WEEK 7 - SUNDAY, OCT. 24, 2021 1 p.m. et - M&T Bank Stadium (70,745)

OUICK HITS

- X The Baltimore Ravens (5-1) play their first AFC North game of the season when they host the Cincinnati Bengals (4-2) in a matchup between the division's Top 2 teams. Baltimore has won five straight games since a Week 1 OT loss at Las Vegas, while Cincinnati has won three of its past four, including a 34-11 tilt last Sunday at Detroit.
- X The Ravens aim to begin a season 6-1 for the first time in franchise history. (Baltimore has now started 5-1 for the fourth time ever, also doing so in 2020, 2012 & 2000). Dating back to 2019, Baltimore is 9-0 in the month of October, marking the league's best such record during that span.
- X The Ravens lead the all-time series with Cincinnati, 27-23. Baltimore has won five straight, including a 38-3 game when the teams last met in Week 17 of 2020. In that game, the Ravens rushed for a team-record 404 yards, with **QB Lamar Jackson** throwing 3 TDs. Under head coach John Harbaugh, Baltimore is 14-12 vs. Cincv.
- Baltimore dominated the Chargers in last week's 34-6 win at M&T Bank Stadium, holding them to 208 yards (including 26 rushing) and 4-of-16 on combined third/fourth downs. S DeShon Elliott registered 1 INT and 1 sack, while three different RBs (Le'Veon Bell, Devonta Freeman & Latavius Murray) each scored a rushing TD and helped Baltimore rack up 187 yards on the ground. QB Mark Andrews posted a game-high 68 yards and 1 TD on 5 catches.
- X This marks the Ravens' third-straight home game and the final contest before Baltimore has its bye in Week 8. The Ravens then return home to face Minnesota on Nov. 7.


INJURY UPDATE

The Ravens have 16 players on Injured Reserve, including starters/ standouts TE Nick Bovle (knee), RB J.K. Dobbins (knee), RB Gus Edwards (knee), CB Marcus Peters (knee), T Ronnie Stanley (ankle) and DE Derek Wolfe (back/hip). WR Sammy Watkins (thigh) missed last Sunday's game against the Chargers, while starters C Bradley Bozeman (back) and RB Latavius Murray (ankle) both left the LAC contest and did not return.

- f 4 NFL defenders this season to record at least 1 sack and 1 INT in a single game: Ravens **S DeShon Elliott**, Bears LB Roquan Smith, Bills DE Greg Rousseau & Panthers LB Shaq Thompson. Last Sunday in the win vs. LAC, Elliott tallied 3 tackles, 1 sack, 1 INT (the first of his career) and 2 PD.
- **7** Games in which the Ravens have held opponents to 7 points or fewer (including last Sunday vs. LAC) since Don Martindale became D.C. in 2018, tying NE for the NFL's most such instances.
- 2.078 Combined yards (pass+rush) by QB Lamar Jackson (1,686 passing & 392 rushing), ranking as the NFL's second most, entering Week 7 (Tom Brady - 2,101).



NOTE OF THE WEEK

Entering Week 7, the Ravens' defensive backs have posted a league-best 8 combined QB hits, including 3 each from S DeShon Elliott and CB Tavon Young. Baltimore's 38 overall QB hits rank sixth (tied, Ari.) in the NFL.

JACKSON'S TOUCHOOWNS

- QB Lamar Jackson has recorded either a rushing or passing TD in 42 straight games, marking the longest-active streak by an NFL QB. (Next best is Patrick Mahomes - 31.) Jackson's streak also ranks as the fifth longest in NFL history.
- Jackson has posted 96 total TDs (passing + rushing) through his first 43 career starts, the fifth most in league history.

RAVENS-BENGALS CONNECTIONS

Franchise Connections

- Ravens ILB Josh Bynes, who is in his third stint with the Ravens, appeared in all 16 games for Cincinnati in 2020.
- Baltimore G Kevin Zeitler was originally selected by the Bengals in the first round (27th overall) of the 2012 NFL Draft. He spent the first five years (2012-16) of his career in Cincinnati.
- Baltimore quarterbacks coach James Urban spent seven seasons (2011-17) as the Bengals' wide receivers coach.
- Cincinnati assistant head coach/special teams coordinator Darrin Simmons spent his first year (1998) in the NFL with the Ravens as assistant special teams coach/assistant strength and conditioning coach.

State Connections

- Several Baltimore coaches have coaching ties to the University of Cincinnati: head coach John Harbaugh (special teams/TEs OLBs, RBs; 1989-94 & assistant head coach; 1995-96), defensive coordinator **Don Martindale** (DEs; 1996 & LBs/ special teams coordinator; 1997-98), running backs coach Craig Ver Steeg (QBs/WRs/recruiting coordinator; 1990-93) and special teams coach **T.J. Weist** (WRs; 2010-12).
- Ravens pass defense coordinator Chris Hewitt (1992-95), played collegiately for the Cincinnati Bearcats. Additionally, Baltimore's roster is comprised of many players who played collegiately in Ohio, including: **DE Derek Wolfe** (IR – Cincinnati), RB J.K. Dobbins (IR - Ohio State), ILB Malik Harrison (Ohio State) and WR Binjimen Victor (PS – Ohio State).
- Ravens RB Le'Veon Bell (Groveport Madison), DT Brandon Williams (Harmony Prep), DE Derek Wolfe (Beaver Local) and ILB Malik Harrison (Walnut Ridge) played HS football in Ohio.
- Bengals senior defensive assistant Mark Duffner served as head coach for the University of Maryland for five seasons (1992-96), compiling an 80-40-1 record and leading the Terrapins back to the national rankings in 1995.
- Bengals LB Keandre Jones (PS) is an Olney, MD, native and played collegiately at the University of Maryland.

College Connections

- Baltimore P Sam Koch and Bengals head coach Zac Taylor played together at the University of Nebraska in 2005.
- Baltimore TE Mark Andrews and Cincinnati RB Joe Mixon were key contributors to Oklahoma's high-powered offense in 2015 and 2016.
- Ravens and Bengals 2020 first-round picks ILB Patrick Queen (28th overall) and QB Joe Burrow (first overall) were two of an NCAA record-tying 14 LSU players selected in the 2020 NFL Draft. In LSU's 2019 National Championship victory, Burrow and Queen each earned Player of the Game honors on their respective sides of the ball, while the Bengals' 2021 first-round pick WR Ja'Marr Chase (fifth overall) finished with a gamehigh 9 receptions for 222 yards and 2 TDs.

MILESTONES ON THE HORIZON

TE Mark Andrews

• Andrews (190) is 10 catches shy of 200, while he needs 2 more receiving scores to reach 25 for his career, which will make him just the fourth Raven ever to achieve the milestone: TE Todd Heap (41), WR Torrey Smith (30) & WR Derrick Mason (29).

RB Le'Veon Bell

- Bell owns 9,741 career yards from scrimmage (6,482 rushing & 3,259 receiving) in 90 career games. With at least 259 more scrimmage yards over his next 10 games, he'll join an elite group of 23 players in NFL history to reach the coveted 10,000-yards mark in their first 100 games played.
- With 1 more TD, Bell (41 rushing & 8 receiving) will reach 50 total TDs for his career.

DE Calais Campbell & OLB Justin Houston

• Houston owns 99.5 career sacks, while Campbell has notched 92 sacks throughout his career. If both players reach 100 career sacks this season, they'll be the first duo in NFL history to attain the century mark as teammates.

RB Devonta Freeman

• With 5 more TDs, Freeman (34 rushing & 11 receiving) will reach 50 total TDs for his career.

QB Lamar Jackson

- Jackson needs one more outing with 100 rushing yards to tie the NFL record for the most regular season 100-yard rushing performances by a QB (Mike Vick -10).
- With one more game producing 75 rushing yards, Jackson will tie Vick's NFL record of 21 such outings.

RB Latavius Murray

• With 1 more TD, Murray (47 rushing & 2 receiving) will reach 50 total TDs for his career.

K Justin Tucker

 Tucker needs one game with multiple FGM to tie Stephen Gostkowski (95 games) for the most such performances through a player's first 10 seasons in NFL history.

- The Ravens' 2021 radio team features Gerry Sandusky and former Ravens FB Femi Ayanbadejo. Sandusky, WBAL-TV 11's sports director, delivers the play-by-play for the broadcast team, while Ayanbadejo serves as the color analyst.
- Games can be heard on 98Rock WIYY (97.9 FM), WBAL 1090 AM/101.5 FM, baltimoreravens.com and in the Ravens mobile app (when in Baltimore). The network broadcasts each game with 30 affiliates spanning five states - Maryland, Delaware, Kentucky, Pennsylvania and West Virginia – and Washington, D.C.

TWO-TIME SUPER BOWL CHAMPIONS



In a magnificent effort showcasing thrilling performances by their defense, offense and special teams units, the Baltimore Ravens won Super Bowl XXXV with a 34-7 victory over the New York Giants. Allowing the Giants a meager 152 total net yards, New York's attack crossed midfield just twice, while Baltimore's "D" posted 4 INTs. LB Ray Lewis was named the game's MVP, capping an accolade-filled season in which he was also tabbed the NFL's Defensive Player of the Year.

Baltimore defeated San Francisco, 34-31, in Super Bowl XLVII, capturing the franchise's second World Championship. After an amazing first-half performance, the Ravens took a commanding 28-6 lead. But following a bizarre, 34-minute power outage that halted play, the 49ers stormed back into contention. Clinging to a 34-29 edge late in the game, the Ravens stood firm on a pivotal goal-line stand, jamming SF on four-straight plays inside the 7-yard line. QB Joe Flacco was named the game's MVP.

HARBAUGH FAST FACTS

John Harbaugh has led the Ravens to a playoff berth in nine (2008-12, 2014 & 2018-20) of his 13 full seasons, and in 2012, captured the franchise's second Super Bowl title. In 2019, Coach Harbaugh became the first Ravens coach ever to win Associated Press NFL Coach of the Year Award.

Here are several more Harbaugh quick hits:

- X Harbaugh owns the most road playoff wins (eight) by a HC in NFL history. Tom Landry (Dal.) and Tom Coughlin (Jax./NYG) are second with seven each.
- Vunder Harbaugh, Baltimore is one of four teams (NE, GB & Sea.) to earn a playoff berth in nine of the past 13 seasons. Baltimore is also one of four teams (KC, Sea. & NO) to make the playoffs in each of the past three seasons (2018-2020).
- X In 2019, the Ravens posted a franchise-best 14-2 record. Baltimore won a team-record 12-straight games to close out the regular season, earning its first-ever No. 1 playoff seed.
- X Coach Harbaugh has led the Ravens to four AFC North Division titles (2011-12, 2018-19).
- X The Ravens' 11 playoff wins since 2008 tie (GB) for the second most in the NFL (New England - 16).
- X Under "Harbs," the Ravens have secured an appearance in three AFC Championship games (2008, 2011 & 2012).
- "Harbs" is the only head coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in each of his first four and five seasons.

- John and his brother, Jim (formerly of the 49ers), are the only head coaches to advance to three conference title games in the first five years as NFL bosses.
- X Harbaugh is the only coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in six of the first seven seasons of a coaching career.
- In 2012, Harbaugh became the third coach (with Bill Cowher & Chuck Knox) since the 1970 merger to guide his team to the playoffs in each of his first five seasons.
- X With the Ravens' 2014 playoff berth, Harbaugh became one of eight coaches in NFL history to make the postseason in six of their first seven seasons coaching.

- For three-plus seasons as Baltimore's D.C., Don "Wink" Martindale has led the Ravens' defense to incredible success. In 2018, Martindale was recognized by SI/MMQB as the Assistant Coach of the Year and was the AP NFL runner-up (then-Bears' DC Vic Fangio) for the same award, guiding Baltimore's unit to a No. 1 ranking (292.2 ypg allowed).
- In 2020, Baltimore allowed the NFL's second-fewest points (18.9 ppg) and produced the No. 2 third-down defense (34.0%), while also registering a league-high 22 FFs on defense.

- During the John Harbaugh Era (since 2008) when rushing for at least 125 yards, the Ravens have produced a 79-19 record. Baltimore is 55-12 when rushing for at least 150 yards and 29-3 when tallying at least 200 yards, under Coach Harbaugh.
- Eight of the Ravens' all-time Top 13 rushing outputs have occurred since 2018, when QB Lamar Jackson became the starter: 404 at Cin. in 2020 (1st), 296 at Cle. in 2018 (4th), 294 vs. Dal. in 2020 (5th), 285 at LAR in 2019 (7th), 269 vs. Cin. in 2019 (9th), 267 vs. Cin. in 2018 (10th), 265 vs. Pit. in 2020 (11th) & 265 at Mia. in 2019 (11th).
- The 2020 Ravens became the first team in NFL history to have three players QB Lamar Jackson, RB J.K. Dobbins & RB Gus Edwards each tally at least 700 rushing yards and 6 rushing TDs.

A RICH HISTORY OF SPECIAL TEAMS

Following the retirement of longtime ST coordinator Jerry Rosburg, Chris Horton took over as the special teams coach in 2019. Horton, who served as Rosburg's assistant for three seasons (2016-18), leads the standout special teams battery.

SIX PRO BOWLERS

• Six Ravens have earned 12 combined Pro Bowl honors during the John Harbaugh Era (since 2008): ST Brendon Ayanbadejo (2008), K Billy Cundiff (2010), RS Jacoby Jones (2012), K Justin Tucker (2013, 2016 & 2019-20), LS Morgan Cox (2015, 2016 & 2019-20) and P Sam Koch (2015).

PRIME KICKER & PUNTER

• Four-time Pro Bowl K Justin Tucker, who the Ravens signed as a rookie free agent, owns the NFL's most FGs (304) since entering the NFL in 2012. With a 90.7% career success mark, "Tuck" is the most accurate kicker in league history (304-of-335 on FGAs). Earning his first Pro Bowl nod in 2015, P Sam Koch's 46.7 gross average ranked No. 9 in the NFL that season, while his 42.9 net average was No. 2. In 2017, Koch led the NFL in both punts inside the 10 (16) and the 20 (a franchise-record 40).

RAVENS' RETURN MEN SOAR

 Dating back to 2011, six different Ravens have returned punts for touchdowns: WR Michael Campanaro, WR Kaelin Clay, WR Tandon Doss, CB Cyrus Jones, WR Jacoby Jones and DB Lardarius Webb.

DUVERNAY CONTINUES ROOKIE KOR-TO TREND

• In Week 3 of 2020 vs. KC, then-rookie WR Devin Duvernay produced a 93-yard KOR-TD. It marked the NFL's first KOR-TD of 2020 and was the Ravens' sixth KOR-TD since 2011, tied with KC for the NFL's second most. Only the Vikings (7) have produced more KOR-TDs dating back to 2011. Duvernay became the fifth rookie in Ravens history to return a kickoff for a TD: Patrick Johnson (1998), Yamon Figurs (2007), Lardarius Webb (2009) and David Reed (2010).



Baltimore has drafted three players (Ogden, Lewis & Reed) who were selected to the Pro Football Hall of Fame. For Ogden & Lewis, it was the first time ever two players were drafted in the same round (1st in 1996) by a team and reached the HOF in their initial year of eligibility.

Eric DeCosta has been with the franchise since Day One, first beginning as an intern during the inaugural 1996 season and then ascending to the personnel department's chief decision-maker in 2019. Prior to being named EVP/GM - succeeding the legendary Ozzie Newsome - DeCosta, 50, received GM interview offers annually from multiple teams in recent years. However, he never seriously considered leaving Baltimore, which has always aligned perfectly with what he envisioned to be his dream job.

- ✗ Baltimore is 35-8 with Jackson as its regular season starter. Since his first NFL start (Week 11 of 2018), Jackson's 35 wins are the most among all NFL starting QBs. Jackson is also the fastest QB in league history to reach 30 regular season wins and the first to reach 35 before the age of 25.
- ✗ In 2020, Jackson (1,005) became the first QB in NFL history to surpass the 1,000-yard rushing milestone in multiple seasons, also doing so in 2019 (1,206).
- ✗ Jackson tallied 26 TD passes and 7 rushing TDs in 2020, joining Deshaun Watson (2018-19) as the only QBs with at least 25 TD passes and 5 rushing TDs in consecutive seasons in NFL history.
- X Jackson is the fastest QB in league history (35 games) to reach 5,000 passing yards and 2,000 rushing yards. He's also the first player in NFL history to reach 5,000 passing yards and 2,500 rushing yards in the first three seasons of a career.
- X Jackson (9), Michael Vick (8) and Russell Wilson (4) own the Top 3 "double-triples" (at least 100 rushing and passing yards in the same game) in league history.
- X Jackson has produced nine career regular season games with at least 100 rushing yards, marking the second most by a QB in NFL history (Mike Vick − 10).

- ✗ Jackson is the only QB in NFL history to produce at least 3,000 passing yards and 1,000 rushing yards in a single season (2019). (He had 3,127 passing & 1,206 rushing yards in 2019.)
- ✗ In 2019, Jackson (36/7) became the third QB in NFL history with at least 35 passing TDs & 7 rushing TDs. Steve Young (1994), Cam Newton (2015) and Josh Allen (2020) have also done this.
- ✗ Jackson was responsible for an NFL-best 43 total TDs (36 passing & 7 rushing) in 2019. His 36 TD passes led the NFL and are the most in franchise single-season history.
- ✗ In his final eight games of 2019 (he sat out Week 17), Jackson threw 25 TDs and 1 INT, completing 69.4% of his passes for 1,477 yards and a 130.3 rating. He had 630 rushing yards & 4 rush TDs.
- ✗ Jackson rushed for 1,206 yards in 2019, marking the most by a quarterback in NFL single-season history.
- ✗ Jackson threw at least 4 TDs in an NFL-best four games in 2019. He also threw at least 3 TDs in an NFL-best eight games.
- ✗ In 2019's Week 15 win vs. NYJ, Jackson rushed for at least 85 yards while throwing for 5 TDs for the second time in his career. (He also did this on 11/25/19 at LAR.) Cam Newton is the only other player in NFL history to accomplish the 85 rushing yards/5 passing TDs feat in a game, doing so in 2015.
- ✗ Jackson posted two perfect passer ratings in 2019 (at Cin. & Mia.), making him one of two QBs in NFL history (Ben Roethlisberger, 2007) to attain the 158.3 mark twice in a season.
- ✗ In Weeks 11 (vs. Hou.) and 12 (at LAR) of 2019, Jackson became the first NFL player ever to throw at least 4 passing TDs and have at least 50 rush yards in back-to-back games.
- ✗ Jackson owns the NFL single-season record for most 100yard rushing games (5 in 2019) by a quarterback.
- ✗ In 2019's Week 6 victory over Cincinnati, Jackson became the first player ever to pass for 200 yards (236) and rush for 150 yards (152) in a regular season game. (Colin Kaepernick also accomplished this feat in a 2013 playoff game.)
- ✗ In the 2019 Divisional Playoff vs. Tennessee, Jackson became the first player in NFL history with at least 350 passing yards (365) and 100 rushing yards (143) in any game.



THE KING OF QUEENS IN 2020

- In Week 5 of 2020 vs. Cincinnati, ILB Patrick Queen posted a strip-sack and then recovered the ball. Queen became the second Ravens rookie to record a sack, FF and FR in a game, joining OLB Terrell Suggs, who accomplished the feat three times during his 2003 Defensive ROY campaign.
- In that 2020 Cincy game, Queen also had a 53-yard FR-TD, which is the fifth-longest FR-TD in Ravens history (sixthlongest overall). His performance earned him AFC Defensive Player of the Week honors for Week 5.
- Queen became the second NFL defender since 1987 to post 9-plus tackles, at least 2 FRs, 1 sack and 1 defensive TD in a game. Former Texans ILB Demeco Ryans was the other.

TUCKER TIDBITS

- Tucker has connected on 52 consecutive fourth-guarter/OT FGAs and is a perfect 16-of-16 on tries in the final minute of regulation throughout his career. His 94.9 career FG% in the second half/OT (150-of-158) also ranks as the NFL's best such mark of all time.
- Since PATs were moved back to the 15-yard line in 2015, Tucker (253-of-257) has produced the NFL's best PAT percentage (98.4, min. 100 attempts)
- Tucker is a seven-time AFC Special Teams Player of the Month. He has also earned a team-record 12 AFC ST Player of the Week honors.
- Tucker's 6 FGs on 12/16/13 at Det. set a team record and a single-game NFL high in 2013. He became the first kicker ever to connect from the 20-, 30-, 40-, 50- & 60-yard range in a game.

2016: THE BEST SEASON EVER?

- In 2016, All-Pro K Justin Tucker connected on 38-of-39 FGAs (lone miss was a block), posting the then-fifth-best pct. (97.4) in NFL single-season history.
- Tucker's 38 FGs made in 2016 ranked No. 1 in the NFL, and he was also 27-of-27 on PATs. An NFL single-season record 24 of Tucker's 38 FGs made in 2016 came from 40 yards or beyond.
- Tucker's 10 FGs of 50-plus yards in 2016 are a Ravens' single-season record. They tie (Blair Walsh, 2012 & Brandon McManus, 2020) for the most in NFL history. (Tucker was a perfect 10-for-10 from 50 yards and out in 2016.)



"Some are designed to hook toward the sideline with maximum hang time. Others use an intentionally low trajectory to aid coverage teams. He has a knuckler and one kick that drops, from the returner's perspective, roughly in the shape of the letter 'S.' He's debuted a 'boomerang' punt that does just what you would imagine it might. Most, but not all, of these punts are intended to discourage a clean catch and minimize the return. ... Sam Koch and the Ravens have introduced a new way to punt."

- WR Marquise Brown recorded 6 receptions for 69 yards and 1 TD, adding 1 carry for 5 yards. With his 10-yard TD reception, Brown has 7 TD grabs in his last seven contests (since Week 12, 2020), marking the second-most TD receptions in the NFL over that span (Davante Adams 8).
- QB Lamar Jackson finished 19-of-30 for 235 passing yards and 1 TD, adding 12 rushes for 86 yards. With 235 passing yards, Jackson (7,320) passed Vinny Testaverde (7,148) for the third-most career passing yards in franchise history.
- In his Ravens' debut, RB Latavius Murray posted 10 carries for 28 yards, including an 8-yard TD run late in the fourth quarter. The score was set up by a 49-yard reception by WR Sammy Watkins, who finished his Ravens' debut with 4 receptions for a team-high 96 yards.
- LB Patrick Queen helped guide Baltimore's defense with a team-high (tied, CB Marlon Humphrey) 9 tackles (6 solo) and 1 sack.
- With CB Anthony Averett's overtime INT, the first of his career, Baltimore
 has forced a turnover in 28 of its last 30 games. It marked the NFL's second
 goal-line INT in the overtime period since 2001 (when data became available).

GAME HIGHLIGHTS

- Under John Harbaugh (since 2008), Baltimore owns a 16-2 record in home primetime games, ranking as the NFL's best winning percentage (.889). The Ravens have won 14 of their last 15 home primetime games, including four straight on Sunday Night Football.
- Baltimore has rushed for 100+ yards in 41 straight games, marking the second-longest streak in pro football history. Also, since **QB Lamar Jackson** became Baltimore's starter, the Ravens have rushed for at least 200 yards in an NFL-high 21 games.
- With his 107 rushing yards on 16 carries (6.7 avg.), Jackson eclipsed 3,000 rushing yards in his 48th-career game, becoming the fastest QB in NFL history to reach that mark (Mike Vick 61 games).
- WR Marquise Brown posted a game-high 113 receiving yards and 1 TD on 6 catches, marking the third 100-yard game of his career (and his fifth including postseason).
- OLB Odafe Oweh forced his first-career fumble also making his first-career fumble recovery on the play to halt the Chiefs' potential game-winning drive with 1:26 remaining.

- K Justin Tucker's 66-yard game-winning field goal is the longest field goal made in NFL history, surpassing K Matt Prater's previous NFL record of 64 yards in 2013. Tucker's previous career long, a 61-yarder, was also a gamewinner in an 18-16 contest at Detroit (12/16/13).
- This marks Tucker's seventh-career game with multiple 50-plus-yard conversions, tying K Brandon McManus and K Matt Prater for the most in NFL history.
- QB Lamar Jackson has recorded either a rushing or passing TD in 39 consecutive games played, marking the longest active streak by a QB.
- With a 31-yard rush this afternoon, his longest since Week 14 of 2020, Jackson now has 19 career rushes of 25-plus yards and surpassed QB Mike Vick (18) for the most such rushes by a QB in his first four seasons in NFL history.
- The Ravens have won 11 straight games against NFC opponents, dating back to Week 13 of 2018 at Atlanta. This ranks as the NFL's longest-active streak in games played against the NFC.

- With 3 FGs, K Justin Tucker reached 300 FGM in his 148th-career game, becoming the fastest kicker in NFL history to reach that mark.
- QB Lamar Jackson threw for 316 yards, marking his second-career 300-yard output and the second-most passing yards in his career (324 yards at Miami; 9/8/19). With 8,162 career passing yards, Jackson surpassed QB Kyle Boller (7,846) for the second-most passing yards in franchise history.
- Jackson is the first QB in NFL history to notch at least 1,000 passing yards (1,077) and 250 rushing yards (279) through a team's first four games of a season.
- CB Anthony Averett sealed the victory with a fourth-quarter interception in the end zone. It marked his career-high second INT of the season, adding 3 solo tackles.

- QB Lamar Jackson threw for a career-high (and single-game Ravens record)
 442 yards, surpassing his previous mark of 324 at Mia. (2019). Jackson
 passed for 4 TDs and 0 INTs, completing 86% (37-of-43). According to ESPN
 Stats & Information, Jackson became the first player in NFL history to pass
 for 400 yards while also completing at least 85% of his passes.
- TE Mark Andrews set career highs in receptions (11) and receiving yards (147), also tying a career high with 2 TD catches and setting a personal best with two 2-point catches. Andrews became the first NFL player since 1970 merger to have 2 receiving TDs and two 2-point conversions in a game.
- **OLB Odafe Oweh** tallied 3 tackles, 1 sack and 1 FF to become first Ravens rookie to notch 3 sacks and 2 FFs through his first five career games. Oweh also joins T.J. Watt and Chandler Jones as the NFL's only defenders in 2021 with at least 3 sacks, 2 FFs and 1 FR.
- DE Calais Campbell's fourth-quarter blocked FG was the 8th blocked kick of his career, which tied Craig Terrill for the third most since 1970 NFL merger. Only Shaun Rogers (14) & Julius Peppers (12) have produced more blocks.
- Under John Harbaugh (since 2008), Baltimore owns a 17-2 record in home primetime games, ranking as the NFL's best winning percentage (.895). At home on Monday Night Football during this span, Baltimore is 3-1.

- The Ravens improved to 5-1 for the second-straight season and for the fourth time in franchise history (also 2000 & 2012).
- The Ravens' defense limited Los Angeles to a season-low 208 yards of offense, including just 26 rushing. The 26 rushing yards are the fewest allowed by Baltimore since 11/25/19 at the Rams, and it ties (2006 at TB) for the 10th fewest allowed in a game in Ravens franchise history.
- QB Lamar Jackson surpassed Hall of Famer Dan Marino by becoming the youngest QB in league history to reach 35 career victories. Jackson, who turns 25 in January, is 35-8 as a starter, producing the NFL's most wins by a QB since he became a starter in Week 11 of 2018.
- Three different RBs (Le'Veon Bell, Devonta Freeman & Latavius Murray) each scored a rushing TD, marking the second such instance in a Ravens' game since 2018 (Javorius Allen, Alex Collins & Kenneth Dixon) and the third in team history (Le'Ron McClain, Willis McGahee & Ray Rice - 2009).
