DION DAWKINS signed a three-year extension to keep him in Buffalo through the 2027 season. Dawkins will enter his eighth year as a Bill in 2024 after he was originally drafted by the Bills in the second round (63rd overall) in 2017. Dawkins is the only player the Bills have ever drafted out of Temple.

SHOUTOUTS

- Has started 122-of-128 career regular season games played and all 14 playoff games.
- A four-time Pro Bowl selection (2021, 2022, 2023, 2024), became the first Bills offensive lineman selected to four or more Pro Bowls since G Ruben Brown earned eight selections from 1996-2003.
- Was named to the 2024 PFWA All-AFC Team.
- Appeared in his 100th career regular season game vs. JAX (10/9/23).
- Has started all 11 playoff games he has played in at left tackle.
- At NE (12/21/19), caught his second career TD. Joined Mitch Ferrotte as the only Bills offensive lineman to catch two touchdowns in their career.
- At NYJ (11/11/18), recorded his first career reception and touchdown on a seven yard pass from Matt Barkley. Marked the Bills first receiving TD by an OL since Jason Peters.
- Starting the majority of his rookie season for the Bills at left tackle in 2019. Also started at left tackle in the Bills first playoff game since 1999.

Is the son of Eric and Lisa Dawkins. Graduated from Temple with a degree in criminal justice. Has two daughters, Dalilah and Dakota, and a son, Dil. Attended Rahway (NJ) High School. Created and attended Shnow University. Hobbies include remote control cars and drifting for Shnow Motor Sports.

MAN OF THE YEAR X3

In December of 2024, the NFL announced the candidates for the Walter Payton Man of the Year award, the highest honor the league can bestow. The award is based on both community service and on-field performance. Dawkins is the Bills' nominee for a third straight year. "It means consistency," Dawkins said. "I think that it means someone knows their true self and who they truly are. I think also it means that, to the core, that what's going on is not fake, for it to be the third time. It's always and will always be my biggest honor. I'm a real piece of this community now, and it's not for fake, like, this is really where I want to be. This is really where I'm at. Buffalo is where the Dawkins will be, and where eventually I will rest."

PROTECTOR OF THE YEAR

Dion Dawkins is credited with launching the campaign that culminated in the NFL creating its Protector of the Year Award, given to the best offensive lineman.

Dawkins broached the subject publicly in January of 2025. He wondered out loud why offensive linemen can't be crowned in some fashion like quarterbacks win passing titles, running backs win rushing titles, edge rushers win sack titles. After all, the most dangerous pass rushers generate beaucoup votes for Defensive Player of the Year, yet the people who are paid to thwart them garner zero attention for Offensive Player of the Year.

"It's very cool that my domino piece makes noise when it falls," Dawkins said. "Just to be a regular kid from Jersey, go to Temple, be a second-round pick to Buffalo, to having a voice so big that it reaches all 32 teams and then some. This is a part of my legacy now, and I stand on it."
