FIRST-AND-10

JAHMILE ADDAE (JUH-mile uh-DYE) was named the Bills cornerbacks coach in 2024. Addae joined the Bills after spending 17 years coaching in the collegiate ranks. He worked the last two seasons as the Miami Hurricanes secondary coach. Addae was signed by Tampa Bay as a UDFA following the 2006 draft.

COACHING SHOUTOUTS

2024-present: (Buffalo Bills)

- During his first season with the Bills, helped third-year CB Christian Benford earn 11 All-Pro votes (1 first team, 10 second team) after playing in 15 games and recording two INTs and 10 passes defended.
- In 2024, the Bills defense finished with a +24 turnover margin, the best in the NFL since the 2012 Patriots (+25).

2022-23: (University of Miami)

- In two years at Miami, his defensive backs totaled 25 interceptions.
- In his first season with the Hurricanes in 2022, Addae helped coach eventual NFL Draft picks Tyrique Stevenson (second round) and DJ Ivey (seventh round) to strong final campaigns.

2021: (Georgia)

- During his time in Athens, the Bulldogs were No. 1 in scoring defense, No. 1 in red zone defense and No. 2 in total defense.
- Won a CFP National Championship with the Bulldogs.

2019-20: (West Virginia)

- In 2020, led a passing defense at West Virginia that ranked first nationally in fewest passing yards allowed at 159.6 yards per game.
- In his first year at WVU, coached two All-Big 12 Conference selections in Keith Washington II and Josh Norwood and freshman All-American Tykee Smith.

COACHING SHOUTOUTS

2018: (Minnesota)

- Served as the defensive backs coach and assisted with several special teams' phases at Minnesota in 2018. His punt return unit finished No. 1 in the nation (22.3 yards per return) and the punt return defense was No. 2 (1.11 yards per return).

2013-17: (Arizona)

- Addae spent five years at Arizona, coaching the defensive backs in 2016-17 and serving as an analyst from 2013-15.

2010-11: (Cincinnati)

- From 2010-11, he served as the running backs coach at Cincinnati. Before coaching the Bearcats, he was the program's Director of Player Development.

2008-09: (Michigan)

- Was a defensive graduate assistant at Michigan, where he worked with the Wolverines' secondary and scout team offense.

2007: (West Virginia)

- After graduating in 2006, Addae was a graduate assistant in the football video department at West Virginia.

PLAYING SHOUTOUTS

- Addae was a four-year starter, two-time captain and two-time All-Big East defensive back at West Virginia. Addae, who is tied for the WVU record for most pass breakups in a game (5, Rutgers, 2002), finished his WVU career with 253 tackles, including 152 solo stops and 25 pass breakups, ranking No. 5 in program history.
- Signed a free agent contract with his hometown Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2006 and spent the end of the season with the Indianapolis Colts.

PERSONAL

- Is a native of Valrico, FL. Addae, and his wife, Maryann, have three sons, Agyeman, Ayden and Amaree.
