



## RUN, THINDER, RUN!

How the Broncos are planning to make big improvements in 2023

There may be a simple way to measure how the Broncos can improve this year:

Is Thunder running more at games?

The team's real-life horse mascot sprints across the field after each Broncos touchdown or field goal. In 2022, the Broncos just didn't give him enough chances to run.

For Head Coach Sean Payton, that is one of the biggest goals as he prepares for his first season leading the Broncos. Denver scored the fewest points in the NFL last year and won just five games. How Payton can highlight the strengths of quarterback Russell Wilson and the rest of the offense will go a long way toward improving both of those marks.

The good news? Payton has done it before!

Before joining the Broncos, he was head coach of the New Orleans Saints for 15 years. In his first year there, he helped the Saints go from 31st in points to fifth.

While that doesn't mean the Broncos will do the same thing, it seems that Denver has the talent to make a similar kind of jump.

Wilson, who has been picked to the Pro Bowl nine times, had a down year last season, but Payton will hopefully help him have another Pro Bowl season this year.

"He's super competitive," Payton said of Wilson during the offseason. "He's won at a high level. He's someone that I think moves well. He's someone that I think works extremely hard. It's hard to find guys with all those

the board, too. Wide receivers Jerry Jeudy and Courtland Sutton are a great duo, and Greg Dulcich was a solid performer as a rookie.

The Broncos also worked hard to sign free agents to improve the offensive line. Tackle Mike McGlinchey and guard Ben Powers were some of the best linemen available, and Denver should be very scary in the trenches now!

On defense, Denver didn't need as much change, as the Broncos had the seventh-best defense in 2022.

The unit includes two of the best players in the entire NFL with cornerback Pat Surtain II and safety Justin Simmons leading the group. Surtain

was an All-Pro and Pro Bowl selection in just his second season, and many people consider him the best cornerback in the league. Simmons, meanwhile, was picked as a second-team All-Pro for the third time in the last four seasons. These two make life very hard for opposing quarterbacks!

Nearly all of the starters from last year's defense returned for 2023. The Broncos also signed defensive end Zach Allen in free agency, and he is expected to make a big impact against the run and pass.

If the defense is as good as last year or even better, they'll help the offense get more chances.

If that happens, this year Thunder will run a lot more, and hopefully the Broncos will be back in the playoffs where they belong!

# Football is back, which means it's time to brush up on

**The Snap:** The action that starts a play from scrimmage. A snap occurs when the center passes the ball through their legs back to the quarterback, punter or holder.

**Touchdown:** The most valuable score in the NFL, worth six points. A player scores a touchdown if they carry the ball across the goal line into the other team's end zone or catches the ball within the opponent's end zone.

**Field Goal:** Worth three points, a team scores a field goal when a kicker kicks the ball through the uprights.

**End Zone:** The scoring areas at each end of the playing field lined by the goal lines, end lines and sidelines are known as the end zones. A player must carry the ball into, or catch the ball in, this area to score a touchdown.

**Catch:** A catch occurs when a forward pass is completed (by the offense) or intercepted (by the defense).

#### **The Next Level:**

**Penalty:** When either the offense or defense breaks the rules of the game, it is assessed a penalty. The teams and fans know a penalty has been called when an official throws a yellow flag on the field.

**Kickoff:** A kick that puts the ball in play at the start of each half, at the start of overtime, after a successful field goal or after a touchdown.

**Coin Toss:** A pregame ritual where the referee flips a coin and the captain of the visiting team calls heads or tails. The coin toss determines who kicks off to start the game, who gets the ball first and which end zone the defense will defend first.

**Turnover:** When an opposing defense gains possession of the ball from the team on offense, usually by picking up a fumble or intercepting a forward pass.

**Handoff:** A handoff occurs when a quarterback hands the ball to a teammate, most commonly the running back, who attempts to advance the football downfield toward their opponent's end zone.

#### **Advanced Stuff:**

**Neutral Zone:** The offense and defense line up on opposite sides of the neutral zone and cannot enter it until the ball is snapped for the next play.

**Touchback:** When a player downs the ball after a kickoff behind their team's own goal line, or the ball is kicked through the back of the end zone, the play is over and the ball is spotted on the 25-yard line.

**Lateral:** A pass that goes sideways or backwards. Unlike forward passes, a team may lateral as many times as it likes on any play, and laterals can occur anywhere on the field as long as they do not go forward.

**Fair Catch:** A player in position to receive a punt can signal for a fair catch by raising one arm above their head and waving it from side to side. Once the receiver signals for a fair catch, they cannot advance the ball, and the play is over when they catch the ball. The opponent may not interfere with or tackle them.

**Signals:** The numbers and code words called by the quarterback in the huddle or at the line of scrimmage ahead of each play. Signals are also called by the defense, usually by a linebacker.

## DEMARCUS WARE IS HEADED FOR THE PROFIDE ALL By Ben Swanson OF FAME!

DeMarcus Ware, who helped lead Denver to its third Super Bowl victory, is now a Hall of Famer!

A nine-time Pro Bowler, Ware was one of the best defensive players in pro football history. Since the league began tracking sacks, only eight players have recorded more quarterback takedowns than Ware, and he is one of just 12 players to record 20 or more sacks in a single season.

Ware is the second player from the Broncos' Super Bowl 50 team to become a Hall of Famer, joining quarterback Peyton Manning, who was inducted in 2021!

Shortly after he was a first-round pick by the Dallas Cowboys in 2005, Ware put himself on a path to greatness. From 2005 through 2008, he recorded 53.5 sacks. Over his nine seasons in Dallas, Ware became the league's premier pass rusher. In 2008 and 2010, he led the NFL in sacks, and he was picked to be a first-team All-Pro four times, in addition to seven Pro Bowl selections!

Following the 2013 season, Ware became a free agent for the first time in his career. The Broncos, who were coming off a loss in the Super Bowl, wanted to sign Ware to finally win another Super Bowl trophy. That was just what Ware wanted!

"I came to the Denver Broncos with the type of edge that I feel like the team needed," Ware said, "and it got us to the point of winning Super Bowl 50."

In Ware's first year in Denver, the Broncos came up short of the ultimate goal, but with his 10-sack season, the team got a glimpse at just how dominant Ware could still be, especially playing with his teammate and friend Von Miller.

Following that Pro Bowl season, Ware and Denver's defense became unstoppable — a group that at times scored touchdowns as easily as they stopped them. Ware was a big reason why the defense was so amazing!

In the playoffs, Ware was as good as ever. He recovered a fumble that gave Denver the go-

ahead score in the AFC Divisional Round, and he tallied seven quarterback hits on Tom Brady in the AFC Championship. Two weeks later, Ware sacked Cam Newton twice in Super Bowl 50 as Denver took down the Panthers.

The next season would be his last. Though he was hurt for part of the season, Ware was still able to add four sacks to his career total, bringing him into the top 10 in league history with other pass-rushing legends like Michael Strahan and Lawrence Taylor.

This summer, Ware took his place alongside those greats and many others!



## 2-in-L Football Game Board

#### Games for 2 Players

- L Cut out two large football shapes, one from blue poster board and one from brown. On the brown shape, add white paper strips for the laces (and game spaces). Mark "Start" and "End," as shown.
- 2. For the spinner, create a helmet out of cardstock. Divide it into four sections: "Move 1 space forward," "Time out," "Move 2 spaces forward," and "Move 1 space back." Glue it to the board. Punch a hole in the center of the helmet and attach a cardstock arrow using a metal fastener.
- S. Glue the blue football to the back of the brown one, hiding the ends of the fastener. Add "We're #1" using markers or paper. (Make "#" large enough for tic-tac-toe.)
- 4. For game pieces, cut five helmets and five footballs out of cardstock. Add details with a marker.


