# **FIRST-AND-10**

**DAVID EDWARDS** joined the Bills in 2023 and then re-signed to a two-year deal in the 2024 offseason. Edwards originally entered the NFL as a fifth round pick (169th overall) of the Rams in 2019 out of Wisconsin.

### SHOUTOUTS

- Has started 46-of-71 regular season games played during his six NFL seasons. Has also started all five of the playoff games he has appeared in, including the Rams Super Bowl LVI victory.
- Played in all 17 regular season games and two playoff games for the Bills during the 2023 season.
- Started all four playoff games and all 17 regular season games during the Rams' championship season in 2021.
- Started 14-of-16 games played in 2020.
- Made his postseason debut, starting at left guard, at Sea. (1/9/21).
- Played in all 16 games and started in 10 of the contests during his rookie season in 2019.
- Made his first start in 2019 for a Week 7 contest in Atl. (10/20/19). Made his NFL debut on special teams in a Week 1 win at Car. (9/18/19).
- Played in 37 games, making 31 starts at right tackle, during his college career with Wisconsin.
- Named First-team All-Big Ten (media) during his final season in 2018. Was also named First-team All-America (AFCA) during his redshirt sophomore season in 2017.

## **PERSONAL**

Is the son of David and Pamela Edwards. His father played football at Indiana University. He majored in finance, investment and banking at Wisconsin. Played three seasons at quarterback for Downers Grove North High School. Was a four-year letter winner and two-year team captain in basketball in high school.

## IF YOU HAVEN'T HERD

#### MY FIRST BUFFALO WINTER

With a snow storm raging through Western New York prior the Bills Wild Card playoff game vs. Pittsburgh, David Edwards set out to go pick up his wife, Karoline, and newborn daughter, Margot, from the hospital. Those plans changed when white-out conditions forced Edwards to drive into and get stuck in a snowbank near Highmark Stadium. "I drove straight into a plowed snowbank on the left side of the road," Edwards told USA TODAY Sports "I was like, 'Holy, crap.""

In desperate need of help, Edwards called Bills vice president of security, Chris Clark, who connected him with Dennis Miller from Miller's Collision and Auto, Inc. Miller was quick to rescue Edwards. "Business as usual. Just trying to help out people. That's what we do," Miller told USA TODAY Sports.

"He was a huge lifesaver for us," Edwards said. After being rescued from the snowbank and running through his options, Edwards and Miller set-out for the hospital.

Miller's help did not end there as shortly after getting Edwards to the hospital, he returned with his payloader to help escort Edwards and his family back to their home. "Without the payloader, (they) never would have made it through there," Miller said. "With that precious cargo in the car, I had to make sure I had to get (them) home."

"Can't say how grateful or appreciative I am for him doing that for us," Edwards said.
