AR'MAJ REED-ADAMS was selected by the Bills in the seventh round in 2026 out of Texas A&M. A 2025 Second Team All-American, Reed-Adams is the first Aggie drafted by the Bills since DT Ron Edwards in 2001.

SHOUTOUTS

- Split his college career between Texas A&M (2024-25) and Kansas (2020-23). Appeared in 31 games, including 15 starts in four seasons at Kansas. Started all 26 games he played for Texas A&M, finishing his career with 57 career games played and 41 starts.
- Was named a Texas A&M team captain in 2025.
- Earned Second Team All-American and Second Team All-SEC honors in 2025 after anchoring an offensive front that helped Texas A&M average 454.4 yards of total offense per game.
- In 2024 during his first season with Texas A&M, started at right guard each game, while helping pave the way for an Aggie rushing attack that ranks 26th in the nation and second in the SEC with 195.5 yards per game.
- Started 11 games in 2023, helping the Jayhawks finish 9-4 and total 500-plus offensive yards in four games.
- In 2021, saw action in three games for the Jayhawks on the offensive line and special teams.
- In 2020, played in the team's last five games of the season, starting three of those contests (vs. ISU, vs. TCU and at Texas Tech).

PERSONAL

First name is pronounced 'are-MAH-jay'. Is the son of Lyonel Adams and Crystal Reed. Has one brother (Lyonel Jr.) and one sister (Ar'maja). Graduated with a degree in marketing from Texas A&M. Graduated from De Soto High School in De Soto, Texas after attending Mesquite Horn High School, where he also competed in shot put and discus for the track & field team as a sophomore in 2018. Hobbies include golfing and cooking.

SMASHING CHAIRS

Folding chairs, beware. Ar'maj Reed-Adams is back at Texas A&M for another season.

The Aggies' veteran offensive lineman garnered a reputation as a leader amongst his teammates last year with his chair-smashing antics. Now he wants to leave his mark as one of the top guards in the country, smashing open running lanes for Texas A&M ball carriers.

Reed-Adams garnered attention last season for smashing a fold-out chair with opponents' logos on it before games. He explained the origins of the "team morale" ritual Wednesday. His motivation came from Tommy Moffitt, the Aggies' director of strength and conditioning, who during the week of the Florida game last year dressed up a padded dummy in a Gators blue jersey and used it as motivation. "He just (got) to hitting the pad and screaming 'F 'em' and 'We've got to win' and 'We've got to change this around,'"

Reed-Adams recalled, thinking back to the week of preparation before the team's first road game. "Just feeling in the locker room that we needed that, I brought out the chair just to keep that energy going. So I just brought it out, and people took pictures, and it went viral. We kept with it, and we started adding stickers (of opponents' logos), and it became something the team was looking forward to."
