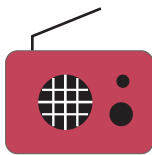

SUSTAINED SUCCESS

- Dating back to Week 4 of the 2021 season, Tampa Bay has held at least a share of the NFC South lead in 43 of the last 51 weeks, winning three consecutive NFC South division titles in that span (2021-23).
- The Buccaneers are the only NFC team to reach the playoffs in each of the past four seasons (2020-23).
- 8-of-11 defensive starters and 12 total starters from Tampa Bay's Super Bowl LV team are still on the roster.
- 28 of Tampa Bay's 33 total starters in 2023 were homegrown players.



Since 2014, when Jason Licht took over as general manager, the Buccaneers lead the NFL in most snaps played and games started by a team's own 1st-5th round draft picks during that span.

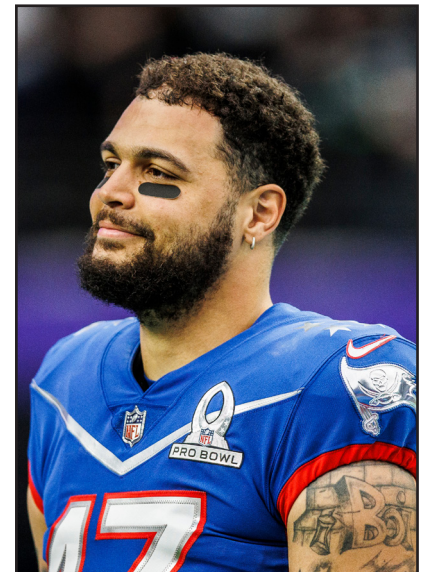

- Though not drafted by Tampa Bay, RB/KR Clifton Smith signed as an undrafted rookie free agent with the Buccaneers after the 2008 draft and became just the third undrafted player since 1970 to make the Pro Bowl as a rookie, joining Everson Walls (1981) and Rufus Porter (1988). The Fresno State grad was also just the second rookie in team history to make the all-star game, joining Warrick Dunn (1997). Doug Martin (2012) later became the third rookie in team history to earn a Pro Bowl selection, while Jameis Winston (2015) became the fourth.

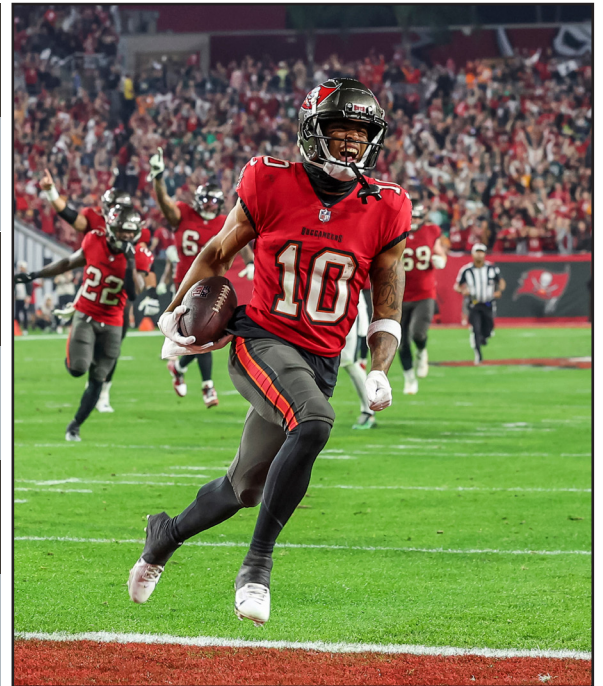

DRAFT DAY GUIDE: HERE'S WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Media Workroom Layout: The media workroom will serve as the primary work area for writers. We ask that videographers and TV reporters use the tables in the press conference room as their workspace for the duration of the draft. Access to the media workroom will require media key cards. If you do not have a key card and seek access to the Buccaneers' facility, please RSVP to a member of Tampa Bay's communications staff prior to the draft so that they can add you to the security list. The media workroom is equipped with power outlets and wireless internet. Televisions carrying ABC, ESPN/ESPN2 and NFL Network's draft coverage will be located throughout the room.
