captain as a senior in 2003, Stefanski was part of one of the most successful stretches in the history of the Quaker football program. The team won three Ivy League titles (2000, 2002 and 2003), and went 10-0 in 2003 to become the first undefeated Penn team in a decade. During Stefanski's tenure, the squad posted a 42-7 overall record and a 32-3 mark in Ivy League play.

Stefanski earned a bachelor's degree in communications from Pennsylvania and attended St. Joseph's Prep in Philadelphia.

The Stefanski family has made a name in athletics as Kevin's father, Ed, was a basketball standout at Penn and works in the front office of the Detroit Pistons. He has previously held executive positions with the NBA's New Jersey Nets, Philadelphia 76ers, Toronto Raptors and Memphis Grizzlies.

Stefanski and wife, Michelle, have a daughter and two sons.

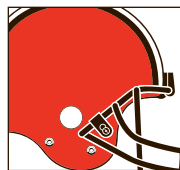

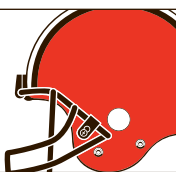

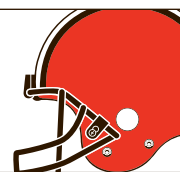
