FIRST-AND-10

JASON REBROVICH (pronounced reb-row-vitch) re-joins the Bills as the team's assistant defensive line coach. Rebrovich returns to Buffalo after previously coaching with the team from 2013-16. A veteran NFL coach of 11 seasons, he most recently served as the Packers defensive line coach in 2024.

COACHING SHOUTOUTS

2022-24: (Green Bay Packers)

- Originally named outside linebackers coach in 2022, was then promoted to pass rush specialist in 2023 and defensive line coach in 2024.
- Coached a Packers defensive line in 2024 that led the Green Bay defense to finish the year with 45 sacks and 31 takeaways, marking the fifth time in team history that they registered 45+ sacks and 30+ takeaways.
- In 2023, worked closely with veteran OLBs Rashan Gary and Preston Smith as well as rookie first-round pick Lukas Van Ness. Gary was one of only four players in the league to register nine-plus sacks (nine), multiple fumble recoveries (two) and multiple forced fumbles (two).
- In his first season in Green Bay in 2022, tutored Gary, who ranked in the top 10 among NFL linebackers in QB hits (12, t-No. 6), sacks (six, t-No. 8) and pressures (27, No. 9) prior to his injury in Week 9. Smith led the team with in sacks (8½) and QB hits (20).

2017-20: (Jacksonville Jaguars)

- Worked with the Jaguars for four seasons, serving as the defensive line coach in 2019-20 and the assistant defensive line coach in 2017-18.
- Tutored Jaguars DE Josh Allen in 2019, who led all rookies and broke the single-season team record for rookies with $10\frac{1}{2}$ sacks on his way to earning All-Rookie honors.
- Worked with Jaguars DL Calais Campbell, who was named to his third consecutive Pro Bowl in '19, and DE Yannick Ngakoue, who was the only NFL player in 2019 to register eight-plus sacks, multiple forced fumbles and an INT return for a touchdown.

COACHING SHOUTOUTS

2017-20: (Jacksonville Jaguars - continued)

• As the Jaguars' assistant defensive line coach in 2017-18, Rebrovich helped Campbell become the first player in team history to post 10-plus sacks in back-to-back seasons. In 2017, the Jaguars ranked No. 2 in the league with 55 sacks, the second most in a season in team history. Campbell earned first-team All-Pro honors from The Associated Press after posting a franchise-record 14½ sacks.

2013-16: (Buffalo Bills)

- Held multiple positions during his first tenure in Buffalo, serving as the defensive line coach in 2016, the outside linebackers coach in 2015, the assistant defensive line coach in 2014 and as a defensive quality control coach in 2013.
- In his four seasons, the Bills were tied for No. 3 in the NFL over that span with 171 sacks and posted back-to-back seasons with 50-plus sacks (2013-14) for the first time in team history.
- In 2014, helped the Bills lead the league with 54 sacks, with three different defensive linemen recording a double-digit sack total (Mario Williams, 14½; Marcell Dareus, 10; Jerry Hughes, 10).

ADDITIONAL EXPERIENCE

• Prior to entering the NFL coaching ranks, spent 12 seasons coaching at the collegiate level at Syracuse (2011-12), SUNY Cortland (2008-10, 2001-03), Ferris State (2005-07) and Concord (2004).

PERSONAL

- Played two seasons on the defensive line at SUNY
 Cortland, recording 40 tackles and 28 QB hurries in eight
 games as a senior in 1999. He played two seasons at
 Alfred State College before attending Cortland, serving
 as a team captain and earning the team's Most Improved
 Player award in 1997.
- Was born on March 15, 1978, in Clarence, NY. He and his wife, Trisha, have two daughters, Reese and Madison, and a son. Chase.
