FEELING A DRAFT

The Buccaneers, led by General Manager Jason Licht and Head Coach Bruce Arians, have seven selections in this year's NFL Draft and hold the No. 14 overall pick. If they draft at No. 14, it will mark the second time drafting a player in that slot. The Buccaneers traded up from No. 21 to No. 14 to draft T Kenyatta Walker in 2001.

- Kelly led the NFL with 8 INTs during the Bucs' Super Bowl season in 2002.
- The Buccaneers have twice made a selection No. 45 overall, taking OL Randy Grimes in 1983 and CB Brian Kelly in 1998.
- Grimes played in 118 games for Tampa Bay (104 starts) from '83-'92, while Kelly made 130 appearances (79 starts) over 10 seasons with the Buccaneers from 1998-2008, winning a Super Bowl title with the red and pewter.





Zoom Video Call Instructions:

- Beginning on Thursday, April 23 and continuing through Saturday, April 25, the NFL will host the 2020 NFL Draft. In order to assist with media availability, the Buccaneers Communications staff has set up a Virtual Media Workroom, where are all availabilities for General Manager Jason Licht, Head Coach Bruce Arians and draft selections will be hosted.
- Due to fluid timing on availabilities, media are encouraged to be logged in to the Virtual Media Workroom prior to the Buccaneers making their first draft selection of each day. An announcement will be made in the Workroom to let media know before an availability begins. Similar to previous sessions, once the availability begins, media will need to follow the instructions for asking questions, which are below.
- Media are encouraged to follow the Buccaneers Communications Twitter account (@BuccaneersComms) for alerts and updates on the timing of availabilities. All availabilities will be conducted via the Zoom videoconferencing platform. A link will be emailed to media.
- For media wishing to ask a question:

 When asking a question, please click the symbol of the hand to digitally raise your hand.
