A SIGNAL CALLER IN THE TRENCHES

Tylan Grable played quarterback in high school. He commanded huddles and looked beyond the bars of a face mask, into eyes and scolded. When quarterbacks see too many opposing players in their faces, they scold linemen. "I did it quite a few times, thinking it was kind of easy," Grable says, with a laugh. "Now, doing the job that they were out there trying to do, I see it's not that easy." The former high school quarterback has gone to the trenches. He's made the transition from quarterback, to tight end and offensive tackle at Jacksonville State. "He's a man of many skills," JSU coach John Grass said. "He's played a little bit of everything. He was a basketball player and played on a really good basketball team. He played quarterback, and I think you still see that with him playing tackle."

JSU's coaching staff had to sell Grable on going from a guy with the ball in his hands to a guy with his hand on the ground. Then they asked him to go from run blocking as a tight end to pass blocking as a tackle. Grable didn't fight it. He just tried to do what offensive linemen can't ... wrap his arms around it. "My first reaction was, how?" he said. "I don't know how, but he kept telling me to just trust the process and listen to coach and listen to your teammates. They'll help you get through it, and then you can really be good. I said, I've got to give it a try. Whatever I can do for the team, I was ready."
