An invaluable institution for children in the Pinellas Park neighborhood has been upgraded thanks to a community initiative led by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers and tech leader Jabil.

The community day included refurbishing the center's existing computer lab and designing an all-new Jabil Innovation Room, complete with a smart board, computers and workspaces to assist students with their schoolwork.

Volunteers overhauled the gym with fresh paint, new décor and physical education equipment and also constructed a brand-new outdoor playground. At the completion of the service project, Buccaneers players, cheerleaders, and staff gathered together with Jabil staff and community leaders including Pinellas Park Mayor Sandra Bradbury to welcome local students to the renovated facility.
