



GENERAL MANAGER JASON LICHT ON DRAFT NIGHT:

- Though not drafted by Tampa Bay, RB/KR Clifton Smith signed as an undrafted rookie free agent with the Buccaneers after the 2008 draft and became just the third undrafted player since 1970 to make the Pro Bowl as a rookie, joining Everson Walls (1981) and Rufus Porter (1988). The Fresno State grad was also just the second rookie in team history to make the all-star game, joining Warrick Dunn (1997). Doug Martin (2012) later became the third rookie in team history to earn a Pro Bowl selection, while Jameis Winston (2015) became the fourth.

DRAFT DAY GUIDE: HERE'S WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Media Workroom Layout: The media workroom will serve as the primary work area for all media. In addition, the studio will be utilized for interviews during the weekend. Access to the media workroom will require media key cards. If you do not have a key card and seek access to the Buccaneers' facility, please RSVP to a member of Tampa Bay's communications staff prior to the draft. The media workroom is equipped with power outlets and wireless internet. Televisions carrying ABC, ESPN/ESPN2 and NFL Network's draft coverage will be located throughout the room. Parking for media will be in the southwest portion of the facility (on the right after entering through the guard gate). Entrance for the media is on the west side of the building.

Internet: The media workroom is equipped with wireless Internet access. For help, please contact a member of the Buccaneers communications staff.

Interview Rooms: The interview rooms located in the hallway leading to the facility <u>are not available</u> for use without prior confirmation from a Buccaneers communications staff member.

Availabilities: Shortly after each Buccaneers selection, members of the media will be able to speak with the drafted player via an in-person Zoom or conference call availability, to be held in the media workroom. Access to the calls will not be granted to media members not in attendance at the AdventHealth Training Center.

Refreshments: Complimentary sandwiches, snacks and beverages will be provided throughout the days of the draft.
