TOMMY DOYLE was drafted by the Bills in the fifth round (161st overall) of the 2021 draft. Prior to joining the Bills, he played at Miami (OH) from 2016-20. Doyle is the second Bill drafted out of Miami (OH), TE Bob Jencks in 1963.

SHOUTOUTS

- Appeared in 11 regular season and 2 playoff games during his rookie season.
- Made his first NFL debut vs. Hou. (10/4/21).
- Appeared in 32 career games during his time at Miami (OH).
- Played in and started all three games that the Redhawks played in a COVID-19 shortened season as a redshirt senior in 2020. Earned first team All-MAC honors.
- Started all 13 games at left tackle in 2019 and was named first team All-MAC. Was also named one of the team's Offensive Power Players of the Year and earned Academic All-MAC honors. Was a leader on an offensive line that allowed just two sacks per game.
- Played in and started 10 games at right tackle for Miami (OH) in 2018 and helped the Redhawks rush for 159.8 yards per game. As a unit, the O-Line allowed 20 sacks over the season.
- Played hockey and football while in high school in Minnesota. Led his team in sacks as a senior as he starred on both sides of the ball for Edina HS.

FROM HOCKEY TO FOOTBALL

Growing up in Edina, Minnesota, Doyle had no choice but to lace up the skates and play hockey in a town that is obsessed with the sport.

"Hockey was the No. 1 thing for me," Doyle said to WCPO. "Seems like the first thing you learn how to do (in Edina) is skate."

Despite that initial pull to the sport, Doyle's size made it undeniable that he had to give football a shot. He stopped playing hockey in his sophomore year of high school and started dominating on the defensive side of the ball. He wanted to play defensive end at the next level, but he was told that he was too slow off the ball. He had to make the switch to the offensive side of the ball and it wasn't an easy process.

"The transition was hard. Switching positions was difficult at first. You can be more reckless on the defensive line, just play hard with your head down with some technique and you can still make plays. Offensive line is a lot of fundamentals, technique, more of a mental game. Had to stay balanced."
