



PAT MEYER

OFFENSIVE LINE

FIRST-AND-10

PAT MEYER was named the Bills offensive line coach in 2026. Returns for his second stint in Buffalo after spending two seasons with the team (2015-16) as a football operations consultant/offensive assistant. Meyer spent the past four seasons (2022-25) as the Steelers' offensive line coach. He has also been an offensive line coach in the NFL for the Panthers (2020-21), Chargers (2017-19) and Bears (2013-14).

COACHING SHOUTOUTS

2022-25: (Pittsburgh Steelers)

- Helped the Steelers secure a 2025 AFC North title. Allowed 31 sacks, tied for ninth-best in the league. Aaron Rodgers' 29 sacks taken were his fewest since 2020.
- The Steelers ran the ball at the third-highest rate (52.1%) in the NFL in 2024, with Najee Harris leading the way with 263 carries for 1,043 yards and six TDs. It was Harris' fourth-consecutive 1,000-yard season to open his career, making him just the 14th player in league history and first in franchise history to do so.
- In 2023, his unit paved the way for Harris and Jaylen Warren to each eclipse 1,000 scrimmage yards, becoming the fourth duo in Steelers' history to do so in the same season.

2020-21: (Carolina Panthers)

- In 2020 and 2021, Meyer's offensive line unit battled considerable injuries and the absence of Pro Bowl running back Christian McCaffrey. Carolina was forced to use 14 different offensive line combinations of starters in '21. In '20, the group still helped running back Mike Davis have a breakout season, eclipsing 1,000 scrimmage yards for the first time in his career.
- Right tackle Taylor Moton, the only Panther offensive lineman to start all 17 contests in 2021, started 16 games at right tackle and one at left tackle in 2020. He also played every snap during the '20 season and, according to PFF, posted the third pass-blocking efficiency rating among qualified NFL tackles and ranked sixth in fewest pressures allowed (20) among qualified tackles.

COACHING SHOUTOUTS

2017-19: (Los Angeles Chargers)

- During 2018, Meyer helped the offense to its highest rushing total since 2013 (1,873 yards). Chargers quarterback Philip Rivers tied his career-best single-season passer rating of 105.5.
- In 2017, Meyer's unit allowed a league-low 17 sacks, the franchise's fewest sacks since the 1982 season. That year, Rivers also finished second in the NFL in passing yards (4,515), and the offensive line paved the way for the team's first 1,000-yard rusher since 2013 (Melvin Gordon).
- Over his three years with the Chargers, Meyer helped coach center Mike Pouncey to a 2018 Pro Bowl appearance and tackle Russell Okung to back-to-back Pro Bowl honors in 2017 and 2018.

2015-16: (Buffalo Bills)

- Spent two seasons with the Bills, first serving as a football operations consultant before transitioning to a role as an offensive assistant.

2013-14: (Chicago Bears)

- Got his start in the NFL with the Chicago Bears, first as an assistant offensive line coach in 2013 before taking over the primary coaching duties in 2014.

ADDITIONAL EXPERIENCE

- Coached on the college level at Memphis (1997-99), NC State (2000-06), Florida State (2007) and Colorado State (2008-11). Spent 2012 with the Montreal Alouettes in the CFL.

PERSONAL

- An all-state selection and four-year starter at Girard (Ohio) High School. Lettered in wrestling, basketball, baseball and track. Earned his bachelor's degree in exercise and sports science from CSU in 1995. Played offensive line at Colorado State from 1991-94, where he was a three-time All-Western Athletic Conference selection.
- Meyer and his wife, Erin, have two daughters, Emma and Sophia and a son, Christopher.
