FEELING A DRAFT

The Buccaneers, led by General Manager Jason Licht and Head Coach Bruce Arians, have eight selections in this year's NFL Draft and hold the No. 32 overall pick. If Tampa Bay picks at No. 32, it will mark the second time drafting a player in that slot in team history (1982 - Booker Reese, Round 2, Pick 32). Tampa also held the No. 32 overall pick in the 2003 NFL Draft, but had previously traded the pick to acquire former head coach Jon Gruden.




