



DREW TERRELL

WIDE RECEIVERS

FIRST-AND-10

DREW TERRELL (tuh-RELL) was named wide receivers coach for the Bills in 2026. Terrell has eight years of NFL coaching experience, spending the past three seasons with the Arizona Cardinals as passing game coordinator/wide receivers coach. Prior to his time in Arizona, he also coached in Washington (2020-22) and Carolina (2018-19).

COACHING SHOUTOUTS

2023-25: (Arizona Cardinals)

- Named the passing game coordinator/wide receivers coach in 2023.
- In 2025, the Cardinals averaged the seventh-most passing yards per game (232.6). TE Trey McBride ranked second in the NFL with 126 receptions and sixth overall with 1,239 receiving yards.
- Helped coach rookie WR Marvin Harrison Jr. in 2024. Harrison tied the Cardinals franchise record for touchdown catches (eight) and finished with the second-most receptions and receiving yards (62 for 885) by a rookie in team history.
- The Cardinals finished the 2024 season with over 6,000 total yards (6,090) for just the fifth time in team history.

2020-22: (Washington Commanders)

- Helped guide the development of WR Terry McLaurin who posted three consecutive seasons with 1,000+ receiving yards from 2020-22.
- In 2022, McLaurin set single-season career highs in receiving yards (1,191) and scrimmage yards (1,220) en route to earning his first Pro Bowl selection.
- Assisted in the development of first-round rookie WR Jahan Dotson in 2022. Dotson's seven TD receptions tied for the most among NFL rookies that season.

2018-19: (Carolina Panthers)

- Served as an offensive quality control coach for two seasons, while also working with the quarterbacks.
- In 2018, the Panthers had 5,972 offensive yards, the second highest total in franchise history.

COACHING SHOUTOUTS

2015-17: (Michigan)

- Spent three seasons as a graduate assistant at Michigan.
- In his first two years, worked with wide receivers and returners, including two receivers (Amara Darboh and Jehu Chesson) who were selected in the 2017 NFL Draft.
- Coached cornerbacks and returners in his final season with the Wolverines. Helped guide future NFL CBs David Long and Lavert Hill.

2014: (Virginia Tech)

- Began his coaching career as an offensive graduate assistant working with wide receivers.
- Assisted with the development of wideouts Cam Phillips and Isaiah Ford, who finished their collegiate careers ranked first and second respectively for the most receptions in school history.

PLAYING SHOUTOUTS

- Played four seasons (2009-12) at Stanford and led the team in receiving yards in 2012 when the Cardinals were 12-2 and won both the Pac-12 championship and the Rose Bowl.
- Earned honorable mention All-Pac 12 recognition as a returner three times (2010-12).

PERSONAL

- Son of Marcus and Marilee Terrell. A Chandler, AZ native, Terrell attended Hamilton High School and received All-State honors as both a wide receiver and punt returner.
- Graduated from Stanford with a degree in political science.
