RYAN LEWIS was claimed off waivers from the Patriots on September 2, 2018 after spending most of the 2017 season on New England's practice squad. He originally entered the NFL as an undrafted free agent with the Cardinals in 2017.

BIG-GAME HUNTER

Lewis knew how big of a rivalry Pittsburgh and Penn State was as he went into the game in his senior year. His uncle, Tim, who played cornerback for Pitt from 1979-1982, called Lewis before the 2016 matchup to remind him how important the opportunity was.

With only a minute left in the game and Penn State driving to take the lead, Lewis intercepted Trace McSorley in the end zone to seal the win.

FAMILY MATTERS

His father, Will, played cornerback with the Seahawks, the USFL's Houston Gamblers and in the CFL. He also worked as an NFL assistant coach with the Falcons (1995-96) and spent time in the front offices of the Packers (1997-98), Seahawks (1999-2013) and Chiefs (2013-17). His uncle, Tim Lewis, spent four seasons playing in the NFL before working as an NFL assistant coach for more than 20 years. His cousin, Louis Riddick, played six seasons in the NFL, served as Washington and Philadelphia's Director of Pro Personnel and is now an ESPN analyst.

PERSONAL

The son of Will and Kimmerly Lewis, he has two brothers and one sister. He set a school record time of 10.7 seconds in the state championships in the 100-yard dash in high school.
