



MARC LUBICK

PASSING GAME SPECIALIST/ GAME MANAGEMENT

FIRST-AND-10

MARC LUBICK is in his tenth season with the Bills and his third as passing game specialist/game management coach. Lubick is the son of Sonny Lubick, the long-time head coach of Colorado State. He has helped the Bills reach the playoffs eight times (2017, 2019-25) and win five consecutive division titles (2020-24).

COACHING SHOUTOUTS

2017-present: (Buffalo Bills)

- In 2025, guided a Bills offense that ranked fourth in the NFL in points per game (28.3).
- Helped the Bills average an AFC-best 30.9 points per game in 2024. QB Josh Allen was named NFL MVP. Including playoffs, the Bills also led the NFL with 612 points scored.
- In 2023, helped QB Josh Allen finish the season as one of five finalists for NFL Most Valuable Player.
- In 2022, helped QB Josh Allen earn Pro Bowl honors and finish the season as an MVP finalist.
- In 2021, assisted in guiding an offense that scored 476 points, which was the second-most in the NFL during the 2021 regular season.
- In 2020, helped the Bills lead the AFC in points per game (31.3) and Stefon Diggs lead the NFL in receiving (1,535 yards).

2015-16: (Denver Broncos)

- Spent two seasons as the team's assistant wide receivers coach, winning Super Bowl 50.
- In his first season with the Broncos in 2015, Lubick assisted a wide receivers group with a pair of 1,000-yard receivers (Demaryius Thomas and Emmanuel Sanders).

2010-13: (Houston Texans)

- Served as an offensive assistant from 2010-11 before moving to the team's assistant wide receivers coach from 2012-13.
- Texans wide receiver Andre Johnson earned two of his

seven Pro Bowl selections working with Lubick and led the NFL with 221 catches from 2012-13.

2005-09: (Colorado State)

- Spent three seasons as the team's wide receivers coach before moving to the tight ends coach in 2008. In 2009, he also became a recruiting coordinator for the program.
- Coached David Anderson to the school's all-time leading receiver with 85 receptions in his senior season before being drafted by the Houston Texans in the 2006 NFL Draft.

2003-04: (St. Louis Rams)

- Served as a scouting assistant with the Rams for two seasons.

2000-02: (Colorado State)

- Spent two seasons as a defensive student assistant before serving as an academic graduate assistant for a season.

PLAYING SHOUTOUTS

- Played safety at Montana State University from 1996-99.

PERSONAL

- Born in Bozeman, Montana, in 1977. Played at Fort Collins High School before spending four seasons at Montana State, playing safety. Lubick lives with his wife, Stephanie.
- Earned his bachelor's degree in health and exercise science from Colorado State in 2001.
- His father, Sonny, is considered the most successful head football coach in CSU history after compiling a 108-74 record in 15 seasons. Brother, Matt, is the co-offensive coordinator/tight ends coach at Kansas.
- Lubick and his wife, Stephanie, have three sons, Cole, Case and Cam.
