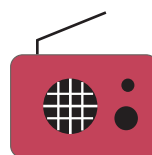

FEELING A DRAFT

The Buccaneers, led by General Manager Jason Licht and Head Coach Todd Bowles, have six selections in this year's NFL Draft and hold the No. 27 overall pick. If Tampa Bay picks at No. 27, it will mark the first time drafting a player in that slot in team history. The team previously held the No. 27 overall pick in the 2000 NFL Draft, but traded the pick to the Jets in exchange for Keyshawn Johnson.

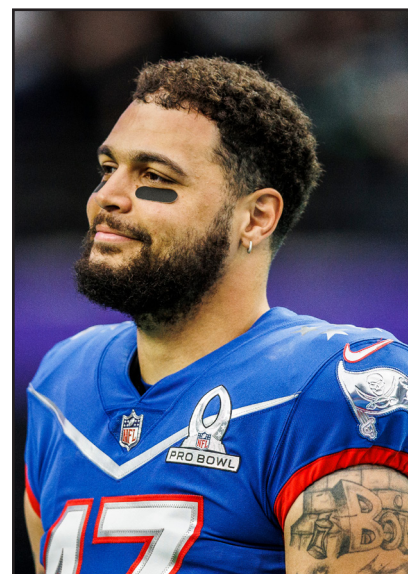

- Though not drafted by Tampa Bay, RB/KR Clifton Smith signed as an undrafted rookie free agent with the Buccaneers after the 2008 draft and became just the third undrafted player since 1970 to make the Pro Bowl as a rookie, joining Everson Walls (1981) and Rufus Porter (1988). The Fresno State grad was also just the second rookie in team history to make the all-star game, joining Warrick Dunn (1997). Doug Martin (2012) later became the third rookie in team history to earn a Pro Bowl selection, while Jameis Winston (2015) became the fourth.

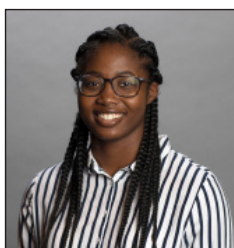
