# GAME INFORMATION

Kickoff: 1 p.m. Eastern.

**Television:** The game will air on CBS-TV. In the Bengals' home region, it will be carried by WKRC-TV (Ch. 12) in Cincinnati, WHIO-TV (Ch. 7) in Dayton and WKYT-TV (Ch. 27) in Lexington. Broadcasters are Tom McCarthy (play-by-play), James Lofton (analyst), Jay Feely (analyst) and Tiffany Blackmon (sideline reporter).

**Radio:** The game will air on the Bengals Radio Network, led by Cincinnati flagship stations WLW-AM (700), WCKY-AM (1530) and WEBN-FM (102.7). Broadcasters are Dan Hoard (play-by-play) and Dave Lapham (analyst).

**Setting the scene:** Coming off a thrilling overtime win at Jacksonville on Monday night, the Bengals get set for a pivotal contest in the AFC playoff picture when they welcome the 7-5 Indianapolis Colts to Paycor Stadium on Sunday.

The 34-31 victory over the Jaguars, which improved Cincinnati's record to 6-6, was highlighted by a memorable performance from QB Jake Browning. Making just his second career start, Browning completed 32 of 37 passes for 354 yards and a touchdown, while also rushing for 22 yards and another score. His 86.5 completion percentage marked the fifth highest in a game in team history, and he became the 10th player in the Super Bowl era to throw for 350 or more yards while completing at least 85 percent of his passes in a regular-season game. Browning was recognized on Wednesday with AFC Offensive Player of the Week honors.

"He just lit the world on fire," head coach Zac Taylor said. "At halftime, I wasn't sure if we had an incompletion, if the ball had hit the ground yet. I thought he managed the game beautifully well. He was aggressive with some of his throws. He did a great job making plays with his feet. I'm really proud of Jake and the job he did, and the guys rallied around him, making plays for him and protecting him."

Browning completed passes to eight different receivers during the game. After the defense forced a Jaguars punt in overtime to regain possession, Browning connected on four of his five attempts to steer Cincinnati into FG range, where K Evan McPherson drilled a 48-yard game-winner that snapped the team's three-game losing skid. For Browning, who made his first start in Week 12 against Pittsburgh, the performance in Jacksonville was a product of an additional week of preparation in the starting role.

"I can watch Joe (Burrow) or whoever I've been behind do it a million times — it's different once it's you," Browning said. "I was able to reflect on what my week was like and what I needed to improve. It was my first time in a live pocket in a little while. I learned a lot from the Pittsburgh game and was really able to focus on some of those things throughout the week of practice. I think the main thing was just having those reps and having another week of it, and we were able to put up points."

Other notable offensive contributors for the Bengals included WR Ja'Marr Chase, who caught 11 passes for 149 yards with a 76-yard TD in the third quarter that gave Cincinnati its first lead. Chase's output helped him surpass 1000 receiving yards this season, making him the eighth player in NFL history and the second in Bengals history (A.J. Green, 2011-13) to reach that milestone in each of his first three years. HB Joe Mixon, meanwhile, totaled 117 yards from scrimmage (68 rushing, 49 receiving), with a pair of rushing TDs in the second quarter.

Defensively, the Bengals held Jacksonville to 71 rushing yards, including just

22 in the second half. Cincinnati tallied four sacks on the night, two of which came from the starting edge rush duo of Trey Hendrickson and Sam Hubbard. After the Jaguars scored TDs on back-to-back possessions in the third quarter to pull ahead 28-21, they were held out of the end zone on each of their final four drives.

The complementary effort allowed Cincinnati to come out on top in a game that featured five ties and six lead changes. According to Taylor, that ability to rely on all three phases becomes paramount as the season progresses, and he hopes that Monday night will provide a spark for the Bengals over their final five games.

"You need this in December, to see that we'll win this way, because you're going to be in other games like this as the stretch comes," Taylor said. "You've got to learn from things that we can improve on, things we did really well managing these situations. I think that's good for our team to have endured this on the road."

This week pits the Bengals against a Colts team that has won four straight games to move into postseason contention. Indianapolis is coming off its own overtime victory in Week 13, a 31-28 win at Tennessee that saw QB Gardner Minshew II connect with WR Michael Pittman Jr. for a walk-off TD late in the extra period.

**The series:** Indianapolis leads 20-12 overall (18-12 regular season, and 2-0 postseason), including 8-5 as the visiting team. The Bengals, however, lead 3-1 in games played at Paycor Stadium (opened in 2000; previously called Paul Brown Stadium) and have won two of the past three meetings overall.

The Colts franchise was in Baltimore prior to 1984. Overall, the Bengals were 4-5 against the Baltimore Colts and now stand 8-15 against the Indianapolis Colts.

The Bengals and Colts also have met 28 times in preseason, with the Bengals leading that series 16-12.

## Team bests from the series:

**Bengals** — MOST POINTS: 42, in a 42-28 win in 2013 at Cincinnati. LARGEST VICTORY MARGIN: 22, in a 41-19 win at Baltimore in 1981. FEWEST POINTS ALLOWED: 9, in a 9-6 loss at Cincinnati in 1993.

**Colts** — **MOST POINTS:** 45, in a 45-37 win at Cincinnati in 2005. **LARGEST VICTORY MARGIN:** 32, in a 35-3 win at Indianapolis in 2008. **FEWEST POINTS ALLOWED:** 0 (twice), in a 17-0 playoff win at Baltimore in 1970 and in a 27-0 regular-season win at Indianapolis in 2014.

**The last meetings:** Summaries of the last two Bengals-Colts meetings — in 2018 and in '20, both in Indianapolis — are on page 16.

**The I-74 rivalry:** Cincinnati vs. Indianapolis is the closest geographical rivalry among cities in the AFC, with a driving distance of 110 miles along Interstate 74. The next closest is Cleveland-Pittsburgh at 137 miles.

Though the teams are not division rivals, they have played each other somewhat frequently. This week's matchup marks the 12th meeting (including postseason) in the past 19 regular seasons (since 2005).

Preseason also has played a role in keeping the rivalry alive. Going back to 1992, as the clubs have met in 27 of the last 30 years in which preseason games have been played (no preseason games were played in 2020).

**Memorable I-74 moments:** The most memorable Bengals-Colts regular-season games include:

• Oct. 22, 1989: The underdog Colts shocked the defending AFC Champion Bengals 23-12 at Riverfront Stadium. It was the second straight upset loss at home for the 1989 Bengals, a powerful team that would outscore its opponents 404-285 but miss the playoffs with an 8-8 record.

• Nov. 20, 1994: The Colts scored on a controversial late TD pass to defeat the Bengals 17-13 at Riverfront. The result stung a Cincinnati crowd of 55,566, which had gathered to celebrate "Blakemania" after seeing QB Jeff Blake deliver his first two victories in the two previous games.

• Sept. 3, 1995: Doug Pelfrey kicked five field goals, including the gamewinner from 47 yards in overtime, as the Bengals won 24-21 in the season opener at Indianapolis.

• Dec. 22, 1996: The Bengals outlasted the Colts 31-24 at Cinergy Field in a game that was tied four times. The season-ending victory completed a 5-0 run at home for the Bengals under head coach Bruce Coslet, and Indianapolis was denied the home-field edge for the playoffs.

• Nov. 9, 1997: In the first significant action of his "encore stint" with the Bengals (following four years with other clubs), QB Boomer Esiason led TD drives on his first three possessions to spark a 28-13 Bengals victory at the RCA Dome. The Colts were leading 10-7 in the third quarter when Esiason took the reins for Jeff Blake, who had been shaken up.

• Oct. 6, 2002: The Colts won 28-21 at the RCA Dome, but not without a frantic finish. The Bengals rallied from deficits of 21-0 and 28-14 to pull within 28-21 with 53 seconds remaining, and after recovering an onside kick, the Bengals drove to a first down at the Indianapolis 35. But on the next play, a Jon Kitna pass bounced off the hands of then-second-year WR Chad Johnson, and the Colts intercepted to preserve the win.

• Nov. 20, 2005: The Colts came to Paul Brown Stadium as the NFL's only unbeaten team (9-0), facing a 7-2 Bengals outfit. Indy survived a shootout, winning 45-37. The Colts got three TD passes by Peyton Manning and two rushing scores by Edgerrin James. The Bengals countered with two TD passes by Carson Palmer and two rushing scores by Rudi Johnson.

• Dec. 18, 2006: Peyton Manning threw four TD passes in leading the Colts to a 34-16 win over the Bengals at the RCA Dome on ESPN's Monday Night Football. The Bengals produced only one TD from five possessions inside the Indianapolis 20-yard line. The Colts improved to an 11-3 record while the Bengals fell to 8-6.

• Nov. 14, 2010: The Bengals trailed 17-0 early in the second quarter at Lucas Oil Stadium but closed to within 23-17 with 2:35 to play on a TD catch by rookie TE Jermaine Gresham. Cincinnati then recovered an onside kick. But Gresham, who caught an astounding nine passes in the fourth quarter, gave up a fumble (lost) on the first play after the onside recovery, and the Colts held on to win 23-17.

• Dec. 8, 2013: The Bengals rolled for 430 yards in a 42-28 win at Paul Brown Stadium. Cincinnati's Andy Dalton threw three TD passes with no interceptions, and Indianapolis' Andrew Luck had four TD passes with no picks. Cincinnati improved to 9-4 and maintained a two-game lead over Baltimore and Pittsburgh in the AFC North. Though the Colts fell to 8-5, they clinched the AFC South title later in the day when Tennessee lost at Denver.

• Oct. 29, 2017: Cincinnati survived a back-and-forth slugfest at Paul Brown Stadium, which saw five lead changes and two ties. The game's defining moment came with seven minutes remaining and the Bengals trailing by six. DE Carlos Dunlap batted a Jacoby Brissett pass in the Indianapolis backfield, caught it when it came down, and ran for a 16-yard INT return for a TD and the game's final points. The play gifted Cincinnati a 24-23 victory, on what happened to be QB Andy Dalton's 30th birthday.

• Sept. 9, 2018: The Bengals captured a 34-23 win at Lucas Oil Stadium — their first win in Indianapolis since 1997 — thanks to 24 unanswered points in the second half that were punctuated by an 83-yard scoop-and-score by reserve S Clayton Fejedelem with 24 seconds left, as the Colts were attempting to drive for a game-winning TD. Fejedelem had been thrust into extended action after starting SS Shawn Williams was ejected for a personal foul in the first half.

• Oct. 18, 2020: The visiting Bengals jumped ahead 21-0 by the first play of the second quarter at Lucas Oil Stadium, against a Colts team which entered the contest leading the NFL in both total defense and pass defense. But the story of the day was the Indy offense, which shook off a slow start to quickly close the gap to three points at halftime. Colts 38-year old QB Philip Rivers turned in a vintage performance, passing for 371 yards and three TDs, good for a 105.4 rating. Still, though, Bengals rookie QB Joe Burrow kept the game close with 313 passing yards of his own, including 125 to fellow rookie Tee Higgins. Down by

four late in the fourth quarter, Burrow led the Bengals deep into Colts territory before throwing an INT with 46 seconds left, sealing the Colts' 31-27 victory.

**Bengals career records watch:** As Cincinnati continues the 2023 campaign, here is a look at potential upcoming movement on the Bengals' career records lists (regular season):

• HB Joe Mixon has 1494 career rushing attempts, 371 shy of HB Corey Dillon (1865) for the team record. Mixon in Week 10 surpassed HB Rudi Johnson (1441) for second place on the team's career list.

• Mixon has 6067 career rushing yards, 380 shy of HB James Brooks (6447) for second place all-time. Dillon (8061) is the team's career record holder. Mixon in Week 6 surpassed Rudi Johnson (5742) for third place.

• Mixon in Week 13 at Jacksonville scored two rushing TDs, moving his career total to 46. That surpassed Dillon (45) for third place all-time. Mixon is two rushing TDs shy of Rudi Johnson (48) for second place and 18 shy of FB Pete Johnson (64) for the team record.

• Mixon has 14 games with 100 or more rushing yards, one shy of HB Cedric Benson for fourth place all-time. Dillon (28), Rudi Johnson (19) and Brooks (17) hold the top three spots on the team's career list.

• WR Tyler Boyd has 501 career receptions, six shy of WR T.J. Houshmandzadeh (507) for fourth place all-time. Boyd in 2022 surpassed WR Cris Collinsworth (417) for fifth place.

• K Evan McPherson has an 82.6 career FG percentage (71 made/86 att.), the third highest mark in team history. K Shayne Graham (86.8 percent; 177/202) and Randy Bullock (84.9 percent; 90/106) hold the top two spots.

• McPherson has converted 75.0 percent of his career FG attempts from 50 or more yards (21 made/28 att.), the best mark in team history (minimum 10 attempts). Bullock (50 percent; 7/14) ranks second on the team's career list.

**Bengals records vs. Colts:** Though the Colts and Bengals have played 30 times during regular season, the list of record-setters from past games is few, with only the following entries:

• On Oct. 19, 2014 at Indianapolis, Bengals P Kevin Huber punted 558 yards on 11 punts. The punt yardage total set a new team single-game record, and punt total tied the team record (which had been set three times previously).

• On Nov. 20, 2005 vs. Indianapolis, Bengals KOR Tab Perry tied the team record for most kickoff returns in a game, with eight.

· Eight players share the record for most receiving touchdowns in a game

against the Bengals with three, and two of those players are former Colts. On Sept. 19, 1976 at Baltimore, Colts WR Roger Carr became the second player to record three TD receptions in a game against the Bengals. And on Dec. 18, 2006 at Indianapolis, Colts WR Marvin Harrison became the seventh player.

**Individually vs. Colts:** Here is a brief look at the stats for current Bengals offensive players against Indianapolis (ordered by total games played):

• HB Joe Mixon: Three games; 46 rushes for 167 yards (3.6-yard average) and two TDs; 10 receptions for 160 yards (16.0).

• WR Tyler Boyd: Two games; Eight receptions for 80 yards (10.0); one rush for 25 yards.

• QB Joe Burrow (Reserve/Injured list): One game; 25-of-39 passing for 313 yards, no TDs and one INT (78.3 rating); Three rushes for two yards (1.5) and one TD.

• WR Tee Higgins: One game; Six receptions for 125 yards (20.8); One rush for two yards.

Bengals-Colts connections: Bengals wide receivers coach Trov Walters played WR for the Colts from 2002-05, and was teammates with Colts wide receivers coach Reggie Wayne ... Bengals assistant special teams coach Colt Anderson played safety for the Colts (2014-15) ... Bengals guarterbacks coach Dan Pitcher previously worked as a scouting assistant and pro scout in the Colts organization (2012-15) ... Bengals linebackers coach James Bettcher served as special assistant to the head coach for the Colts in 2012 ... Colts CB Tony Brown played for the Bengals from 2020-21 ... Bengals C Ted Karras (Cathedral High School) and Bengals HB Chris Evans (Ben Davis High School) are natives of the Indianapolis area ... Colts C Ryan Kelly is a native of West Chester Township, Ohio (approximately 23 miles north of Cincinnati), and attended Lakota West High School ... Bengals DT Jay Tufele was teammates with Colts DT Taven Bryan on the Jacksonville Jaguars (2021) ... Bryan also was high school teammates with Bengals LB Logan Wilson at Natrona County High School in Casper, Wyo. ... Bengals G Cody Ford was teammates with Colts RB Zach Moss on the Buffalo Bills (2020-21) ... Bengals S Nick Scott was teammates with Colts DE Samson Ebukam on the L.A. Rams (2019-20) ... Colts defensive coordinator Gus Bradley was head coach of the Jacksonville Jaguars while Bengals senior defensive assistant Mark Duffner served as linebackers coach (2013) ... Colts offensive coordinator Jim Bob Cooter served as running backs coach for the N.Y. Jets while Bengals offensive line coach/run game coordinator Frank Pollack was offensive line coach and Bengals assistant offensive line coach Derek Frazier served in the same capacity (2019-20) ... Cooter was also offensive coordinator for the Detroit Lions while Bengals offensive coordinator Brian Callahan coached quarterbacks (2016-17), after they were both offensive assistants for the Denver Broncos ('13) ... Bengals defensive line coach Marion Hobby coached defensive line for the Jacksonville Jaguars while Colts offensive line coach Tony Sparano Jr. was assistant O-line coach (2017-18) ... Bengals DE Sam Hubbard was teammates with Colts DE Tyquan Lewis at Ohio State (2014-17) ... Bengals S Dax Hill was teammates with Colts DE Kwity Paye and LB Cameron McGrone at the University of Michigan (2019-20) ... Colts special teams coordinator Brian Mason spent five seasons at the University of Cincinnati as special teams coordinator (2018-21) and director of recruiting ('17) ... # THE HEAD COACHES

**Zac Taylor** was named the 10th head coach in Bengals history on Feb. 4, 2019. The 2023 season is his fifth in the position.

In 2022, Taylor led Cincinnati to a second consecutive AFC North Division title and a repeat appearance in the AFC Championship. The Bengals tied a team record for regular-season wins (12) and consecutive wins (eight), and with a pair of playoff victories in January, Taylor became one of just 13 head coaches in NFL history with five wins in their first six career postseason games. He once again oversaw a dynamic offense that ranked in the top 10 leaguewide in scoring (seventh, 26.1 points per game), total yards (eighth, 360.5), and passing yards (fifth, 265.0).

is 2-2 overall when wearing that combination, which was last featured in the team's home contest against Baltimore in Week 2 of this season.

Cincinnati unveiled new uniforms in 2021, marking the team's first significant uniform redesign since '04. There are three different color options for the current jerseys — black, white and orange. The pants also feature three different options — black with orange stripes, white with orange stripes, and white with black stripes. Options for sock color include black, white and orange.

NFL rules allow teams to wear designated alternate jerseys and/or color rush (CR) uniforms and/or throwback uniforms for a combined total of three regularseason games. In 2022, with the league's approval for the use of alternate helmets, Cincinnati introduced a new helmet branded as the "White Bengal," featuring a white base coat and the team's iconic black stripes. The Bengals have worn the helmet four times — twice last season and twice this season — and have collected a 4-0 record. The "White Bengal" look made its most recent appearance in Week 13 at Jacksonville, when Cincinnati earned a 34-31 overtime win on Monday Night Football.

^ — The league permitted teams to create alternate helmets for the 2022 season. However, teams were required to wear those alternate helmets only with alternate, throwback or color rush uniforms that season. The Bengals donned their new alternate white helmet in 2022 with their color rush jersey, which at the time had not been worn since '20, prior to the '21 primary uniform redesign. In 2023, the Bengals are permitted to wear their alternate white helmet with their primary white jersey.

# COACHES

The Bengals also boasted a versatile defense that held opposing passers to a league-low 58.9 completion percentage while also ranking sixth in points allowed (20.1 per game) and seventh in rushing yards allowed (106.6).

In 2021, Taylor guided the Bengals to their first division championship since '15, before winning three postseason games to claim the AFC crown and a berth in Super Bowl LVI. QB Joe Burrow, playing in his first full season in Taylor's system, was named the NFL's Comeback Player of the Year after leading the league in completion percentage (70.4), while first-round draft pick WR Ja'Marr Chase totaled the most receiving yards by a rookie in the Super Bowl era (1455) en route to Offensive Rookie of the Year honors.

#### (The head coaches, continued)

In the postseason, Taylor led the Bengals to their first playoff win in 31 years, a home Wild Card victory over Las Vegas, before the team went on the road to defeat the AFC's top two seeds, Tennessee and Kansas City.

In 2020, Taylor helped the Bengals navigate the league's COVID-19 pandemic protocols which included no in-person offseason program. Still, he guided a rookie Burrow to notable production that included the most ever completions by a QB through their first 10 games (264) and the fifth-most passing yards (2688).

In 2019, his first season as head coach, Taylor led Cincinnati to second-half turnarounds on both offense and defense. Offensively, the Bengals' per-game rushing average jumped 70.6 yards from the first half of the season (59.5) to the second (130.1), while they allowed 10 fewer sacks (29 to 19). Defensively, Cincinnati notched 11 more sacks in the second half of the season compared to the first, and allowed 84.1 fewer yards per game.

Taylor came to Cincinnati after two seasons (2017-18) with the L.A. Rams, where he served as assistant wide receivers coach in '17 and quarterbacks coach in '18. In 2018, he helped guide QB Jared Goff to career highs in every major passing category as the Rams won the NFC West and advanced to Super Bowl LIII.

Taylor had a one-year stint at the University of Cincinnati in 2016, serving as offensive coordinator and QBs coach under head coach Tommy Tuberville.

Taylor broke into NFL coaching in 2012 as assistant quarterbacks coach for the Miami Dolphins. He was elevated to quarterbacks coach from 2013-15, and spent the final five games of '15 as interim offensive coordinator and primary play-caller.

Taylor's coaching career began at Texas A&M University, where he served as offensive graduate assistant and tight ends coach under head coach Mike Sherman from 2008-11. The Aggies played in three bowl games during Taylor's time in College Station.

As a player, Taylor began his college career at Wake Forest (2002-03) before transferring to Butler County Community College in Kansas ('04) and then playing his final two seasons ('05-06) at the University of Nebraska. He set numerous program records, totaling 5850 passing yards and 45 TDs. He was named the Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year as a senior in 2006 after passing for 3197 yards and leading the Cornhuskers to a 9-3 record, an appearance in the Big 12 Championship Game and a berth in the Cotton Bowl. He was inducted into the Nebraska Football Hall of Fame in 2017.

Taylor joined the Tampa Bay Buccaneers as a college free agent in 2007, but was waived prior to the start of training camp and never saw NFL action. Later that year, he joined the Winnipeg Blue Bombers of the Canadian Football League, where he spent one season (did not play).

His father, Sherwood, was a defensive back and captain at the University of Oklahoma, playing under Sooners head coach Barry Switzer from 1976-79. Sherwood Taylor later served as an assistant coach at Oklahoma and Kansas State University. Taylor's younger brother, Press, played quarterback at Marshall University and currently is the offensive coordinator for the Jacksonville Jaguars.

Taylor was born in Norman, Okla., on May 10, 1983. After attending Norman High School, he earned a bachelor's degree in communication studies from the University of Nebraska in 2006. He and his wife, Sarah, have four children — Brooks, Luke, Emma Claire and Milly. Sarah Taylor is the daughter of former Green Bay Packers and Texas A&M head coach Mike Sherman.

**Shane Steichen** was hired as head coach of the Indianapolis Colts on Feb. 14 earlier this year. He has 13 years of coaching experience, including the last 12 seasons in the NFL.

Steichen served as the offensive coordinator of the Philadelphia Eagles the last two seasons and helped the team reach Super Bowl LVII last season. During his two seasons as offensive coordinator, he coordinated an offense that ranked first in the NFL in rushing yards per game (153.6), rushing yards (5224) and rushing touchdowns (57) over that time span. Philadelphia also ranked tied for first in fewest interceptions (19) and third in fourth-down conversion percentage (58.92). Additionally, the Eagles offense set single-season franchise records in third-down conversion percentage in back-to-back seasons.

In 2022, Steichen guided a Philadelphia offense that finished in the top 10 in numerous categories, including yards per game (389.1; third), points per game (28.1; third), rushing yards per game (147.6; fifth), passing yards per game (241.5; ninth), fewest turnovers (19; tied for fifth) and first downs per game (22.6; third). The Eagles also were one of just two teams to finish in the top 10 in rushing yards per game and passing yards per game.

In his first season with the Eagles in 2021, Steichen orchestrated the NFL's most productive rushing offense, as Philadelphia led the league with a franchise-record 2715 rushing yards. The Eagles also ranked fifth in fewest turnovers (16).

Prior to Philadelphia, Steichen spent seven seasons (2014-20) with the Los Angeles/San Diego Chargers where he served as offensive coordinator ('20), interim offensive coordinator ('19), quarterbacks coach ('16-19) and offensive quality control/wide receivers coach ('14-15). The Chargers offense finished in the top 10 in the NFL in passing yards per game in each of his seven years on the offensive staff, including No. 1 in 2017.

In 2013, Steichen assisted the quarterbacks as an offensive quality control coach with the Cleveland Browns. He began his NFL career as a defensive assistant with the Chargers (2011-12) after spending one season as a full-time offensive assistant at Louisville ('10). Steichen also served as an offensive graduate assistant (2008-09) and student graduate assistant ('07) at his alma mater, Nevada-Las Vegas.

Steichen was a four-year letterman (2003-06) at QB for UNLV, and he left as the school's 12th all-time leading passer with 2755 yards and 22 TDs. He also totaled 399 rushing yards with another five TDs.

A native of Sacramento, Calif., Steichen was born on May 11, 1985. He and his wife, Nina, have a son, Hudson, and a daughter, Stella.

## **BENGALS NOTES**

**The Jungle is jammin':** The five highest-attended home games (and nine of the top 10) in Bengals history have occurred since the start of the 2022 calendar year. The Bengals beat Miami on Thursday Night Football in Week 4 of the 2022 season in front of a paid attendance of 67,260 at Paycor Stadium, marking the largest crowd for a sporting event in Cincinnati history. That figure surpassed the previous mark of 66,277 set in the 2021 Wild Card Playoff win over Las Vegas on Jan. 15.

Cincinnati's Sunday Night Football win over Buffalo in Week 9 had an attendance figure of 66,965, which now stands as the second largest in team history. The team's following game in Week 10 vs. Houston (66,526) ranks as the third largest, while the 2022 Wild Card Playoff victory over Baltimore (66,399) is fourth largest and a win over Seattle in Week 6 of this season (66,385) ranks fifth.

Three contests during the 2022 regular season rank in the top 10 for largest home crowds in team history, with each resulting in a win — Week 13 vs. Kansas City (seventh), Week 14 vs. Cleveland (eighth) and Week 9 vs. Carolina (10th). Adding in figures of 65,841 for the 2022 season opener vs. Pittsburgh, and 65,849 for the Week 18 matchup vs. Baltimore, the Bengals welcomed an attendance of over 65,000 in each of their regular-season home games for the first time since 2007. That streak has continued into this season and now stands at 12 straight regular-season home contests.

The Paycor Stadium crowds have coincided with a recent string of home success for the Bengals, as they have won 13 of their last 17 played at the

venue dating back to Week 16 of the 2021 regular season (includes postseason). The last time Cincinnati topped the current stretch was when it won 15 of 18 home contests from Week 10 of the 2012 season through Week 9 of the '14 campaign.

**Leads lead to Bengals wins:** Much of the Bengals' success over the past two-plus seasons has been built on their ability to close out games after jumping in front early. Since the start of the 2021 campaign, Cincinnati has the third best record in the NFL when scoring first (18-3), the second best record when leading at halftime (20-2), and the fifth best record when leading at any point in a game (28-8). This season, the Bengals are 4-1 when ahead at the half and 5-0 when leading after three quarters.

Among the many factors contributing to the Bengals' knack for cementing wins is the defensive play coming out of halftime. Since 2021, Cincinnati has

allowed just 45 TDs (tied for second fewest leaguewide) and 441 total points (fifth fewest) in the second half/overtime. The Bengals' recent four-game win streak from Weeks 5-9 was highlighted by the defense recording eight takeaways in the second half of play (five INTs, three FRs), while also forcing four turnovers on downs.

**Bengals find edge in turnover battle:** Cincinnati this season has been among the league's best at both forcing turnovers defensively and taking care of the ball offensively. The Bengals have collected 19 takeaways (tied for eighth in NFL) while committing just 10 giveaways (tied for fewest), resulting in a turnover differential of plus-nine that ranks third leaguewide.

Cincinnati has won the turnover battle in seven of its 12 games this season, collecting a 5-2 record in those contests. The Bengals' offense has lost just two fumbles, tied for the fewest in the NFL.

Defensively, 14 of Cincinnati's 19 takeaways have come over the past eight games. Eleven different Bengals have contributed to that season total with either an INT or a fumble recovery.

The Bengals are tied for fifth in INTs leaguewide with 12. They recorded at least one pick in seven straight games from Weeks 3-10, the longest such streak by Cincinnati since Weeks 2-8 of the 2020 season (also seven games). The Bengals have won each of their last 10 games (including postseason) in which the defense had multiple INTs.

**Offense opens strong:** The Bengals have scored 55 points in the first quarter of play since Week 5, tied for the fourth most in the NFL in that span, while their seven first-quarter TDs during that timeframe are tied for second most leaguewide.

Cincinnati came away with points on its opening offensive possession in seven consecutive games from Weeks 5-11. During that stretch, the Bengals scored an opening-drive TD in five straight games from Weeks 5-10 — the longest such streak in team history and the longest in the NFL since Atlanta went six straight (Weeks 12-17) during the 2016 season. The TD streak was ended in Week 11 at Baltimore, when a drive that reached the Ravens' 31-yard line resulted in a 50-yard FG from K Evan McPherson.

During the streak, the Bengals followed up with a TD on their second possession in three consecutive games from Weeks 6-9. It marked the first time Cincinnati opened three straight contests with back-to-back TD drives since Games 13-15 of the 1985 campaign. The most recent team to accomplish that feat was Green Bay, which did it in four straight (Weeks 14-17) during the 2020 season.

**Browning shines on MNF:** QB Jake Browning was named AFC Offensive Player of the Week for his performance in the Bengals' 34-31 overtime win at Jacksonville on Monday Night Football in Week 13. Making just his second career start, Browning completed 32 of 37 passes (86.5 percent) for 354 yards and one TD with zero INTs.

Browning's 86.5 completion percentage was the fifth highest in a game in Bengals history, and the highest in league history by a player in either of his first two starts (minimum 20 attempts). He became the 10th player in the Super Bowl era (1966-present) to pass for 350 or more yards with a completion percentage of 85 or higher. Browning's 354 passing yards marked the second most by a Bengals QB within his first two career starts behind Jeff Blake, who threw for 387 yards in his second start — an overtime win at Seattle on Nov. 6, 1994.

Browning completed a pass to eight different receivers, and during the Bengals' game-winning drive in overtime he went four of five for 36 yards to march Cincinnati into FG range. In the third quarter, Browning hit WR Ja'Marr Chase down the left sideline for a 76-yard TD that gave the Bengals their first lead. It marked the team's longest play from scrimmage this season, and was one of four completions Browning had for over 20 yards.

Browning on third down completed nine of 11 passes for a passer rating of 149.1. He additionally ran for 22 yards on two carries, including a one-yard QB sneak into the end zone that tied the game 28-28 in the fourth quarter.

**The Browning rundown:** QB Jake Browning has started the Bengals' past two games after it was announced that QB Joe Burrow would miss the remainder of the season due to a wrist injury. In his starting debut in Week 12 vs. Pittsburgh, Browning completed 19 of 26 passes (73.1 percent) for 227 yards and one TD with one INT. It was Browning's first start in a non-preseason game at any level since his senior season at the University of Washington in 2018, and marked just his third appearance in a regular-season NFL game. He made his NFL debut in Week 1 of this season at Cleveland, playing four snaps late in the fourth quarter in relief of Burrow, then saw extensive action in Week 1 at Baltimore after Burrow exited in the second quarter.

Browning originally entered the league as a college free agent signee of Minnesota in 2019. He spent two seasons (2019-20) on the Vikings' practice squad, then was on the Bengals' practice squad for the past two years. He made the 53-man roster coming out of training camp for the first time in 2023, and spent the first 10 games of the season as Cincinnati's second-string QB before taking over the starting role.

Browning has played in six preseason games (two starts) for the Bengals over the past two years, completing 74 of 109 passes (67.9 percent) for 729 yards and two TDs with two INTs. Facing the Ravens' fourth-ranked passing defense in Week 11, Browning came in and went eight of 14 for 68 yards and one TD with no picks.

Browning was a four-year starter (2015-18) at Washington, where he helped steer the Huskies to a 39-14 record and set program records for career passing attempts (1483), completions (958), passing yards (12,296) and TD passes (94). As a sophomore in 2016, he finished sixth in Heisman Trophy voting while leading Washington to a Pac-12 title and a berth in the College Football Playoff. He also set California prep records in several categories while at Folsom High School, including career passing yards (16,775) and TD passes (229). Browning was teammates with Bengals OT Jonah Williams at Folsom.

**Burrow's season highlights:** QB Joe Burrow's fourth pro season came to an end in Week 11, as he suffered a right wrist injury at Baltimore that will hold him out of action until 2024.

Burrow finished his season with 244 completions on 365 pass attempts (66.8 percent) for 2309 yards and 15 TDs with six INTs, good for a passer rating of 91.0. After recovering from a calf injury that caused him to miss over a month of training camp, Burrow started the regular-season opener and went on to crack the top five for career completions, TD passes and 300-yard passing games in team history.

The 2022 Pro Bowler was at his best from Weeks 5-10 of this season, when he led the NFL in completion percentage (74.1), ranked second in completions (146), second in passer rating (107.0), third in TD passes (12) and fourth in passing yards (1480). He had three games with 300 or more passing yards in that stretch, led off by a 317-yard, three-TD performance in Week 5 at Arizona. Burrow then threw for 348 yards on Sunday Night Football in Week 9 against Buffalo, and the following week had 347 vs. Houston.

In Week 8 at San Francisco, Burrow completed 28 of 32 passes for 283 yards and three TDs with no INTs to lead the Bengals to a crucial road win. His career-high 87.5 completion percentage was the second highest in a game in team history, trailing only QB Ken Anderson's 90.9 percent (20 of 22) on Nov. 10, 1974. Burrow closed out the first half against the 49ers by completing 19 consecutive passing attempts, marking the most consecutive completions in a game by any NFL passer this season and the second most in team history (Anderson, 20 on Jan. 2, 1983). Burrow's efforts at Levi's Stadium were rewarded with his sixth career AFC Offensive Player of the Week honor.

Burrow also rushed for 85 yards from Weeks 5-11, after totaling three rushing yards in the opening four games as he continued to work his way back to full health. He eclipsed some notable career marks in 2023 and did so in nearrecord timing, as he became the fifth fastest player in NFL history to reach 13,000 passing yards (48 games) and tied for the sixth fastest to 90 TD passes (49 games). Burrow additionally has a career completion percentage of 68.0, the highest in NFL history (minimum 1500 pass attempts).

Prior to the start of the regular season, Burrow signed a five-year contract extension that made him the highest-paid player in NFL history, based on average annual value. The extension keeps Burrow in Cincinnati through the 2029 season.

**Chasing history:** WR Ja'Marr Chase surpassed 1000 receiving yards this season with a 149-yard effort in Week 13 at Jacksonville. He became the eighth player in NFL history to reach the 1000-yard receiving milestone in each of his first three career seasons, and the second player in Bengals history to do so (A.J. Green, 2011-13). Chase also notched his 29th career receiving TD in Week 13 to tie Green for the most in team history in a player's first three

#### seasons.

Chase finished the contest against the Jaguars with a game-high 11 catches for 149 yards and one TD. It marked his sixth career game (third this season) with at least 10 receptions, at least 100 receiving yards and at least one receiving TD, the most such games in league history within a player's first three seasons.

A first-round pick of the Bengals in 2021 (fifth overall), Chase earned Pro Bowl selections in each of his first two seasons while recording back-to-back 1000-yard receiving campaigns. He has reached a pair of career milestones in recent Bengals wins, beginning with his 200th reception in Week 5 at Arizona. Playing in just his 34th career game, Chase tied as the fourth fastest player in league history to net 200 catches. Only former N.Y. Giants WR Odell Beckham Jr. (30 games), New Orleans WR Michael Thomas (32) and former Miami WR Jarvis Landry (33) reached the mark in fewer games.

In Week 6 vs. Seattle, Chase surpassed 3000 receiving yards in his 35th career game, tying as the fifth fastest player ever to reach that mark. Beckham (30 games), former Houston Oilers WR Charlie Hennigan (31), Minnesota WR Justin Jefferson (33) and former San Diego Chargers WR Lance Alworth (34) are the only players to net 3000 receiving yards in fewer games.

Chase has continued to establish himself as one of the NFL's most productive receivers in his third season. He had 50 receptions from Games 3-7, the most in a five-game stretch in Bengals history which included three stat lines of 10 or more catches. For the season, Chase ranks fifth in the NFL in catches (86), fifth in receiving yards (1063) and tied for fifth in receiving TDs (seven).

**On the Chase:** In the third quarter of Week 13 at Jacksonville, WR Ja'Marr Chase caught a pass from QB Jake Browning down the left sideline and broke away from Jaguars defensive backs for a 76-yard TD. It marked Chase's 15th career reception of 40 or more yards (fourth this season), tied for the second most in the NFL since he entered the league in 2021. It also was the Bengals' longest TD from scrimmage since an 82-yarder by Chase in Week 7 of the 2021 season at Baltimore.

With a team-high 149 receiving yards against the Jaguars, Chase went over the century mark for the fifth time this season and 14th time in his career. With five games remaining in the regular season, Chase is 392 receiving yards shy of his career-high 1455 set in 2021. That total set both a Bengals single-season record and an NFL rookie record.

**Ja'Marr's record day:** WR Ja'Marr Chase earned his third career AFC Offensive Player of the Week award for his performance in Week 5 at Arizona, in which he hauled in a Bengals single-game record 15 receptions for 192 yards and three TDs. His receptions total surpassed the previous team mark of 13, set by WR Carl Pickens on Oct. 11, 1998 against Pittsburgh.

Chase became the fifth player in NFL history to register at least 15 catches, 150 receiving yards and three receiving TDs in a game. At 23 years old, he also became the fourth player in NFL history under the age of 24 to record 15 receptions in a single game. Combining his performance at Arizona with a stat line of 11 catches for a Bengals-record 266 yards and three TDs in Week 17 of the 2021 campaign vs. Kansas City, Chase is the first player in league history with multiple games of at least 10 receptions, 150 receiving yards and three receiving TDs in his first three career seasons.

Chase's second TD at Arizona came early in the third quarter, when he got behind the Cardinals' secondary and caught a deep ball from QB Joe Burrow for a 63-yard score. It marked Chase's seventh career TD of 50 or more yards, and at the time was Cincinnati's longest TD from scrimmage since Chase scored a 72-yarder in the 2021 win over the Chiefs (since surpassed by Chase TDs of 64 and 76 yards this season).

Since he entered the NFL in 2021, Chase is one of four players with three or more receiving TDs in multiple games, alongside Buffalo WR Stefon Diggs, Tampa Bay WR Mike Evans and Kansas City TE Travis Kelce.

**Chase, Boyd pose deep threats:** WR Ja'Marr Chase's 76yard TD in Week 13 at Jacksonville was his ninth career scoring catch of 50 or more yards, the most in the NFL since he entered the league in 2021. It also tied former N.Y. Giants WR Odell Beckham Jr. for the second most such TDs in NFL history by a player under the age of 24. Only Pro Football Hall of Famer Randy Moss (11) has more.

Chase has three TDs of 50-plus yards this season. The first of which came in Week 5 at Arizona, when QB Joe Burrow found Chase streaking behind the Cardinals' secondary for a 63-yard TD in the third quarter. Then in Week 10 vs. Houston, Chase broke free downfield on a scramble play and hauled in a pass from Burrow for a 64-yard score.

Boyd, meanwhile, has four TD catches of 50 or more yards since 2021, the third most in the NFL behind Chase and former Kansas City/current Miami WR Tyreek Hill (seven). Two of those receptions occurred during the 2022 campaign — a 56-yard TD in Week 3 at the N.Y. Jets and a 60-yarder in Week 7 vs. Atlanta.

**Boyd reaches 500 catches:** With five catches in Week 13 at Jacksonville, WR Tyler Boyd became the fifth player in Bengals history to surpass 500 career receptions. An eighth-year veteran who is the longest tenured player on the Bengals active roster, Boyd's 501 career catches are tied for the 16th most in the NFL since he entered the league in 2016.

Boyd, who was a second-round draft pick of the Bengals in 2016, has played in 115 regular-season games (75 starts) and seven postseason contests (six starts). After totaling 76 catches for a combined 828 yards over his first two seasons, he broke out in 2018 with a team-leading 76 grabs for 1028 yards. He followed up in 2019 with career highs in receptions (90) and yards (1046), becoming the sixth player in team history to eclipse 1000 receiving yards in back-to-back years.

Boyd this season ranks second on the Bengals in receptions (55) and receiving yards (499). He hauled in a season-best eight catches for 117 yards in Week 10 against Houston, including a 64-yarder late in the fourth quarter that set up a game-tying FG.

**Tee among top young WRs:** WR Tee Higgins returned to action in Week 13 at Jacksonville, after missing the previous three games due to a hamstring injury. Though sharing production with his fellow star WRs, Higgins has developed into one of the NFL's premier pass catchers since being drafted by the Bengals in the second round in 2020.

Higgins has 3392 career receiving yards, and posted back-to-back 1000yard seasons in 2021 and '22. He is one of five players in Bengals history with multiple 1K receiving seasons within the first three years of his career, alongside WRs Cris Collinsworth (1981, '83), Chad Johnson (2002-03), A.J. Green ('11-13) and Ja'Marr Chase ('21-22). Higgins' career yardage total at the end of 2022 (3028) marked the second most ever by a Bengals player through their first three seasons, trailing only Green (3833).

Higgins enjoyed his best statistical game of 2023 in Week 9 vs. Buffalo, when he caught eight passes for a season-high 110 yards. It marked his 11th career game with 100 or more receiving yards. After missing the Week 5 contest at Arizona due to a rib injury, Higgins returned to full health for Week 8 at San Francisco and hauled in five catches for 69 yards. In his first game back from the previously referenced hamstring ailment, Higgins caught three passes for 36 yards against the Jaguars, including an 11-yard reception on third-and-10 in overtime that helped set up a game-winning FG.

Higgins has continued to produce during his brief but impressive postseason career. He ranks second in Bengals postseason history in receptions (31) and receiving yards (457), trailing Chase in both categories, while his three TD catches are tied with Chase and former TE Dan Ross for the team's postseason record. With two TDs in Super Bowl LVI vs. the L.A. Rams, he also joined Ross as the only players in team history with multiple TDs in a postseason game.

**Mixon hits 6K:** HB Joe Mixon surpassed 6,000 career rushing yards during a 68-yard effort in Week 13 at Jacksonville. A second-round pick of the Bengals in 2017, Mixon began the season with the fifth most rushing yards in team history, but through 12 games he has climbed to third on the all-time chart. He surpassed FB Pete Johnson (5421) in Week 1 at Cleveland, then in Week 6 vs. Seattle overtook HB Rudi Johnson (5742). HB Corey Dillon (8061) and HB James Brooks (6447) hold the top two spots in the Bengals' record book.

Mixon's 6067 rushing yards are the fifth most in the NFL since 2017. He has logged over 1000 rushing yards in three of his five full seasons (missed 10 games in 2020 due to injury), including the '21 campaign in which he posted career highs in rushing yards (1205; third in NFL) and rushing TDs (13, fourth) while earning his first Pro Bowl selection.

Mixon rushed for over 80 yards in a pair of Bengals wins this season, beginning with an 81-yard effort on 25 carries in Week 5 at Arizona. He topped that number in Week 8 at San Francisco, when he recorded a season-best 87 yards on 16 attempts (5.4 per carry), including a five-yard TD late in the fourth quarter that helped seal the victory.

Mixon has found the end zone in five of the past six games, including rushing TDs in three straight contests from Weeks 8-10. He then had a four-yard receiving TD in Week 11 at Baltimore — the 11th of his career — and in Week 13 at Jacksonville broke through for two rushing scores in the second quarter. With 46 career rushing TDs, he surpassed Dillon (45) for the third most in team history. Mixon is now two rushing TDs shy of Rudi Johnson (48) for second place and 16 shy of Pete Johnson (64) for the team record.

Mixon has established himself as a pass-catching threat out of the backfield in addition to his rushing prowess. In 2022, he set career bests in receptions (60) and receiving yards (441). He had 49 receiving yards on six catches in Week 13 at Jacksonville in addition to his 68 rushing yards, giving him his third game this season with 100 or more yards from scrimmage.

**First-quarter defense among league's best:** Though defensive coordinator Lou Anarumo is regarded as one of the best in the NFL when it comes to in-game adjustments, his Bengals defense has also been consistently prepared from the opening kickoff. Since the start of the 2022 season, Cincinnati in the first quarter of play has allowed just 10 TDs (tied for third fewest leaguewide) and 100 total points (tied for fifth fewest).

Baltimore's TD on its opening drive of Week 2 marked the first TD allowed by Cincinnati in a first quarter since Week 6 of the 2022 season. The Bengals' 14-game streak without giving up a first-quarter TD was the longest in the NFL since Buffalo went 16 straight from Week 14 of the 2020 season through Week 10 of the '21 campaign. In their 10 games since Week 2, the Bengals have allowed 41 total points in the first quarter (five TDs).

**Defense tightens after the break:** As referenced previously, Cincinnati's defense has proven itself among the league's elite units coming out of halftime. The Bengals have given up 45 total TDs in the second half/overtime since the start of the 2021 regular season, tied for the second fewest in the NFL, while their 9.8 average points allowed in the second half/OT in that span are the eighth fewest leaguewide.

Of the Bengals' 19 takeaways this season, 12 have come in the second half (tied for fourth most in NFL). In Week 10, CB Cam Taylor-Britt picked off Texans QB C.J. Stroud with 3:41 remaining and returned it to the Houston four-yard line, sparking a late surge that saw the Bengals score 10 points in less than two minutes of play to tie the game.

The previous week against Buffalo, LB Germaine Pratt forced a fumble at the Cincinnati 11-yard line that was recovered by S Nick Scott, preserving a 21-10 Bengals lead early in the fourth quarter.

**Trey's torrid pace:** DE Trey Hendrickson has recorded a sack in each of the past three games to boost his team-leading sack total to 11.5 this season (tied for sixth most in NFL). He is one of five players leaguewide with double-digit sacks in at least three of the past four seasons, alongside Myles Garrett (Cleveland), Micah Parsons (Dallas), Haason Reddick (Arizona/ Carolina/Philadelphia) and T.J. Watt (Pittsburgh).

Seven of Hendrickson's sacks this season came in a five-game stretch from Weeks 3-8, kicked off by a two-sack performance in Week 3 against the L.A. Rams. He logged 2.5 more in Week 5 at Arizona, including a strip sack of QB Josh Dobbs in the fourth quarter that resulted in a fumble recovery by DE Sam Hubbard to help seal a Bengals win. Hendrickson closed out another victory in Week 8 at San Francisco, as his 50th career sack came late in the fourth quarter and forced a Brock Purdy fumble that was scooped up by DT B.J. Hill.

After spending his first four pro seasons with New Orleans, Hendrickson joined the Bengals as a free agent in March of 2021 and quickly asserted himself among the NFL's best pass rushers. His debut season in stripes saw him post a career-best 14 sacks, which ranked fifth in the league and second in Bengals single-season history behind DE Coy Bacon's 22 in 1976 (sacks became an official NFL statistic in '82, however the Bengals tracked the stat back to '76 and thus recognize Bacon as the record-holder). Hendrickson earned his first career Pro Bowl nod, and then followed up with another Pro Bowl campaign in 2022 when he notched a team-leading eight sacks.

Combined with a team-high 13.5 sacks in his final season with the Saints (tied for second in NFL), Hendrickson has 46 sacks since the start of the 2020 campaign — the fourth most in the league in that span. His production was rewarded on July 27, when he signed a one-year contract extension that keeps him in Cincinnati through the 2025 season.

**Hubbard a Day 2 draft steal:** DE Sam Hubbard logged his fifth sack of the season in Week 13 when he took down Jaguars QB Trevor Lawrence for a loss of seven yards late in the second quarter. It boosted Hubbard's career sack total to 35.5, the second most among all players from the 2018 rookie class (draft picks and college free agents).

Hubbard this season has 44 total tackles, the most among Cincinnati's defensive linemen. He also recovered a fumble midway through the fourth quarter in Week 5 at Arizona, setting up a Bengals FG drive that increased their lead. Four of his sacks came in Games 3-7, his most in a five-game stretch since the 2021 season (Games 7-11).

Players' listed positions vary by media outlet (e.g. whether they're classified as a LB or DE), but according to NFL.com's draft record, Hubbard was the 13th defensive lineman selected in 2018 — five DEs and seven DTs came off the board before him. According to NFL.com, there were a total of 40 defensive linemen (20 DEs, 20 DTs) selected in the 2018 draft, along with 32 LBs and one player with his position listed as "edge."

Hubbard has been the Bengals' starting LDE since 2019, and during the '21 regular season his 7.5 sacks were second on the team. While his 2022 campaign will be remembered primarily for his 98-yard fumble return for a TD in the Wild Card Playoff vs. Baltimore, Hubbard during the regular season tallied 60 total tackles — his fourth straight year with at least 60 — including a team-leading 11 TFLs and 6.5 sacks. He also recorded three PDs and a forced fumble.

Hubbard additionally has four career postseason sacks, tied with former DE Jason Buck for the most in Bengals history. He signed a contract extension with the Bengals in July 2021 that keeps him in Cincinnati through the '25 season.

Wilson leads LBs in INTs ... : Fourth-year pro Logan Wilson has led the Bengals in tackles in each of the past two seasons, but his most notable contributions have come when dropping into coverage. A former defensive back at the University of Wyoming, Wilson has 10 career INTs, the most by any NFL LB since he entered the league in 2020.

Three of Wilson's picks have occurred this season, beginning in Week 3 vs. the L.A. Rams when he intercepted QB Matthew Stafford twice to help lead Cincinnati to a Monday Night Football victory. The second INT came at the Bengals' 30-yard line when the Rams were driving to potentially take the lead in the third quarter. In the fourth quarter of Week 8 at San Francisco, Wilson stepped in front of a pass thrown by QB Brock Purdy and returned it 16 yards to set up a Bengals TD on the following play.

Wilson had two picks as a rookie in 2020, then followed up with four in '21 — the most by a Bengals LB in a single season since Odell Thurman (five) in '05.

Also a sure tackler, Wilson posted a career-high 123 stops last season that marked the most by a Cincinnati player since LB Vontaze Burfict in his 2013 Pro Bowl campaign. Wilson again paces the Bengals in that category with 97 tackles (63 solos) through 12 games in 2023. He additionally had a career-best 2.5 sacks in the 2022 season, all coming in a three-game stretch from Weeks 14-16. Since the start of the 2020 season, Wilson is one of six NFL players with at least 300 tackles, five sacks, five INTs and five FFs.

Wilson additionally wears the "green dot" as the player that relays defensive play calls. He signed a contract extension in early August that keeps him in Cincinnati through the 2027 season.

... and Pratt racks up takeaways: Wilson's fellow starting LB, fifth-year pro Germaine Pratt, has had a similar knack for coming up with turnovers at crucial points in the game. In the fourth quarter of Week 9 vs. Buffalo, Pratt forced a fumble from TE Dalton Kincaid at the Cincinnati 11-yard line that was recovered by S Nick Scott, ending a Bills scoring threat that would have made it a one-possession game.

It marked the fourth turnover Pratt has contributed to this season, with three of those coming in a four-game span from Weeks 5-9. He logged his first INT of the year in Week 5 at Arizona, picking off QB Josh Dobbs midway through the fourth quarter to help seal a win, but his biggest play of that game came earlier in the third quarter when he tackled Dobbs for a loss on fourth-and-one at the Bengals' 16-yard line when Cincinnati led 24-20. Then in Week 8 at San Francisco, the 49ers had a chance to tie the game in the third quarter with a first-and-goal from the Cincinnati eight, before Pratt tipped a Brock Purdy pass and came down with the INT.

Since the start of the 2021 season, Pratt is one of seven NFL players with at least five FFs and five INTs. He and Logan Wilson are two of the three linebackers in that category.

Pratt's lone FF last season occurred in Week 13 vs. Kansas City, when he stripped the ball from TE Travis Kelce early in the fourth quarter and recovered it to set up a go-ahead Bengals TD drive.

Pratt inked a contract extension in March and will remain a Bengal through the 2025 season.

**Nothing easy in the air:** Since the start of the 2022 season, the Bengals have held opposing passers to the fifth lowest completion percentage in the NFL (61.5) and the eighth lowest passer rating (84.3). Cincinnati has given up just 32 TD passes in that span of 28 regular-season games, tied for the fourth

#### fewest leaguewide.

In 45 regular-season games since the start of the 2021 regular season, the Bengals have yielded 300 net passing yards on just seven occasions. San Francisco in Week 8 reached 300 net passing yards, becoming Cincinnati's first opponent to do so since Tampa Bay in Week 16 of the 2022 campaign. In both instances, the Bengals led by over 10 points late in the fourth quarter when the opposing QB surpassed 300 yards. In Week 13 at Jacksonville, the Jaguars had 288 net passing yards in regulation, then recorded 17 more in overtime to break 300.

**Money Mac from deep:** With under three minutes remaining in the fourth quarter of Week 13 at Jacksonville, K Evan McPherson drilled a 54-yard FG to give the Bengals a 31-28 lead. It marked McPherson's 21st career FG from 50 or more yards, the most in NFL history by a player in his first three seasons.

McPherson's 21 FGs from 50-plus yards also are the most by any NFL kicker since he entered the league in 2021. He has seven such FGs this season (tied for league lead), including two in the Week 3 win over the L.A. Rams (distances of 53 and 54 yards), as well as a season-long 56-yarder in the Week 8 victory at San Francisco. The kick against the 49ers was the fifth longest made FG in Bengals history, with McPherson also boasting three of the four longest. He knocked through a Bengals-record 59-yarder in the 2022 season opener vs. Pittsburgh, breaking his own previous record of 58 that he hit in Week 15 of the '21 campaign at Denver. Then in Week 4 of 2022 against Miami, he converted a 57-yarder, tying Randy Bullock for the third longest.

McPherson is already the team's career leader in 50-yard FGs. It took him just 14 games into his rookie season to reach the top of Cincinnati's career chart in that category, breaking the previous record of eight. Referred to by fans as "Money Mac," McPherson made an NFL-best nine FGs of 50 or more yards during the 2021 regular season and fell just one shy of tying the NFL record for most 50-yarders. His nine such FGs were more than double the previous team record for a single season (four, by K Horst Muhlmann in 1970). He followed that up by going a perfect five of five on attempts of 50-plus yards in 2022.

McPherson followed up his 54-yarder at Jacksonville with a 48-yarder in overtime that secured a win for the Bengals. It marked his sixth career "walk-off" FG, with the first five occurring during his 2021 rookie campaign. Three of those were kicked during the 2021 regular season, but the most notable were his pair of game-winners in postseason play — a 52-yarder in the Divisional Playoff at Tennessee, and a 31-yarder in the AFC Championship at Kansas City that punched Cincinnati's ticket to Super Bowl LVI.

In seven postseason games, McPherson is a perfect 19-for-19 on FG attempts, marking the most made FGs in league history by a player in his first two career seasons and the second most in consecutive fashion to begin a postseason career (Robbie Gould, 29).

**2023 draft class overview:** Cincinnati's eight-player draft class in April featured four players on defense, three on offense and one on special teams. The group played in a combined 356 collegiate games.

Here's a closer look at the Bengals' 2023 draft class:

• DE Myles Murphy, Clemson (Round 1, Pick 28): Murphy logged his second sack of the season in Week 12 vs. Pittsburgh, a two-yard takedown of QB Kenny Pickett in the third quarter. At 6-5, 270 pounds, Murphy possesses an athletic frame and showcased his edge rushing ability with 17.5 career sacks in 38 games at Clemson. He earned second-team All-ACC honors as a junior in 2022.

• CB DJ Turner II, Michigan (Round 2, Pick 60): Turner ran the fastest 40yard dash at this year's NFL Combine, clocking 4.26 seconds. He has played in all 12 games this season, starting each of the past eight while earning an increased role in the secondary. Turner ranks fourth on the team with five PDs, but has also showcased his physicality with 33 total tackles, including a seasonhigh eight solo stops in Week 13 at Jacksonville. He earned a pair of All-Big Ten accolades (honorable mention in 2021, second team in '22) while playing at the University of Michigan.

 S Jordan Battle, Alabama (Round 3, Pick 95): Battle has emerged as a key member of the Bengals' secondary in recent weeks. He has started each of

the past two games, and has 26 tackles over the past three contests after logging 11 in the first nine. Battle in Week 13 at Jacksonville recorded his first sack and added a PD. He was twice named a third-team All-American at Alabama, where he started at S from 2020-22. Three of his six career INTs in college were returned for a TD.

• WR Charlie Jones, Purdue (Round 4, Pick 131): Jones opened the season as the Bengals' primary punt returner and solidified that role with an 81yard punt return TD in Week 2 vs. Baltimore. He suffered a thumb injury in Week 3 vs. the L.A. Rams and spent the next six games on the Reserve/Injured list, before returning to the active roster ahead of the Week 11 contest at Baltimore. Jones was a second-team All-American in his lone season at Purdue in 2022, as he led the FBS in receptions (110), while ranking second in receiving yards (1361) and fifth in receiving TDs (12).

• HB Chase Brown, Illinois (Round 5, Pick 163): Brown saw extended action for the first time this season in Week 13 at Jacksonville, when he rushed for 61 yards on nine attempts. He had just two carries in his previous six games played, and spent four games on the Reserve/Injured list due to a hamstring injury. Brown put together an impressive career at Illinois, earning second-team All-America honors in 2022 and totaling 1000 rushing yards in each of his final two seasons.

• WR Andrei Iosivas, Princeton (Round 6, Pick 206): Iosivas is the Bengals' seventh all-time draft pick out of an Ivy League program, and the first since LB Reggie Williams (Dartmouth) and QB Bob Bateman (Brown) in 1976. He had a receiving TD in back-to-back games, with the first of his career coming in Week 6 vs. Seattle followed by another in Week 8 at San Francisco. Iosivas led the team in receptions (12) and receiving yards (129) during the preseason, and also has found a role on special teams.

• P Brad Robbins, Michigan (Round 6, Pick 217): Robbins earned the Bengals' punting job out of training camp, and through 12 regular-season contests has punted 55 times with a 44.3-yard gross average. Five of his 13 punts downed inside the opponents' 20-yard line came in a two-game stretch from Weeks 9-10. Robbins spent six seasons (2017-22) at Michigan, where he finished his career with the second highest punting average (43.0 yards) in program history and was a three-time All-Big Ten selection.

• CB DJ Ivey, Miami (Fla.) (Round 7, Pick 246): The Bengals' final draft pick logged 10 tackles and a team-leading three PDs in the preseason, showcasing an athleticism and tight coverage that has already impressed his coaches. He has played in six regular-season games (game day inactive in six), appearing primarily on special teams. Ivey started 32 games over a five-year career (2018-22) at the University of Miami (Fla.), totaling six INTs and 17 PDs.

**Coaching continuity under Taylor:** Head coach Zac Taylor returned virtually the entire coaching staff for the 2023 season, including defensive coordinator Lou Anarumo, offensive coordinator Brian Callahan and assistant head coach/special teams coordinator Darrin Simmons.

Anarumo, Callahan and Simmons have all been on staff since Taylor was hired in February 2019. The Bengals are the only team in the NFL with the same head coach and same coordinators in place for each season since 2021. Simmons, now in his 21st season with the team, is the longest-tenured coach on the Bengals' staff. He has led Cincinnati's special teams units each year since 2003.

**Back-to-back division champs:** The Bengals captured the AFC North Division title in 2022 for the second consecutive season, marking the first time in franchise history that Cincinnati won a division in back-to-back years. The 2022 division title was the team's 11th all-time.

While some databases list the Bengals as repeat division winners in 1981 and '82, the '82 postseason featured a special 16-team format (dubbed the "Super Bowl Tournament") that was implemented by the NFL, as the regular season was reduced to nine games due to a players' strike. Eight teams from each conference were seeded 1-8 based on their regular-season records, so despite the Bengals boasting the top record in the AFC Central, they went in as the conference's No. 3 seed and were not recognized as division champions.

**Ken Riley enters Hall of Fame:** Bengals legend Ken Riley, the most productive CB in team history, was officially inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame on Aug. 5. He joined OT Anthony Munoz as former Bengals players immortalized in Canton, Ohio.

The honor came posthumously for Riley, who passed away in 2020 at the age of 72. Riley's wife, Barbara, received the gold jacket on his behalf and revealed the bust with his son, Ken Riley II, who spoke at the enshrinement.

"Dad is just getting inducted today, but his whole life he was a Hall of Famer on and off the field," Ken Riley II said.

Riley spent 15 seasons (1969-83) with the Bengals, playing in 207 games. His 65 career INTs constitute the most dominant lead in any major statistical category of the team's record book, nearly doubling the second-place total of 33. At the time of Riley's retirement, that total of 65 INTs was the fourth-most in NFL history, and it still stands tied for fifth-most. He was a member of five Bengals teams that reached the postseason, including the 1981 squad, which he helped lead to Super Bowl XVI.

Following his retirement, Riley spent two seasons as an assistant coach for the Green Bay Packers before taking over as head coach at his alma mater, Florida A&M University. He led the Rattlers' football program from 1986-93, then served as the school's athletic director from '94-2004. Riley was inducted into the FAMU Athletics Hall of Fame in 1982, the Black College Football Hall of Fame in 2015, and the Bengals Ring of Honor in '21.

Riley's family received his Hall of Fame Ring of Excellence during a halftime ceremony in the Bengals' Week 9 contest against Buffalo on Sunday Night Football.

**Esiason, Johnson join Bengals Ring of Honor:** The Bengals welcomed two new members to the team's Ring of Honor with the induction of former QB Boomer Esiason and WR Chad Johnson. Remembered by fans for their on-field contributions as well as their charismatic personalities, Esiason and Johnson became the seventh and eighth members of the Ring of Honor during a ceremony at halftime of the team's Week 3 game against the L.A. Rams on Monday Night Football.

Esiason played for the Bengals from 1984-92 before returning for a final season in '97, and is regarded as one of the greatest locker-room leaders in team history. He earned three Pro Bowl nods (1986, '88-89), and ranks third in Bengals history in both career passing yards (27,149) and TD passes (187). Esiason in 1988 was named NFL MVP while leading the league with a 97.4 passer rating, before steering the Bengals to an AFC title and a berth in Super Bowl XXIII.

Johnson, who was officially known as Chad Ochocinco from 2008-11, emerged as one of the NFL's best receivers during his 10 seasons with the Bengals ('01-10). He was selected to six Pro Bowls (2003-07, '09), and remains the team's all-time leader in receptions (751), receiving yards (10,783) and receiving TDs (66).

Bengals president Mike Brown on the 2023 inductees: "Boomer and Chad were both exceptional players. If you look at the statistics, Boomer has a long list of quarterback firsts here. And Chad was a superb athlete who was probably the quickest receiver we have had here. They could have moments when they just carried the team by themselves. Both players are very deserving of this honor."

Esiason and Johnson joined QB Ken Anderson, OT Willie Anderson, team

founder/head coach Paul Brown, WR Isaac Curtis, OT Anthony Munoz and CB Ken Rilev in the Ring of Honor.

**Bengal bites:** The Bengals' victory over Buffalo in Week 9 was the 400th win in team history (390 regular season, 10 postseason); the team now

Quarterbacks: First-year QB Jake Browning is coming off a memorable performance in Week 13 at Jacksonville that earned him AFC Offensive Player of the Week honors. Making just his second career start, Browning completed 86.5 percent of his passes (32 of 37) for 354 yards and a TD. His TD throw came early in the third quarter, when he hit WR Ja'Marr Chase for a 76-yarder. Browning added 22 rushing yards on two carries with a TD. His 86.5 completion percentage was the fifth highest in a game in team history, and he became just the 10th player in the Super Bowl era (since 1966) to pass for at least 350 yards while completing 85 percent or more of his attempts. His performance in Jacksonville followed his first career regular-season start in Week 12 vs. Pittsburgh, which saw him go 19 of 26 (73.1 percent) with one TD and one INT. Browning's first substantial action came in Week 11 at Baltimore, when he entered the game in the second guarter following QB Joe Burrow's season-ending wrist injury. Browning went eight of 14 for 68 yards against the Ravens' defense, and recorded his first TD pass late in the fourth quarter. He spent the first 10 games of this season as Cincinnati's second-string QB behind Burrow, after earning a spot on the 53-man roster coming out of training camp for the first time in his career. He originally was a college free agent signee of Minnesota in 2019, and was on the Vikings' practice squad for the '19 and '20 seasons. Browning then joined the Bengals prior to the 2021 campaign and spent the past two years on Cincinnati's practice squad. He has played in six preseason games for the Bengals, including three in 2023 (two starts) in which he completed 71.1 percent of his passes (32 of 45) for 277 yards and one TD. He made his NFL debut in Week 1 at Cleveland, entering late in the fourth quarter in relief of Burrow. Browning was a four-year starter (2015-18) at the University of Washington, where he led the Huskies to the College Football Playoff in '16 and finished his career with numerous school records. Backing Browning up is ninth-year veteran AJ McCarron, who is in his second Bengals stint after being signed to the practice squad on Sept. 23. He was elevated to the active roster for the Week 12 contest against Pittsburgh, then on Dec. 4 was signed to the active roster off the practice squad. McCarron came into the NFL as a fifth-round draft pick of Cincinnati in 2014 and missed his rookie campaign due to a shoulder injury, but went on to play in 11 games over the next three seasons. That included three starts in 2015, when he helped the Bengals secure the AFC North Division title and started a Wild Card Playoff vs. Pittsburgh. McCarron also saw regular-season action with the Oakland Raiders (2018) and the Houston Texans ('19-20). He helped lead the University of Alabama to backto-back national titles as a starter in 2011 and '12.

Running backs: Leading the Bengals running back room is seventhvear pro Joe Mixon, who ranks third in team history in career rushing vards (6067) and third in rushing TDs (46). Mixon has surpassed the 1000-yard mark in three of his five full seasons (played just six games in 2020), and in 2022 he asserted himself as a reliable pass catching option with career highs in receptions (60) and receiving yards (441). Voted a team captain for the third straight year, Mixon has 689 rushing yards on 180 carries (3.8) through 12 games. He has scored a touchdown in five of the last six games, including two rushing TDs in Week 13 at Jacksonville. Mixon finished with 68 rushing yards and 49 receiving yards against the Jaguars, eclipsing 100 yards from scrimmage for the third time this season. He also surpassed 6000 career rushing yards and moved ahead of former RB Corey Dillon for the third most rushing TDs in team history (46). In Week 8 at San Francisco, Mixon tallied a season-high 87 rushing yards on 16 attempts (5.4), with a TD late in the fourth guarter to seal the win. He scored a TD in four consecutive games from Weeks 8-11, marking his first time finding the end zone in four straight since the 2021 season. Mixon's 6067 career rushing yards are fifth most in the NFL since he entered the league in 2017. Next on the running backs depth chart is fifth-year veteran Trayveon Williams. Williams has served as a reserve HB with 46 games of experience, totaling 297 rushing yards on 59 carries along with 13 catches for 73 yards. He also serves as the team's primary kickoff returner. Third-year pro Chris Evans had 17 carries for 77 yards his rookie season, but none in 2022. He opened the 2023

The lightest player on the roster is CB DJ Turner II, who is listed at 180 pounds ... The heaviest player on the roster is OT Orlando Brown Jr., who is listed at 345 pounds ... Brown is also the tallest player on the roster, listed at 5-8.

season with two carries for 12 yards in Week 1 at Cleveland. Rounding out the running backs room is rookie **Chase Brown**, who had spent four games on the Reserve/Injured list with a hamstring injury before returning to the lineup in Week 12 vs. Pittsburgh. Brown has played in seven games after leading the Bengals in rushing yards (69) during the preseason. He saw his first extended action in Week 13 at Jacksonville and helped provide a spark for the Cincinnati offense, totaling 61 rushing yards on nine carries including a 31-yard burst in the third quarter that marked the team's longest run of the season.

Wide receivers: The Bengals' wide receiver room is highlighted by one of the most explosive pass-catching trios in the NFL, with the senior member being eighth-year pro Tyler Boyd. Boyd is regarded as a premier slot receiver that poses a challenge for nickel CBs with his size (6-2, 203) and route-running ability. He ranks fifth in team history in career receptions (501) for 5832 yards and 31 TDs, and posted consecutive seasons of 1000-plus receiving yards in 2018-19. Boyd's two TD catches this season came in consecutive games vs. Seattle and at San Francisco, and each capped off the Bengals' opening offensive drive. He had a season-high eight receptions for 117 yards in Week 10 vs. Houston, including a 64-yard catch and run that set the Bengals up for a game-tying FG late in the fourth guarter. Boyd's four TD catches of 50 or more yards since the start of the 2021 season rank as the third most in the league, and leading that category with nine such TDs is teammate and third-year pro Ja'Marr Chase. Chase was the team's first-round draft pick in 2021 and paced the Bengals in receptions, receiving yards and receiving TDs in each of his first two seasons, earning Pro Bowl honors both years. Chase helped lead the Bengals to their first win in Week 3 vs. the L.A. Rams, amassing 141 yards on 12 catches. In Week 5 at Arizona, he hauled in a Bengals single-game record 15 catches for 192 yards and three TDs, including a 63-yard TD early in the third quarter. Chase in Week 6 vs. Seattle surpassed 3000 career receiving yards, doing so in the fifth-fewest games (35) in NFL history. He had another double-digit catch game in Week 8 at San Francisco, finishing with 10 receptions for 100 yards including a 17-yard TD in the fourth quarter. He had a 64-yard TD as part of a 124-yard receiving day in Week 10 against Houston, and in Week 12 vs. Pittsburgh led the Bengals with 81 yards on four grabs. Chase surpassed 1000 receiving yards on the season in Week 13 at Jacksonville when he recorded 149 yards on 11 receptions, including a 76-yard TD early in the third guarter that marked Cincinnati's longest play from scrimmage since 2021 (also a Chase TD). Chase missed four games in 2022 due to a hip injury, but still managed 87 catches for 1046 yards and nine TDs. Another Cincinnati receiver with a proven history of big plays is fourth-year pro Tee Higgins. Higgins, a second-round pick in 2020, has posted over 1000 receiving yards in each of the past two seasons, becoming one of five players in team history to do so within his first three years. He had four 100-yard receiving games in 2022, including two when Chase was out of the lineup in Weeks 11-12. At 6-4, he possesses elite athleticism and the ability to high-point the ball when contested by defensive backs. Higgins' top performance so far this season came in Week 9 vs. Buffalo, when he caught eight passes for a season-high 110 yards. He has missed four games due to injuries, including three in Weeks 10-12 with a hamstring ailment. He returned to action in Week 13 at Jacksonville, grabbing three receptions for 36 yards, including a key 11-yard catch to convert a third down on Cincinnati's gamewinning FG drive in overtime. Fellow fourth-year pro Trenton Irwin is a dependable option that can play at multiple WR spots, and has started four of his 11 games played this season. He ranks fifth on the team with 241 receiving yards, including a 32-yard TD catch to cap off the Bengals' opening drive of Week 10 against Houston. He had an increased role with Higgins out of the lineup for Week 5 at Arizona, and delivered a career-high eight catches for 60 yards. Irwin spent parts of his first three seasons on Cincinnati's practice squad and saw limited game action, but then found a role in 2022 when he played in nine contests with two starts. Despite not making his season debut until Week 8 at Cleveland, Irwin managed to record 15 catches for 231 yards and four TDs. His best performance came on Christmas Eve at New England, when he caught

three passes for 45 yards and two TDs, all in the first half. Two rookies comprise the rest of the WR room, including the team's fourth-round draft choice Charlie Jones. Jones is listed behind Boyd as the team's backup slot WR, and also serves as the team's primary punt returner. He was a second-team All-American last season at Purdue, when he led the FBS in receptions (110), while ranking second in receiving yards (1361) and fifth in receiving TDs (12). He recorded his first career catch in Week 3 vs. L.A. Rams. Jones missed Weeks 4-10 while on Reserve/Injured with a thumb injury but returned to action in Week 11 at Baltimore. Rounding out the WR room is rookie sixth-round pick Andrei losivas. The former Princeton standout both in football and track and field had a TD catch in back-to-back games (Week 6 vs. Seattle and Week 8 at San Francisco). Both scores came on QB scrambles, with losivas working himself free for Burrow to find in the end zone. losivas led Cincinnati in catches (12) and receiving yards (129) during preseason, helping him earn a roster spot. He missed the Week 11 contest at Baltimore due to a knee injury, but returned the following game against Pittsburgh and had a 16-yard catch to convert a third down.

Tight ends: Among Cincinnati's key free agent acquisitions this offseason was Irv Smith Jr., who is in his fifth NFL season after spending his first four years with Minnesota. Originally a second-round draft pick of the Vikings in 2019, Smith has played in 47 career games with 21 starts and totaled 107 catches for 955 yards and 10 TDs. He missed the entire 2021 campaign due to a knee injury and was limited to eight regular-season games in '22 due to an ankle injury, but has played in 10 contests this year with the Bengals. Smith missed Weeks 3-4 due to a hamstring injury, then returned to the lineup in Week 5 at Arizona. He scored his first TD as a Bengal on Cincinnati's opening drive in Week 9 vs. Buffalo. Next on the depth chart is fellow 2019 second-round pick Drew Sample, who since being drafted by the Bengals has established himself as a consistent blocking TE. Sample missed most of the 2022 season with a knee injury sustained in Week 2 at Dallas, but has played in all 12 games this season, making five starts. He has 70 career receptions for 551 yards and three TDs. Sample recorded three catches for 30 yards and a TD in Week 9 vs. Buffalo, his first score since the 2020 season. In Week 12 vs. Pittsburgh, Sample caught an 11-yard TD to give the Bengals a lead in the second quarter. He had a streak of 39 consecutive games played (including postseason) prior to the injury and has also been a core contributor on special teams for Cincinnati. The Bengals in July re-signed Mitchell Wilcox, who spent his first three career seasons with Cincinnati. He had his first two receptions of the season for 10 yards in Week 3 against the L.A. Rams. Wilcox has played in all 12 games this season and made his first start in Week 12 vs. Pittsburgh. The University of South Florida product has 25 career catches for 185 yards and a TD in 43 games. Tanner Hudson has emerged as a pass catching threat for the Bengals with 180 receiving yards over the past five games. He joined the Bengals' practice squad late in the 2022 season after spending time with Tampa Bay ('19-20), San Francisco ('21) and the N.Y. Giants ('22). Hudson played in 11 regularseason and all four postseason contests for the Buccaneers team that won Super Bowl LV. He spent the first seven games of 2023 on Cincinnati's practice squad, and after being a standard elevation for two games earlier this season, he was signed to the active roster on Nov. 1. He made an immediate impact, starting in Week 9 vs. Buffalo and recording four catches for 45 yards. In Week 10 vs. Houston, he posted a career-high six receptions for 33 yards, including five for 28 on the Bengals' opening TD drive. He added four catches for 49 yards in Week 11 at Baltimore, and followed that up with a combined eight catches for 53 yards over the past two games.

Offensive linemen: The Bengals have invested heavily in revamping the offensive line over the past two offseasons, signing four marguee free agents to bolster that unit. The most recent such addition is OT Orlando Brown Jr., who signed with Cincinnati in March after spending his first three seasons in Baltimore (2018-20) and the past two in Kansas City ('21-22). A Pro Bowl selection in each of the past four years, Brown took over as the Bengals' starting LOT. He was a crucial piece of offensive lines that blocked for Ravens QB Lamar Jackson (2019) and Chiefs QB Patrick Mahomes ('22) in their MVP seasons. Brown made his first 32 career starts at ROT, then transitioned to LOT midway through the 2020 season and has started his past 55 games at that spot. Brown has started all 12 contests for the Bengals, though he exited Week 6 vs. Seattle with a groin injury late in the third quarter. The nucleus of Cincinnati's Oline is C Ted Karras, who signed as a free agent in 2022 and almost instantaneously became a vocal leader in the locker room. Currently serving as a team captain for the second straight season, Karras has experience at all three interior OL positions but quickly cemented himself as the Bengals' starting center and played 99.4 percent of offensive snaps in 2022. He spent five of his first six pro seasons with New England, with the only outlier coming in 2020 with Miami.

Karras was a member of Patriots Super Bowl winning teams in 2016 and '18, before earning the starting center role in '19. Through 12 games, Karras has played 100 percent of offensive snaps. Joining Karras in the 2022 free agency class was RG Alex Cappa, who spent his first four seasons with Tampa Bay. Cappa was perhaps the Bengals' most consistent performer on the line through most of the 2022 season, starting the first 16 games before suffering a left ankle injury in the regular-season finale that kept him out of all three playoff contests. He was the Bucs' starting RG from 2019-21 and was a member of the Super Bowl LV-winning team, though he did not play in the final three postseason games due to an injury sustained in the Wild Card Playoff. Cappa has played 100 percent of offensive snaps through 12 games this season. Second-year pro Cordell Volson is building off an impressive rookie season in which he was the team's only player to line up for every single offensive snap in the regular season and postseason (1311 total). Volson originally was a fourth-round draft pick out of North Dakota State University, where he played four different positions along the O-line during his career. He played in a school-record 65 games at NDSU, helping the Bison win four FCS national championships while earning three FCS All-America honors. Through 12 games, Volson has played 100 percent of offensive snaps. Jonah Williams, the Bengals' first-round pick in 2019, is the team's starting ROT this year after lining up at LOT for his first three full seasons (missed '19 campaign due to shoulder injury). He has started all 54 regularseason games and all five postseason games he has played in. Williams carried a streak of 37 consecutive starts before suffering a left knee injury in the 2022 Wild Card Playoff vs. Baltimore that ended his season. He spent the majority of the offseason rehabbing, including all of the team's mandatory minicamp, but was a full participant in training camp and has played 100 percent of offensive snaps in the regular season. G Max Scharping is in his fifth pro season and serves as both a backup right guard and center for Cincinnati. Scharping was acquired by the Bengals on waivers prior to the start of the 2022 season and played in 14 regular-season contests before being thrust into the starting RG spot for all three postseason games following Cappa's injury. He spent his first three pro seasons with Houston, splitting time between RG and LG in 48 games played (33 starts). Another notable free agent addition this offseason was G Cody Ford, a fifth-year veteran who originally was a second-round pick of Buffalo in 2019. Ford spent his first three pro seasons with the Bills before playing for Arizona in 2022. He has played in 61 career games with 33 starts -15 at ROT, nine at RG, eight at LG and one as a third tackle. Ford saw action on 17 offensive snaps in Week 6 vs. Seattle, filling in at LOT in relief of Brown. He made his first start of the season as a third TE in Week 12 vs. Pittsburgh. In Week 13 at Jacksonville, Ford entered the contest as a sixth offensive lineman for three snaps. Ford previously lined up alongside Brown for two seasons (2016-17) at the University of Oklahoma. OT D'Ante Smith was inactive for all but one game for Cincinnati during the 2022 regular season, but played in all three postseason contests as a reserve lineman. He was originally a fourthround pick in 2021 and battled injuries as a rookie, seeing action in just two regular-season games. Smith returned in time for the postseason run, playing in both the AFC Championship and Super Bowl LVI. Third-year pro Jackson Carman played in all 17 regular-season games as a rookie in 2021 but saw action in just three contests last season. With the O-line affected by injuries heading into the Divisional Playoff at Buffalo in January, Carman was called upon to start at LOT and played perhaps the best game of his young career, as he helped limit the Bills to one sack and paved the way for Cincinnati's 172 net rushing vards. A native of Fairfield. Ohio (Greater Cincinnati area). Carman played three collegiate seasons at Clemson before the Bengals drafted him in the second round in 2021. C Trey Hill has served primarily as a special teams contributor the last two seasons, but started three games (two at C, one at RG) in his 2021 rookie campaign. A sixth-round draft pick, Hill has played in all seven of Cincinnati's postseason games the past two years.

**Defensive linemen:** Cincinnati native and Archbishop Moeller High School graduate **Sam Hubbard** is in his sixth Bengals season (fifth as a full-time starter). A third-round draft pick of the Bengals in 2018, Hubbard has 35.5 career sacks, the second most among all players from his rookie class. Four of those sacks came in a five-game span (Games 3-7), beginning in Week 3 when he took down Rams QB Matthew Stafford for an eight-yard loss in the fourth quarter. Hubbard was dominant in Week 6 vs. Seattle, recording six tackles (four solos) and five QB hits, including a sack of QB Geno Smith on fourth-and-goal to preserve Cincinnati's lead late in the fourth quarter. He helped preserve a 14-14 halftime tie when he dropped QB Trevor Lawrence for a seven-yard loss right before the break in Week 13 at Jacksonville. Hubbard also is considered among the best DEs in the NFL against the run and led the Bengals with 11 TFLs in 2022. He made one of the most memorable plays in recent team history during the fourth quarter of the Wild Card Playoff vs. Baltimore, returning a fumble 98 yards for what proved to be the game-winning TD. It was his second career

fumble returned for a score (regular and postseason). Hubbard missed games due 9-10 due to an ankle injury, but made four tackles including a TFL in his return to action vs. Pittsburgh in Week 12. On the other side of the line is DE Trey Hendrickson, who leads Cincinnati with 11.5 sacks this season (tied for sixth in NFL). Hendrickson joined the team as a free agent in 2021 and has earned Pro Bowl selections in each of his two Bengals seasons. His first year in stripes, Hendrickson posted a career-high 14 sacks, the fifth most in the league and second most in a season in team history. He followed that up with a teamleading eight sacks in 2022. The Florida Atlantic University product has 10.5 sacks over the past 10 games, including 2.5 in Week 5 at Arizona. He helped cement the Week 8 win over San Francisco with a strip sack of QB Brock Purdy that resulted in a Bengals recovery. Hendrickson's 47 sacks since the start of the 2020 season are the fourth most in the NFL in that span. On July 27, he signed a one-year contract extension that keeps him in Cincinnati through the 2025 season. DT DJ Reader, a 6-3, 335-pound run stuffer, has anchored the defensive line since signing with the Bengals as a free agent in 2020. Reader is a key component of a unit that has ranked in the top seven leaguewide in rushing vards allowed per game in each of the past two seasons. His first sack of the 2023 campaign came in Week 3 vs. the L.A. Rams, when he brought down QB Matthew Stafford for a nine-yard loss on a goal-to-go situation to help force the Rams into a FG. In Week 10 vs. Houston, Reader recovered a C.J. Stroud fumble on fourth-and-one in the red zone. Reader spent six games on the Reserve/Injured list in 2022 due to a knee injury, but returned in Week 11 and started each contest through the AFC Championship. DT B.J. Hill is in his third season with the Bengals and has become a major contributor on the D-line. Hill was acquired in a trade with the N.Y. Giants shortly before the 2021 regular season and has played in 44 games (30 starts) for Cincinnati. Hill started all 16 contests in 2022, posting a career-high 68 tackles with three sacks, one FF, three FR and four PDs. He has added four more sacks this season, highlighted by a takedown of Rams QB Matthew Stafford in Week 3 that forced a punt in the fourth quarter. He also recovered the fumble forced by Hendrickson in the fourth quarter in Week 8 at San Francisco. DE Joseph Ossai is in his third season as a pro, but 2022 was his first healthy year as he missed his entire rookie campaign due to a knee injury. The athletic pass rusher showcased his potential last season with 3.5 sacks as a reserve DE. He then posted six tackles in postseason play, including five with a TFL in the AFC Championship at Kansas City. Ossai saw action in all three preseason games and had an INT on the opening drive at Atlanta, but suffered an ankle injury the following week at Washington that caused him to miss the first two regular-season contests. He made his season debut in Week 3 and has seen action on 121 defensive snaps in nine games, and was an active DNP in Week 12 vs. Pittsburgh. He tallied his first sack of the season in Week 13 at Jacksonville, taking down QB C.J. Beathard on the Jaguars' final drive of regulation to help force a FG attempt. Second-year DT Zach Carter had a strong 2022 rookie campaign in which he played in all 16 regular-season games with nine starts. Carter, a 2022 thirdround pick out of the University of Florida, contributed to the run defense while totaling 23 tackles, a half-sack and a PD. He appeared in all three postseason games, starting the Wild Card round and AFC Championship as a second DT. Carter has 15 tackles, a FF and a PD through 12 games this season, and made his first start in Week 8 at San Francisco. He forced a fumble to end a Steelers red zone possession in Week 12 vs. Pittsburgh. Third-year pro Cam Sample logged his first sack of the season in Week 6 vs. Seattle, bringing down QB Geno Smith on the final play of the first half. Sample has played in 42 career regular-season games and serves as a rotational DE. He started in Week 10 vs. Houston and Week 11 at Baltimore in place of Hubbard, making five tackles against the Texans and three against the Ravens. A product of Tulane University, he posted 25 tackles with two sacks in 2022, and then flashed in the AFC Championship with a sack of Chiefs QB Patrick Mahomes along with another TFL. Sixth-year DT Josh Tupou has been a reliable DT against the run since joining the Bengals as a college free agent in 2017. The 6-3, 340-pound veteran has appeared in 60 games (22 starts) for the Bengals, and has logged 74 total tackles, including a pair of sacks in 2022. The Bengals selected DE Myles Murphy out of Clemson University in the first round (28th overall) of this year's draft, looking to bolster their pass rushing production. Murphy totaled 17.5 sacks in 38 games at Clemson, earning second-team All-ACC honors last season. He brings premier size and athleticism to the D-Line room at 6-5, 270 pounds. Murphy recorded his first career tackle and sack on a second-quarter takedown of QB Ryan Tannehill in Week 4 at Tennessee, and sacked QB Kenny Pickett for a two-yard loss in Week 12 vs. Pittsburgh. The Bengals acquired DT Jay Tufele on waivers from Jacksonville prior to the 2022 season opener and it proved to be a valuable move, as he started two games (Weeks 8-9) while

Reader was recovering from a knee injury. Tufele finished with 16 total tackles in seven regular-season games for Cincinnati. He has appeared in seven regular-season games this season, registering five total tackles.

Linebackers: Among Cincinnati's most promising young defenders is fourth-year pro Logan Wilson, who wears the "green dot" as the defense's communicator. Wilson led the Bengals in tackles the past two regular seasons, with his career-high 123 stops in 2022 marking the most by a Bengals player since Vontaze Burfict (171) in '13. Wilson has a team-high 97 total tackles through 12 games (all starts) this season. He also has shown a high proficiency when dropping into coverage, as his 10 career INTs are the most by an NFL LB since he entered the league in 2020. Three of those picks have come this season, including two in Week 3 vs. the L.A. Rams and another in Week 8 at San Francisco. He and DE Trey Hendrickson split a sack in Week 10 vs. Houston, with Wilson forcing a fumble on the play that ended a Texans drive in Cincinnati territory. Wilson was inked to a four-year contract extension on Aug. 5 that keeps him in Cincinnati through the 2027 season. Ranking second on the team in tackles this season with 89 is Germaine Pratt. Pratt, a fifth-round Bengals pick in 2019 who is in his fifth pro season, has started 66 of 74 regularseason games played. He tied for the team lead with 11 tackles (seven solos) in Week 1 at Cleveland, with a sack and FF, and followed that up with nine stops in Week 2 vs. Baltimore. In Week 5 at Arizona, Pratt led the team with 10 tackles, including a key stop on a Cardinals fourth-and-one in the third quarter, then in the fourth quarter picked off QB Joshua Dobbs to help seal the win. Pratt added another INT in Week 8 at San Francisco, tipping a pass by QB Brock Purdy and coming down with it to end a potential game-tying drive that reached Cincinnati's eight-yard line. Pratt forced a fumble in the fourth guarter of Week 9 vs. Buffalo (recovered by S Nick Scott) that ended a Bills scoring threat. In Week 13 at Jacksonville, Pratt logged a team-high 12 combined tackles, tied for the most by a Bengals player this season. A 2020 seventh-round draft choice of the Bengals, Markus Bailey has grown into a key reserve role in the LB room as well as a valuable contributor on special teams. Bailey has played in 55 regular-season games (four starts), and has 51 total defensive tackles as well as 17 special teams tackles. He provided a crucial block during Sam Hubbard's 98-yard fumble recovery return for a TD in the Wild Card Playoff vs. Baltimore this past January. Akeem Davis-Gaither played in the first three games this season before suffering a knee injury that has caused him to be inactive for four contests. He returned to game action in Week 9 vs. Buffalo. He logged a career-best 37 tackles in 16 games (one start) in 2022, with 13 of those stops coming in a notable Week 3 performance at the N.Y. Jets. Davis-Gaither also played in all three postseason games, recording his first career INT in the Wild Card Playoff against Baltimore. Joe Bachie spent the first six games of 2022 on the Reserve/Physically Unable to Perform list while recovering from a left knee injury, but returned to the active roster and saw action in 10 regular-season games and all three postseason contests. He resumed his role as a core special teams player, totaling seven ST tackles in 168 snaps. Bachie has seen action mostly on special teams so far in 2023. The Bengals acquired LB Devin Harper on waivers from Dallas on Sept. 29. Harper originally was a sixth-round pick of the Cowboys in 2022 and played in six games for them, including their first three contests of this season. He made his Bengals debut in Week 5 at Arizona and has played in three contests this year for Cincinnati.

Defensive backs: Nickel CB Mike Hilton, a free agency acquisition of the Bengals in 2021, is widely considered one of the top slot corners in the NFL. Though listed at 5-9, 184 pounds, Hilton is a sure tackler and excellent blitzer. He was voted to serve as a team captain this season for the first time in his career, and has started 10 of 12 games played. Hilton came down with his first INT of the season in Week 6 vs. Seattle, picking off QB Geno Smith in the third guarter to end a Seahawks drive that reached the red zone. He recovered a fumble in the second guarter of Week 10 vs. Houston, ending a Texans drive that reached the Cincinnati 31-yard line. His eight solo tackles, including two TFLs, led the team in Week 12 vs. Pittsburgh. Hilton has notably made several game-altering plays in the postseason over the past two years, including an INT in the 2021 Divisional Playoff at Tennessee and a sack in the fourth quarter of the '22 Wild Card Playoff vs. Baltimore. Chidobe Awuzie arrived in Cincinnati in 2021 alongside Hilton and quickly established himself as the team's No. 1 boundary corner. Awuzie has started 32 of 37 games he has played in for the Bengals (including postseason). His 2022 season was cut short by a knee injury suffered in Week 8 at Cleveland, and he spent the following nine-plus months rehabbing before being cleared to practice on July 25 of this year. Awuzie's first game back came on the same field where he sustained the injury, as he played 43 defensive snaps in Week 1 at Cleveland and recorded a FR in the first quarter. Awuzie missed the Week 5 contest at Arizona due to a back injury, but returned to game action in Week 6 vs. Seattle. He has started the past two contests in the absence of CB Cam Taylor-Britt (Reserve/Injured list), and in

Week 13 at Jacksonville tallied eight tackles and a PD. Cincinnati used its 2023 second-round selection on DJ Turner II, a speedy boundary corner out of the University of Michigan. Turner ran the fastest 40-yard dash at this year's NFL Combine, clocking a time of 4.26 seconds. He recorded three INTs and 20 PDs in four seasons (2019-22) at Michigan and was named second-team All-Big Ten last season. He made his NFL debut in the regular-season opener at Cleveland and had his first career PD in the fourth quarter of Week 3 vs. the L.A. Rams. Turner has started each of the past eight games, totaling 29 tackles (25 solos) and four PDs in that stretch. In Week 12 vs. Pittsburgh, he broke up a would-be touchdown reception before recovering a fumble on the very next play to end a Steelers drive in the red zone. Jalen Davis serves as a reserve slot CB behind Hilton, but secondary/cornerbacks coach Charles Burks has expressed his opinion that Davis could start for many NFL teams. He has played in 53 career games (including postseason), carving out a role on special teams in addition to his CB duties. He notched his first PD of the season in Week 3 against the Rams. DJ Ivey, the Bengals' seventh-round pick in April, made his NFL debut in Week 5 at Arizona after he was inactive for the first four games. Ivey played in 58 games with 32 starts over a five-year career (2018-22) at the University of Miami (Fla.). At 6-1, 192, he provides a rangy frame and displayed impressive ball skills in training camp. Ivey logged 10 tackles and a team-leading three PDs in the preseason. At safety, second-year pro Dax Hill has stepped up as a consistent performer in his first season in a starting role. Hill was the Bengals' first-round draft choice in 2022 and played in 15 games with two starts as a rookie, but this season has started all 12 contests and ranks third on the team with 80 tackles. He also has five TFLs, 1.5 sacks, two INTs and 10 PDs. Hill's first career INT came in Week 1 at Cleveland, when he picked off QB Deshaun Watson and returned it 20 yards. He had a team-high eight stops, including his first sack, in Week 3 against the L.A. Rams, and then grabbed his second INT the following week at Tennessee. Cincinnati took Jordan Battle in the third round of this April's draft, adding depth and championship pedigree to the safeties room. Battle was a third-team All-American in each of the past two seasons while at the University of Alabama, and helped the Crimson Tide win the College Football Playoff National Championship in 2020. He has played in all 12 games this season, but has started each of the past two while earning an increased load of defensive snaps. Of his 37 tackles on the year, 26 have come over the past three games. He led the Bengals in tackles in Week 11 at Baltimore with 11 (10 solos). Battle logged his first career sack in Week 13 at Jacksonville, which came on third down to force a FG attempt late in the fourth quarter. Fifth-year veteran Nick Scott was among Cincinnati's notable acquisitions during the 2023 free agency period and holds 76 games of NFL experience (27 starts). He spent his first four seasons with the L.A. Rams, starting out as a special teams contributor before gradually increasing his role defensively and eventually becoming the team's starting safety in 2022. Scott is known for his physical play and sure tackling abilities, but also has four INTs and nine PDs. He started each of the Rams' four postseason contests on their run to a Super Bowl LVI title. Scott made his Bengals debut in Week 1 at Cleveland, tying for the team lead with 11 total tackles. He also led Cincinnati in tackles with 10 (nine solos) in Week 4 at Tennessee. Scott recovered a fumble in the red zone (forced by LB Germaine Pratt) in the fourth quarter of Week 9 vs. Buffalo.

Special teams: Rookie Brad Robbins earned the Bengals' punting role following a strong display in training camp and preseason. A native of Westerville, Ohio (north of Columbus), he is averaging 44.3 gross yards per punt with 13 downed inside the opponents' 20-yard line through 12 regular-season contests. Robbins punted five times with an average of 51.4 yards in Week 4 at Tennessee, including a career-long 62-yard boot. In Week 9 vs. Buffalo, he landed each of his three punts inside the Bills' 20-yard line. He recorded two more inside-20 punts in Week 10 vs. Houston, and finished with a 51.8-yard average on five total punts. Robbins was selected by the Bengals in the sixth round of April's draft after a five-year playing career at the University of Michigan that saw him post the second highest career punting average (43.0 yards per attempt) in program history. He additionally handles holding duties on placekicks for the Bengals. Third-year K Evan McPherson has earned a reputation as one of the NFL's top kickers from long range, as his 21 FGs from 50 or more yards are the most in the league since the start of the 2021 campaign. The former fifthround Bengals draft pick has kicked four of the five longest made FGs in Bengals history, including each of the two longest - a 59-yarder in the 2022 season opener vs. Pittsburgh, and a 58-yarder in Week 15 of the '21 season at Denver. McPherson is also 19 for 19 on FG attempts in the postseason, the second most consecutive FGs without a miss to begin a postseason career in NFL history. McPherson's 82.6 career FG percentage ranks third in Bengals history. He drilled four of his five FG attempts, with hits from 53 and 54 yards, in Week 3 against the L.A. Rams, and connected on a season-long 56-yard attempt at San Francisco in Week 8. He converted one of his two attempts from 50 or more vards in Week 11 at Baltimore, hitting a 50 yarder. In Week 13 at Jacksonville, McPherson converted two of his three attempts, including a 54-yarder to give the Bengals the lead late in the fourth quarter and a 48-yarder in overtime that marked his sixth career game-winner. The Bengals' long-snapper is second-year pro Cal Adomitis, who took over the role in Week 2 of the 2022 season following a season-ending injury to veteran Clark Harris. In 30 career games (including postseason), Adomitis has delivered 250 snaps without an unplayable attempt. He originally joined the Bengals as a college free agent in 2022 after a five-year career ('17-21) at the University of Pittsburgh. Listed as the first-string punt returner and second-string kickoff returner is rookie WR Charlie Jones, who in 2021 was named Big Ten Return Specialist of the Year while at the University of Iowa. Jones returned 25 kickoffs for 635 yards (25.4) and one TD that season for the Hawkeyes, while also returning 37 punts for 285 yards. In Week 2 against Baltimore, Jones scored his first career TD on an 81-yard punt return, the Bengals' first punt return TD since 2012 (CB Adam Jones). Jones missed Weeks 4-10 while on Reserve/Injured with a thumb injury but returned to action in Week 11 at Baltimore and returned three punts for 24 yards. WR Trenton Irwin is listed as the second-string punt returner. Irwin has returned 10 punts for 98 yards, including four for 68 with two going for over 20 yards in Week 5 at Arizona. HB Trayveon Williams has been the team's primary KOR. Williams this season has returned 12 kickoffs for 290 yards, including a 41-yard runback in the first quarter of Week 8 at San Francisco that set up a Bengals TD drive. He followed that with three KORs for 61 yards in Week 9 vs. Buffalo. In Week 12 vs. Pittsburgh, he had a career-long 46-yard KOR in the second guarter that set up the Bengals at their own 47-yard line and led to a TD four plays later. Williams took over the role in the second half of last season and had 16 KORs for 356 yards (22.3) over the final eight regular-season games.

### Cincinnati Bengals 34, Indianapolis Colts 23 Sunday, Sept. 9, 2018 at Lucas Oil Stadium

The Bengals captured their first win in Indianapolis since 1997, thanks to 24 unanswered points in the second half that were punctuated by an 83-yard scoop-and-score by reserve S Clayton Fejedelem with 24 seconds left, as the Colts were attempting to drive for a game-winning TD. Fejedelem had been thrust into extended action after starting SS Shawn Williams was ejected for a personal foul penalty in the first half. The defense gave up 319 passing yards and two TDs to Colts QB Andrew Luck, who made his first start since the 2016 season. Big plays on defense by the Bengals were key. In addition to Fejedelem's FR, LB Preston Brown had an INT at the Cincinnati seven-yard line on the Colts' first drive, and DE Carlos Dunlap sacked Luck at the end of the third quarter to push a Colts FG attempt back to 55 yards (Colts K Adam Vinateri's attempt fell short). On offense, QB Andy Dalton posted a 109.7 passer rating, while HB Joe Mixon had 149 yards from scrimmage (95 rushing, 54 receiving) and a TD.

# Indianapolis Colts 31, Cincinnati Bengals 27 Sunday, Oct. 18, 2020 at Lucas Oil Stadium

The visiting Bengals jumped ahead 21-0 by the first play of the second quarter, against a Colts team which entered the contest leading the NFL in both total defense and pass defense. But the story of the day was the Indy offense, which shook off a slow start to quickly close the gap to three points at halftime. Colts 38-year old QB Philip Rivers turned in a vintage performance, passing for 371 yards and three TDs, good for a 105.4 rating. Still, though, Bengals rookie QB Joe Burrow kept the game close with 313 passing yards of his own, including 125 to fellow rookie Tee Higgins. Down by four late in the fourth quarter, Burrow led the Bengals deep into Colts territory before throwing an INT with 46 seconds left, sealing the Colts' victory. Cincinnati fell to 1-4-1, while Indianapolis improved to 4-2.

# WEEK 1, GAME 1

#### Cleveland Browns 24, Cincinnati Bengals 3 Sunday, Sept. 10, 2023 at Cleveland Browns Stadium

Hindered by wet and rainy conditions, the Bengals were limited to three points and 142 offensive net yards in a season-opening loss to their in-state rival. The Cincinnati defense kept the game within reach, forcing two turnovers and holding the Browns to 13 points through three quarters, but Cleveland's strong rushing attack eventually broke through and finished the day with 206 yards, led by 106 from RB Nick Chubb. Browns QB Deshaun Watson found the end zone on a 13-yard run just before halftime to give the Browns a 10-0 lead at the break, but the Bengals responded with a 42-yard FG from K Evan McPherson early in the third quarter to cut the deficit to seven. A promising drive on Cincinnati's next offensive possession resulted in a missed FG attempt, and the offense did not reach Browns territory the rest of the way as Cleveland held the upper hand in the battle of field position. The Bengals went for it on fourth-and-four from their own 31-yard line with just over 10 minutes remaining in an attempt to jumpstart the offense, but QB Joe Burrow was dropped for a 13-yard sack and the Browns scored three plays later to seal the final outcome. The game was the 100th "Battle of Ohio" between the two teams.

Cincinnati faced two 10-point deficits in the second half and each time was able to cut it to three, but ultimately the Bengals never took the lead in a home-opener loss. Baltimore was efficient offensively, totaling 415 net yards — including 178 rushing — and scoring a TD on three of its four red zone trips. Cincinnati's offense had just three possessions in the first half and was limited to a FG, but an 81-yard punt return for a TD by rookie WR Charlie Jones in the second quarter helped keep the team within striking distance. QB Joe Burrow connected with WR Tee Higgins for a TD late in the third quarter to reduce Baltimore's lead to three points at 20-17, but the Ravens answered with a 12-play, 85-yard TD drive to regain the two-score advantage. Another Burrow-to-Higgins TD with 3:28 left closed the gap again, but the Ravens converted a pair of third downs on the ensuing possession to end the game. Cincinnati fell to 0-2, while Baltimore improved to 2-0.

The Bengals' defense recorded six sacks and two INTs to steer Cincinnati to its first win of the season on Monday Night Football. The Bengals then struck with a 10-play, 75-yard march on their first possession of the third quarter that ended with a 14-yard TD run by HB Joe Mixon. WR Ja'Marr Chase contributed 33 of his 141 receiving yards on that go-ahead scoring drive, and his team-leading 12 catches on the night helped spark the offense. Cincinnati's defense continued to pressure Rams QB Matthew Stafford, and LB Logan Wilson's second INT of the game not only ended a LA. scoring threat, but it led to another Bengals FG which extended the lead to 16-9 late in the third quarter. Five different Bengals tallied a sack — DE Trey Hendrickson recorded two in the second half — and the Rams' offense converted just one of 11 third-down attempts. Cincinnati improved to 1-2, while the Rams fell to 1-2.

The Bengals opened the game with an 11-play, 72-yard FG drive, but it proved to be their most successful possession as the Titans held them to just 139 net yards the rest of the way. Tennessee used a balanced offensive attack and totaled 400 net yards (227 passing, 173 rushing) to wear down the Cincinnati defense. The score was tied 3-3 at the midway point of the second quarter, before the Titans erupted for three TDs in the final 6:31 to take a commanding 24-3 halftime lead. RB Derrick Henry led the charge for Tennessee with 122 yards on 22 carries (5.5-yard average), including a 29-yard TD run that saw him break three tackles before reaching the end zone. The Titans repeatedly blitzed QB Joe Burrow, sacking him three times while holding the Bengals to two of nine on third down. Cincinnati fell to 1-3, while Tennessee improved to 2-2.

Bengals WR Ja'Marr Chase posted a team-record 15 receptions for 192 yards and three TDs, while the Cincinnati defense forced three turnovers in a road victory. Chase's first TD capped an 11-play opening drive to give the Bengals an early lead, but Arizona answered with two TDs in the second quarter to pull ahead 14-10. The Cardinals then stopped HB Joe Mixon at the one-yard line on fourth-and-goal late in the first half, but two plays later CB Cam Taylor-Britt intercepted a Joshua Dobbs pass and returned it 11 yards to the end zone, putting Cincinnati back in front. Less than two minutes into the second half, QB Joe Burrow launched a deep ball that hit Chase in stride for a 63-yard TD to extend the Bengals' lead. Arizona responded with a TD and had a chance to reclaim the lead later in the third guarter, but LB Germaine Pratt stopped Dobbs on a rush on fourth down at the Bengals' 16-yard line. Cincinnati's offense took over and drove 83 yards in 15 plays, punctuated by Chase's third TD, to take command midway through the fourth quarter. The Bengals improved to 2-3, while Arizona fell to 1-4.

QB Joe Burrow completed 87.5 percent of his passes (28 of 32) for 283 yards and three TDs, while LBs Germaine Pratt and Logan Wilson each had an INT in the second half to lead Cincinnati to a road victory. The Bengals' offense found the end zone on its opening two drives to grab an early 14-7 lead, and Burrow closed out the first half with a career-best 19 consecutive completions. San Francisco had a chance to tie the game on a first-andgoal late in the third quarter, before Pratt tipped a pass by QB Brock Purdy and picked it off to end the scoring threat. The 49ers forced a punt less than two minutes later, but Wilson intercepted Purdy's next pass and returned it inside the red zone to give the offense a short field. Burrow cashed in on the following play with a 17-yard TD pass to WR Ja'Marr Chase, who finished with a game-high 10 catches for 100 yards. The 49ers inched closer with a TD on their next drive, but the Bengals responded with a 10-play, 78-yard march capped by a rushing TD from HB Joe Mixon to regain the two-score advantage and seal the win. Cincinnati improved to 4-3, while San Francisco fell to 5-3.

## Baltimore Ravens 34, Cincinnati Bengals 20 Thursday night, Nov. 16, 2023 at M&T Bank Stadium

The Bengals held a narrow lead early in the second quarter in a highly anticipated Thursday Night Football showdown at Baltimore, but a wrist injury forced QB Joe Burrow to miss the remainder of the game and the Ravens went on to secure a 34-20 divisional win. Burrow left the contest after throwing a TD pass to HB Joe Mixon that put Cincinnati ahead 10-7, and Baltimore capitalized on his absence with two TD drives before halftime to build a double-digit advantage. The balanced Ravens offense totaled 405 net yards — with 248 coming through the air and 157 on the ground — and had seven plays of 20 or more yards. Backup QB Jake Browning was effective in relief of Burrow, leading a 10-play FG drive to open the second half that closed Cincinnati's deficit to 21-13. The Bengals also posted a season-best 136 rushing yards to help keep the game within reach through three quarters, but Baltimore managed to create separation with 13 straight points while forcing a punt on three consecutive Bengals possessions. Cincinnati fell to 5-5, while Baltimore improved to 8-3.

The Bengals opened the second half by marching into the red zone, but an INT by Steelers S Trenton Thompson led to a 14-play, 79-yard TD drive that put Pittsburgh back in front. The Bengals were forced to punt twice in the fourth quarter while the Steelers expanded their lead, before Cincinnati kicked a FG ahead of the two-minute warning to close its gap to six. With no timeouts remaining, the Bengals attempted an onside kick, but a Steelers recovery allowed Pittsburgh to kneel out the remaining clock. Cincinnati fell to 5-6, while Pittsburgh improved to 7-4.

#### Cincinnati Bengals 34, Jacksonville Jaguars 31 (OT) Monday night, Dec. 4, 2023 at EverBank Stadium

In a nationally televised thriller which included five ties and six lead changes, the Bengals won when K Evan McPherson converted a game-winning 48-yard FG with 3.17 left in overtime. In his second career start, QB Jake Browning completed 32 of 37 passes (86.5 percent) for 354 yards and one TD, highlighted by four completions in the extra period to move Cincinnati into FG range. The Bengals answered a pair of Jaguars TDs in the first half with two rushing scores from HB Joe Mixon, then grabbed their first lead early in the third quarter when Browning found WR Ja/Marr Chase down the left sideline for a 76-yard TD. Chase had 11 catches for 149 yards, while Mixon had 117 scrimmage yards (68 rushing, 49 receiving). Cincinnati improved to 6-6, while Jacksonville fell to 8-4.
