THIS WEEK'S PREVIEW

The Cardinals travel to Cincinnati this week for Arizona's first game at Paul Brown Stadium since 2011. Having won three of the last four against the Bengals, Arizona travels to Cincy looking to even up the all-time series, which the Bengals currently lead 6-5.

The majority of the meetings between these franchises have taken place on the Bengals home field. This week's game marks Arizona's eighth road trip in 12 all-time matchups in the series. The home team has won 10 of the 11 contests, with the lone exception being the Cardinals 35-27 victory at Paul Brown Stadium in 2007.

Historically, matchups between these two teams have been decided by narrow margins, with five of the last six meetings determined by eight points or fewer. In the 11 combined games between the two teams, Cincinnati holds a three-point advantage over Arizona (274-271).

The last time Arizona and Cincinnati squared off was in Week 11 of the 2015 season on Sunday Night Football. In that contest the Cardinals overcame an early deficit to take the lead, only to have the Bengals tie the game with a minute remaining in regulation. Arizona drove down the field quickly on its final possession and kicked a game-wining FG as time expired for a 34-31 victory.

Although the Cardinals and Bengals don't meet often, one Arizona defender knows this week's opponent well. Sunday's game will mark LB **Terrell Suggs**' 29th career matchp against Cincinnati and his 14th at Paul Brown Stadium. The NFL's active sacks leader, Suggs has recorded 12.5 of his 136.0 career sacks against the Bengals. Six of those sacks have been of Cincinnati QB Andy Dalton.

Another Arizona player who has had success against the Bengals is WR Larry Fitzgerald. In three career games against Cincy, he has 22 receptions for 288 yards and two TDs. In two games at Paul Brown Stadium, Fitzgerald has 14 receptions for 198 yards and two TDs.

Both the Cardinals and Bengals are coming off home losses in Week 4, as Arizona fell 27-10 to Seattle and Cincinnati was defeated 27-3 by the Steelers on Monday Night Football.

Highlighting Week 4 for Arizona was Fitzgerald, who passed Hall of Fame TE Tony Gonzalez for second place on the NFL's all-time receptions list. Former QB **Carson Palmer** became the 18th member of the Cardinals Ring of Honor in a ceremony at halftime.

Next week, the Cardinals return to State Farm Stadium to face the Falcons in the sixth meeting between the two teams in the last eight seasons. Cincinnati will travel to Baltimore for an AFC North showdown against the Ravens.

FITZGERALD #2 ALL-TIME WITH 1,326 CAREER CATCHES

With five receptions against the Seahawks last week, WR **Larry Fitzgerald** (1,326) passed Hall of Fame TE Tony Gonzalez (1,325) for second place on the NFL's all-time receptions list behind only Hall of Fame WR Jerry Rice (1,549). Rice was on hand at State Farm Stadium last week as Fitz moved up the all-time list.

THIS WEEK'S HIGHLIGHTS

• This week's game marks the 12th all-time matchup between the Cardinals and Bengals. Of those 12 matchups, eight will have taken place in Cincinnati.

• This week's matchup features two first-time NFL head coaches in **Kliff Kingsbury** and **Zac Taylor**. Both were former college QBs who were named Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year as seniors.

• Sunday's game will feature three players who were named Cardinals High School Player of the Year during their prep career: Cardinals CB **Byron Murphy** (2015) and RB **D.J. Foster** (2011) and Bengals QB **Ryan Finley** (2012).

• LB Jordan Hicks - who starred at Lakota West High School in Cincinnati - returns to Ohio as the league's leading tackler in 2019. Hicks has 48 tackles this season and is the only player in the NFL with 10+ tackles in all four games.

• LB **Terrell Suggs** recorded 1.5 sacks against the Seahawks last week, giving him 136.0 sacks for his career. Suggs enters Sunday's game with more career sacks against the Bengals (12.5) than any player in NFL history.

• Arizona leads the NFL with 10 forced fumbles in 2019. The Cardinals have five "strip-sacks" of opposing QBs this season, which ranks second behind only Houston (7).

CARDS-BENGALS CONNECTIONS

Bengals Connections Cardinals Defensive Coordinator Vance Joseph was the Bengals DBs coach from 2014-15, helping the Bengals to back-to-back postseason appearances. During those two seasons the Bengals led the NFL with 41 INTs and were the only team to post more INTs than TDs allowed (36) in that span.

Cardinals OL Clinton McDonald was drafted by the Bengals in the seventh round of the 2010 NFL Draft and played eight games for the team during his rookie campaign.

Cardinals WR **Pharoh Cooper** was signed by the Bengals in September and played in one game with Cincinnati (Week 1 @ Sea) earlier this season.

Cardinals OL Justin Murray signed with the Bengals late in the 2017 season and spent the 2018 offseason with Cincinnati.

Cardinals Connections Bengals D-Line coach Nick Eason played 32 games for the Cardinals from 2011-12.

Bengals OT Andre Smith played eight games for the Cardinals during the 2018 season.

Bengals Asst. Strength and Conditioning coach **Garrett Swanson** played the 2016 preseason with the Cardinals after signing with the team as an undrafted rookie free agent.

<u>Cincinnati/Ohio Connections</u> Cardinals LB Jordan Hicks and OL Justin Murray both hail from Cincinnati. Hicks was named Gatorade's Ohio High School Player of the year in 2009, and Murray attended the University of Cincinnati from 2011-15

Cardinals WR **Andy Isabella** (Mayfield), LBs coach **Bill Davis** (Youngstown) and Video Director **Jeff Wallo** (Youngstown) are Ohio natives. Davis was a QB and WR at the University of Cincinnati from 1985-88 and went on to coach at Ohio State from 2016-18.

Cardinals Asst. WRs coach **Peter Badovinac** (2018), LBs coach **Bill Davis** (2016-18) and Offensive Assistant **Jerry Sullivan** (1991) all coached at Ohio State.

Cardinals Head Athletic Trainer Tom Reed was as an assistant athletic trainer at Miami (OH) University from 1996-99.

Arizona Connections Bengals QB Ryan Finley attended Paradise Valley (Phoenix, AZ) High School where he earned first-team All-State honors after leading the state in passing with 3,442 yards and 35 TDs as a senior in 2012.

Bengals DT **Renell Wren** played at Arizona State from 2014-18 and earned honorable mention All-Pac 12 honors in 2018.

Bengals Offensive Assistant Brad Kragthorpe was born in Flagstaff.

High School Connections Cardinals practice squad TE Darrell Daniels and Bengals RB Joe Mixon played together at Freedom (Oakley, CA) High School.

Cardinals S Budda Baker (2014-16), TE Darrell Daniels (2013-16) and LB Ezekiel Turner (2015-17) played with Bengals WR John Ross III (2013-16) and TE **Drew Sample** (2015-18) at Washington. Sample also played for the Huskies with Cardinals CB **Byron Murphy** (2017-18).

Cardinals WR Christian Kirk (2015-17) played with Bengals RB Trayveon Wil-liams (2016-18) at Texas A&M.

Cardinals OL Justin Pugh (2013-17) played for the Giants with Bengals OT Bobby Hart (2015-17), G John Jerry (2014-17) and DE Kerry Wynn (2014-17).

Cardinals TE Charles Clay (2015-18) and OL Jordan Mills (2015-18) played in Buffalo with Bengals LB **Preston Brown** (2014-17), OT **Cordy Glenn** (2012-17) and G **John Miller** (2015-18).

CARDS VS. BENGALS - SERIES BREAKDOWN

This Sunday's matchup between the Cardinals and Bengals represents the 12th all-time meeting between the two teams and first since 2015. THE HEAD COACHES

Kliff Kingsbury

Cardinals head coach Kliff Kingsbury and Bengals head coach Zac Taylor were both hired as first-time NFL head coaches this offseason. The pair have much more in common than being among the six first-time NFL head coaches hired in 2019.

 Both began their coaching careers in 2008 - Kingbury as an offensive quality control coach at Houston and Taylor as a grad assistant at Texas A&M.

 Both were star QBs at the college level and each was named Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year: Kingsbury at Texas Tech in 2002; Taylor at Nebraska in 2006. Kingsbury was drafted by the Patriots in the sixth round (201st overall) in 2003. Taylor signed with the Buccaneers as a rookie free agent in 2007.

• Kingsbury set 39 school and and 17 NCAA records at Texas Tech, throwing for 12,423 yards and 95 TDs. Taylor led the Cornhuskers to a 9-3 record and an appearance the Big 12 Championship Game in '06.

 Both have earned reputations for their work with young QBs. Kingsbury tutored six future NFL quarterbacks during his college tenure, a list includes first-round selections Patrick Mahomes, Baker Mayfield and Johnny Man-ziel as well as Case Keenum, Davis Webb and Nic Shimonek. Taylor was tasked with the development of first-round picks in both Miami (**Ryan Tan-**nehill) and Los Angeles (**Jared Goff**).

THE LOCAL STARS

The rosters of both the Cardinals and Bengals feature players who starred at high schools in the opposing franchise's home state.

Arizona LB Jordan Hicks - the NFL's leading tackler in 2019 - attended Lakota West High School in Cincinnati where he was a prep All-American and two-time first-team All-State selection at LB. Following his senior season in 2009, Hicks was named the Butkus Award winner as the nation's top LB and Gatorade's Ohio High School Player of the Year.

He was also named a USA Today, EA Sports and PA-RADE first-team All-American selection that year. Hicks posted 216 tackles, 8.5 sacks, 36 tackles for loss, three forced fumbles, four INTs, 10 passes defensed and a TD over his final three seasons. Hicks also lettered in basketball at Lakota, setting district records for most varsity basketball games played (87) and total steals (170).

Bengals rookie QB Ryan Finley (pictured bottom-right receiving HSPOY Award at Cardinals game in 2012) starred at Paradise Valley High School, where he was named Arizona Cardinals High School Player of the Year and first-team All-State as a senior in '12.

He completed 270-of-424 passes for the Trojans that year, leading the state of Arizona with 3,442 passing yards. He threw for 35 TDs and also rushed 96 times for 282 yards and four scores during his final prep campaign when he led Paradise Valley to the state playoffs.

PALMER ENTERS THE RING OF HONOR

The Cardinals inducted QB Carson Palmer into its Ring of Honor at halftime of last week's game vs. Seattle at State Farm Stadium.

Palmer became the 18th member of the Cardinals Ring of Honor, the creation of which coincided with the opening of State Farm Stadium in 2006.

"It was the most fun I've had playing football, and I had a lot of fun in college," Palmer said of his time with the Cardinals. "I had some fun playing for the Bengals, but it's the most fun I've had playing the game. I met some unbelievable (people). It's not just the coaches and the players. It's everybody that's affiliated with this organization."

HIGHLIGHTS FROM PALMER'S ARIZONA TENURE • Acquired by the Cardinals in a trade with Oak-land prior to the 2013 in which Arizona gave up a sixth round pick. Played five seasons in Arizona (2013-17).

His .642 win percentage (38-21-1) is the best for a starting QB in team history.

• Started 60 games, completing 1,373-of-2,197 pass attempts (62.5%) for 16,782 yards, 105 TDs, 57 INTs and a 91.1 passer rating.

• Holds the franchise's single-season records for passing yards (4,671), TDs (35) and passer rating (104.6), all of which he set in 2015

• Led the Cardinals to a franchise single-season record 13 wins in 2015 and an appearance in the NFC Championship game.

• Holds the franchise record for 300-yard passing games (25) and 400-yard passing performances (3).

MILESTONES WITHIN REACH

WR Larry Fitzgerald
With a reception, Fitzgerald would have at least one catch in 232 consecutive games, the second-longest reception streak in NFL history (Jerry Rice - 274). • With a TD reception, Fitzgerald would have 119 career TD catches. It would

give him a TD reception in all three career games played at Paul Brown Stadium.

RB David Johnson

• With a TD (of any kind), Johnson would have 47 TDs. That would set a new franchise record for TDs in a player's first five seasons. • With a rushing TD, Johnson would tie John David Crow (33) for third place on

the franchise all-time list for career rushing TDs.

<u>OB Kyler Murray</u> • With 300+ passing yards, Murray would become the first player in franchise history to throw for 300+ yards at least three times in his rookie season.

<u>LB Terrell Suggs</u>
 With a sack, Suggs would have 137.0 career sacks, putting him alone in 11th place on the NFL's all-time sacks list.

With a sack, Suggs would have 13.5 career sacks against the Bengals. He already has more sacks vs. Cincy (12.5) than any player in NFL history. It would also give him 7.0 career sacks of Cincinnati QB Andy Dalton.

• With 10+ tackles this week, Hicks would extend his career-long streak to five consecutive games with double-digit tackles.

LB Chandler Jones

• With a sack, Jones would have 45.0 sacks in 53 games with Arizona.

MURRAY THROWS FOR 300+ IN 1st TWO GAMES Playing his first-ever game in the Cardinals season-opener vs. Detroit, rookie QB Kyler Murray threw for 308 yards. In doing so, he became just the fifth rookie in <u>NFL history to throw for 300+ yards in a season-opener.</u> He is the first Cardinals rookie in history to throw for 300+ yards in his first career game.

In Week 2 at Baltimore Murray exceeded that total, throwing for 349 yards against the Ravens. He joined Cam Newton (2011) as the only QBs in NFL history to throw for 300+ yards in each of their two career games.

Murray (657) and Newton (854) are the only two QBs in NFL history with at least 650 passing yards in their first two career games.

When Arizona hosted Detroit in Week 1, Murray became the first Cardinals rookie QB to start a season opener since Lamar McHan in 1954.

That wasn't the only history Murray made in that contest. Below are a few more highlights:

• Leading the Cardinals to an 18-point fourth quarter comeback to tie the Lions, completed 29-of-54 pass at-tempts for 308 yards and 2 TDs.

• Became the first player in franchise history to throw for 300+ yards in his first career game.

• Joined Jake Plummer (1997) as the only players in franchise history to throw for 300+ yards and multiple TDs in a game during their rookie season.

 Sparked the comeback with his performance in the fourth quarter and OT, when he completed 20-of-29 pass attempts (68.9%) for 238 yards, 2 TDs, 0 INTs.

After rushing for 17 total yards in the first two games, **Murray** has 96 rushing yards in the last two contests, including his first career rushing TD (9 yards) last week against Seattle.

Murray had his highest rushing output in Week 3 vs. Carolina when he finished with 69 yards on eight carries (8.6 avg.). His 69 rushing yards represent the fifth-best single-game total by a QB in franchise history. The only rookie QB to rush for more yards in a game was M.C. Reynolds (99) in 1958.

In September (9/10), Cardinals RB **David Johnson** and his wife, **Meghan**, presented a gift to bring cheer to young patients at Ryan's House in Phoenix on behalf of their nonprofit Johnson Family's Mission 31 Foundation.

"This is really why I play football, just to be able to give back to the community and give back to people in need," said Johnson.

The organization donated its fourth "David's Locker," a mobile cart containing Nintendo Switches, iPads, noise-cancelling headphones and video games to serve as a welcome diversion for patients during treatment and recovery.

Cardinals WR Larry Fitzgerald recently partnered with country music artist and friend Garth Brooks to donate electronics to 32 schools in the Phoenix and Minneapolis metro areas to increase digital literacy.

In September (9/12), Fitzgerald visited Academia Del Pueblo, a lowincome K-8 charter school in Phoenix and was joined by Brooks via video screen, to announce their donation to a crowd of elementary school students.

The visit was known by few, including principal Frank Lomeli, who said "place just absolutely erupted" when Fitzgerald was introduced.

Digital literacy is described as the ability to understand and use digital tools "in communicative, collaborative ways" by the American Library Association.

"Technology bridges all gaps," Fitzgerald said in an interview with The *Arizona Republic*. "It doesn't matter what school you go to. A young person can sit down and learn about anything that they desire to learn about."

The Saguaro High School football team also attended the Cardinals home game on Sunday (9/29) against the Seahawks as guests of the team.

Foster, Kirk and Murphy all attended Saguaro High School and won a collective six state championships with the Sabercats from 2008-15.

Foster set a single-season state record with 60 total TDs while leading Saguaro to an Arizona Division III State Championship as a senior in 2011.

Kirk was an All-American and earned 2014 Arizona Gatorade Player of the Year honors after surpassing 3,000 all-purpose yards and scoring 46 total TDs as a senior.

Murphy helped lead the Sabercats to state titles during both his junior and senior seasons and was named the Arizona Division II Player of the Year and first-team All-Arizona in 2015.

"NFL100" is a year-long celebration to commemorate the centennial season of the National Football League and bring generations of football fans, players, communities and all 32 clubs together for a unique line-up of programming and activities.

CARDS JOIN NFL TO CELEBRATE 100TH SEASON

The NFL is celebrating its 100th season in 2019. As the United States' oldest professional football franchise still in existence, the Cardinals hold a unique place in league history.

The Cardinals were founded in 1898 as the Morgan Athletic Club, predating the formation

of the NFL by over 20 years. By the time the NFL was founded in 1920 as the American Professional Football Association (APFA), the team was known as the Racine Cardinals when it became one of the 14 charter members of the upstart league after paying a \$100 franchise fee. Today, the Cardinals and Chicago Bears represent the only two charter members of the NFL still in existence.

In 1932, Hall of Fame owner Charles W. Bidwill, Sr., then a vice president of the Bears, purchased the Cardinals. After divesting himself of his Bears' holdings, that began a period of family ownership that continues today with current owner **William V. Bidwill** and team president **Michael Bidwill**.

In 2019, the Cardinals will join the NFL in celebrating 100 years of play with a year-long series of "NFL 100" events, initiatives and programs celebrating fans, players and communities.

The historic and unprecedented celebration is a salute to the millions of fans who love the game; highlighting the unifying nature of football and its positive impact in communities; bringing together generations of past, present and future players; and looking ahead to the NFL's next 100 years.

CARDS A MEMBER OF NFL'S TWO OLDEST RIVALRIES

Having met twice during the NFL's inaugural season in 1920, the Cardinals and Bears represent the oldest rivalry in league history. The Cardinals and Packers – who joined the league in 1921 – are the NFL's second-oldest rivalry. The Packers were formed in 1919 by Earl (Curly) Lambeau and George Calhoun but did not gain entry into the AFPA until 1921.



• The Cards and Bears have faced each other 90 times during the regular season, dating back to 1920.

1920 Racine Cardinals

• The first-ever meeting between the Cardinals and Bears – then known as the Racine Cardinals and Decatur Staleys – occurred at Normal Park in Chicago on November 28th, 1920, exactly 72 days after the league was conceived as the APFA during a meeting in Canton, OH. In that game, the Cardinals defeated the Staleys 7-6 at Normal Park.

• The first meeting between the Cardinals and Packers (a 3-3 tie) occurred on November 20, 1921 at Normal Park in Chicago. The following week (November 27, 1921), the Packers and Bears met for the first time.

FRIENDSHIP OF THE HALL OF FAME OWNERS

Cardinals Hall of Fame owner Charles Bidwill and Bears Hall of Fame owner George Halas had a friendship that endured even as their team's were cross-town rivals during their shared time in Chicago.

At one point during the Great Depression, that friendship helped save Halas' ownership of the Bears.

In 1931, Halas' co-owner Edward "Dutch" Sternaman proposed being bought out of his stake in the Bears

for \$38,000, which was to be payed in installments. After suffering \$18,000 in losses during the 1932 season, Halas was \$15,000 short when the final payment was due in 1933. Defaulting on the payment meant ownership would revert to Sternaman.

"It was a case of finding \$15,000 in a hurry, or losing everything I'd worked for since moving the Staleys from Decatur to Chicago in 1921," Halas wrote in 1967 in a history of the Bears published in the Chicago Tribune. "From this desperate situation, I was rescued by the joint efforts of my mother and my good friend Charley Bidwill. Mother bought \$5,000 worth of stock from her savings. Bidwill purchased \$5,000 in stock and also arranged a bank loan for the remaining \$5,000 needed. But it was a mighty close call. As I remember, I finally got all the money together at 11:10 a.m. on the day the final note came due. Forfeit time was 12 o'clock noon."

A HISTORY OF BEING THE FIRST

In addition to being the oldest professional football team in the country, the Cardinals also have a long history of serving as a pioneer in the sport - both on and off the playing field.

1st Female Owner in NFL History: Following the 1947 death of Cardinals owner and Pro Football HOFer Charles Bidwill, his wife Violet oversaw operations of the franchise for the next 15 years. As such, she became the first female to serve as principal own-

er in NFL history and is believed to be the first female owner in American pro sports.

1st African American Female Executive in NFL History:

Adele Harris spent 26 seasons with the franchise before retiring in 2001. She holds the distinction of being the first African American female to hold a front office position with an NFL team. Harris first worked as a secretary for the St. Louis Football Cardinals from 1971-74. She left the club to pursue a degree in business management and returned to the team in 1978 as a publicity assistant. By 1980, Harris became the team's director of community relations, and was instrumental in the team's civic efforts when it relocated to Arizona in 1988. Harris passed away in November of 2007.

1st African American to Handle Contract Negotiations for NFL Team: In 1981, the team hired attorney Bob Wallace, making him the first African American to handle contract negotiations for an NFL club.

1st African American Head Coach/General Manager Tandem: In 2004, the Cardinals hired Dennis Green as the team's head coach. Joining General Manager Rod Graves, they became the first African American general manager/ head coach pairing. Hired by Arizona in 1997 as Assistant to the President, Graves spent 16 seasons with the organization, including the last six years at the team's GM.

1st Female Coach in NFL History: In 2015, the Cardinals hired Jen Welter as a coaching intern for training camp and the preseason to work with inside linebackers, making her the first female coach of any kind in NFL history.

INTERNATIONAL PLAY

1st NFL Game Outside of North America: The most popular sport in the United States played before an international audience for the first time ever when the Cardinals and San Diego Chargers met for a preseason matchup at Korakuen Stadium in Tokyo, Japan. On August 16, 1976 the Cardinals defeated the Chargers 20-10 before an estimated crowd of 38,000.

1st NFL Game in Europe: On August 6, 1983 the Cardinals faced the Minnesota Vikings in a preseason matchup at Wembley Stadium in London. The Vikings defeated the Cardinals 28-10 in front of 32,847 fans at the landmark event.

1st NFL Regular Season Game Played Outside United States: On October 2, 2005 the Cardinals earned a 17-point come-from-behind victory over the San Francisco 49ers in a game played in front of a then-record crowd of 103,467 at Mexico City's Estadio Azteca. It was the first NFL regular season game ever played outside of the US.

FOOTBALL FIRSTS

1st Night Game in NFL History: On November 6, 1929 the Providence Steamrollers became the first team to host a game at night using floodlights in a matchup against the Cardinals. That night contest also featured the first use of a football painted white during an actual game. With fan attendance crucial to generate revenue, the game was played in

the evening rather than during the workday. The minor league baseball field of Kinsley Park was adorned with floodlights and the Cards earned a 16-0 victory over the Steamrollers.

1st Out of Town Training Camp: Prior to the 1929 season, the Cardinals conducted what is believed to be the NFL's first extended out-of-town training camp when the team spent the summer at Waterworks Park in Coldwater, Michigan.

1st Indoor NFL Game: With the country struggling through the Great Depression in late 1930, the Chicago Cardinals challenged the cross-town Bears to play a game to raise money for the governor's fund for unemployment relief. To battle the freezing temperatures the teams agreed to play at Chicago Stadium, then the largest indoor arena in the world. On December 15, 1930 the Bears earned a 9-7 victory in front of 10,000 fans. Six inches of dirt were hauled in and rolled for a playing surface, forcing the teams to use a white ball to increase visibility for both the players and fans. In addition to raising thousands of dollars for charity, it was a precursor to the 1932 championship when the Bears played for the NFL title in the same venue against the Portsmouth Spartans.

1st Retractable Grass Field in NFL History: When the Cardinals opened their new stadium in 2006, the venue broke the mold in terms of design and architecture. Among its most unique features is a fully retractable grass playing surface that resides outside the stadium for 300+ days a year and rolls in when needed. The first of its kind in NFL history, the stadium's grass playing surface has consistently ranked #1 in surveys of the league's players.

TAKING THE REINS

On January 8, 2019 the Cardinals announced the hiring of Kliff Kingsbury as the team's head coach.

The 40-year old Kingsbury spent the past six seasons (2013-18) as the head coach at his alma mater, Texas Tech, and was hired as USC's offensive coordinator in December. The New Braunfels, TX native is an 11-year coaching veteran who has also worked at Texas A&M (2012) and at the University of Houston (2008-11) where he began his coaching career.

Recognized as one of the profession's brightest and most-innovative offensive minds, Kingsbury has tutored six future NFL QBs, including first-round selections Patrick Mahomes, Baker Mayfield and Johnny Manziel as well as Case Keenum,

Davis Webb and Nic Shimonek. Under Kingsbury's guidance, Mahomes (2016) and Keenum (2009, '11) both led the nation in passing.

Highlights from Kingsbury's Coaching Career

 While at Texas Tech, Kingsbury served as the play-caller for one of college football's most explosive and productive offenses. The Red Raiders featured a passing attack that ranked in the top-10 in the country in all six seasons of his tenure, ranked in the top-20 nationally for total offense in all six seasons and finished in the top-25 in scoring five times.

• Under Kingsbury, Texas Tech averaged at least 30 points per game, 470 The Red Raiders averaged more than 500 yards of offense in four seasons. The Red Raiders averaged more than 500 yards of offense in four seasons and over 450 passing yards twice. They also averaged at least 140 rushing yards per game four times in six seasons under Kingsbury and averaged more than 40 points per game twice.

• At both Houston (2011) and Texas Tech (2016) Kingsbury's offenses led the nation in total offense and passing offense.

• Dating back to his first offensive coordinator job at Houston in 2011, a Kingsbury-led offense never finished outside the top-20 in the nation in total offense and never finished outside the top-15 in passing offense.

• In 2016, Texas Tech led the nation in total offense (566.6 ypg) and pass-ing offense (463.0 ypg) while finishing #5 in scoring (43.7 ppg). It was the sixth consecutive season a Kingsbury-led unit finished in the top-10 in total offense dating back to his time at both Houston and Texas A&M.

 In 2015, the Red Raiders finished #2 in the nation in total offense (579.5 In 2015, the Red Raiders finished #2 in the nation in total offense (37.5.5 ypg), #2 in scoring offense (45.1 ppg) and had the nation's second ranked passing offense (388.2 ypg). The 45.1 points per game average established a school single-season record and Texas Tech was one of just two schools schools in the second ranked area into a school single-season record and Texas Tech was one of just two schools areas the second ranked areas the second in the nation to score at least 25 points in every game. The Red Raiders featured a 4,000-yard passer, 1,000-yard receiver and a 1,000-yard rusher for the first time in school history.

 With Kingsbury serving as co-offensive coordinator in 2011, Houston led the nation in total offense (599.1 ypg), passing offense (450.1 ypg) and scoring (49.3 ppg) as quarterback Case Keenum finished his collegiate career as the most prolific passer in NCAA FBS history.


Kingsbury spent the 2012 season at Texas A&M as offensive coordinator/ QBs coach working under current University of Arizona head coach Kevin Sumlin. Texas A&M finished third nationally in total offense (558.5 ypg) with an attack that finished 13th nationally in rushing (242.1 ypg) and 14th in passing (316.5 ypg). The Aggies beat #1 Alabama on the road and #11 Oklahoma in the Cotton Bowl.

Kingsbury began his coaching career at the University of Houston under Sumlin as the offensive quality control coach (2008-09) prior to being el-evated to QBs coach (2010) and then co-offensive coordinator in 2011.

Kingsbury played QB at Texas Tech (1999-2002) where he set 39 school records, 16 Big 12 marks and 17 NCAA records during his collegiate career while throwing for 12,423 yards and 95 TDs. As a senior in 2012, he was awarded the Sammy Baugh Trophy as the nation's top college QB and was also named the Associated Press Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year while faiching night in Universe Texaburgation. finishing ninth in Heisman Trophy voting

He was drafted in the sixth round of the NFL Draft by New England in 2003 and spent his rookie season on the Patriots injured reserve list before spending the 2004 season on the Saints practice squad. Kingsbury played in one game with the Jets in 2005 and attended training camp with the Bills in 2006. He also played with the Cologne Centurions of NFL Europe in 2006 before playing with the Winnipeg Blue Bombers of the Canadian Football League in 2007.

In 2018, Kingsbury was inducted into the Texas High School Football Hall of Fame. He played high school football under his father, Tim, at New Braunfels (TX) High School where he threw for more than 3,000 yards and 34 TDs as a senior.



KINGSBURY ERA BEGINS IN UNIQUE FASHION

Cardinals first-year head coach Kliff Kingsbury made his NFL debut in the Cardinals matchup against the Lions in Week 1. At 40 years, 30 days old he became the youngest Week 1 head coach for the Cardinals since Joe Kuharich (35 years, 166 days) in 1952.

A RARE RESULT IN HIS FIRST GAME

Exactly 98 years, 10 months and 30 days after playing their first game as an NFL franchise (0-0 tie against the Chicago Tigers), the Cardi-nals played to a 27-27 tie with the Lions in the season-opener against the Lions in Week 1.

Kingsbury joins the coach from that '20 matchup vs. the Tigers – Pro Football Hall of Famer **Paddy Driscoll** – as the only coaches in franchise history to have their debut game end in a tie.

Prior to Kingsbury, the last NFL coaching debut that resulted in a tie was Detroit's Joe Schmidt, who led the Lions to a 17-17 tie against the Packers on 9/17/67.

COACHING QUARTERBACKS

After joining the coaching ranks with the University of Houston in 2008, Kliff Kingsbury mentored six future NFL QBs during his coaching tenure: Patrick Mahomes, Baker Mayfield, Johnny Manziel, Case Keenum, Davis Webb and Nic Shimonek. Mahomes, Mayfield and Manziel were all selected in the 1st round of the NFL Draft

Mahomes (Texas Tech)

Under Kingsbury's tutelage, Mahomes spent two full seasons (2015-16) as the starter at Texas Tech. In those two years the Red Raiders finished #2 (2015) and #1 (2016) in the nation in total offense while Mahomes threw for a combined 9,705 yards and 77 TDs in 25 starts.

As a sophomore in 2015, Mahomes became the youngest QB in NCAA history to amass 5,000 yards of total offense. He eclipsed the 5,000-yard mark again in 2016, becoming just the third quarterback ever to record 5,000+ yards of total offense in back-to-back seasons.

<u>Keenum (Univ. of Houston)</u>

Kingsbury began his coaching career at the University of Houston where he was a quality control coach from 2008-09 before being

promoted to QBs coach in 2010 and co-offensive coordinator in 2011. The Cougars led the nation in total offense, passing offense and scoring in 2011, while Keenum completed his record-setting career by placing seventh in the Heisman Trophy voting and winning the Sammy Baugh Award.

With Kingsbury calling plays, the Cougars averaged 599.1 total yards per game, including 450.1 through the air, while scoring over 49 points per game. Keenum wrapped up his career as the most prolific passer in NCAA FBS history. In his one season with Kingsbury as his QBs coach, Keenum completed 428-of-604 passes for 5,631 yards and 48 TDs, all of which led the NCAA FBS.

Manziel (Texas A&M)

Prior to taking over at Texas Tech, Kingsbury spent one season (2012) as the offensive coordinator at Texas A&M. In his lone season with the Aggies, Kingsbury played a crucial role in Manziel becoming the first freshman ever to win the . Heisman Trophy.

Webb and Shimonek (Texas Tech)

Two other Kingsbury quarterbacks have also moved on to the league in recent years as Webb was selected by the New York Giants in the third round of the 2017 draft while Shimonek signed an undrafted free agent agreement with the Los Angeles Chargers in 2018.



TOM CLEMENTS - PASS GAME COORDINATOR/QBS

Now in his first season as the Cardinals Pass Game Coordinator/ QBs coach, veteran assistant Tom Clements (CLEM-ents) is a 24-year coaching veteran who has spent 20 seasons as an assistant coach in the NFL, including five seasons as an offensive coordinator.

• Named Cardinals pass game co-ordinator/QBs coach on 1/22/19.

• Coached for 11 seasons with the Packers (2006-16). In his 11 sea-

sons with Green Bay, the Packers finished top-10 in the NFL in total offense nine times, made the postseason nine times and won Super Bowl XLV following the 2010 season.

• During his tenure with the Packers, Clements helped with the development of QB Aaron Rodgers who was selected to six Pro Bowls and earned NFL MVP honors in 2011 and 2014.

• In three seasons as offensive coordinator with Green Bay (2012-14), the Packers ranked #3 in the NFL in scoring (27.8 pp), #5 in total offense (381.9 ypg), #3 in giveaways (54) and #5 in first downs (1,048).

• The Packers finished top-10 in the NFL in scoring in each season Clements worked as offensive coordinator, including in 2014 when the Packers led the NFL with 486 points.

 Also coached QB Brett Favre, who in 2007 was selected to the Pro Bowl after throwing for more than 4,000 yards for the fifth time in his career and led the Packers to the NFC Championship game.

• Has coached 13 different offensive players to a total of 21 Pro Bowls and tutored five quarterbacks who had 13 total 3,000-yard passing seasons, including eight 4,000-yard campaigns.

Prior to joining Green Bay, Clements spent two seasons (2004-05) as the offensive coordinator in Buffalo. He spent the previous seven years as a QBs coach with Pittsburgh, Kansas City and New Orleans. Clements helped Elvis Grbac (Chiefs in 2000) and Kordell Stewart (Steelers in 2001) earn Pro Bowl selections while Tommy Maddox (Pittsburgh) was named NFL Comeback Player of the Year in 2002.

Clements got his start in coaching at his alma mater, Notre Dame, spending four seasons (1992-95) working under Lou Holtz. He played 12 years in the Canadian Football League as a QB and was a seven-time divisional All-Star, 1987 CFL MVP, 1975 CFL Rookie of the Year and two-time Gray Cup Champion with Ottawa (1976) and Winnipeg (1984), earning the Outstanding Offensive Player award in each game.

JEFF RODGERS - ASST. HEAD COACH/SPECIAL TEAMS

Jeff Rodgers is in his second season with Arizona and first as the team's assistant head coach/special teams coordinator.

He came to Cardinals in January, 2018 as the team's special teams coordinator and added the title of assistant head coach in 2019

• Hired as Cardinals special teams coordinator in 2018 after working in the same capacity for three seasons (2015-17) with the Chicago Bears.

• Has 18 years of coaching experience, including 15 seasons coaching special teams in the NFL with Arizona, Chicago (2015-17), Denver (2011-14), Carolina (2009-10) and San Francisco (2003-07).

• Helped the Cardinals rank 5th in the NFL in special teams last season after the team finished 30th in 2017. P Andy Lee led the NFL and set a franchise single-season record with a 48.6-yard punting average and rookie LB Zeke Turner led the NFL with 13 solo special teams tackles in 2018.

CARDINALS

•The Broncos returned six kicks for TDs during Rodgers tenure in Denver (2011-14), tied for the second most in the NFL in that span. In 2012, Trindon Holliday became the first player in NFL history to record multiple return TDs in a playoff game when he scored on a 90-yard punt return and a 104-yard kickoff return in a 38-35 double-overtime loss to the Ravens.

• Under Rodgers tutelage, Broncos K Matt Prater was named to the Pro Bowl in 2013 after setting franchise records in field goal percentage (96.2%; 25-of-26) and points scored (150). Prater's 64-yard field goal in 2013 is the longest in NFL history. In 2014, K Connor Barth's 93.8 field-goal percentage (15-of-16) was the second-highest in team history.

Rodgers began his coaching career at the University of Arizona in 2001, spending two seasons as a graduate assistant working with the secondary and LBs under head coach John Mackovic. He entered the NFL coaching ranks with San Francisco in 2003 as a special teams quality control coach for two seasons.

VANCE JOSEPH - DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR

Vance Joseph was hired as Arizona's Defensive Coordinator this offseason and joined the Cardinals after two years (2017-18) as head coach of the Denver Broncos.

He is a 20-year coaching veteran, including 14 seasons in the NFL with San Francisco (2005-10), Houston (2011-13), Cincinnati (2014-15), Miami (2016) and Denver (2017-18)

 Hired as Cardinals defensive coordinator on 1/11/19.

• Joseph has 12 years of coaching experience on the defensive side of the ball in the NFL, including as defensive coordinator with Miami in 2016.



• In Joseph's initial season with the Broncos in 2017, Denver had the NFL's #3 ranked defense and joined Minnesota as the only teams in the NFL that season to rank in the top-five in both run defense and pass defense. The Broncos ranked #5 in run defense in '17 after finishing the previous year ranked #28 in that category.

• In 2018, the Broncos defense ranked in the top-10 in the NFL in INTs (17), takeaways (28) and sacks (44). Rookie LB Bradley Chubb – Denver's first-round selection in the 2018 NFL Draft – led all NFL rookies with 12.0 sacks last season. Pro Bowl LB Von Miller had 14.5 sacks, tied for fourth in the NFL last season. Denver was one of three teams (Seattle, Kansas City) to have two players record double digit sacks in 2018.

• In a stretch from 2011-16, which spanned jobs in Houston, Cincinnati and Miami, Joseph's teams made the postseason five times in six seasons.

• Joseph's teams have ranked in the top-10 in INTs in four of the past five seasons.

• Four different DBs earned a combined five Pro Bowl selections - Johnathan Joseph (2), Reggie Nelson (1), Adam Jones (1) and Walt Harris (1) – during Joseph's time coaching defensive backs in Cincinnati, Houston and San Francisco.

Prior to his tenure in Miami, Joseph coached DBs for two seasons (2014-15) with Cincinnati, helping the Bengals to back-to-back postseason appearances. During his two seasons with Cincinnati, the Bengals led the NFL with 41 INTs. Cincinnati was the only team to post more INTs than TDs allowed (36) during that two-year stretch while holding opposing QBs to the lowest combined passer rating (77.4) in the NFL.

Prior to beginning his coaching career as a grad assistant at the University of Colorado in 2000, Joseph appeared in 30 games for the Buffaloes (1990-94), playing QB, RB and on special teams, and was a member of the Buffaloes 1990 National Championship team. He served as a backup to All-American QBs Darian Hagan and Kordell Stewart and completed 34-of-61 passes for 454 yards and four TDs to go along with 50 carries for 237 yards and one TD in his college career.

He converted to CB in the NFL and signed with the Jets as an undrafted rookie free agent in 1995. As a rookie, Joseph played in 13 games and had 21 tackles (17 solo), two INTs and five passes defensed. He played in four games with the Colts in 1996 before spending the preseason with Denver in 1997.

COACHING STAFF HIGHLIGHTS

• Of the 25 coaches on the Cards staff, 18 are new to the organization. The seven returning coaches are Chris Achuff (Defensive Line), Steve Heiden (Tight Ends), Randall McCray (Asst. Special Teams), Buddy Morris Strength & Conditioning), Jeff Rodgers (Asst. Head Coach/Special Teams Coordinator), Vernon Stephens (Asst. Strength & Conditioning) and Cam Turner (Offensive Asst./Asst. Quarterbacks).



• The Cards coaching staff entered the 2019 season with a combined 419 years of coaching experience at the college and NFL levels: 201 in the NFL; 218 in college. Of the 25 coaches on staff, 21 entered the season with NFL coaching experience.

• In addition to their experience on the sidelines, the Cardinals staff features seven coaches who played a combined 38 years in the NFL: Kliff Kingsbury (3), Vance Joseph (2), Tom Clements (1), Steve Heiden (11), Brian Natkin (1), Marcus Robertson (12) and James Saxon (8).

 Nine members of the Arizona staff entered the year having coached at least 10 seasons in the NFL: Jerry Sullivan (24), Bill Davis (24), Tom Clements (20), James Saxon (19), Jeff Rodgers (15), Vance Joseph (14), Sean Kugler (12), Marcus Robertson (12) and Greg Williams (10).

• Three members of the staff - Kingsbury (Texas Tech), Joseph (Denver Broncos) and Sean Kugler (Texas-El Paso) - have previously served as a head coach either at the college or NFL level.

CHRIS ACHUFF - Defensive Line



Last name pronounced "A-cuff" ... long-time college assistant is in his second season with the Cardinals and first as the D-Line coach ... joined the Cardinals in 2018 after 19 years coaching at the collegiate level, coaching the D-line at Baylor (2008-16), Tennessee-Martin (2006-07), Charleston Southern (2005) and Tennessee-Chattanooga (2004).

PETER BEDOVINAC - Asst. Wide Receivers



Last name pronounced "buh-DOE-vuh-nack" ... spent the last six seasons (2013-18) at the college level ... a former QB at Michigan State (2010-12), spent the 2018 season as a defensive graduate assistant at Ohio State ... spent the previous three seasons (2015-17) coaching LBs at Missouri State after beginning his coaching career at Missouri in 2013.

CHARLIE BULLEN - Asst. Linebackers

ROB GROSSO - Defensive Quality Control



Is in his first season in Arizona after working as the assistant to the head coach under Vance Joseph in Denver in 2018 ... previously served as an operations intern with the Broncos in 2017 ... a former WR at John Carroll University (2011-13), worked with the Arizona Rattlers of the IFL during the 2017 season as a coaching/player personnel intern.

STEVE HEIDEN - Tight Ends



Veteran NFL tight end is in his seventh season with the Cardinals and first as TEs coach after working the past six seasons as asst. O-Line coach (2018) and asst. special teams/asst. TEs coach (2013-17) ... after playing in the NFL for 11 seasons (1999-2009), entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as TEs coach at Concordia University in St. Paul, MN.

SEAN KUGLER - Offensive Line



Last name pronounced "KOOG-ler" ... a 29-year coaching veteran, has spent 12 seasons as an assistant in the NFL having previously coached with Detroit (2001-05), Buffalo (2007-09) and Pittsburgh (2010-12) in addition to last season with Denver as the Broncos O-Line/guards/centers coach ... was the head coach at his alma mater, Texas-El Paso, for five seasons (2013-17).

RANDALL McCRAY - Asst. Special Teams



Now in his second year with the Cardinals in '19 ... a college assistant coach for 26 seasons, was hired by the Cardinals in 2018 ... came to Arizona after spending two years as Texas State's assistant head coach, defensive coordinator and LBs coach ... began his coaching career as a grad assistant at South Carolina in 1991.

RUSTY MCKINNEY - Defensive Asst.



In his first season with the Cardinals - and sixth in the NFL - after after spending the past three seasons as a defensive quality control coach with Miami, including working under Cardinals defensive coordinator Vance Joseph in 2016 ... started in the NFL with Cleveland as a coaching intern for two seasons (2014-15) after five seasons (2009-13) at Bentley University.

BUDDY MORRIS - Strength & Conditioning



Now in his fifth season as the Cards strength and conditioning coach ... previously with the Browns (2002-04), returned to the NFL in 2014 with the Cardinals following stints at the Univ. of Buffalo and the Univ. of Pittsburgh ... in 2009, Muscle & Fitness Magazine named his private gym (New York Sports Center) one of the 10 toughest in America.

BRIAN NATKIN - Asst. Offensive Line

Joined the Cardinals in 2019 after spending the last 15 seasons at the college level ... a consensus All-American TE as a player at the University of Texas-El Paso, spent the 2018 season as run-game coordinator/O-Line coach at Hutchinson (KS) Community College ... worked the previous six seasons (2012-17) at his alma mater, UTEP.

DAVID RAIH - Wide Receivers



Last name pronounced "RYE" ... spent the last five seasons with Green Bay as WRs coach (2018), offensive perimeter coach (2017), asst. O-Line coach (2016) and coaching administrator (2014-15) ... played QB at Iowa (1999-2003) and helped the Hawkeyes to a 2002 Big Ten Conference Championship and a berth in the 2003 FedEx Orange Bowl.

MARCUS ROBERTSON - Defensive Backs



A former NFL DB, is in his first season as Arizona's DBs coach after spending the past two seasons (2017-18) in the same role with the Broncos ... has spent the last 28 seasons in the NFL as a player, coach, and administrator and has coached DBs for the past 12 seasons with Tennessee (2007-11), Detroit (2012-13), Oakland (2014-16) and Denver.

JAMES SAXON - Running Backs



Has 19 seasons of experience as a RBs coach (2000-18) in the NFL after an eight-year playing career in the league with the Chiefs (1988-91), Dolphins (1992-94) and Eagles (1995) ... came to AZ after coaching Pittsburgh's RBs the past five seasons (2014-18) ... has coached for four different franchises that had eight total postseason appearances.

JERRY SULLIVAN - Offensive Asst.



Returned to the Cardinals as an offensive assistant for his second tenure with the team after previously serving as WRs coach (2001-02) and offensive coordinator (2003) ... has 47 years of experience, including 24 seasons in the NFL with the Chargers (1992-96), Lions (1997-2000), Cardinals (2001-03), Dolphins (2004), 49ers (2005-10) and Jaguars (2012-16).

CAM TURNER - Offensive Asst./Asst. Quarterbacks



A former WR and QB at The Citadel, now in his second year with Arizona's coaching staff in '19 ... spent three seasons (2015-17) in Carolina, where he assisted WRs for two years before serving as the assistant QBs coach in 2017 ... prior to Carolina, spent two seasons (2013-14) as the QBs and WRs coach at Florida International.

SPENCER WHIPPLE - Offensive Quality Control



In his first NFL season after spending the past seven years at the college level ... coached the last five seasons (2014-18) at the Univ. of Massachusetts where he served as the passing game coordinator/QBs coach in '18 ... joined the UMass staff in 2014 as TEs coach before working the following three seasons (2015-17) as passing game coordinator/WRs coach.

GREG WILLIAMS - Cornerbacks



Came to Arizona after spending last season coaching DBs with the Broncos ... has 15 years of coaching experience, including 10 seasons in the NFL ... a former WR and DB at the University of North Carolina (1994-97), spent time in training camp with the Bears and Giants ... began his coaching career at Arizona State as an intern in 2003.

CHRIS WILSON - Defensive Asst.



Is in his first season with the Cardinals as a defensive assistant ... came to Arizona after spending the past three seasons (2016-18) as the D-Line coach with the Eagles ... previously coached with the Cardinals as part of the NFL's minority internship program in 1997 ... son, Caleb, is a TE drafted by the Cardinals in the seventh round of the 2019 NFL Draft.

ELEVATING A FRANCHISE

The 2019 season is the 13th since Michael **Bidwill** took over as team President in 2007. His leadership during that time has been instrumental in transforming the franchise both on and off the field.

Highlights of Bidwill's tenure: • Leading the list of Bidwill's accomplishments with the Cardinals is the creation of State Farm Stadium. Since it opened in 2006, the team has sold out all 139 games (preseason and postseason included) played at the venue, which has also hosted a pair of Super Bowls.

• In addition to his role in helping Arizona land Super Bowls XLII and XLIX, he led the effort to land Super Bowl LVII (2023) in the spring of 2018. Michael was instrumental in getting the 2015 Pro Bowl moved to Arizona; played a week before Super Bowl XLIX and the 2015 Pro Bowl combined to deliver a record economic impact of \$720 million to the region.

• Of the Cardinals seven all-time postseason wins, five have come during Bidwill's 12 years as team president. Arizona has played in nine postseason contests since Bidwill took over in 2007.

• AZ has appeared in the NFC Championship Game twice during Bidwill's time as president (2008, 2015), including a victory in the 2008 conference title game that led to the team's first-ever Super Bowl appearance (Super Bowl XLIII).

 Arizona's 50 wins between 2013-17 were the most in any five-year span in franchise history.

• In January of 2016, the National Football Foundation (NFF) and College Hall of Fame inducted Bidwill and Arizona Governor Doug Ducey into the NFF Leadership Hall of Fame.

• In January of 2018, Michael was one of five owners named to the NFL's Player-Owner Committee focused on social and racial justice initiatives. In December of 2014, Commissioner Roger Goodell tapped Bidwill to chair the league's Conduct Committee.

• In January of 2019, Michael received the Paul Tagliabue Award from the Fritz Pollard Alliance for demonstrating integrity and leadership in the area of career development for minorities and advocating for diversity.

Valley Will Host 4th Super Bowl When Game Returns in 2023

The biggest event in American sports is returning to Arizona as State Farm Stadium was se lected to host Super Bowl LVII that will cap the 2022 NFL season

Super Bowl LVII will be the fourth Super Bowl played in Arizona and the third in 15 years at State Farm Stadium. The Valley last hosted Super Bowl XLIX following the 2014 season. With Super Bowl LVII being held at State Farm Stadium, Arizona will join South Florida, New Orleans, Los Angeles and Tampa Bay as the only sites selected to host the Super Bowl at least four times

THRILLING THE HOME FANS

Fitzgerald has been thrilling fans at State Farm Stadium since the venue opened in 2006. He has played 105 career regular season games in 13-plus seasons at State Farm Stadium.

In those contests, he has totaled 616 receptions. In NFL history, only WR Jerry Rice had more recéptions in a single stadium. Fitzgerald needs 31 receptions

over the final five homes games in 2019 to pass Rice for most catches in a single venue.



In fact, Fitzgerald's career numbers already surpass all but one receiver currently in the HOF (Rice). He has more career receptions than 26 of the 27 receivers in the HOF: Swann (336), Hayes (371), Pihos (373), Lavelli (386), Hirsch (387), Fears (400), Warfield (427), McDonald (495), Mitchell (521), Stallworth (537), Alworth (542), Biletnikoff (589), Berry (631), Maynard (633), Taylor (649), Irvin (750), Joiner (750), Lofton (764), Largent (819), Monk (940), Reed (951), Moss (982), Owens (1,078), Brown (1,094), Carter (1,101) and Harrison (1,102).

He has more career receiving yards than 26 of the 27 receivers in the HOF: Fears (5,397), Swann (5,462), Pihos (5,619), Lavelli (6,488), Hirsch (7,029), Hayes (7,414), Mitchell (7,954), McDonald (8,410), Warfield (8,565), Stallworth (8,723), Biletnikoff (8,974), Taylor (9,110), Berry (9,275), Alworth (10,266), Maynard (11,834), Irvin (11,904), Joiner (12,146), Monk (12,721), Largent (13,089), Reed (13,198), Carter (13,899), Lofton (14,004), Brown (14,934), Harrison (14,580), Moss (15,292) and Owens (15,934).

A Career Full of Accomplishments:

• Franchise career leader in receptions (1,326), receiving yards (16,579), receiving TDs (118), total TDs (118) and 100-yard receiving games (49). His nine 1,000-yard seasons are also a franchise record.

•Led the NFL with 107 receptions in 2016, marking the second time in his career (103 in 2005; tied with Steve Smith) he had done so. He became the first player in NFL history to lead the NFL in receptions at least 11 years apart. Prior to Fitzgerald, the longest span between leading the league in receptions was six by Jerry Rice (1990, 1996).

• Fitzgerald (11) joins Hall of Famer Jerry Rice (13) as the only wide receivers in NFL history to be named to the Pro Bowl at least 11 times.

• Fitzgerald had more receptions in his first 200 career games (1,116) than any player in NFL history.

•One of just seven players in NFL history to record at least 1,400 receiving yards in a season four times in their career: Jerry Rice (6), Julio Jones (5), Randy Moss (4), Marvin Harrison (4), Antonio Brown (4) and Andre Johnson (4).

•At 28 years, 74 days old, he became the third-youngest player in NFL history to reach 70 career receiving TDs behind only Randy Moss (26 years, 269 days old) and Hall of Famer Jerry Rice (28 years, one day old).

•At 32 years, 97 days old, he became the youngest player in NFL history to reach 1,000 career receptions.

•At 31 years, 102 days old, he became the youngest player in NFL history to reach 900 career receptions.

•At 30 years, 57 days old, he became the youngest player in NFL history to reach 800 career receptions.

•At 30 years, 85 days old, he became the youngest player in NFL history to reach 11,000 receiving yards.

•In 2010, he became the first player in NFL history to record 90+ receptions five times in their first seven seasons.

• During the 2008 postseason, he broke virtually every major playoff receiving record, establishing new single-season marks for receptions (30), receiving yards (546) and TDs (7). His four 100-yard receiving games in the postseason established a new NFL record for consecutive games with 100 yards receiving.

• His 10 TD receptions in nine career postseason games are an NFL record for a player in their first nine career playoff contests.

•With a then franchise-record 103 receptions during the 2005 season, he became the youngest player in NFL history to record a 100-catch campaign when he reached the mark at 22 years, 123 days old.

•Led the NFL in receiving TDs in both the 2008 (12) and 2009 (13) seasons. In addition to his 10 receiving TDs in 2007, he became the first player in franchise history to record at least 10 TDs in three consecutive seasons.

•At 29 years, 44 days old, joined Randy Moss (28 years, 314 days) as the only players in NFL history to reach 10,000 career receiving yards before the age of 30.

•One of just five players in NFL history to record 15,000+ receiving yards and 100+ TD receptions in their career.

TWO SEASONS IN AZ, TWO TEAM RECORDS



A trio of rookie draft picks – DL Zach Allen (one game), CB Byron Murphy Jr. (four) and S Deionte Thompson (one) - have started for the Cardinals on defense this season.

<u>CB BYRON MURPHY JR.</u>

The first pick in the second round of the 2019 NFL Draft out of Washington, Murphy has 19 tackles and leads all NFL rookies with three passes defensed (tied with Packers S Darnell Savage), according to official league statistics.

He started all 20 games he played during his final two seasons (2017-18) with the Huskies and earned first-team All-America and All-Pac-12 honors with 58 tackles, four INTs (one returned for a TD), four tackles for loss, 17 passes defensed and a forced fumble as a senior.

ZACH ALLEN

DL ZACH ALLEN Allen was drafted by the Cardinals in the third round (65th overall) out of Boston College. He was the ACC's highest-rated edge defender last season and one of the top edge defenders in the 2019 NFL Draft according to ProFootballFocus.com.

Allen played four seasons (2015-18) for the Eagles, appearing in 50 games and totaling 199 tackles, 40.5 tackles for loss, 18.5 sacks 16 passes defensed, four fumble recoveries, two INTs and two blocked kicks.

<u>S DEIONTE THOM</u>PSON

Arizona's fifth-round pick (139th overall) in the 2019 NFL Draft, Thompson has played all four games this season and made his first-career start in a nickel formation in Week 2 against the Ravens.

In three seasons (2016-18) at Alabama, Thompson appeared in 43 games (17 starts) and totaled 113 tackles, 4.5 tackles for loss, three INTs, 10 passes defensed, four forced fumbles and a fumble recovery. He was a a consensus first-team All-American as a senior in 2018.

UNDRAFTED BUT SPECIAL

Three second-year players have made significant contributions on special teams after joining the Cardinals as undrafted rookies in 2018.

LB EZEKIEL TURNER

Turner led the NFL with 13 solo spe-<u>cial teams tackles last season.</u> He finished second in the NFL with 15 total special teams tackles, and he has added four more in three games this season.

Turner, who appeared in all 16 games in 2018 (one start) was named Special Teams Player of the Month (September) by ProFootballFocus.com.

LB DENNIS GARDECK

Gardeck appeared in all 16 games and led all NFL rookies with 388 special teams snaps in 2018. Among all NFL players last season, only Jets WR Terrence Brooks (395) played more snaps on special teams than Gardeck.

In the 2018 season finale at Seattle, Gardeck deflected a punt, recovered a blocked punt for a TD and had a special teams tackle against the Seahawks. Late in the third quarter, Gardeck recovered a blocked punt in the end zone for his first career TD.

It was the Cardinals first blocked punt returned for a TD since 10/12/08 vs. Dallas. For Gardeck, it was his first TD since his senior year at Crystal Lake (IL) South High School in 2012 (80-yard fumble return). In the 2019 season-opener vs. Detroit, Gardeck deflected another punt, giving Arizona possession at midfield and resulting in a TD drive that forced OT.

WR TRENT SHERFIELD

In Week 1 against the Lions, Sherfield recorded an open-field tackle for minusthree yards on punt coverage and recovered a muffed punt at the Lions eightyard line that led to the Cardinals first points of the season (Zane Gonzalez FG).

Sherfield on playing gunner on punt coverage: "I take pride in playing that position. I love it, being able to go down there and make plays, set the oppos-ing team back in field position and help the defense out."

The Cardinals signed P Andy Lee just prior to the 2017 season, and during his first year in Arizona, he set a franchise single-season record with a 47.3-yard punting average. In 2018, Lee topped himself, breaking his own record with an NFL-high 48.6-yard average last season.

Arizona State product and 2016 Lou Groza Award winner Zane Gonzalez made his Cardinals debut in Week 13 at Green Bay last season. He connected on both FG attempts in the win over the Packers, including the game-winning 44-yard FG with just 1:41 remaining in the fourth quarter.

Gonzalez entered the NFL with Cleveland in 2017, and the Browns were 0-17-1 during his time with the team. He earned his first-career victory by kicking Arizona's game-winner against the Packers.


GONZALEZ CARRIES MOMENTUM INTO 2019

QUARTERBACKS

Brett Hundley – Chandler, AZ native and 2009 Arizona Gatorade Player of the Year. Packers 2015 fifth-round pick out of UCLA, spent his first four NFL seasons with Green Bay (2015-17) and Seattle (2018).

Kyler Murray – First QB in NFL history to complete 25+ passes in each of his first three career games and the second to throw for 300+ yards in each of his first two career games. Completed 106-of-169 passes for 1,071 yards and four TDs in four games.

RUNNING BACKS

Chase Edmonds – First Fordham alum to score an NFL TD since 1988 when he scored two against the Packers in Week 13. Has 443 all-purpose yards on 71 carries, 23 receptions and three kickoff returns in 20 career games (one start).

D.J. Foster – Scottsdale native and ASU product joined the Cardinals in 2017 and re-signed in March. Has 392 all-purpose yards on 13 carries, 18 catches and nine kickoff returns in 14 games with the Patriots (2016) and Cardinals (2017-19).

David Johnson – Tied for third in franchise history with 33 career rushing TDs, tied for seventh with 46 total TDs and joined Larry Fitzgerald as the only players in team history with 10+ TDs in three different seasons (2015-16 and '18).

WIDE RECEIVERS

Damiere Byrd – Signed a one-year contract with the Cardinals in March after playing 17 games (three starts) in three seasons with the Panthers. Has 12 receptions for 96 yards and four kickoff returns for 59 yards in three games (all starts) this year.

Pharoh Cooper – Spent the offseason and training camp with Arizona and rejoined the Cardinals in Week 5 after spending Weeks 1-2 with Cincinnati. Earned All-Pro and Pro Bowl honors with 932 kick return yards and 399 punt return yards in 2017 when he led the NFL with 1,331 combined return yards.

Larry Fitzgerald – Passed HOF TE Tony Gonzalez (1,325) for the second most receptions in NFL history with five catches against Seattle. Franchise leader in receptions (1,326), receiving yards (16,579), receiving TDs (118), total TDs (118), 100-yard receiving games (49), games played (238) and Pro Bowls (11).

Andy Isabella – Consensus first-team All-American at Massachusetts after leading the FBS with a single-season program-record 1,698 receiving yards on 102 receptions (second in FBS) during his senior season in 2019.

KeeSean Johnson – Played 52 games at Fresno State, set a school record with 3,463 receiving yards and led the Bulldogs in all receiving categories in each of his final three seasons on campus. Has 11 catches for 109 yards in four games (one start).

Christian Kirk – Arizona's 2018 second-round pick leads all second-year NFL players with 24 receptions. High school teammate of RB D.J. Foster (2011) and CB Byron Murphy (2014) and played with QB Kyler Murray at Texas A&M.

Trent Sherfield – Has 20 receptions for 225 yards and a TD in 17 games (two starts) after signing with the Cardinals as an undrafted free agent out of Vanderbilt in 2018. Had 136 catches for 1,869 yards and nine TDs in 48 games for the Commodores.

TIGHT ENDS

Charles Clay – Eight-year NFL veteran has 343 receptions for 3,654 yards and 23 TDs in four games (one start). First TE in Bills history with 500 receiving yards in three consecutive seasons – 528 in 2015, 552 in 2016 and 558 in 2017.

Maxx Williams – Signed a one-year contract with the Cardinals in March after four seasons in Baltimore, where he was selected in the second round (55th overall) of the 2015 NFL Draft out of Minnesota. Has three catches for 57 yards this season.

OFFENSIVE LINE

Mason Cole – Cardinals third-round pick (97th overall) in the 2018 NFL Draft was one of just six NFL rookie offensive lineman to start all 16 games last season and the fourth in franchise history to accomplish the feat.

Lamont Gaillard – Selected by the Cardinals in the sixth round (179th overall) of the 2019 NFL Draft out of Georgia, where he started all 42 games in his final three years and earned first-team All-SEC accolades as a senior in 2018.

D.J. Humphries – Cardinals first-round selection (24th overall) in the 2015 NFL Draft has started all 31 NFL games he has played, including the first 10 at RT before moving to LT full-time prior to the 2017 season.

Josh Miles – Selected by Arizona with its first pick in the seventh round (248th overall) of the 2019 NFL Draft, becoming the first Morgan State player ever selected by the Cardinals and just the second player from the program drafted since 1983.

Jordan Mills – Bears 2013 fifth-round pick (163rd Overall) has played 90 games (84 starts) for Chicago (2013-14), Buffalo (2015-18) and Arizona (2019). Signed with Arizona in Week 2 after spending training camp with Miami.

Justin Murray – Started at RT and played every offensive snap in Weeks 1-2 after being claimed on waivers on 9/1. Spent time with the Broncos, Buccaneers, Saints, Bengals and Raiders since entering the NFL as an undrafted rookie free agent with Denver in 2016 out of the University of Cincinnati.

Justin Pugh – Started all 74 games he has played with the Giants (2013-17) and Cardinals (2018-19). The former first-round pick (19th overall) signed a five-year contract with Arizona before the 2018 season.

A.Q. Shipley – Originally drafted by the Steelers in the seventh round (226th overall) of the 2009 NFL Draft and has played 93 games (58 starts) for the Colts (2012, '14), Ravens (2013) and Cardinals (2015-19).

J.R. Sweezy – Entered the NFL with Seattle as a seventhround selection (225th overall) in the 2012 NFL Draft and has played 92 games (82 starts) with the Seahawks (2012-15, '18), Buccaneers (2016-17) and Cardinals (2019).

Brett Toth – A rookie free agent who finished his college career at Army in 2017 and spent last season as a graduate assistant for the Black Knights while fulfilling his Army commitment. A second lieutenant with a degree in Nuclear Engineering.

DEFENSIVE LINE

Zach Allen – Selected by the Cardinals in the third round (65th overall) of the 2019 NFL Draft out of Boston College where he was the highest-rated edge defender in the ACC in 2018, according to ProFootballFocus.com.

Jonathan Bullard – Chicago's 2016 third-round pick (72nd overall) has 65 tackles, three sacks, 10 tackles for loss and four passes defensed in 48 games (six starts) with the Bears (2016-18) and Cardinals (2019).

Michael Dogbe – Picked by the Cardinals in the seventh round (249th overall) of the 2019 NFL Draft out of Temple, where he played with Cardinals LB Haason Reddick and wore a single-digit jersey number reserved for the team's toughest players.

Rodney Gunter – Arizona's 2015 fourth-round pick (116th overall) re-signed with the Cardinals after setting career highs with 48 tackles, 14 for loss, 4.5 sacks, one pass defensed and two forced fumbles in 2018.

Clinton McDonald – 10th-year NFL veteran has totaled 276 tackles, 21 sacks, two INTs and four fumble recoveries in 116 games (37 starts) for the Bengals (2010), Seahawks (2011-13), Buccaneers (2014-17), Raiders (2018) and Cardinals (2019).

Corey Peters – Signed a three-year extension through 2020. Has played 117 games (100 starts) for the Cardinals (2015-19) and Falcons (2010-14), totaling 300 tackles, 15.5 sacks, a forced fumble and two fumble recoveries.

LINEBACKERS

Dennis Gardeck – Signed as an undrafted rookie free agent out of Sioux Falls, played a team-high 386 snaps on special teams and scored a TD on a blocked punt in the season finale at Seattle in 2018. Has 10 special teams tackles in 20 career games.

Jordan Hicks – Leads the NFL with 48 tackles and became the first Cardinals defender since at least 1999 to record 10+ tackles in each of the first three games of a season. Philly's 2015 third-round pick signed a four-year contract with Arizona.

Chandler Jones – Two-time Pro Bowler (2015, '17) leads the NFL in sacks (44.0) and ranks second in tackles for loss (57) since joining the Cardinals in 2016. Led the league with a franchise-record 17.0 sacks in 2017 and posted a team-high 13.0 sacks last season.

Cassius Marsh Sr. – Sixth-year NFL veteran has 117 tackles, 21 tackles for loss, 12.5 sacks, four forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries in 72 games with Seattle (2014-16, '17), New England (2017), San Francisco (2017-18) and Arizona (2019).

Haason Reddick – Cardinals first-round pick (13th overall) in the 2017 NFL Draft has 176 tackles, 7.5 sacks, nine passes defensed, three forced fumbles and six special teams tackles in 36 games (18 starts).

Brooks Reed – Tucson native was selected by the Texans in second round (42nd overall) of the 2011 NFL Draft and has played 124 games (86 starts) with the Texans (2011-14), Falcons (2015-18) and Cardinals (2019).

Terrell Suggs – Seven-time Pro Bowler, 2011 first-team All-Pro and 2011 NFL Defensive Player of the Year. Leads all active NFL defenders in games played (233), career sacks (136.0) and forced fumbles (37).

Ezekiel Turner – Signed with Arizona as an undrafted rookie free agent out of Washington and led the NFL with 13 solo tackles on special teams, according to league stats. Has 25 special teams tackles in 19 games (one start) with the Cardinals.

Joe Walker – Philly's 2016 seventh-round pick (251st overall) out of Oregon, won Super Bowl LII with the Eagles. Started at ILB and had a career-high seven tackles against the Lions.

DEFENSIVE BACKS

Budda Baker – Has 29 tackles in four games this season, tied for the sixth most by an NFC DB. Recorded 107 tackles in his first year as a full-time starter last season after earning Pro Bowl and first-team All-Pro honors as a special teamer in 2017.

Chris Banjo – Six-year NFL veteran has 55 special teams tackles in 76 career games (two starts) with New Orleans (2016-18) and Green Bay (2013-16).

Tramaine Brock Sr. – Entered the league as a rookie free agent out of Belhaven College in 2010 and has played 105 games (49 starts) with San Francisco (2010-16), Minnesota (2017), Denver (2018) and Arizona (2019).

Chris Jones – Entered the league with Detroit as an undrafted rookie free agent in 2018 out of Nebraska. Has seven tackles and a pass defensed in six games (one start) with the Cardinals.

Byron Murphy Jr. – First pick in the second round of the 2019 NFL Draft leads all rookies with three passes defensed. Once a teammate of Arizona's previous two second-rounders – WR Christian Kirk (Saguaro HS) and S Budda Baker (Washington).

Kevin Peterson – Entered the NFL as an undrafted rookie free agent with the Bears out of Oklahoma State in 2016. Has two INTs and seven passes defensed in 10 career games.

Deionte Thompson – Has played all four games after being drafted in the fifth round (139th overall) of the 2019 NFL Draft out of Alabama where he earned consensus first-team All-American honors in his final season with the Crimson Tide.

Jalen Thompson – Selected in the fifth round of the 2019 supplemental draft out of Washington State, where he Totaled 191 tackles, 11.5 tackles for loss, six INTs and 23 passes defensed in 39 games (all starts).

Charles Washington – Has played 33 games with the Lions (2016-18) and Cardinals (2019) since entering the league as a rookie free agent with Detroit in 2016 out of Fresno State.

Zane Gonzalez – ASU product and 2016 Lou Groza Award winner is tied for the NFL lead with 10 made FGs this season.

Andy Lee – Four-time All-Pro led the NFL in gross punting average with a franchise-record 48.6-yard mark last season.

Ryan Winslow – Entered the league with Chicago in 2018 and made his NFL debut with the Cardinals in Week 4.

Recap For the 1st 3 quarters of Arizona's regular season opener, the visiting Lions were spoiling the debut of new head coach Kliff Kingsbury and rookie QB Kyler Murray. Early in the 4th quarter, Detroit went up 18 and to that point had held AZ to just 2 FGs. But down 24-G, Murray shrugged off a challenging start and led the Cards to 21 consecutive points. He threw one TD pass with 5:51 remaining to cut it to 8 and then with :43 left completed a TD pass and two-point conversion to force overtime. After each team notched a FG on their opening possession of 0T, the game would end in a rare week 1 tie. In the 4th quarter and 0T, Murray was 20-29 passing for 238 yards with 2 TDs & no INTs (116.7 rating). The game's leading receiver was the ageless Larry Fitzgerald (8-113, TD) who also set the franchise record for career games played (235).

Early on Detroit DB Tracy Walker picked off a Murray pass along the sideline midway thru the 1st, setting the Lions up at the AZ24. But on the next snap, LB Chandler Jones sacked QB Matthew Stafford forcing a fumble that Jones recovered himself. The next Lions drive reached the AZ37 and Matt Prater's 55-yard FG made it 3-0. Two plays into the ensuing DET possession, Stafford found WR Danny Amendola open down the right sideline for a 47-yard TD and a 10-0 lead. That lead increased to 17-0 on the next Lions series when Stafford a 9-play, 95-yard drive with a 9-yard pass to WR Kenny Golladay. AZ created a spark 2 minutes later when DET's Jamal Agnew muffed a punt and Trent Sherfield recovered at the DET8 with 1:40 before intermission. David Johnson's 7-yard run took it to the 1, but the Cards couldn't punch it in on either of the next 2 plays and Zane Gonzalez's 20-yard FG made it 17-3 at the half.

The 3rd quarter's only points came on a 42-yard Gonzalez FG but early in the 4th, Stafford hit rookie TE T.J. Hockenson with a 23-yard TD pass in the back of the end zone that made it 24-6. Three plays later the Cards faced a 3rd-n-14 at their own 22 when Fitzgerald hauled in a 41-yarder to the DET 37 that set-up another Gonzalez FG. With 5:57 left, Murray ended a 7-play, 70-yard drive with a 27-yard TD pass to David Johnson down the middle that made it an 8-point game (24-17). DET then advanced to its own 49 but AZ forced a punt that LB Dennis Gardeck tipped, setting the Cards up at their own 40. With under a minute to play, they reached the DET4 when Fitzgerald hauled in a TD pass and Christian Kirk tied the game with his catch on the 2-point conversion. AZ won the coin toss in OT and on the 2nd play of it Murray & Fitzgerald connected on a 45-yard pass to the DET23. The Cards would reach the 8 but no further and went up 3 on a 28-yard Gonzalez FG. The Lions responded by advancing to the AZ 15 where Prater's 33-yarder made it 27-27. Each team would get the ball once more. AZ advanced to the DET46 but punted on 4th-n-7 with 1:10 to go. The decision nearly paid off on a 3rd-n-9 at the DET15 with :11 left when Stafford was nearly picked by Tramaine Brock but the veteran DB could not hold on.



Recap In week 2 at Baltimore, the Cardinals faced a Ravens team that scored 59 points and 8 touchdowns in its season opening win at Miami 7 days earlier. It was also a showdown of young, dynamic QBs pitting AZ's rookie Kyler Murray vs. BAL's 2nd-year player Lamar Jackson. Neither disappointed. Jackson threw for 272 yards and a pair of touchdowns while adding another 120 yards on the ground. Murray completed 25 of 40 passes for 349 yards and joined Cam Newton as the only players in NFL history to eclipse 300 passing yards in their 1st two career games. Early in the 4th quarter, Murray led a 79-yard TD drive that pulled the Cards to within 3 points. After a Ravens FG on the ensuing drive made it a 6-point game, AZ got it back twice more with the chance to score a go-ahead TD but was not able. WR Christian Kirk finished with his 1st career 100-yard day and led all receivers with 114 yards on 6 catches. Fellow wideout Larry Fitzgerald topped the century mark for the 2nd straight week and finished with 5 receptions for 104 yards. The loss dropped the Cards to 0-1-1 while the Ravens improved to 2-0.

Baltimore opened the scoring on its first possession when Jackson's 27-yard scoring pass to TE Mark Andrews capped a 7-play, 94-yard drive. The Ravens penetrated AZ territory on their next drive but turned it over on downs thanks to a Cards stop on 4th-n-3 at the AZ43. Murray then completed 4 straight passes to get AZ to the Ravens 4 but AZ came away with just a Zane Gonzalez FG that made it 7-3. After Justin Tucker's 33-yarder made it 10-3 on the next series, the Cards again marched into the red zone. They got as far as the 4 but had to settle for a short Gonzalez FG. The Ravens then went up 17-6 just before halftime thanks to a 1-yard Jackson TD pass to TE Hayden Hurst at the end of an 85-yard drive.

On its 1st possession of the 3rd quarter, the AZ offense again reached the Baltimore 5 thanks to 4 Murray completions that included a 40-yarder to Fitzgerald. For the 3rd time they came away with a Gonzalez FG and the score was 17-9. The next series saw the Ravens reach the 6 but they too had to settle for a short FG that made it 20-9 early in the 4th. On the next play from scrimmage, Murray & Fitzgerald connected to a 54-yard completion to the 25 and 3 plays later. David Johnson ran it in from a yard out. That TD combined with a Murray to KeeSean Johnson pass on the 2-point try made it 20-17 with 12:52 left. Tucker's 51-yard FG midway thru the 4th Marquise Brown deep down the right sideline for a 41-yard game that iced the game.

Recap Hosting the Panthers in week 3, the Cardinals took a 17-14 lead early in the 3rd quarter on a 3-yard TD catch & run by RB David Johnson. From there, though, Carolina outscored Arizona 24-3 on the strength of big plays, a pair of AZ turnovers and the right arm of young back-up QB Kyle Allen. The Scottsdale native and one-time college teammate of Cards starter Kyler Murray made his 2nd career start in place of Cam Newton and threw for 261 yards and 4 TDs. Two of the TD passes went to TE Greg Olsen while RB Christian McCaffrey ran for 153 yards and a score to pace the Panthers.

On the game's opening drive, Carolina reached the AZ15 where they faced a 3rd-n-5. Cards LB Chandler Jones came off the edge and strip-sacked Allen, forcing a fumble that he recovered himself at the CAR26. From there the AZ offense methodically moved 74 yards in 14 plays and Murray ended it with a 1-yard TD pass to Larry Fitzgerald. On that drive Murray completed 7 of 8 passes and ran 3 times for 28 yards. Carolina answered quickly. WR Curtis Samuel's 5-yard catch in the back of the end zone capped an 11-play, 75-yard drive and the game was tied at 7 early in the 2nd. Late in the quarter, the Cards advanced to the CAR18 and Zane Gonzalez's 34-yard FG made it 10-7 with 1:36 to go before halftime. That was more than enough time for Carolina. On the 3 play of the next drive, Allen connected on a deep crossing pattern with WR D.J. Moore who turred it into a 52-yard score. The Cardinals nearly answered on the next snap from scrimmage when Murray appeared to hit Christian Kirk on a huge pass play down the deep middle but the WR could not hold on and the Panthers led 14-10 at intermission.

The Cards got the ball to open the 2nd half and took the lead on that possession; on 3rd-n-goal from the 3, Murray hit Johnson with a short pass that the RB muscled into the end zone to give AZ a 3-point lead. The Panthers again had an answer and ended a 7-play, 80-yard drive with Allen's 3-yard scoring pass to Olsen that put Carolina back up 21-17. The Cards looked like they'd reclaim the lead when WR Trent Sherfield was wide open down the left sideline but he and Murray could not connect and a 47-yard Gonzalez FG trimmed the lead to 1. However, on the 2nd play of the next drive MCCaffrey would burst thru the middle for a 76-yard TD run that made it 28-20. Things went from bad to worse for AZ two plays later when CB Donte Jackson picked off Murray and returned it to the AZ22. Another 3-yard Olsen TD catch followed and in the blink of an eye, the Panthers suddenly had a 15-point lead with 13:32 remaining. The Cardinals would get no closer and a 36-yard Joey Slye FG with 4:27 left provided the game's final points.

Recap In a week 4 match-up that was the 1st divisional contest for each team, the Cardinals hosted the Seahawks at State Farm Stadium. The game was nearly even in most statistical categories including 1st downs (21-20), offensive plays (59-59) rushing yards (115-115) and passing yards (225-206). But in the only category that counts, Seattle outscored the Cards 27-10 by capitalizing on its big plays and scoring opportunities while the Cards did not. With the victory, the Seahawks improved to 3-1 while Arizona fell to 0-3-1.

RB David Johnson led the Cardinals with 139 total yards from scrimmage, including 99 receiving yards on 8 catches. With his 5 receptions, WR Larry Fitzgerald moved passed TE Tony Gonzalez into 2nd place on the NFL's all-time receptions list behind only Jerry Rice.

Arizona got the ball to open the game and advanced to the Seattle 25 on that possession but came away with no points when Zane Gonzalez was wide on his 43-yard FG try. It was his first miss of the year after starting the season 9-for-9 on FGs. The Seahawks then moved 52 yards in 10 plays to the AZ15 but their drive stalled there and Jason Myers' 33-yard kick made it 3-0. Two plays later the lead instantly grew to 10-0 when Seahawks DE Jadeveon Clowney snared Kyler Murray's screen pass attempt to David Johnson near the line of scrimmage and returned it 27 yards for a TD. On the next AZ drive, Murray & Johnson did connect, this time on a short pass that the RB took that 31 yards down the middle of the field. It led to a 33-yard Gonzalez FG that made it 10-3. But Seattle would push it to 17-3 on the next series when consecutive Russell Wilson passes picked up 32 & 28 yards and his 9-yard TD toss to TE Will Dissly capped the drive. The Cards were in position to answer on their next series when they reached the SEA30 but another FG miss – this one from 48 – kept the Seahawks lead at 14. A short Myers FG (24) in the closing seconds of the half made it 20-7 at intermission.

The AZ defense forced punts on all 3 Seattle possessions in the 3td quarter and when Murray capped an 8-play, 80-yard drive with his 1st career rushing TD (9 yards), the score was 20-10 with 10:21 remaining. However, SEA would chew off most of that time on its next drive. It covered 75 yards in 15 plays and consumed 8:08. The possession was aided by a pair of AZ personal fouls and ended with a 9-yard C.J. Prosise TD run that made the final score 27-10.
