KALEB ELARMS-ORR was selected by the Bills in the fourth round in 2026 out of Texas Christian. A 2025 All-SEC Third Team selection, Elarms-orr is the first Horned frog drafted by the Bills since WR Kolby Listenbee in 2016.

- Played for Cal (2021-23) before transferring to Texas Christian (2024-25). Played in 47 games and posted 276 career tackles, 19 TFL's, seven sacks, seven passes defended, two fumble recoveries, one forced fumble, and one interception.
- Appeared in and started all 13 games during the 2025 season. Led the team in tackles with 130, along with 11 TFL's, four sacks, and two passes defended.
- Named a 2025 All-Big 12 First Team selection.
- Earned Alamo Bowl Defensive MVP honors after leading TCU with 11 tackles, 1.5 TFL's for a victory against USC (12/30/25).
- Recored a season-high of 16 tackles vs. Baylor (10/18/25) and at West Virginia (10/25/25).
- Played in all 13 games in the 2024 season. Totaled 54 tackles, 4.5 TFL's, two sacks, and one fumble recovery.
- Had a key sack in a victory at Utah (10/19/25).
- Started in all 11 games in the 2023 season. Recorded a team high of 92 tackles, five pases defended, 3.5 TFL's, one sack, one forced fumble, and one fumble recovery.
- Named a 2023 Second-Team All-Pac 12 selection of the Associated Press and Phil Steele.
- Made first career start at North Texas (9/2/25). Collected first-career interception for one yard.

STAY IN THE MOMENT

TCU linebacker Kaleb Elarms-Orr is a man of few words. His play does the talking for him, and the senior was voted a first-team All-Big 12 selection after leading the conference in tackles with 119. In many ways, Elarms-Orr is the perfect representation of the modern linebacker that's suited to combat the rise of the spread offenses .

"He's productive as any player in college football. What makes you a good player is that you produce," TCU head coach Sonny Dykes said last month. "His numbers are going to be as good as anybody. He's a great leader. He doesn't say a word, he's a guy that just works hard all week. I would put his production up against anybody. His impact on our defense has been substantial."

Elarms-Orr's rise to become one of the country's best linebackers starts with his mental approach .

"I'll be honest, I haven't even paid attention to the season I've been having," Elarms-Orr said. "I've just been trying to stay in the present moment and not focus on the statistics as much. I'm just taking it one play at a time, do my job and just strain every play. I know the rest will take care of itself."

"I definitely had to work on mental toughness, I came in and thought I was going to be that main guy," Elarms-Orr said in February.

This year I'm trying to be that guy and take charge of the defense." Elarms-Orr accomplished that goal and then some with the season he had for the Horned Frogs. He played the most snaps of any linebacker in a Power Four conference. (**Steven Johnson, Fort Worth Star-Telegram, December 9, 2025**).
