FIRST-AND-10

ADAM HENRY joined the Buffalo Bills in 2023 after he spent the 2022 season as Indiana's wide receivers coach and co-offensive coordinator. Henry spent 14 seasons in the NFL where he coached seven Pro Bowl pass catchers.

COACHING SHOUTOUTS

2023-Present: (Buffalo Bills)

- In his first season with Buffalo serving as the wide receivers coach he helped Stefon Diggs to his fourth straight Pro Bowl selection and finished the season with 107 receptions the third most in team history and 1,183 receiving yards becoming the first player in team history with four consecutive 1,000+receiving yard seasons.
- Under Henry, Gabe Davis matched his career high in touchdown receptions with 7 in 2023 and caught a touchdown pass in four straight games, which was a new career high. Davis averaged 16.6 yards per reception which ranked fifth in the NFL (minimum 45 receptions).

2022: (Indiana)

• Henry spent the 2022 season as Indiana's wide receivers coach and co-offensive coordinator. In his lone season in Bloomington under head coach Tom Allen, Henry played a role in Cam Camper's emergence from junior college. In his first season at the Division I level, Camper led the Hoosiers with 46 receptions and 569 yards despite playing just seven games.

2020-21: (Dallas Cowboys)

- In 2021, Henry aided in CeeDee Lamb's development en route to his first career Pro Bowl selection. He commanded the most targets (120) and led the team in receptions (79) and yards (1,102). He finished tied for third on the team in touchdowns (six).
- Lamb's 2,037 career receiving yards are the second-most receiving yards by a Cowboys wide receiver through his first two seasons, trailing only Bob Hayes (2,235, 1965-66).
- In 2021, Amari Cooper registered a first down or touchdown on 77.9% of his catches in 2021, which ranked ninth among all wide receivers with at least 50 touches.
- Dallas receivers finished 2020 third in the NFC in receiving yards (4,511) and first in receptions (413) despite undergoing four quarterback changes.

COACHING SHOUTOUTS (CONT.)

2020-21: (Dallas Cowboys)

• In his first year with Dallas, Henry helped CeeDee Lamb become one of the most successful rookie wide receivers in team history. Lamb established a franchise record for most receptions by a rookie with 74, smashing Bob Hayes' previous record of 46. Lamb also finished with 935 receiving yards, which ranked second all-time in Cowboys rookie history. In addition to the rookie phenom, Henry assisted Amari Cooper to a career-high 92 catches - fourth Cowboy to reach 90 catches - and 1,114 receiving yards.

2018-19: (Cleveland Browns)

- •Under Henry's watch in 2019, two Browns became the first pair of wide receivers in franchise history to each record over 1,000 receiving yards in the same season. Jarvis Landry had a career-high 1,174 yards with six touchdowns on 83 receptions, and Odell Beckham Jr. went for 1,035 yards and four scores on 74 catches.
- In his first season with the Browns in 2018, Henry helped Landry to a Pro Bowl selection and the then third-most receptions by a Browns wide receiver in a season (81).

2016-17: (New York Giants)

• In 2016 Beckham registered a career-high 101 receptions for 1,367 yards and 10 touchdowns en route to his third Pro-Bowl selection. His reception total was the second-highest in Giants history, and his yardage total was third. Sterling Shepard finished second among all NFL rookies with 65 receptions.

2012-14: (Louisiana State)

 Henry helped develop two of the most successful receivers in school history in Beckham and Landry. In 2013 Beckham and Landry became the first pair of receivers in school history to finish with more than 1,000 yards in the same season. The two, along with James Wright, were all selected in the 2014 NFL Draft, making LSU the only school to have three receivers picked that year.

2007-11: (Oakland Raiders)

 Was promoted to the tight ends coach prior to the 2009 season after spending the first two season (2007-08) as the offensive quality control and helped the development of Zach Miller, who became the first tight end in franchise history to lead the team in receiving three consecutive years, and he earned a Pro Bowl selection following the 2010 season.

• As a wide receiver at McNeese State, Henry earned all-conference honors and finished his career with 93 receptions for 1,690 yards and 16 touchdowns en route to being enshrined in the McNeese Sports Hall of Fame in 2017. He signed with the Saints as an undrafted free agent in 1994.

PERSONAL/OTHER EXPERIENCE

- Henry spent 10 years coaching at his alma mater, McNeese State. He spent nine seasons (1997-05) as wide receivers coach before being promoted to assistant head coach/offensive coordinator for 2006.
- A native of Beaumont, Texas, Henry earned an undergraduate degree and a master's degree from McNeese State and is currently pursuing his doctorate in education.
 Henry is married to Dr. Zita Henry and they have three children, Darian, Kynidee and Ava.
