### MATCHUP PREVIEW

The **Denver Broncos** (0-1) return home for their home opener in Week 2 as they welcome the **Pittsburgh Steelers** (1-0) to Empower Field at Mile High on Sunday at 2:25 MDT. It is first time the teams have met in Denver since 2018, with the Broncos having won the last two regular-season matchups in the Mile High City.



The Broncos lead the overall regular-season series with a record of 15-10-1 against the Steelers, including a 9-3-1 record in Denver.

### QUICK HITS

The Broncos had seven players make their NFL debuts in Week 1 against Seattle, including four rookies who were drafted in the 2024 NFL Draft. **See Page 5**

Linebacker **Randy Gradishar** became the fourth defensive player in team history who spent at least four seasons with the team to be enshrined into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 2024. **See Page 6**

## WHAT TO WATCH FOR VS. PITTSBURGH

### TEAM (15-10-1 all-time record versus Steelers; 9-3-1 at home)

\* - Needs a win to improve to 16-10-1 overall and 10-3-1 at home in the all-time series versus the Steelers.

### TEAM (305-181-7 all-time record at home)

\* - Needs a win to capture the team's 306th home victory in franchise history.

### TEAM (2 safeties)

\* - Needs one safety to tie the franchise record for most safeties recorded in a single season.

### HEAD COACH SEAN PAYTON (160 career regular-season wins)

\* - Needs one victory to tie former NFL Head Coach Mike Holmgren for the 19th-most regular-season wins among head coaches in league history.

### OLB JONATHON COOPER (15.0 Sacks in 48 career games)

\* - Needs one sack to tie defensive end Fred Stokes and nose tackle Jeff Wright for the 10th-most quarterback takedowns by a player drafted in the seventh round or later in the NFL Draft in his first 49 career games.

### K WIL LUTZ (198 field goals in 115 games)

\* - Needs two field goals to become just the seventh kicker in NFL history to reach 200 field goals made in his first 116 games played.

### WR JOSH REYNOLDS (2,978 receiving yards)

\* - Needs 22 receiving yards to reach the 3,000 yards marker in 109 career games played.

### ILB ALEX SINGLETON (580 defensive tackles)

\* - Needs 20 tackles to reach 600 defensive tackles in his career.

### CB PAT SURTAIN II (37 passes defended)

\* - Needs three passes defended to become the fourth Bronco in team history to record 40 pass breakups in his first four seasons.

### CB PAT SURTAIN II (193 defensive tackles)

\* - Needs seven defensive tackles to join cornerback Chris Harris Jr. as the only Broncos in team history to record at least 200 tackles and 35 passes defended in their first four seasons.

### WR COURTLAND SUTTON (4,297 rec. yards / 82 career games)

\* - Needs 49 receiving yards to tie wide receiver Vance Johnson for the third-most receiving yards by a Bronco in his first 83 career games.

### WR DEVAUGHN VELE (8 receptions in his first career game)

\* - Needs six receptions to tie wide receiver Eddie Royal for the most catches by a Bronco in his first two career games.

### CB LEVI WALLACE (54 passes defended)

\* - Needs one pass defended to become the 15th undrafted player in NFL history to reach 55 passes defended in his first 85 career games.

### RB JAVONTE WILLIAMS (1,904 rushing yards)

\* - Needs 96 rushing yards to reach 2,000 career rushing yards.

## WELCOME HOME, RANDY



A key member of the famed 'Orange Crush' defense, linebacker Randy Gradishar became the fourth defensive player in Broncos history who spent at least four seasons with the team to be enshrined into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio.

A native of Ohio, Gradishar spent his entire 10-year career (1974-83) with the Broncos after being selected in the first round (14th overall) by the club in the 1974 NFL Draft out of Ohio State. A seven-time Pro Bowl selection and four-time Associated Press All-Pro, Gradishar totaled 2,049 tackles, 19.5 sacks, 20 interceptions (335 yds., 3 TDs) and 13 fumble recoveries (1 TD) in 145 games (134 starts).

Gradishar currently holds the franchise record for most tackles (2,049) in a career and led the team in tackles for a franchise-record nine consecutive seasons (1975-83). The 1978 Associated Press Defensive Player of the Year, he helped the Broncos to four playoff berths (1977-79, '83), two division titles (1977-78), and one appearance in Super Bowl XII (1977).

With the selection, Surtain is just the second Broncos cornerback to earn multiple Pro Bowl nods in his first three seasons. He's also the sixth corner in franchise history to be named a Pro Bowler in consecutive seasons.

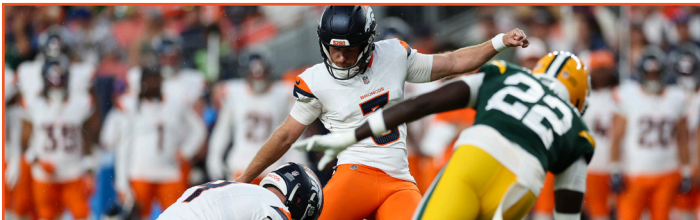

## LUTZ WITH MOST MADE FIELD GOALS IN THREE-GAME SPAN IN FRANCHISE HISTORY

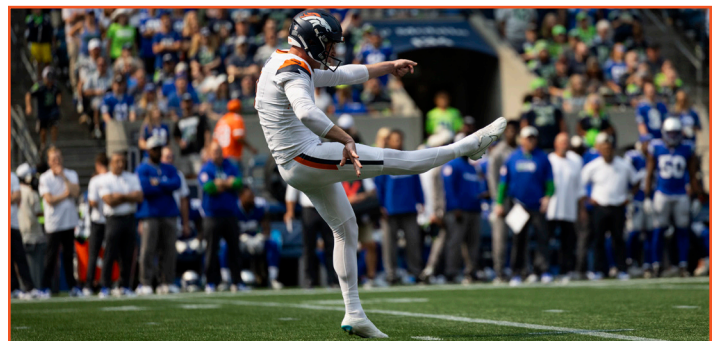
