JOSH ALLEN is in his eighth season in Buffalo after spending three years at Wyoming (2015-17) and one year at Reedley College (2014). Allen was the seventh selection of the first round by the Bills in 2018. In 2025, the Bills reached an agreement on a new deal to keep the MVP QB in Buffalo through 2030.

SHOUTOUTS

- Named the 2024 NFL MVP, becoming the third MVP in Bills team history and first QB to win the honor.
- Has the most wins (76), total TDs (262) & total yards (30,595) by any player all-time in their first 7 seasons.
- Became the first player in NFL history vs. Bal. (9/7) to have 250+ passing yards & 2+ rushing TDs in any single quarter of any single game while doing so in the 4th quarter to bring the Bills back from a 15-point deficit.
- Is the Bills all-time leader in total touchdowns (266).
- Led the NFL in 2023 in total TDs (44) & yards (4,830).
- Finished second in MVP voting in 2020 and was a finalist in 2022 and 2023. Named a second-team All Pro in 2020 & 2024 and a Pro Bowler in 2020, 2022 & 2024.
- During the 2021 postseason, tallied a 149.0 passer rating—which marked the highest all-time for a player in a single playoffs (min. 50 att.).
- Was under center for the first ‘perfect game’ in NFL history as the Bills scored a touchdown on every drive vs. NE (1/15/22). In the effort, became the first player in NFL history with 5 passing TDs, an 80% completion percentage & 50+ rush yards.
- Has been named AFC Offensive Player of the Month three times (Sept./Dec. 2020 and Sept. 2024). Has been named AFC Offensive Player of the Week a franchise-record 16 times in his career.
- In 2020, set Bills single season franchise records for passing touchdowns (37), completions (396), 300 yard games (8), passer rating (107.2), completion percentage (69.2), passing yards (4,544) and total touchdowns (46).

FROM THE GRIDIRON TO THE GREEN

Away from the field, Allen is an avid fan of golf. Whether it's playing or attending tournaments, Allen has enjoyed some golf experiences that any golf fan would be envious of. Some of the highlights include:

- Has attended 10 majors, including the Masters every year since first attending golf's premier event in 2018 (except for 2020 due to COVID).
- Is a member of Oak Hill Country Club in Rochester, NY, which is the home of the 2023 PGA Championship. Beat Bills GM Brandon Beane in a golf outing at Oak Hill prior to the start of the 2022 season.
- Played Oak Hill CC on the Monday after the 2023 PGA Championship.
- Has played in the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am three times, pairing with PGA pro Keith Mitchell.
- Has played in the American Century Championship in Lake Tahoe three times.
- In February 2023, met his childhood idol Tiger Woods while attending the final round of the Genesis Invitational. Played in a pro-am with Tiger in the 2024 offseason.
- Paired up with Patrick Mahomes and faced Tom Brady/Aaron Rodgers in the sixth edition of The Match, which was played at Wynn Golf Club in Las Vegas, NV.
- He has a golf simulator in his basement in his Buffalo house.
- Is a part-owner of the local golf brand, OnCore Golf.
- Is a member of one of the premier golf clubs in Western New York: Crag Burn Golf Club.
- Participated in a nationally televised event at Augusta National put on by EA Sports to launch their new golf game. Among others, Allen was joined by Eric Church and Tony Finau in playing the new video game.

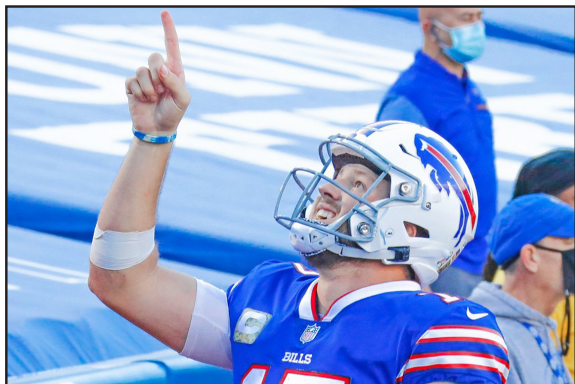
PERSONAL

AN EMOTIONAL WIN

Josh Allen led the Bills to a 44-34 win over the Seattle Seahawks in 2020. The performance became even more meaningful after the game when Bills HC Sean McDermott told the media that Josh's grandmother, Patricia Allen, had passed away the day prior. In a post-game video released by the team, Allen emotionally tells his teammates "I love you guys. There's no place I'd rather be." Upon learning of the heartache Allen played through, Bills fans began making donations to Oishei Children's Hospital in \$17 increments. Donations exploded over the week, eventually surpassing a million dollars.
