• Among active pass-catchers, Mike Evans ranks third in yards per reception (min. 250 receptions).

• Since entering the league in 2014, Evans ranks third in receiving touchdowns with 52.

GODWIN'S GOT GAME



• **Chris Godwin** finished third in the NFL in receiving yards in 2019 with 1,333 and following Week 3 of the 2020 season, has the fourth-most receiving yards in the NFL dating back to the start of the 2019 season.

• Godwin leads the Buccaneers in receptions through Week 3, with 11.

IT'S MILLER TIME

• In Week 1 vs. New Orleans, second-year receiver **Scotty Miller** hauled in five receptions for 73 yards, setting a career high for receptions.

• In Week 3 vs. Denver, the Bowling Green product set a new career high with 83 receiving yards, topping his previous high set in Week 1.

• He ranks fifth among members of the 2019 draft class in yards per reception (min. 20 receptions) and first among players drafted after the third round.

WASTING NO TIME

Outside linebacker **Jason Pierre-Paul** recorded sacks in each of the first three weeks of the 2020 season, taking his career total to 82.5.

Pierre-Paul has earned 24.0 sacks since joining the Buccaneers in 2018, which tie for the ninth-most in the NFL during that span.

He has now recorded a sack in five-consecutive games dating back to 2019, tying for the third-longest such streak among Buccaneers since sacks became an official statistic in 1982. His 8.0 sacks during this five-game stretch are the most in the NFL.

• Over the last two seasons, he leads the NFL in sacks and multi-sack games, while ranking third in quarterback hits and tied for third in forced fumbles.

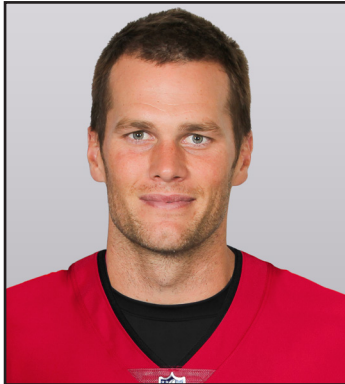

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

BUCCANEERS TEAM

- Quarterback **Tom Brady** and tight end **Rob Gronkowski** have connected for **78 touchdowns** in the regular season and need **1 more** to match Dan Marino and Mark Clayton (79) for the fourth-most touchdown connections in NFL history.
- Tampa Bay recorded two interceptions in each of the past two contests. With at least **two interceptions** against the Chargers, it would mark the first time since 2016 that the team has recorded two-or-more interceptions in three consecutive games (11/27/16 vs. Seattle-12/11/16 vs. New Orleans).
- The Buccaneers have recorded at least 5.0 sacks in each of the past two games. With **5.0-or-more sacks** against the L.A. Chargers, it would tie the longest streak in team history of games with at least 5.0 sacks (also 9/3/00 at New England-9/17/00 at Detroit).
- The Buccaneers held the Broncos to 242 net yards. If Tampa Bay **holds Los Angeles under 250 net yards**, it will mark the first time since 2008 that the team has held consecutive opponents under 250 net yards (11/16/08 vs. Minnesota-11/23/08 at Detroit).
- The Buccaneers held the Broncos to 42 rushing yards. If Tampa Bay **holds Los Angeles under 50 rushing yards**, it will mark only the third time in team history the team has held consecutive opponents under 50 rushing yards (11/4/07 vs. Arizona -11/18/07 at Atlanta; 9/11/05 at Minnesota -9/18/05 vs. Buffalo).
- Dating back to the 2019 season, the Buccaneers have held nine consecutive opponents under 100 rushing yards, tying a franchise record. If Tampa Bay **holds the Chargers under 100 rushing yards**, the team will establish a new franchise record. The 2014 Detroit Lions is the last NFL team to hold at least 10 consecutive opponents under 100 rushing yards (11 games, 10/5/14-12/21/14).
- Tampa Bay has 12.0 sacks this season. With **1.0 sack** against Los Angeles, the team will tie for fourth-most (13.0 in 1990, 1999, 2002 & 2013) sacks through four games in franchise history. With **4.0 sacks** against the Chargers, the team will tie for third-most (16.0 in 1992). With **5.0 more** this week, the team will tie for second-most (17.0 in 1979) and with **7.0 more sacks**, the team will tie for the most sacks through four games in franchise history (19.0 in 2000).



TOM BRADY

- At Denver, Brady threw for three touchdowns and no interceptions. With **at least three passing touchdowns and no interceptions** against the Chargers, Brady will be only the second player in team history to post consecutive such games (also Josh Freeman, 10/21/12 vs. New Orleans-10/25/12 at Minnesota).
- Brady has 547 regular season passing touchdowns and needs **six** to tie Drew Brees (553 - active) for the most regular season passing touchdowns in NFL history. Including the postseason, Brady has thrown for 620 touchdowns, the most in NFL history.
- Brady has 221 regular season wins, tied for the most by a player in NFL history, (also Adam Vinatieri, 221).
- Brady has two career regular season games with at least **six passing touchdowns** and needs **one more** such game to tie Peyton Manning (three) for the most such games in NFL history. Including the postseason, Brady has seven such games, tied with Ben Roethlisberger for the third-most in NFL history.
- Brady has six career regular season games with at least **five passing touchdowns** and needs **one more** such game to pass Dan Marino (six) and Roethlisberger (six) for the third-most such games in NFL history. Including the postseason, Brady is tied with Manning with three such games.
- Brady has 92 career regular season **games with at least 300 passing yards** and needs **one more** such game to tie Peyton Manning (93) for the second-most such games in NFL history. Including the postseason, Brady has 108 games with at least 300 passing yards, trailing only Drew Brees (128).

SHAQUIL BARRETT

- Barrett recorded a **franchise-record 19.5 sacks** in 2019. **With 15.0 or more sacks** in 2020, he would be just the 11th player in NFL history to post consecutive seasons with at least 15.0 sacks.
- Barrett has **21.5 sacks as a Buccaneer**. He needs **4.5 more** to tie Greg Spires (26.0 from 2002-07) for 10th-most sacks in franchise history.



WHAT TO WATCH FOR

CAMERON BRATE

- Brate has **27 career touchdown catches**. He needs **one more** to pass Mark Carrier (27 from 1987-92) and tie Joey Galloway (28 from 2004-08) for the fourth-most touchdown receptions in team history.
- Brate has **three career games with multiple touchdown receptions**. He needs **one more** to tie Jimmie Giles for the most ever such games by a Buccaneers tight end and tie for the third-most such games in franchise history.

LAVONTE DAVID

- David has **22.5 career sacks**. He needs **3.5 more** to tie Greg Spires (26.0 from 2002-07) for 10th-most and **4.0 more** to pass Broderick Thomas (26.5 from 1989-93) for the ninth-most sacks in franchise history. Thomas holds the record for the most sacks by a linebacker in franchise history.
- David has **three career defensive touchdowns** and needs **one more** to tie for the third-most in franchise history (David Logan, 1979-96; Mike Washington, 1976-84).



MIKE EVANS

- Evans caught two touchdowns at Denver. With at least **two touchdown receptions** against the Chargers, it will mark only the fourth time in franchise history that a player has posted multiple touchdown receptions in consecutive games. Previously: Chris Godwin (9/29/19 at L.A. Rams-10/6/19 vs. New Orleans), Vincent Jackson (10/13/13 vs. Philadelphia-10/20/13 at Atlanta) and Horace Copeland (10/24/93 vs. Green Bay-10/31/93 at Atlanta). Dating back to last season, Evans has recorded a **receiving touchdown in each of the past three games** he has played in. With **one receiving touchdown** at Denver, Evans will match the franchise record for consecutive games with a receiving touchdown (four), done eight times, including once by Evans. Last done by Chris Godwin (12/31/17 vs. New Orleans-9/24/18 vs. Pittsburgh).



CHRIS GODWIN

- Godwin has **2,843 career receiving yards**. He needs **105 more** to pass Mike Williams (2,947 from 2010-13) for 10th-most receiving yards in franchise history.
- Godwin has **18 career touchdown receptions**. He needs **two more** to tie Vincent Jackson (20 from 2012-16) for 10th-most receiving touchdowns in Buccaneers history.
- Godwin had **1,333 receiving yards in 2019**. If he **surpasses 1,300 yards receiving in 2020**, he would be the first player in team history to record 1,300-or-more yards in consecutive seasons.

ROB GRONKOWSKI

- Gronkowski has **7,872 regular season receiving yards** and needs **37 more** to pass Jimmy Graham (7,908 - active) for the fifth-most receiving yards by a tight end in NFL history. Including the postseason, Gronkowski has **9,035 receiving yards** and needs **65 more** to pass Greg Olson (9,099 - active) for the fourth-most receiving yards by a tight end in NFL history (regular season and postseason combined).
- Gronkowski has **79 regular season receiving touchdowns**. He needs **one more** to pass Harold Carmichael (79) and Charley Taylor (79) for 27th-most, **two more** to tie Art Powell and Steve Smith (81) for 25th-most and **three more** to tie Anquan Boldin and Reggie Wayne (82) for the 23rd-most touchdown receptions in NFL history. Including the postseason, Gronkowski has **91 receiving touchdowns** and needs **one more** to pass Reggie Wayne (91) for the 14th-most receiving touchdowns in NFL history (regular season and postseason combined).
- Gronkowski has **604 career receptions** (regular season and postseason combined) and needs **six more** to tie Vernon Davis (610) for the seventh-most receptions by a tight end in NFL history.



WHAT TO WATCH FOR

LESEAN MCCOY

- McCoy has **11,066 career rushing yards**. He needs **176 more** to pass O.J. Simpson (11,236) for 21st-most and **176 more** to pass Corey Dillon (11,241) for the 20th-most regular season rushing yards in NFL history.
- McCoy has **73 career rushing touchdowns**. He needs **one more** to tie Earl Campbell and Leroy Kelly (74) for 26th-most, **two more** to tie Clinton Portis (75) for 25th-most and **three more** to tie Pete Johnson (76) for the 24th-most regular season rushing touchdowns in NFL history.
- McCoy has **14,915 career yards from scrimmage**. He needs **196 more** to pass Jerome Bettis (15,111) for 25th-most, **203 more** to pass Steve Smith (15,118) for 24th-most, **206 more** to pass Steven Jackson (15,121) for 23rd-most, **209 more** to pass Tim Brown (15,124) for 22nd-most and **226 more** to pass Tony Gonzalez (15,141) for the 21st-most regular season yards from scrimmage in NFL history.



JASON PIERRE-PAUL

- Dating back to last season, Pierre-Paul has recorded at least 1.0 sack in each of the past four games. With **1.0 sack** at Denver, would tie Simeon Rice (five consecutive games: 12/2/01 at Cincinnati-12/29/01 vs. Baltimore) for the third-longest streak in franchise history.
- Pierre-Paul has **23.0 sacks** as a Buccaneer. He needs **3.0 more** to tie Greg Spires (26.0 from 2002-07) for 10th-most and **3.5 more** to tie Broderick Thomas (26.5 from 1989-93) for ninth-most in franchise history.

NOTED & QUOTED

HC BRUCE ARIANS

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- X Arians is a two-time Associated Press NFL Coach of the Year, earning the award in 2012 (Indianapolis Colts) and in 2014 (Arizona Cardinals).
- X He is the only coach in NFL history to earn the award multiple times in a three-year span with different teams and is one of only 12 coaches in NFL history to win the award multiple times.
- X Prior to his time with the Colts, Arians spent eight seasons with the Steelers, five as offensive coordinator (2007-11) and three as the wide receivers coach (2004-06). During his tenure as the offensive coordinator, the Steelers had a 55-25 record, tying Green Bay for the second-best mark in the NFL during that span.
- X Pittsburgh won three AFC North Division titles, two AFC Championships and earned a victory in Super Bowl XLIII over the Cardinals. Arians was also part of the Steelers' Super Bowl XL win as the team's wide receivers coach.

TAMPA BAY BUCCANEERS

- X Bruce Arians was named the 12th head coach in franchise history on January 8, 2019.
- X In his first season with the Buccaneers in 2019, Arians led Tampa Bay to a two-win improvement over the previous season, guiding the team to a 5-3 record over the last eight games to finish 7-9. The team's seven wins were its most since 2016. In addition, the Buccaneers 5-3 record on the road matched the third-best road mark in team history.
- X Under Arians' direction, Tampa Bay's offense set franchise records for both points scored (458) and touchdowns (54), while leading the league in passing offense at 302.8 yards per game and ranking third in the NFL in total offense at 397.9 yards per game. On the defensive side of the ball, the Buccaneers boasted the NFL's best run defense, limiting opponents to 1,181 rushing yards over 16 games (73.8 avg.), the lowest total allowed in a 16-game season in franchise history.

ARIZONA CARDINALS

- X During his time in Arizona, Arians compiled a 49-30-1 regular season record (.619 winning percentage). The Cardinals' 49 wins during that span were the seventh-most in the NFL and the third-most in the NFC. Arians won 50 total games in Arizona (49 regular season, one postseason), finishing as the winningest coach in franchise history. His 49 regular season wins are also the most by any coach in Cardinals history.
- X In 2015, Arians led the Cardinals to a franchise record 13 wins, which also featured the team's first-ever postseason bye and second-ever appearance in the NFC Championship Game.
- X Under Arians, the Cardinals offense set several single-season team records, including points scored (489 in 2015), total touchdowns (59 in 2015), total net yards (6,533 in 2015) and first downs (373 in 2015).

INDIANAPOLIS COLTS

- X Arians went to Arizona after spending the 2012 season with Indianapolis. Hired as the team's offensive coordinator, he also served as the team's interim head coach for 12 games while head coach Chuck Pagano was treated for leukemia. He led the Colts to a 9-3 record and was selected as the 2012 AP NFL Coach of the Year. Indianapolis' nine-win improvement (2-14 to 11-5) matched the third-largest single-season turnaround in NFL history.
- X Arians helped the Colts' offense rank 10th in the NFL in yards (362.4 ypg) and seventh in passing yards (258.0 ypg). Rookie quarterback Andrew Luck - the first overall pick in the 2012 NFL Draft - made the Pro Bowl and set rookie records for passing yards (4,374) and 300-yard passing games (six). He also established the NFL single-game rookie record for passing yards (433, 11/4 vs. Miami). Luck finished with the then-third-most passing touchdowns by a rookie in NFL history, with 23.

ANTHONY LYNN



On Jan. 13, 2017, the Los Angeles Chargers named Anthony Lynn the 16th head coach in franchise history and the first African-American head coach in team annals. Lynn joined the Chargers after spending the 2015-16 seasons with the Buffalo Bills as the assistant head coach, running backs coach, offensive coordinator and interim head coach.

The 2019 season was highlighted by record-setting performances and recognition. Keenan Allen and Melvin Ingram III each went to their third-straight Pro Bowl while Joey Bosa went to his second in three

seasons. On offense, Allen set a team record for catches in a season (104) and the unit touted a pair of 1,000-yard receivers (Allen and Mike Williams) while Austin Ekeler finished the year with 92 catches for 993 yards and eight touchdowns. In three seasons in Los Angeles, Lynn has compiled a 26-22 regular-season record.

Lynn led the Chargers to their first playoff appearance since 2013 and their best record since 2009 by posting a 12-4 mark in just his second season with the team in 2018. The Chargers led the NFL with seven Pro Bowl selections and were a resilient squad, winning eight-straight road contests.

In his first season at the helm in Los Angeles, Lynn rallied the team after an 0-4 start to win nine of the final 12 games, including six of the last seven contests. The Chargers finished 9-7 and just missed out on a playoff berth due to a tiebreaker.

A native of Celina, Texas, some 40 miles north of Dallas, Lynn was an All-Southwest Conference running back as a collegian at Texas Tech, where he rushed for 1,911 yards and 17 touchdowns on 481 carries. That helped him earn a ticket to the NFL where he signed with the New York Giants as an undrafted free agent in 1992. He concluded his career in Denver (1997-99), where he won back-to-back Super Bowl championships (XXXII and XXXIII) with the Broncos.

Lynn jumped right into the coaching ranks in 2000, spending three seasons (2000-02) with the Broncos as an offensive assistant and assistant to special teams. In 2003, he landed his first full-time position gig as the running backs coach for the Jacksonville Jaguars (2003-04). That was followed by similar positions with the Dallas Cowboys (2005-06), Cleveland Browns (2007-08), New York Jets (2009-14) and Bills (2015-16). Lynn carried the additional title of assistant head coach in New York in 2014 and with the Bills for his two seasons there.

Lynn spent the last two seasons (2015-16) with the Bills, including the final 14 games of the 2016 season as their offensive coordinator and the final game of the year as their interim head coach. The Bills led the NFL in both of Lynn's seasons in both rushing yards (2,630 in 2016 and 2,432 in 2015) and rushing touchdowns (29 in 2016 and 19, tie in 2015). More impressively, at his last two coaching stops (New York and Buffalo), his teams combined to rush for 18,218 yards during that span (2009-16), the most combined yards in the NFL over that time period.

Lynn is married to Stacey Bell Lynn. He has two children, son, D'Anton, and daughter, Danielle. Stacey was a news anchor at WNBC in New York City. D'Anton played football collegiately at Penn State and professionally with the New York Jets and the Canadian Football League's Hamilton Tiger-Cats and currently is the defensive backs coach for the Houston Texans. Danielle studied at the University of Oklahoma and earned her master's degree at the University of North Texas. She is currently the COO of The Lynn Family Foundation and the Process Improvement Specialist at Southwest Hospital in Dallas.
