MILLI WILSON originally joined the Bills in 2023 while participating in the Bill Walsh Diversity Coaching Fellowship program. Wilson then joined the team as a fellowship coach in 2024 and was promoted to offensive assistant/offensive fellowship coach in 2025.

COACHING SHOUTOUTS

2023-present: (Buffalo Bills)

- Was promoted to offensive assistant/offensive fellowship coach for the 2025 season.
- Re-joined the team as a fellowship coach in 2024, primarily assisting with the offensive line alongside Aaron Kromer and Austin Gund. The Bills offensive line only allowed an NFL-best 14 sacks, marking the second consecutive year the team led the league in sacks allowed. The offensive line helped the Bills become the first team in NFL history to score 30+ rushing and 30+ receiving touchdowns and led the way for RB James Cook to tie a franchise record with 16 rushing touchdowns.
- Participated in the Bill Walsh Diversity Coaching Fellowship program with the Bills during the team's 2023 OTAs, minicamp and training camp.
