FIRST-AND-10

DJ MANGAS enters the 2025 season as the Bills offensive quality control/assistant wide receivers coach. Mangas originally joined the Bills during the 2023 season as an offensive assistant. He previously coached in the NFL during the 2020 season as an offensive coaching assistant with the Panthers.

COACHING SHOUTOUTS

2023-present: (Buffalo Bills)

- Was promoted to offensive quality control coach for the 2024 season, helping the Bills offense become the first team in NFL history to score 30+ rushing and 30+ receiving touchdowns. The Bills averaged an AFC-best 30.9 points per game, only allowed an NFL-best 14 sacks and QB Josh Allen was named NFL MVP. Including playoffs, the Bills also led the NFL with 612 points scored.
- Joined the Bills during the 2023 season, assisting the team in winning it's final five regular season games and capturing an AFC East division title.

2023: (University at Buffalo)

• Was the offensive coordinator and tight ends coach for the UB Bulls in 2023.

2022: (UCF)

• Coached on the defensive side of the ball for the first time in his career as a defensive analyst for UCF in 2022.

2020: (Carolina Panthers)

• In 2020, helped coach a Panthers offense that became just the fifth unit in the Super Bowl era to produce four different players (DJ Moore 1,215, Robby Anderson 1,111, Curtis Samuel 1,051 and Mike Davis 1,015) with over 1,000 scrimmage yards. Carolina also set a franchise record for the fewest punts (45) in a season and tied a franchise-record 27 fourth-down attempts, converting over half (55.6) of them.

COACHING SHOUTOUTS

2019/21: (LSU)

- Has coached at LSU in two different capacities, helping the team win a national championship in 2019. In his role as an offensive analyst on the 2019 team, helped put together the most prolific offensive in SEC history, averaging 48.4 points and 568.4 total yards per game in 2019. That year, LSU won the national championship, scoring 50 or more points seven times and winning all but two games by double-digits.
- In 2021, was the Tigers passing game coordinator and coached future first round picks Malik Nabers (selected sixth overall by NYG in 2024) and Brian Thomas Jr. (selected 23rd overall by JAX in 2024).

2014-18: (William & Mary)

- Coached running backs for three seasons and then was elevated to offensive coordinator for his final two years with the Tribe. Had four players earn all-conference honors during his first year as offensive coordinator in 2017 and two of his former players offensive linemen Chris Durant and Connor Hilland signed free agent NFL contracts.
- Under his direction as a running backs coach for William & Mary, both Mikal Abdul-Saboor (3,108) and Kendell Anderson (3,082) etched their names in the Tribe's record books and finished their illustrious careers as two of the most productive running backs in school history, ranking fourth and fifth, respectively, on the program's all-time rushing list.

2013: (Georgetown)

Coached Georgetown's running backs during the 2013 season.

2012: (Hampden-Sydney College)

• Began his coaching career as the quarterbacks coach at Hampden-Sydney College in 2012.

PERSONAL

- Graduated from William and Mary in 2012, where he played wide receiver for the Tribe.
- Is married to his wife, Kelsy, whom he met at LSU.
