MATCHUP PREVIEW

The **Denver Broncos** (6-5) head out west as they wrap up their season series against the **Las Vegas Raiders** (2-8) on Sunday at Allegiant Stadium at 1:05 p.m. PST. The last time the two teams met earlier this season, the Broncos came away with the 34-18 win in Denver.



The Broncos can sweep the season series

against the Raiders for the first time since the 2014 season, when Denver went 6-0 against all AFC West opponents.

Linebacker **Randy Gradishar** became the fourth defensive player in team history who spent at least four seasons with the team to be enshrined into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 2024. **See Page 7**

WHAT TO WATCH FOR VS. LAS VEGAS

TEAM (54-72-2 all-time record versus Raiders; 25-39-0 on the road)

*- Needs a win to improve to 55-72-2 overall and 26-39-0 on the road in the all-time series versus the Raiders.

DE ZACH ALLEN (5.0 sacks in 2024)

*- Needs one sack to set a new career high in quarterback takedowns recorded in a season.

OLB NIK BONITTO (9.0 sacks in 2024)

*- Needs one sack to become the first Bronco since 2018 to record double digit quarterback takedowns in a season.

OLB JONATHON COOPER (19.5 sacks in first four seasons)

*- Needs 0.5 sacks to become the first seventh-round NFL Draft choice since 2010 to reach 20 quarterback takedowns in his first four seasons.

QB BO NIX (4 games with 200+ pass yds., 2+ pass TDs & 0 INTs)

*- Needs to record at least 200 passing yards, two passing touchdowns and no interceptions on Sunday to become the fifth rookie in NFL history to record five such games in a season.

CB PAT SURTAIN II (43 passes defensed)

*- Needs three passes defensed to tie cornerback Chris Harris Jr. for the second-most passes defensed by a Bronco in his first four seasons.

WR COURTLAND SUTTON (347 receptions as a Bronco)

*- Needs six receptions to tie former Broncos wide receiver Steve Watson for the ninth-most catches in team history.

WR COURTLAND SUTTON (647 receiving yds. & 49 receptions)

*- Needs 53 receiving yards and one reception to become the fifth Bronco all-time to have five seasons with 700+ receiving yds. & 50 receptions.

WELCOME HOME, RANDY



A key member of the famed 'Orange Crush' defense, linebacker Randy Gradishar became the fourth defensive player in Broncos history who spent at least four seasons with the team to be enshrined into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio.

A native of Ohio, Gradishar spent his entire 10-year career (1974-83) with the Broncos after being selected in the first round (14th overall) by the club in the 1974 NFL Draft out of Ohio State. A seven-time Pro Bowl selection and four-time Associated Press All-Pro, Gradishar totaled 2,049 tackles, 19.5 sacks, 20 interceptions (335 yds., 3 TDs) and 13 fumble recoveries (1 TD) in 145 games (134 starts).

Gradishar currently holds the franchise record for most tackles (2,049) in a career and led the team in tackles for a franchise-record nine consecutive seasons (1975-83). The 1978 Associated Press Defensive Player of the Year, Gradishar helped the Broncos to four playoff berths (1977-79, '83), two division titles (1977-78), and one appearance in Super Bowl XII (1977).



His 106.3 passer rating in that span is the fourth-highest among all NFL passers with at least 145 pass attempts, behind only quarterbacks Jared Goff. Lamar Jackson and Joe Burrow.
